

BERWYN CITY COUNCIL
SEPTEMBER 11, 2007

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:55 p.m. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Phelan, to allow Alderman Erickson to attend by remote participation per ordinance. The motion carried by a voice vote. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Phelan, Erickson. Absent: Weiner, Lovero. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd to excuse Aldermen Weiner and Lovero. The motion carried by a voice vote.
2. The Colors were presented by the Police and Fire departments and the Pledge of Allegiance was lead by Commander Manfredini. The Mayor read a letter reminding all, of the tragic event that occurred on September 11th and for all the civilians, police and firefighters who gave their lives on that day. A moment of silence was also observed in memory of Joe Johnson, Jr. father of Commander Jeffrey Johnson, William Glass, retired firefighter, and Lee Listermann, father of Cindy Herckes, police telecommunicator and for the safety of the our armed forces, police, firefighters, and paramedics.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. A 5th Ward resident read a statement concerning the lack of representation in the 5th Ward and presented petitions in support of Ricardo Sanchez. A resident of the 1500 block of Harvey complained about the blighted conditions in the 5th Ward. A resident at 1639 East Avenue spoke regarding her dog being attached and killed by her neighbor's dog. Also, Judy Vessely, 1633 East Avenue voiced concern over this animal and the danger it brings to the entire block, both residents are seeking help with this problem. Senator Sandoval reported that the state budget is still not signed by the governor and that there is much concern regarding the Transit problem and the refusal of the governor to sign the bill that would approve funding. Also, funding for many projects in the Berwyn and Cicero area have been cut, and urged all his constituents to notify the governor's office to voice opposition to the cuts. Alderman Chapman reminded everyone of the OktoberFest in the Depot District on Friday, September 21st and Saturday, September 22nd and invited all to attend.

4. The minutes of the regular City Council meeting held on August 28, 2007, and the Committee of the Whole meetings held on August 14th 27th and 28, 2007 were submitted. Thereafter, Alderman Phelan made motion, seconded by Skryd, to reconsider his vote on item #9 of the August 28, 2007 City Council meeting. The motion carried. Thereafter, Phelan made a motion, seconded Ramos, to change his vote on item #9 from Nay to Aye. The motion carried by the following roll: Yeas: Ramos, Phelan, Erickson. Nays: Chapman, Skryd. Excused: Weiner, Lovero. Thereafter, Phelan made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve the minutes of August 28, 2007 as amended and to approve the minutes of the Committee of the Whole as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.
5. The bids proposals for the Holiday Decorations were submitted. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Phelan, for Anthony Bertuca, Jim Frank and any other interested parties to proceed to the conference room to open, tabulate, and return same to the Council Chambers for public reading. The motion carried by a voice vote.
6. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth items J-1 and J-2. The motion carried. J-1 is a deferred communication from the City Attorney regarding an intergovernmental Safety Enforcement agreement. J-2 is a revised version of same. After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to defer and refer to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried.
7. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a request for TIF funds for applicant Alex Priesto, Bodhi Thai Restaurant, 6211 Roosevelt Road. After discussion, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Phelan, to concur and approve as submitted not to exceed \$97,389.20. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos Skryd, Phelan. Nays: Erickson. Excused: Weiner, Lovero.
8. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding 100th Birthday celebration and the presentation by Carl Reina. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Phelan, to concur with the appointment of Carl Reina as Chairperson for the event and to approve the outline as presented by Mr. Reina. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Skryd, Phelan, Erickson. Nays: Ramos. Excused: Weiner, Lovero.
9. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding an amendment to the Health Insurance. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as submitted and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto following the unions' membership approval and representatives' signatures. The motion carried by the following roll

call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Phelan. Nays: Erickson. Excused: Weiner, Lovero.

10. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the 5th Ward Aldermanic seat. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to refer to the Committee of the Whole for the review of applicants whose resumes have been submitted to the Mayor's office prior to Friday, September 21, 2007. The motion carried by a voice vote.
11. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to bring forward Item I-2 as germane to F-4. The motion carried. F-4 is a communication from the Mayor regarding Ethics Ordinance provisions. F-4 is a communication from Alderman Chapman regarding recruiting members for the "Ethics Board". After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to refer the matter to a joint committee of Administration and Ordinance and Resolutions. The motion carried by a voice vote.
12. The Bid tabulations for the Holiday Decorations were returned to the Council Chamber for reading. The proposals were based on a 3 year scale. Folger Flag & Decorations, 2007-\$13,840, 2008-\$14,255, and 2009-\$14,683. Tyler Temple, 2007- \$27,680, 2008- \$29,064, and 2009-\$30,517. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to refer the bids to the Public Works director and the Public Works committee. The motion carried by a voice vote.
13. The Zoning Board of Appeals submitted a Resolution and Ordinance regarding a second floor addition for Justin Myers, 1604 East Avenue. Phelan made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to refer to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried by a voice vote.
14. The Zoning Board of Appeals submitted a Resolution regarding Potter's House Christian Fellowship Ministries, 6950-52 Windsor Avenue. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to deny the request. The motion failed by the following roll call: Yeas: Erickson. Nays: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Phelan. Excused: Weiner, Lovero. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to recall the previous vote and confirm the motion to deny the request. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Phelan. Nays: Erickson. Excused: Weiner, Lovero.
15. Alderman Chapman submitted a communication regarding the 6th Annual Oktoberfest information. Chapman waived reading and gave a brief summary of events. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by

Ramos, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.

16. Alderman Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to continue the City Council meeting passed the hour of 10:00 p.m. per ordinance. The motion carried by a voice vote with Phelan voicing a contrary nay.
17. Alderman Skryd submitted a request and License Agreement to allow the Berwyn Main Street to close Elmwood Avenue south from Cermak Road to the alley for the Houby Day Event. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to amend on face to close "Gunderson Avenue" not Elmwood Avenue contingent upon obtaining of liquor license. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Phelan, Erickson. Nays: none. Excused: Weiner, Lovero.
18. The City Attorney submitted an Enforcement Agreement for Cermak Plaza. After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to defer the matter for two (2) weeks. The motion carried by a voice vote.

The signs are wind resistant, metal fabricated which will be hung on the cream colored light poles throughout the Ogden Corridor. The project was bid out and Landmark Sign Group was the lowest-best bid response.

We are recommending the approval of purchasing 40 signs for a total cost of \$19,000 (\$475 per sign) this cost includes installation and hardware. A copy of the bid and design are attached for your review.







Attached is a copy of our current ordinance regarding dangerous animals. It has become very apparent this ordinance does not address the growing concerns of our residents. Although State Law prohibits this City Council from being breed specific, we can set certain requirements for those animals known for being more aggressive. I would also recommend any amendments to these ordinances include fines of the highest allowed by law for any attacks outside an owners' property.

Please refer to the Law department as well as the committee of the whole.

As used in this chapter:

- (a) "Animal" means any living vertebrate, domestic or wild, not including man.

(1958 Code Sec. 5-1.)

(b) "Dangerous animal" means an animal which, by reason of its species, is by nature ferocious or has a dangerous propensity, such as, but not limited to, lions, tigers, bears, elephants and wolves. As used in this section, the term "dangerous animal" means any animal meeting any one of the following criteria:

(1) Any animal which bites, inflicts injury on, kills or otherwise attacks a human being or domestic animal without provocation on any public or private property; or

(2) Any animal which on more than one occasion, without provocation, chases or approaches any person in an apparent attitude of attack, on any public property or in any place outside or over the boundaries of its owner's property; or

(3) Any animal owned or harbored, primarily or in part, for the purpose of dog or other animal fighting or any animal trained for dog or other animal fighting; or

(4) Any dog that is used by a commercial venture to guard public or private property, except those owned by a governmental or law enforcement unit; or

(5) Any animal which has been found to be a vicious dog under State law (510 ILCS 5/15).

(Ord. Unno. Passed 3-30-65; Ord. 4-36. Passed 8-24-04.)

616.02 RUNNING AT LARGE.

(a) No animal shall run at large in the City. Any animal found so running at large shall be impounded by the Superintendent of Police and the owner or person having possession of such animal and allowing it to run at large shall be guilty of a violation of this section. The herding or picketing of animals upon unenclosed land without the consent of the owner or person having control of such land, or in or upon any street, alley, parkway, public ground or railway lands in the City, shall be deemed running at large.

(1958 Code Sec. 5-2.)

(b) In the case of a dog or a cat, whenever such an animal is found upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, parkway or unenclosed place, it shall be deemed running at large, unless such dog or cat is firmly held on a leash or is in an enclosed vehicle.

(Ord. Unno. Passed 7-1-47; 1958 Code Sec. 5-9; Ord. Unno. Passed 9-15-75.)

616.03 CRUELTY.

No person shall be cruel to an animal in any of the following ways:

(a) By overloading, overdriving, overworking, cruelly beating, torturing, tormenting, mutilating or cruelly killing an animal, or causing or knowingly allowing the same to be done;

(b) By cruelly working an old, maimed, infirm, sick or disabled animal, or causing or knowingly allowing the same to be done;

(c) By unnecessarily failing to provide an animal in his or her charge or custody, as owner or otherwise, with proper food, drink, shelter and air;

(d) By abandoning an old, maimed, infirm, sick or disabled animal;

(e) By driving or keeping, or causing to be driven or kept, an animal in an unnecessarily cruel manner; and

(f) By carrying or keeping, or causing to be carried or kept, an animal bound or tied by its legs, bound down by the neck or so that it cannot freely stand in an upright position while being transported, or in a crate or cage so constructed as to permit such animal to push its head between the slats, wires or other openings of such crate or cage unless the space between such openings is also sufficient to permit such animal to freely withdraw its head therefrom.

616.04 KEEPING OR EXHIBITING DANGEROUS ANIMALS.

(a) No person shall own, control or keep a dangerous animal on any real property in the City, except in zoos or business enterprises legally operated in areas properly zoned for such usage, where adequate caging or safeguards shall be provided to protect the general public.

(b) No person shall conduct an exhibition or parade of wild animals without first obtaining a permit therefor from Council.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to have, keep, maintain or have in his or her possession or control within the corporate limits any dangerous animal, as defined in Section 616.01.

(Ord. 04-36. Passed 8-24-04.)

616.05 ANIMAL FIGHTS.

No person shall instigate, cause or procure any dog fight, cock fight or other public or private fighting of any animal or fowl.

(1958 Code Sec. 5-6.)

616.06 IMPOUNDMENT OF RABID ANIMALS.

Provisions shall be made in each veterinary hospital for securely impounding any animal confined for observation for rabies. Special precautions shall be taken to securely and separately confine any such animal during such period of observation, and a report shall be made to the President of the Board

of Health at the time such animal is accepted for confinement and again at the time the animal is released from the hospital. Such animal shall also be vaccinated against rabies before being released.

(1958 Code Sec. 5-8.)

616.07 DOGS AND CATS.

(a) Impounding Animals at Large; Redemption. Any dog or cat found running at large, as set forth in Section 616.02, or a dog or cat for which the annual tax has not been paid, as provided in subsection (b) hereof, shall be impounded by the Police Department. If such animal and/or dog or cat is not redeemed within five days after being impounded, it shall be disposed of in the manner prescribed by the Chief of Police. Any animal impounded may be redeemed by its owner upon payment of a fee equal to the cost per day to board and care for such animal for each day the animal has been impounded.

(b) License Tax; Tags. Every person who owns, keeps or harbors a dog or cat in the City shall register the same with the City Collector and pay to the Collector annually, or upon acquiring a dog or cat not previously registered, an annual license fee of five dollars (\$5.00) per animal.

The Collector shall not issue a license for a dog or cat until the owner or keeper thereof produces satisfactory evidence to the Collector that such dog or cat has been vaccinated against rabies by a qualified veterinarian within the preceding twelve months.

The Collector shall provide, each year to each person paying such tax, a metal tag for each dog or cat for which the license tax has been paid, such tag to be stamped with the letters "B.D.T." and the number of such license. Every person keeping or harboring a dog or cat so licensed shall maintain a collar around the neck of such dog or cat with such metal tag securely fastened thereto. Every dog or cat not bearing the tag required by this section shall be impounded by the Superintendent of Police and dealt with as provided in subsection (a) hereof, and the owner thereof shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section 616.99(b).

(c) Impoundment of Animals that Bite. The owner or person having custody of a dog or cat which bites a person shall keep such dog or cat locked up in an enclosure for a period of two weeks following the time the dog or cat has bitten the person. Such owner or person having custody shall also immediately notify the Board of Health and the Police Department of the incident and shall have the dog or cat examined by a physician or a licensed veterinarian at the commencement and termination of such two-week period. If such dog or cat dies or shows definite signs of illness during such period, the owner or person having custody of the dog or cat shall turn the dog or cat over to the Superintendent of Police so that it can be determined whether or not the dog or cat has rabies.

(d) Quarantine. The Mayor may publish a notice in a newspaper in which official notices of the City are customarily published, and, at his or her discretion, may post such notices at public places, forbidding the running at large of a specific dog or cat in the City at any period whenever in his or her opinion the public safety is in danger from such cause, unless such dog or cat is securely muzzled, or prohibiting the running at large of any dog or cat. Upon the publication of such notice, no dog or cat shall run at large in violation of such notice. A dog or cat found running at large in violation of such notice may be killed by a police officer.

(e) Number Permitted. No person shall keep or harbor, in the City, more than three dogs or cats

over two months old on any premises occupied by one family or more. Different parties living on the same premises or in the same building, or using the same premises, shall not keep or harbor thereon more than three dogs or cats.

(Adopting Ordinance)

(f) Urination and Defecation on Public and Private Property. No person, being the owner or having control of a dog or cat being walked with or without a leash, shall allow such dog or cat to urinate or defecate on any property other than that of such person. No such person shall allow such dog or cat to defecate on any property other than that of such person or on a public street, alley, ground, parkway, thoroughfare, lot or other public property, without immediately removing the defecation and cleaning the animal feces from the place of deposit and restoring such place to its condition before the defecation.

(Ord. Unno. Passed 8-22-77; Ord. 98-02. Passed 1-13-98.)

(g) Dog Runs. No person shall construct, cause to be constructed or utilize on property within the City what is commonly known as a "dog run" (or is otherwise a fenced-in structure or space within the property that restricts movement of dogs to a specific area and not the entire lot), without first obtaining necessary permits to construct the same and without first complying with the following requirements:

(1) Any such dog run or any part thereof that is constructed within three feet of a property lot line shall be constructed with a solid, non-open fence made of materials designed to protect adjoining properties from animal waste. This applies to the fence closest to the neighboring property.

(2) All fences shall be constructed under a permit and in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 1272 of the separately published Planning and Zoning Code of the City.

(3) The ground and/or floor of such dog run shall be pitched toward the property owners property and not pitched in any fashion that would allow for leakage or run-off onto neighboring property.

The construction of a dog run in conformity with the provisions of this subsection does not in any way exempt the property owner from the other provisions of this chapter, including, but not limited to, those involving proper removal of animal waste. (Ord. 92-17. Passed 3-24-92; Ord. 04-36. Passed 8-24-04.)

616.08 OFFENSIVE KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

No person shall own, keep or use any railroad car, yard, pen, place or premises in or upon which fowl, cattle or other animals are confined or kept, so as to be offensive to those residing in the vicinity or an annoyance to others.

(1958 Code Sec 22-11.)

616.09 SLAUGHTERING.

No person shall slaughter or kill cattle, hogs or sheep or keep, maintain or use any house or place in which the business of slaughtering any such animal is carried on. (1958 Code Sec. 22-13.)

616.10 BIRDS AND BIRD EGGS.

No person shall kill or wound or attempt to kill or wound, by the use of firearms, slingshots, bows and arrows, stones or otherwise, any song, plumage or game bird that is not the property of such person. No person shall take the eggs of any song, plumage or game bird within a private enclosure or on any public grounds.

(1958 Code Sec. 23-3.)

616.11 BEEKEEPING.

No person shall keep, harbor or maintain, or permit to be kept, harbored or maintained, any bees or beehives at any place or in or upon any premises or part thereof in the City. (1958 Code Sec. 22-33.)

616.12 LEGHOLD TRAPS.

No person in the City shall use or permit the use of any leghold animal trap, or similar device with spring activated jaws of the type used for the trapping of fur-bearing animals, which is capable of inflicting cruelty upon dogs, cats or other animals or which constitutes a hazard to small children.

(Ord. Unno. Passed 7-15-83.)

616.13 ABUSE OF OR INTERFERENCE WITH POLICE DOGS.

No person shall willfully or maliciously torture, torment, beat, kick, strike, mutilate, injure, disable or kill any dog used by the Police Department in the performance of functions of such Department, or interfere with or meddle with any such dog while it is being used by the Department.

(Ord. 87-06. Passed 1-27-87.)

616.14 FEEDING OF WILD OR FERAL ANIMALS OR BIRDS.

(a) Definitions. As used in this section:

(1) "Feed" means any material, including, but not limited to, bird seed, bird feed, corn or any like or similar substance which can be utilized for consumption by wild/feral animals and/or birds to provide nourishment.

(2) "Feeding" means the spreading, casting, laying, depositing or dumping of feed on any property within the City.

(3) "Person" means any natural person, association, partnership, organization or corporation.

(4) "Residential property" or "residential areas" means any property within the City which is currently zoned or used for residential purposes.

(5) "Wild/feral animals and/or birds" means any animal or bird not normally considered domesticated, including, but not limited to, the following: pigeon, vulture, sparrow, morning dove, starling or crow, and which is not currently being kept as a pet within a residence or outside in a cage.

(b) Prohibitions. Except as provided in subsection (c) hereof, no person shall feed, or cause the feeding of, any wild/feral animals and/or birds within the corporate limits of the City.

(c) Exceptions. The feeding of wild/feral animals and/or birds shall be allowed in residential areas, provided that the following conditions are complied with:

(1) All feed must be placed within a container, receptacle or feeder designed for the feeding of wild/feral animals and/or birds.

(2) The containers, receptacles or feeders used for feeding the wild/feral animals and/or birds shall be designed to limit, to the extent possible, any excess spillage of seed and shall be of a size which does not exceed two feet in length by sixteen inches in width by sixteen inches in height. Such container, receptacle and/or feeder shall be installed at least three feet off the ground.

(3) There shall be no more than two containers, receptacles or feeders used for feeding wild/feral animals and/or birds per residential lot of record. However, one additional container, receptacle or feeder shall be allowed for every 3,750 square feet of lot area beyond the minimum residential lot size of 7,500 square feet.

(4) No container, receptacle or feeder used for feeding wild/feral animals and/or birds shall be located within fifteen feet of any residential building (house, condominium, townhouse, two-flat, apartment building) other than the residential building located on the same lot as said container, receptacle or feeder, nor shall any such feeder be located within five feet of any lot line. Further, no such container, receptacle or feeder shall be erected in a required front yard, as defined in Chapter 1240 of the separately published Planning and Zoning Code of the City.

(d) Nuisance Declared. It is hereby declared to be a nuisance for any person to engage in the feeding of wild/feral animals and/or birds other than in full compliance with the provisions of this chapter.

(Ord. 91-33. Passed 8-13-91.)

666.02 PROHIBITED NOISES.

No person shall make or cause to be made loud, unnecessary or unusual noises or noises which annoy, disturb, injure or endanger the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others in the City. Actions so prohibited include, but are not necessarily limited to, the following:

(a) Horns and Signaling Devices. The sounding of any horn or signaling device on an automobile, motorcycle, bus or other vehicle on a street or public place of the City, except as a danger warning; the creation, by means of any such signaling device, of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound; the sounding of any such device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time; the use of any horn, whistle or other device operated by engine exhaust; and the use of any such signaling device when traffic is for any reason held up;

(b) Radios, Musical Instruments and Phonographs. The playing, use or operation, of a radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, tape cassette player, stereo, boom box or kicker box, radio and/or tape cassette player, or other machine or device, either in a stationary position, in a vehicle or hand held, which is capable of producing or reproducing sound or receiving broadcast sound in such a manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants, or at any time with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing for the persons that are in the room, area, vehicle or chamber in which such set, instrument, machine or device is operated and who are voluntary listeners thereto;

(c) Shouting and Singing. Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling or singing on the public streets, particularly between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. of the next day, or at any other time or place, so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in the vicinity;

(d) Animals. The keeping of a bird or other animal which, by causing frequent or long continued noise, disturbs the comfort or repose of persons in the vicinity;

ORDINANCE NO. _____

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TRAFFIC CODE OF THE CITY OF BERWYN REGARDING PARKING RESTRICTIONS ON 16TH STREET

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time;

WHEREAS, the City Council has further decided to amend the Code to provide for restricted parking on 16th Street between certain hours;

WHEREAS, the City Council is attempting to provide adequate parking for local businesses;

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS:

SECTION ONE.

Section 480.07 of the Traffic Code shall read as follows: (**Additions are bolded and double underlined**, deletions are struck through):

480.07 LIMITED PARKING

(a) Wesley Avenue from 16th Street south to the southern property line of the North Berwyn Park District Community Center shall be designated "15-Minute Parking" from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

(b) Parking on the south side of Windsor Avenue, from the east corner of Home Avenue to the west corner of Oak Park Avenue shall be designated two (2) hour parking. This restriction shall apply only from the hours of 7:00a.m. to 5:00p.m., Monday through, and including, Friday.

(c) Two parking spots on the north side of 16th Street and directly west of Wisconsin Avenue shall be designated as "30 Minute Parking" from the hours of 12:00 p.m. to 5:00p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of each week.

SECTION TWO.

All ordinances or parts in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict herewith. The repeal of any such ordinances or parts of ordinances shall, however, not abate, or in any other manner be

considered by a court to affect any prosecution previously commenced or presently pending under the Codified Ordinances of Berwyn, Illinois, 1984, as previously amended.

SECTION THREE.

- a. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn that the several provisions of this ordinance are separable.
- b. If any court of competent jurisdiction should adjudge any provisions or part thereof of this ordinance to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect any other provision or part thereof of this ordinance including other parts of the provision declared invalid with are not specifically declared to be invalid in such judgment.

SECTION FOUR.

This ordinance shall become and be effective upon its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet in the manner prescribed by law.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL LOCAL ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT
AGREEMENT**

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into this ____ day of August, 2007, by and between the City of Berwyn, an Illinois home rule municipal corporation (the "City"), and the Berwyn Park District (the "District"), organized and operating in conformance with the provisions of the Illinois Park District Act (70 ILCS 1205-1, et seq.) (the "Acts").

RECITALS

A. Chapter 70, Section 1205/8-1(d) of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 2005, as revised grants to the Berwyn Park District (the "District") the power to establish by ordinance all rules and regulations necessary for the government and protection of parks, boulevards, driveways and other property under the jurisdiction of the District; and

B. Chapter 70, Section 1205/8-1(d) of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 2005, as revised grants to the District the power to impose such fines and penalties for violation of ordinances as it shall deem proper, provided such fines do not exceed \$1000.00 for any one offense.

C. Pursuant to this authority, the City and District have passed, from time to time, various Ordinances relating to the control of the conduct of all persons and patrons under the jurisdiction of the District and areas adjacent whether under District or City jurisdiction.

D. The District wishes to limit the use of its parks and areas adjacent and to control the conduct of persons, and patrons of the parks under its jurisdiction and areas adjacent.

E. Pursuant to Berwyn Park District Ordinance No., O-07-02, Certified Police Officers of the City of Berwyn are authorized to police these parks and issue citations to persons for violations of these ordinances.

F. The District, from time to time employs off-duty certified law enforcement officers on a part-time bases for purposes of law enforcement within the District's parks.

G. The City has an established local ordinance prosecution system wherein City attorneys and law enforcement officers, if requested, appear in court on regularly scheduled days for purposes of prosecuting citations and other charges issued.

H. Chapter 5, Section 220/3 of the Intergovernmental Cooperative Act, (5 ILCS 220-1, et seq.), , as revised, allows units of local government to enter into agreements for the purpose of exercising joint authority.

I. Article VII, Section 10, of the Illinois Constitution provides that units of local government may contract among themselves to obtain or share services, to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance, and use their

revenues to pay costs related to intergovernmental activities. Additionally, the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act provides that one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more other public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform.

J. The District requested the City to prosecute on the District's behalf citations for ordinance violations issued by District law enforcement officials in the District parks and areas adjacent thereto, on the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

K. After due consideration, the City is agreeable to the District's request, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the mutual promises and considerations set forth herein, the terms and conditions hereof, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made part of this Agreement as though fully set forth in this Section 1.

Section 2. Administrative Adjudication. The City agrees that citations issued by certified law enforcement officers of the District and/or the City for offenses committed within the District's parks shall be prosecuted as part of the City's local ordinance and administrative adjudication systems, and the City Prosecutor for the City of Berwyn shall act as the District's prosecutor when the matters of the ordinance violations are presented in court.

Section 3. Compensation. The Parties agree that 50% of the net amount of all fines collected by the District pursuant to this agreement for all citations issued and prosecuted by the City of Berwyn for City or District ordinance violations taking place within the District's parks shall be promptly paid from the District's treasury to the City as compensation for its services pursuant to the aforesaid intergovernmental agreement. All fines collected are subject to reasonable administrative fees as agreed to by the parties before dispersing funds to either party. The "net" amount of fines collected shall be the amount remaining after deductions or payment of fees and costs.

Section 4. Administrators of this Agreement. The respective administrators of the District and the City are hereby authorized by each of their respective governing boards to coordinate and perform such activities as are necessary to implement and maintain this Agreement.

Section 5. Termination. This Agreement shall terminate upon delivery of not less than 180 days written notice by either party.

Section 6. Entire Agreement. This Agreement sets forth all of the promises, agreements, conditions and understandings between the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement, and there are no promises, agreements, conditions and understandings, either oral or written, other than the contents of this Agreement.

Section 7. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit the City and the District, and their respective legal representatives and successors.

Section 8. Partial Invalidity. The clauses, provisions and sections of this Agreement are deemed by the parties to be separable and the invalidity of any portion of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

Section 9. Notices. All notices and demands required hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given or made when delivered personally, with proof of delivery thereof, or when mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or by facsimile transmission followed on the same date as the facsimile by mailing, addressed as follows:

**AGREEMENT FOR REGULATION OF PARKING
OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC AT THE CERMAK PLAZA SHOPPING
CENTER IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

This Agreement, made and entered into this ____ day of September, 2007, by and between the City of Berwyn, a home-rule municipal corporation of the State of Illinois (hereinafter called the "City") and CERMAK PLAZA ASSOCIATES, a New York Partnership, (hereinafter called "Owner).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CERMAK PLAZA ASSOCIATES, a New York Partnership, is the owner of a Shopping Center which controls a parking area located within the limits of the City, which has been the subject of an Agreement with the City since 1987 for the purpose of providing police patrols and ordinance enforcement; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement between the parties has been mutually beneficial resulting in greater police protection and a safer commercial area for employees and customers; and,

WHEREAS, the parties desire to continue to enjoy the benefits of the previous agreement between the Owner and City and wish to reaffirm the terms, provisions and conditions of the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The City hereby agrees to enforce local ordinances related to vehicles and parking, including the following regulations within the Shopping Center:
 - A. The maximum speed limit for any vehicle shall be ten (10) miles per hour.

- B. Stop signs shall be posted at all exits and the driver of a vehicle emerging from the Shopping Center shall stop such vehicle immediately prior to driving onto a sidewalk or street, and shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian as may be necessary to avoid collision, and upon entering the street or roadway shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on said street or roadway;
- C. The stopping, standing or parking of any motor vehicle on the roadway or driveway which lies directly in front of the stores located within the shopping center in excess of fifteen (15) minutes, shall be prohibited.
- D. The prohibition of parking by vehicles not driven by, or used by, handicapped persons, in parking spaces designated only for use by the handicapped.
- E. The stopping, standing, or parking of any motor vehicle which is not driven by or used by an employee or customer of Cermak Plaza within the shopping center during the hours of 12:00 A.M. to 6:00 A.M. shall be prohibited, except that any motor vehicle having a decal or sticker issued by the owner shall not be subject to this restriction, nor shall this restriction apply to customers of the Walgreens store.
- F. The removal and storage of any vehicle parked within the Shopping Center which is left unattended for a period of seven (7) days or which is left unattended anywhere in the area covered by this Agreement in such a manner as to constitute an obstruction to traffic or where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited. The City shall remove such vehicle to the municipal storage area and shall retain it until a charge is made for the removal and storage in accordance with ordinance provisions.

- G. The prohibition of parking of vehicles not driven by or used by employees or customers of Cermak Plaza.
 - H. The prohibition of dumping upon the premises covered herein.
 - I. Ordinances related to vehicle impoundment for various municipal violations.
2. The Owner does hereby agree to erect signs relating to the aforesaid regulations at appropriate places within the shopping center.
 3. The Owner does hereby agree to bear the costs and expenses of obtaining, erecting and maintaining any and all signs necessary to the enforcement of the aforesaid regulations.
 4. The Owner further agrees to make available at its own expense, a distinctive decal or sticker for the use of its employees and other authorized personnel, such decal or sticker to be placed on the automobile of said persons for identification purposes.
 5. The City hereby agrees to regulate the parking of automobiles and the traffic at the said shopping center to enforce the aforesaid regulations.
 6. Where any owner or user of a vehicle shall use or permit the use of a vehicle in any manner contrary to the regulations contained within this agreement, the City will enforce its ordinances against such person as if the action had taken place on a public highway.
 7. It is mutually agreed that this agreement shall cover a period of one (1) year from the date hereof and shall be self renewing for periods of one (1) year each thereafter, not to exceed a period of 20 years, unless and until cancelled by not than thirty (30) days written notice by either party to the other of its intention to cancel same, in which case, the agreement shall terminate on the first day of January in the year next following the filing of the cancellation notice.

9. The Owner hereby agrees to release and hold harmless and defend (including the payment of all costs and attorneys fees) the City, its officers and agents, in connection with any and all actions or claims for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this agreement and shall procure insurance to protect, save harmless and indemnify the City pursuant thereto. Such insurance shall be in the minimum amount of One Million (\$1,000,000.00) Dollars and name the City as certificate holder.
10. The provisions of this Agreement shall be interpreted whenever possible to sustain their legality and enforceability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, in whole or in part, neither the validity of the remaining part of such provision, nor the validity of any other provisions of this Agreement, shall be in any way affected thereby.
11. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the parties, and there are no other understandings or agreements, oral or written, between the parties.



Re: Proposed Changes to Emergency Snow Route Procedures

Current Emergency Snow Route Procedure

Current City of Berwyn Snow and Ice Control procedures allow for parking on each side of the street until snow fall exceeds six inches. Once the six inches is reached a siren is to be sounded (between 8:00 am and 10:00 pm) warning all there is to be absolutely no parking on snow routes until all snow is cleared. The only streets not considered snow routes are Maple, Wisconsin to Grove, Euclid to Clarence, Scoville to Elmwood, Cuyler to Lombard, and parts of 26th, 30th, and 33rd Street, as well as 26-28th Place, Fair Field and Sinclair There is no parking on these roads from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm on an odd/even format. Any vehicle found parked in the restricted areas are to be ticketed \$50 and towed from the area. The tow charge is currently \$125 with a \$25 per day storage charge.

January, 1988 was the last time this system was utilized. There are numerous stories of disgruntled motorists, lost and abandoned vehicles, as well as a lack of alternative parking spaces and tow storage areas. In addition, most current residents do not know or understand this policy due to its lack of implementation in almost ten years

Effect of Current Policy

The current snow route procedure makes it very difficult for the city to quickly address snow and ice conditions below 6 inches. Cars remain parked on the both sides of the streets hampering plowing efforts and increasing the likelihood of accidents and significantly increasing the completion time for storm cleanup.

The City of Berwyn utilizes the following priority list for storm and ice control:

1. Major Snow Routes
2. Train Stations (3)
3. North/South Streets
4. East/West Streets
5. Commercial Zones and Parking Areas
6. Service Alleys
7. School Crossings
8. Bus Shelters
9. Snow Removal in Commercial Zones and Parking Areas
10. Alleys/Handicap Spaces

Under the current system, yearly street sweeping parking restrictions are enforced meaning streets are not completely cleared for at least one week following a normal storm event.

RECOMMENDED CHANGES:

Following is a series of recommendations that would help ease some of the confusion of the snow and ice control process as well as allow for the quicker and more complete cleanup after a winter storm:

Modified Streets Designated as Snow Routes

Under this change only Harlem, Roosevelt, Riverside Drive, Ogden, Windsor, Stanley, Oak Park, East Ave, Ridgeland, 16th Street, Cermak, 26th, 31st, 34th Streets and Pershing Road would be declared Snow Emergency Routes preventing parking on both sides during a Snow Emergency. All other streets would allow parking on the odd/even format. This would allow for safe transportation of vehicles throughout the City while providing for the orderly relocation of vehicles. Vacin Parkway as well as Baseball Alley could be used for spillover storage for towed vehicles.

Alternative Snowfall Level Policy

The City of Berwyn can modify its policy by implementing a Snow Emergency when snowfall exceeds two inches. This modification will result in an average of 6-10 Snow Emergencies each winter. Storm cleanup would be quicker; revenues from fines would greatly increase, as well as inconvenience to motorists

Increased Public Education

No matter whether any policy modifications are implemented, there needs to be a significant increase in the education of the public and governmental officials as to what the actual policy contains. This means coordination between the Police, Public Works, and Administration Departments and the selected towing companies. Rules and procedures should be published in the Berwyn Banner, Neighborhood Watch Bulletin, and all local media outlets along with strategic placement in all public offices.

CONCLUSION

Major snowfalls of 6 inches or more do not often strike the City of Berwyn. When these major storms hit, they present unique challenges to City and its residents. Any changes to the policies and procedures will require changes to

- Departmental policies
- Signage
- Ordinances
- Informational literature
- Designated parking and staging areas

Staff looks to the City Council for guidance on how to good forward with enacting possible changes to the Snow Emergency Policy and procedure.
