

**AUGUST 14, 2007**

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:32 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero, Phelan, Erickson.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was called for the safety of our armed forces overseas, police, firefighters, and paramedics.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Nancy Holdwin, 3545 Harvey expressed concerns over school District 201's financial crisis and request any help from elected officials- Berwyn resident questioned measures taken to preserve "Spindle"-Maria Fernandez, 2722 Lombard, congratulated city officials on "National Night Out"- and also reported sewer problems in her area following heavy rainfall.
4. The minutes of the regular City Council and the Committee of the Whole held on July 24, 2007, and the minutes of the Special City Council meeting held on July 31, 2007 were submitted. Weiner made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
5. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth item G-2. The motion carried. G-2 is a communication from the City Clerk regarding the presentation of Dollars for Scholar. There after, Clerk Pavlik presented the certificates to the recipients Victoria McLain and Mary Carney and extended congratulations. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
6. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted an agreement between the City of Berwyn and the Berwyn Main Street organization. Thereafter, Lovero made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero. Nays: Phelan, Erickson.

7. A deferred communication from the Mayor regarding Liquor License classification limitations was submitted. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur and approve as amended. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero, Erickson. Nays: Phelan
8. Erickson made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth item I-11 as germane to F-2. The motion carried. F-2 is a deferred communication from the Mayor regarding the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of Berwyn. I-11 is a communication from Alderman Erickson regarding Berwyn's Centennial Celebration. Thereafter, Alderman Erickson read a statement into the record, see attached, requesting the City Council to formally request Carl Reina to be appointed as Chief Executive of the Berwyn Centennial Festival with a flat fee of \$35,000 and that a working capital of \$200,000 be allotted for this event. After extensive discussion, regarding Mr. Reina's desire to head this celebration and the concerns of several aldermen why Mr. Reina did not want to approach the Council in person with specifics plans for the event. The Mayor stated that if this is not approved at this meeting, the 100<sup>th</sup> year celebration will not go forward. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Phelan, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion was defeated by the following roll call: Yeas: Phelan, Erickson. Nays: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero.
9. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding referral item #39 of July 10, 2007 requesting Record Keeping and Approval of Purchase Card Program. Weiner made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur. The motion was defeated by the following roll call: Yeas: Ramos, Weiner, Erickson. Nays: Chapman, Skryd, Phelan, Lovero. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to refer the matter to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried.
10. Weiner made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to suspend the rules and bring forth items I-13 and J-8 as germane to F-4. The motion carried. F-4 is a communication from the Mayor regarding referral item #26 of July 24, 2007, Professional Management. I-13 is a communication from the Administration committee regarding Public Works Supervisor Positions. J-8 is a communication from the Public Works director regarding the creation of Water and Street Superintendent Position. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur with the request and post for 2 positions in the Public Works department. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Ramos, Weiner, Phelan, Erickson. Nays: Chapman, Skryd, Lovero.

11. The Mayor submitted an amended ordinance section 804.18 of the Berwyn Code to enhance Clear View Requirements of Liquor Establishments. Weiner made a motion to concur. There being no second, the motion was withdrawn. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to defer and refer the matter to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried.
12. The Mayor submitted a communication requesting the settlement of case #02 WC 32059. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Weiner, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero, Erickson. Nays: Phelan.
13. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the appointment of Michael Collins to the Community Relations Commission. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Weiner, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
14. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the re appointment of Irene Martin to the Library Board. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
15. The Mayor submitted a communication from Havlicek Elementary School requesting (2) parking spaces designated for handicapped parking at 15<sup>th</sup> and Elmwood, and (2) signs placed by the diagonal parking spaces on the east side of 14<sup>th</sup> and Elmwood for staff parking. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to waive reading and defer for (2) weeks. The motion was withdrawn. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Weiner, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
16. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding Notification of Written Order entered at the conclusion of Liquor License hearing proceedings. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
17. The Mayor submitted a communication requesting the consideration of Maureen Brocato to fill the seat of the 5<sup>th</sup> Ward Alderman. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, with no second being heard, the Mayor requested a second. Skryd seconded the motion. The motion was defeated by the following roll call: Yeas: Weiner, Skryd. 



**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 804.18 OF THE BERWYN CODE TO ENHANCE CLEAR VIEW REQUIREMENTS OF LIQUOR ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn requires all liquor license establishments serving alcoholic beverages on the premises to facilitate a clear view of the interior premises at all times; and,

**WHEREAS**, additional clear view requirements have been recommended by public safety officials within the City of Berwyn; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that all applicable liquor license establishments be required to provide minimum openings adjacent to public ways and that such openings shall conform to building code standards.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of Berwyn's home rule powers as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Section 804.18 CLEAR VIEW OF PREMISES is hereby amended to read as follows (with proposed additions underlined, and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

**804.18 CLEAR VIEW OF PREMISES.**

In the case of premises upon which the sale of alcoholic liquor, for consumption on the premises, is licensed, no screen, blind, curtain, partition or other thing shall be permitted in the windows or upon the doors of such premises, or inside such premises, which prevents a clear view into the interior of such licensed premises from the street, road or sidewalk at all times. No booth, screen, partition or other obstruction or any arrangement of lights or lighting is permitted in or about the interior of such premises which prevents a clear view of the entire interior from the street, road or sidewalk. All rooms where liquor is sold for consumption on the premises shall be continuously lighted

during business hours by natural light or artificial white light so that all parts of the interior of the premises are clearly visible. If the view into any such licensed premises required by this section is willfully obscured by the licensee or permitted by him or her to be obscured or in any manner obstructed, then such license shall be subject to revocation as provided in Section 804.21. In order to enforce this section, the Mayer Liquor Commissioner may require the filing ~~with him or her~~ with the Building Department of plans, drawings and photographs showing the clearance of the view required in this section. The minimum clear view openings adjacent to all public ways shall be three (3) feet by four (feet) and such openings shall be located no higher than 72 inches from ground level as measured from the top of the opening. The actual height and width requirements shall be determined by the Building Department pursuant to the building's architectural and structural considerations. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the Liquor Commissioner from granting Banquet Facilities and Fraternal Organizations an exemption from this Ordinance provided that events held at said locations are monitored by an internal or external security or police presence within the premises.

**SECTION 3:**

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 4:**

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 5:**

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on January 1, 2007, after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.







than three feet from any lot line, less than five feet from any building or structure on the zoning lot, or less than thirty feet from the rear lot line where there is no accessory building at the rear of the lot.

(c) No pool shall occupy more than seventy-five percent of the rear yard.

(d) Above-ground pools shall not be more than six feet in height, including any attached fences, railings and/or other structural and decorative additions, and shall not be in close proximity (as determined by the designated City official) to any telephone or electrical lines and cables.

(e) A permit shall be required to erect, construct, install or assemble a below-ground pool or a permanent above-ground pool. (Any above-ground pool that will remain intact on the zoning lot beyond November 1 in the year of installation shall be considered permanent under this section.) The applicant and the owner of the property, if not the same, will assume full responsibility of informing the utility companies and the appropriate department of the City regarding any activity relative to the erection, construction, installation or assembly of an above or below-ground pool that may in any way interfere with any cables, telephone and electrical lines, wires, pipes, transformers, conduits, sewers, etc., located on the property, above or below the ground level, and the applicant and the owner, if not the same, will indemnify and hold harmless the City from all costs, claims and actions resulting from any damage resulting from the work performed either by or on behalf of the applicant and the owner, and, upon request by the designated City official, shall purchase a bond from a company acceptable to the City in the principal sum requested, to assure that the work will be properly performed.

(f) Any new pool installation shall require the residential lot to be completely fenced and gated. The fence shall conform with the requirements of Chapter 1272 of this Zoning Code.

#### 1274.14 ROOF-TOP PATIOS OR OTHER USAGES.

(a) In the event that a proposed use of property and/or a structure is not listed in the district involved, the designated City official may, if such action is deemed appropriate, submit the same to Council to determine if such requested use and/or structure is substantially similar in nature to any other listed use and/or structure, is not less restrictive, and can be considered as being compatible with the established uses and/or structures on adjoining premises. 



ORDINANCE No. \_\_\_\_\_

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 289 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn (the "City"), is a home rule municipality within the purview of Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Illinois Constitution (1970), and, as such, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to 50 ILCS 750/15.4, the number of Emergency Telephone System Board members may be increased but shall include no less than 5 qualified who may serve staggered terms; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council have determined that a seven member Emergency Telephone System Board serving staggered terms will enhance 911 operations and provide additional skill, knowledge and experience to continue to provide quality emergency response services.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule power, as follows:

*Section 1.* That the above recitals are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

*Section 2.* That Chapter 289, Section 289.01, entitled Emergency Telephone System Board, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, is hereby amended to read as follows (with ~~deletions~~ and additions expressed as herein shown):

**289.01 ESTABLISHMENT; COMPOSITION.**

There is hereby established an Emergency Telephone System Board of and for the City. The Emergency Telephone System Board shall consist of ~~five~~ seven members who shall be appointed by the Mayor, by and with the consent of the City Council. The Mayor may appoint a public member who is a resident of the local exchange service territory included in the 9-1-1 coverage area. At least ~~three~~ five members of the Emergency Telephone System Board shall be representative of the 9-1-1 public safety agencies, including, but not limited to, the Police Department, the Fire Department, emergency medical service providers, and emergency services and disaster agencies. All appointments shall be made on the basis of ability or experience. Elected officials are also eligible to serve on the Board. Members of the Board shall serve either two (2) or three (3) year staggered terms and shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses.

*Section 3.* If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

*Section 4.* All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

*Section 5.* This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.







Per request, I've provided a list of all emails and subjects original from [MOCConnor@ci.berwyn.il.us](mailto:MOCConnor@ci.berwyn.il.us) destined for [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com). In total, fourteen (14) emails were found. Full text copies of the emails have been scanned into PDF format and attached for your review. 'Attachment A' is a screen dump of the search criteria while 'Attachment Set C' is a full-text log of the emails (minus attachments) that were delivered to [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com) according to the Mayor's 'Sent Mail' folder.

By inspecting the Mayor's computer, I've determined he uses "local" groups (mailing lists that reside only on his computer) to mass-email Alderman. This group is titled "Alderman" and contained the [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com) email address. While I had removed [5thward@berwyn-il.gov](mailto:5thward@berwyn-il.gov) months ago, the Mayor's local group, containing [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com) and not the Berwyn-il.gov forwarder, still pushed email out to [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com). When an email message is composed to a local group, in this case "Alderman", the full verbose list of recipients and their email addresses is not shown to the sender. I believe the mistake here is that [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com) was not taken off that local list which resides solely on his computer. The Mayor, whose technical knowledge is not vast, believed when I removed [5thward@berwyn-il.gov](mailto:5thward@berwyn-il.gov) forwarder, all email posting to Ben's accounts would not be delivered. This is not the case. Email sent to [5thward@berwyn-il.gov](mailto:5thward@berwyn-il.gov) went and continues to go nowhere; however, email sent directly to [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com) does in fact find its way to that email address. So, in conclusion, we're looking at 14 (fourteen) emails that did in fact make their way to [bbrocato@aol.com](mailto:bbrocato@aol.com).

To expand the search parameters, I contacted Marueen Brocato directly and received her private email address. She related to me that one around the City uses it, but my intention was to search for any sent message from the City network to this private address. This email address is [REDACTED]. Searches with this address set as the recipient yielded no responses. A screen dump of this search is included as 'Attachment B'.







## INTERGOVERNMENTAL SAFETY ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of August, 2007, by and between the City of Berwyn, an Illinois home rule municipal corporation (the "City"), and the Berwyn Park District (the "District"), operating in conformance with the provisions of the Intergovernmental Cooperative Act (5 ILCS 220-1, et seq.), and the Illinois Park District Act (70 ILCS 1205-1, et seq.) (the "Acts").

### RECITALS

A. Chapter 5, Section 220/3 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 2005, as revised, allows units of local government to enter into agreements for the purpose of exercising joint authority.

B. Pursuant to this authority, the City and District have passed, from time to time, various Ordinances relating to the control of the conduct of all persons and patrons under the jurisdiction of the District and areas adjacent whether under District or City jurisdiction.

C. The District wishes to limit the use of its parks and to control the conduct of persons and patrons of the parks under its jurisdiction.

D. Pursuant to Berwyn Park District Ordinance No., O-07-02, Certified Police Officers of the City of Berwyn are authorized to police these parks and issue citations to persons for violations of these ordinances.

E. The District, from time to time employs off-duty City law enforcement officers on a part-time bases for purposes of law enforcement within the District's parks.

F. The City has an established local ordinance prosecution system wherein City attorneys and law enforcement officers, if requested, appear in court on regularly scheduled days for purposes of prosecuting citations and other charges issued.

G. Article VII, Section 10, of the Illinois Constitution provides that units of local government may contract among themselves to obtain or share services, to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance, and use their revenues to pay costs related to intergovernmental activities. Additionally, the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act provides that one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more other public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform.

H. The District requested the City to prosecute on the District's behalf citations for ordinance violations issued by District law enforcement officials in the District parks, on the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

I. After due consideration, the City is agreeable to the District's request, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, based on the mutual promises and considerations set forth herein, the terms and conditions hereof, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made part of this Agreement as though fully set forth in this Section 1.

Section 2. Administrative Adjudication. The City agrees that citations issued by certified law enforcement officers of the District and/or the City for offenses committed within the District's parks shall be prosecuted as part of the City's local ordinance and administrative adjudication systems, and the City Prosecutor for the City of Berwyn shall act as the District's prosecutor when the matters of the ordinance violations are presented in court.

Section 3. Compensation. The District agrees that 50% of the amount of all fines collected by the District pursuant to this agreement for all citations issued and prosecuted by the City of Berwyn for City or District ordinance violations taking place within the District's parks shall be promptly paid from the District's treasury to the City as compensation for its services pursuant to the aforesaid intergovernmental agreement. All fines collected are subject to reasonable administrative fees as agreed to by the parties before dispersing funds to either party.

Section 4. Administrators of this Agreement. The respective administrators of the District and the City are hereby authorized by each of their respective governing boards to coordinate and perform such activities as are necessary to implement and maintain this Agreement.

Section 5. Termination. This Agreement shall terminate upon delivery of not less than 180 days written notice by either party.

Section 6. Entire Agreement. This Agreement sets forth all of the promises, agreements, conditions and understandings between the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement, and there are no promises, agreements, conditions and understandings, either oral or written, other than the contents of this Agreement.

Section 7. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit the City and the District, and their respective legal representatives and successors.

Section 8. Partial Invalidity. The clauses, provisions and sections of this Agreement are deemed by the parties to be separable and the invalidity of any portion of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

Section 9. Notices. All notices and demands required hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given or made when delivered personally, with proof of delivery thereof, or when mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or by facsimile transmission followed on the same date as the facsimile by mailing, addressed as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the parties entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement on April 13, 2006 regarding the rehabilitation and joint use of certain real property known as the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Community Center; and,

**WHEREAS**, the rehabilitation of said property is substantially complete and the parties desire to extend the term of this Agreement from five years to ten years.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises and conditions set forth in the original intergovernmental agreement and as provided herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Paragraph 6(A), identifying the term of the agreement, is hereby revised from five years to ten years.

**Intergovernmental Agreement  
Between  
North Berwyn Park District, Cook County, Illinois and  
The City of Berwyn providing for the Rehabilitation and Joint Use of certain  
Property Known as the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Community Center**

This Intergovernmental Agreement is made and entered into by and between the North Berwyn Park District , Cook County, Illinois, an Illinois unit of local government (hereinafter referred to as the "Park District"), and the City of Berwyn, an Illinois unit of local government (hereinafter referred to as the "City of Berwyn").

**WITNESSETH**

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are empowered to enter into this Intergovernmental Agreement pursuant to the authority granted in Article XII, Section 10, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the authorities granted to each government party by their enabling statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn owns the property at 16<sup>th</sup> and Ridgeland, which has been used in various capacities in the past.

WHEREAS, the parties agree that the best interests of the constituents of both the City of Berwyn and Park District would be to improve the community center with a rehabilitated facility.

WHEREAS. The City of Berwyn agrees that the Park District should then be allowed to conduct certain programmed activities in the facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, terms and conditions set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The preambles set forth above are incorporated herein and made part hereof.
2. Within 30 days of the date of this Agreement, the Park District and City of Berwyn may initiate plans for the rehabilitation, per I.C.C. Code, of area's deemed in unsatisfactory/unsafe condition. The management of this project will be the responsibility of the City of Berwyn.
3. The Park District and City of Berwyn shall work to secure funds for this project; any and all funds derived for the purpose of the rehabilitation of the 16<sup>th</sup> street community center shall be deposited into the General Fund of the North Berwyn Park District with the exception of the \$250,000. State grant (DECO). The Park District shall provide financial documentation to the City of Berwyn on a monthly basis.
4. The Park District shall continue to provide the City of Berwyn a certificate of insurance on an annual basis indemnifying the city for program related circumstances.
5. The City of Berwyn hereby grants to the Park District authority for access to community center during the rehabilitation of the facility.

6. Beginning with the completion of the first floor senior area and the basement art center, the City of Berwyn shall provide for joint access to the Park District for the use of the programming areas according to the following terms and conditions:
  - A. The term of the agreement is <sup>Ten</sup> five years.
  - B. This is a shared use agreement, and parties shall share the use of the program area.
  - C. Park District shall be allowed to program activities from 6:00 am until 11:00pm.
  - D. Park District shall control and program all activities in the arts center.
  - E. Park District and City of Berwyn shall jointly plan, initiate, and market programs for the senior center.

The parties agree to work reasonably, and in good faith, to provide for the best interests of the constituents of both the City of Berwyn and the Park District.

7. Vending – Only vendors licensed and approved by the City of Berwyn shall be allowed to operate such concessions in the building. Revenue from concessions will be placed in an enterprise sub fund for senior center and art program uses only.

8. The maintenance, upkeep, and responsibility of maintaining all mechanical equipment shall be the responsibility of the City of Berwyn. All physical repairs to the facility shall be the responsibility of the City of Berwyn. The city shall be responsible for the exterior maintenance of the facility. The park district shall promptly inform the city of any damage to the mechanical equipment or repairs affecting use of this property.

9. The City of Berwyn agrees to allow the Park District to seek out sponsorship for program support and/or naming rights for a corporate donor. Any and all sponsorship dollars shall be used for support of programs at the 6420 W. 16<sup>th</sup> Street location and shall be deposited in a special fund designated specifically for programs at the community center.

10. The City of Berwyn agrees to support Park District requests for CDBG funding for program costs associated with this project.

11. The Park District agrees to create a sub fund under the appropriate fund to tract revenue and expenses for this project.

12. All revenue shall be collected and retained by the park district for both senior activities and arts center related activities

13. The City shall be responsible for the rehabilitation of the senior center area and arts center area. The district shall be consulted as to the specifics of the rehabilitation of both areas.

14. The city shall be responsible for all utilities, garbage removal, and snow removal.

15. This Park District may terminate this agreement with two years notice.

16. The City of Berwyn may terminate this agreement with two years notice and the agreement to not engage in similar direct service/activities or support of an organization providing similar activities that were occurring in the 16<sup>th</sup> street community center and/or operated by the North Berwyn Park District for a period of five years from the last day of occupancy of community center by the park district.

17. The parties to this AGREEMENT may amend this AGREEMENT at any time by mutual agreement between the parties.

ORDINANCE NO.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING § 484.05 OF THE BERWYN CODE REGARDING STREET PARKING FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of Berwyn's home rule powers as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has previously enacted an ordinance dealing with reserved street parking for handicapped individuals; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council, has determined that appropriate signage clearing designating the handicapped parking permit number is adequate to highlight the restricted nature of the parking spot.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:**

Section 484.055 of the City of Berwyn Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows (with proposed additions underlined, and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

**484.055 RESERVATION OF STREET PARKING FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS.**

(a) All street parking spaces reserved for the handicapped shall be marked by the posting of two signs erected under the direction of the Director of Public Works and used to designate the reservation of parking spaces for the handicapped in the form and manner prescribed under Section 11-301 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/301), provided that all of the following criteria have been met, unless specifically exempted by Council:

(1) An application on a form to be prescribed by the Police Parking Division has been completed, and verified by the notarized signature of the applicant. The City Council shall determine its approval or disapproval of a properly completed application.

(2) The applicant must be an owner of a motor vehicle for which the Illinois handicapped or disabled veteran license plate or handicapped card has been issued and which plate or card is valid at the time of such application (or renewal application).

(3) The person who is handicapped or a disabled veteran as defined under State law must be a lawful resident of the City at the address for which the installation of the restricted handicapped parking sign is requested. Written evidence of such residency must be provided to the Police Parking Division at the time such application is submitted.

(4) The applicant must verify that neither the applicant nor the handicapped or disabled veteran involved has reasonable access to a garage or a driveway adjacent to a garage located at the address of the handicapped or disabled veteran resident of the City.

(5) If the applicant is not the owner of the property at which the handicapped or disabled veteran resides, the written approval of the owner or property manager of such property for the installation of such restricted handicapped parking space sign must be provided at the time of application.

(6) If known to the applicant or reasonably ascertainable by the applicant, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of persons who reside on any property adjacent to the property on which the handicapped person or disabled veteran resides in the City must be provided at the time such application is submitted.

(b) There shall be parking by permit for persons holding handicapped parking stickers and paying an additional fee of \$10 annually, as well as an initial fee of \$10 to enact a handicapped permit sign adjacent to the property the applicant resides in.

(1) The sticker shall be numbered to correspond to the sign posted on the property described in this subsection, and only the vehicle bearing that handicapped parking permit number shall be allowed to park therein.

(2) Only vehicles with the corresponding handicapped parking permit number to the posted signage shall be allowed to park in that handicapped parking permit spot.

(3) Violations of this section shall be punished by a two hundred fifty dollar (\$250.00) fine.

(4) Handicapped parking permits shall only be issued to one vehicle per property and only one handicapped parking permit number shall be issued per property.

(5) The Director of the Department of Public Works shall develop the appropriate signage, in compliance with this section and 65 ILCS 5/301 et seq., clearly designating the handicapped parking permit number in fluorescent green, so as to highlight the restricted nature of the spot.

~~(6) Street markings shall be such as to clearly identify the handicapped parking permit spot in such a fashion as is recognizable from a vehicle on the street, i.e., curb painted with fluorescent green paint.~~

(c) All handicapped parking space designations shall expire on October 1 of each year, but may be renewed upon the submission of a renewal application form to be prescribed by the Police Parking Division, verified by the notarized signature of the renewal applicant meeting the requirements of subsection (a)(2) hereof and submitted to the Police Parking Division, along with any verification documentation called for by such renewal application form and the payment of a ten dollar (\$10.00) fee.

(d) Section 11-1301.3 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1301.3) is hereby incorporated into this section by reference.

(e) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be fined not more than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), except that anyone who fraudulently uses a handicapped parking permit in violation of this section shall be subject to a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine.

**SECTION 2:**

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 3:**

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 4:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.




