BERWYN CITY COUNCIL
FEBRUARY 12, 2008

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:02 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the safety of our armed forces, police, firefighters, paramedics, and for the officials and officers injured or killed in the Kirkwood, Missouri Council incident.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. There being no speakers, the Open Forum was declared closed.
4. The minutes of the regular Berwyn City Council and the Committee of the Whole meetings held on January 22, 2008 were submitted. Thereafter, Alderman Day made a motion to reconsider his vote on item #8 of the Council minutes to change his vote from Nay to Aye, the motion was seconded by Erickson and carried by the following roll call: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson. Thereafter, discussion ensued how this affected the ordinance entitled: "The Indemnification of Officers and Employees" that was referred to the Committee of the Whole at the January 8, 2008 City Council meeting. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to approve the Council minutes as amended and the Committee of the Whole minutes of January 22, 2008. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.
5. A motion by Chapman, seconded by Erickson, to suspend the rules and bring forth item J-10. The motion carried. J-10 is an ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BERWYN CODE TO RESTORE THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT FIRE CHIEF IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to concur and **adopt** as amended and to further amend on face to change "Director of

Computer Operations" to "Director of Information Technology" and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

6. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to suspend the rules and bring forth items F-1, F-2, and F-3. The motion carried. F-1 is a communication from the Mayor regarding the appointment of Deputy Chief Dennis O'Halloran to the position of Fire Chief effective March 12, 2008. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Lovero, to concur and approve the appointment as submitted and to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the oath of office and the Mayor welcomed the new Fire Chief.
7. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the appointment of Deputy Chief Frank Simek to the position of Assistant Fire Chief effective March 12, 2008. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Ramos to concur and approve the appointment as submitted and accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the oath of office and the Mayor welcomed the new Assistant Fire Chief.
8. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the appointment of Lieutenant Richard Swade to the position of Deputy Fire Chief effective February 18, 2008. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur and approve as submitted and to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the oath of office and the Mayor welcomed the new Deputy Fire Chief.
9. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the 16th Street firehouse bids with a recommendation from our Fire Department and Wold Architects to award the bid to American Demolition Corporation in the amount of \$79,800. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
10. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Ogden Avenue Light Pole signage hardware with the recommendation to approve \$8,650 for twenty-five (25) light pole brackets. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Weiner, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

11. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding a TIF application for Martin Jamine, 2138 Highland Avenue for a maximum of 50% of the construction cost in the amount of \$36,529.50. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote with Erickson abstaining.
12. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication requesting approval for the 2008 annual events. Thereafter, Mayor O'Connor questioned the Depot District Oktoberfest and the hours of operation and submitted a letter from the Condo Association, 3303 Grove. Thereafter, Chapman reported that two representative from the Depot District met with the Condo Association this evening and stated that the Association had no problems with Oktoberfest and questioned why the Mayor is questioning city services from the police, fire, and public works to support. After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Lovero, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
13. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the City Attorney Appointment of the law firm of Odelson & Sterk after accepting the resignation of our former attorney Bruce Bonebrake. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by the following roll call: Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Lovero. Nays: Phelan, Erickson. Present: Chapman. During the call of the roll, Chapman questioned replacing Odelson & Sterk with Bruce Bonebrake and requested a cost analysis of having Bruce Bonebrake as City Attorney. Lovero requested same.
14. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the appointment of Nora Laureto to the Community Relations Commission for a three year term expiring October 11, 2010. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
15. The Mayor submitted a request to hire a Foreclosure Clerk. Thereafter, Weiner made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to defer and refer the matter to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried by a voice vote.
16. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the proposed ordinance amendment for the Indemnification of Officers and Employees. Thereafter, the Mayor presented a cost analysis in the amount of \$742.50 for legal fees paid to the law firm of Odelson & Sterk for the creation of the ordinance. After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to

withdraw the communication. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson. Nay: Ramos.

17. A deferred communication from the City Clerk regarding the approval of closed Committee of the Whole minutes of October 23, 2007, November 13, 2007, December 11, 2007, and December 18, 2007 as reviewed in close session. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded Erickson, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
18. A deferred communication from the City Clerk regarding the approval of closed Committee of the Whole minutes of January 7, 2008 and January 8, 2008. Ramos made a motion, seconded by Erickson, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote with Phelan abstaining.





1. The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 7:15 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson. Absent: none.
2. Redevelopment Agreement-Superblock-The Mayor recognized Joe Montana of Odelson & Sterk along with the developer. Montana reviewed the Ordinance, the Certificate of Notice, the actual Redevelopment Agreement and stated that the developer has agreed to all of the amendments. Montana gave a brief summary of the agreement and the developer stated that this will be a retail and condo project with a parking garage. Montana stated that the city has the final word on what retailers are accepted and that all is detailed in the agreement along with the time line for City Council approval. Montana explained that the development will be in two phases, 1st the redevelopment of the bank building and 2nd the mixed use development and stated that the developer has to provide escrow. Alderman Lovero questioned the time line. Montana stated that by April 1, 2008, the site plan has to be submitted for City Council review and approval and that the City Council has 30 days to reply. On June 1, 2008 the developer must identify the bank tenant followed by the outline for construction plans, and all finalized by the end of 2008 with the Bank Project proceeding with this construction season and the Mixed Use with the 2009 construction season. Lovero questioned the developer as to when the bank tenant would be up open for business, answer, Spring of 2009.
3. The 2008 proposed Budget-The Mayor recognized Stephanie Walker who was available for any more questions. Walker stated that this is a positive budget of \$14,000 not a deficit budget. The Mayor asked for a consensus on the proposal of four (4) additional items to the budget, see attached, page 8.
 1. Added 2 sergeants, 2 replacement officers, 1 in January and 1 in July including benefits at \$134,685. Consensus 8-0 in favor
 2. Additional raises for Telecommunicators including benefits totaling \$153,147 Consensus-7-1 in favor with Ramos against
 3. Proposed \$5.00 increase for automobile stickers-generated revenue totaling \$156,000. After discussion, a consensus was taken with Weiner, Skryd, Day, Lovero, O'Connor in favor. Chapman, Ramos, Phelan, Erickson against. Consensus 5-4 in favor


4. City Administrative position, including benefits totaling \$176,250. Consensus taken to remove from the budget 7-0 in favor with Chapman voicing a no vote. The Mayor asked each alderman, if there were any other questions or comments regarding the amendments to the budget. Chapman, no comment. Walker questioned if these should go back to the city at the end of the alderman term. Discussion ensued regarding questioning major purchases at the end of the individual's term.





Re: Smoke Free Illinois

On January 1, 2008 Illinois became a Smoke Free state. The statute states that:

"Smoking in public places, places of employment, and governmental vehicles prohibited. No person shall smoke in a public place or in any place of employment or within 15 feet of any entrance to a public place or place of employment. No person may smoke in any vehicle owned, leased or operated by this State or a political subdivision of the State."

The statute goes on to define Public Places. Some of the public places where smoking is prohibited are: offices, restaurants, enclosed or partially enclosed sports arenas, meeting rooms, private clubs, all government owned vehicles and facilities, including buildings and vehicles owned, leased, or operated by this State or State subcontract, enclosed shopping centers, public hearing facilities, lobbies, bars, taverns, bowling alleys, etc. The full list is provided in 410 ILCS 82/10. The statute also lists exempted areas where smoking is allowed. A general description of these areas are private residences, retail tobacco stores, private and semi-private rooms in nursing homes and hotel/motel rooms. However there are specific limitations for each of these areas described in depth in the statute. 410 ILCS 82/35


This statute specifically limits home rule powers. Therefore, a municipality may be more restrictive in their determination and enforcement of non smoking areas but may not be less restrictive than what the Act allows. The Act also specifically allows a municipality to designate a non-enclosed area of a public place, including outdoor areas, as non smoking as long as signs are posted.

This Act may be adopted and enforced through local ordinance. If adopted as a local ordinance, the municipality may choose to prosecute these violations either through the circuit court or administrative adjudication. If the violations are handled in circuit court the fine collected will be split between the State Department of Public Health and the law enforcement agency that wrote the violation. If, however, the violations are handled in house through the administrative adjudication process, the local law enforcement agency will then keep the entire fine collected. We recommend adopting an ordinance which allows smoking violations to be handled in the municipal adjudication process.


Dear Editor:



An open letter to the citizens of Berwyn:

On behalf of the Illinois Municipal Police Association, Berwyn Local # 1, we would like to set the record straight in reference to the recent media attention over the arrest of former police dispatcher, John Flynn. Some information contained the Berwyn Life article was misleading and inaccurately brought the integrity of Berwyn Police officers into question. Therefore, the Illinois Municipal Police Association is issuing the following statement:

Following a comprehensive investigation, the sworn members of the Berwyn Police Department discovered and arrested a dispatcher who had violated the public trust by releasing protected information to sources within the criminal element. The arrestee, John Flynn, was NOT a Berwyn Police officer and he was charged for violations related to his short-term capacity as a dispatcher for the City of Berwyn. Furthermore, there are no part time sworn police officers with the Berwyn Police Department.

The integrity of the Berwyn Police Department is of paramount importance to the officers who wear its uniform. Several Berwyn Police investigators worked tirelessly to bring Flynn to justice and have unfairly been discredited by media reports that falsely classify Flynn as a part time police officer. Flynn was a civilian dispatcher that acted alone and his behavior in no way reflects a pattern or culture of misconduct within the organization. The fact that the sworn members of the Berwyn Police Department went to great length to secure criminal charges against Flynn is a testament to their resolve in ensuring that their civilian support staff members share the same integrity.

For some reason, the press unfairly uses the insinuation of police corruption to aid in its quest to boost circulation. However, the citizens of Berwyn can rest assured that John Flynn was never a police officer. We at the Illinois Municipal Police Association encourage the editor at Liberty Suburban Life Newspapers to conduct more responsible journalism and forward accurate information to those who expect the media to publish the truth.



**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART 6 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES
OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS ESTABLISHING

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the “*City*”) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “*Home Rule Powers*”); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) find that it is reasonable and necessary to prohibit nuisances within the corporate boundaries of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that clothing donation containers located within the City are unattended and not adequately monitored or maintained, and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that due to the failure to maintain clothing donation containers, clothing is being placed on private and public property and is frequently scattered by wind and weather; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities declare that the scattering of materials is unsightly, potentially hazardous to pedestrian and vehicular traffic, offensive to the senses, detrimental to public health and therefore a public nuisance; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of residents of the City to establish regulations and restrictions for the use and placement of clothing donation containers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. Part 6 “General Offenses Code” of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn is hereby amended by adding the following new Chapter to read, as follows.

CHAPTER 674 CLOTHING DONATION CONTAINER REGULATIONS

674.01 Definitions.

The term “Clothing Donation Container” shall mean any box, bin, trailer, vehicle, structure or other receptacle that is intended for use as a collection point for donated clothing or other household materials at times when no employee or representative of the sponsoring company or organization is present to accept donations.

674.02 Requirements; Maintenance.

- a. The organization or company benefitting from the Clothing Donation Container or the host site on whose property the Clothing Donation Container is situated, must indicate the following information on the Clothing Donation Container. name of organization or company, address, contact telephone number.
- b. All signage on the Clothing Donation Container shall be in compliance with all requirements contained in the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn.
- c. The Clothing Donation Container shall be painted and in good condition and appearance, with no structural damage, no holes in the receptacle that would allow leaks, no visible rust and free of graffiti or advertising other than the name of the host site or organization or company benefitting from the Clothing Donation Container.
- d. The Clothing Donation Container may only be used as a collection receptacle for clothing. The collection or storage of clothing outside of the Clothing Donation Container and the collection or storage around the Clothing Donation Container of bulk materials, including appliances, mattresses or furniture, is prohibited.

674.03 Permit Requirement.

Before placement of a Clothing Donation Container occurs as permitted in this chapter, a permit shall first be obtained from the City. Any applicant for a permit pursuant to this section shall complete an application on a form to be determined by the City. The fee for said permit shall be One Hundred Dollars and no/100 (\$100.00). The permit shall be renewed on a yearly basis.

674.04 Enforcement.

- a The organization or company benefitting from the Clothing Donation Container will be held primarily responsible for the maintenance, upkeep and servicing of the Clothing Donation Container. However, in the event the organization fails to adequately maintain and service the Clothing Donation Container, the business owner, or host site, on whose property the Clothing Donation Container is placed shall also be responsible.
- b Failure to properly maintain, upkeep or service the Clothing Donation Container shall result in a fine pursuant to the penalty provision contained in this chapter.

674.05 Relationship to Other Laws.

Nothing in this chapter shall be deemed to limit the City in any way to use any or all other means available to remove the nuisance, or summarily eliminate immediate hazards to the public health, safety or welfare as granted in any ordinances of the City of Berwyn or the laws or Constitution of the State of Illinois.

674.99 Penalty.

Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, any person, firm or corporation violating any section of this chapter shall be fined not more than Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars and no/100 (\$250.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

SMOKE-FREE WORKPLACE POLICY

The City of Berwyn is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace and to promoting the health and well-being of its employees. To that end, and to comply with the State of Illinois Public Act 095-0017, the following policy has been adopted and shall apply to all city employees, contractors, visitors and temporary employees:

POLICY

No person shall smoke on any city property or in any city-owned vehicle. ~~that transports the general public.~~ Smoking is prohibited in any city owned building and restricted to farther than 15 feet away from any entrance, exit, windows that open, and ventilation intakes that serve an enclosed area where smoking is prohibited so as to ensure that tobacco smoke does not enter the area through entrances, exits, open windows or other means.

Smoking means the carrying, smoking, burning, inhaling or exhaling of any kind of lighted pipe, cigar, cigarette or any other lighted smoking equipment.

Smoking by employees will be designated by location as follows:

City Hall – Rear entrance of building only, 15 feet from any entrance or window

Police Dept. – Rear of building 15 feet from Northeast entrance only. ~~Smoking in all police vehicles is prohibited.~~

Fire Stations – Rear entrance of all locations, 15 feet from entrance and all windows. ~~Smoking in all fire department vehicles is prohibited.~~

Recreation Center – Smoking is allowed only in non-public entrances 15 feet from those entrances. ~~Smoking in city-owned vehicles is prohibited.~~

Public Works – Rear entrance of public works building 15 feet from rear entrance. Smoking in the garage is prohibited.

Library – 15 feet from Harlem avenue entrance only.

16th Street / Cultural/Senior Center/CDBG- 15 feet from rear entrance (Elmwood & 16th)

Any employee who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.

Any employee complaints about the application of this policy should be brought to the attention of the Human Resources Director.

I have read and fully understand the terms of this policy.

I understand that any violations of this smoking policy may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.

I understand that the City reserves the right to make changes to this policy as may be required.



We are very happy to report that the city's new Historic Preservation Commission has begun to move forward on several projects dedicated to preservation issues in Berwyn. We are very excited about the future of the Commission and we are looking forward to working with the Mayor's Office and City Council on projects that we hope will benefit all Berwyn residents and business owners.

A key goal of the Commission is to identify and ensure the protection of Berwyn's historic landmark properties and districts. This process is underway, and we expect to act soon on nominating some well-known local landmarks for approval by the City Council. The process of identifying additional landmark properties will continue in the coming years, as we are just beginning to gain an understanding of the historically-valuable structures and architecture in the City. In fact, the Commission has recently learned that Berwyn may be home to a number of previously-unrecognized historic properties by noted architects. Much exciting work is to come.

Given the current lack of research into Berwyn's historic properties, we would like to propose that the Commission be allowed to review and comment on all demolition permit applications filed in the City. We understand that currently, the City Council must approve the demolition of any building that is not a garage or outbuilding, and we would like to be part of that process. We therefore ask that the Building Director route all demolition permit applications to the Commission within five days of their filing, so that we may provide our input before the applications are considered by the City Council.

Dear Mayor O'Connor and Members of the City Council.

In September 2007, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission met with Berwyn Fire Chief Richard Kalivoda and Richard Schroepfer of Wold Architects to review the design for the new 16th Street Fire Station. We then provided feedback regarding the design to your office and to the City Council. We made several suggestions, including the following:

- Scale and set-backs: the building as presented was significantly larger and closer to the street than the existing fire station. We suggested reconsidering the scale and varying the set-backs to make the new building more compatible with its surroundings.
- Re-Use of Materials: we suggested that historic materials from the original firehouse be more integrated with the building itself, rather than being used as decorative elements. We also noted that the white glazed brick inside the building should be salvaged and could be used as accents on the south elevation and numerous other locations.
- Exterior Materials: we suggested that masonry be used as much as possible in the construction of the new building, rather than extensive use of EIFS/Dryvit.
- Image/Spirit/Character: we suggested that landscaping, street furniture, and lighting all play a vital role in establishing a connection with the surrounding neighborhood and noted that the drawings presented did not address these issues.

We now understand that revisions have been made to the design, the project has gone out to bid, and a contractor has been selected. We would like to review the amended plans and ask that the new plans be submitted to the Commission as soon as possible so that we can provide additional feedback as necessary. 

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2008 (the "Effective Date") by and between Morton College, an Illinois Community College District, ("Morton") and the City of Berwyn, an Illinois Municipal Corporation, (the "City") (collectively, Morton and the City may, for convenience only, be hereinafter referred to as the "Parties" and each individually as a "Party").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.*) (the "Act") authorizes public agencies, which includes units of local government and public community college districts, to jointly enjoy and/or exercise powers, privileges, functions or authority with other public agencies, except where specifically and expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes public agencies to enter into intergovernmental agreements with other public agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of certain limestone that bears the words "Berwyn Trust & Savings Bank" or similar inscriptions on it (the "Limestone"); and

WHEREAS, the City has no need for the Limestone, which is currently taking up space in the City's public works yard; and

WHEREAS, Morton desires to place the Limestone on an exterior wall or walls of a building or buildings located on Morton's campus; and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to loan the Limestone to Morton and Morton desires to borrow the Limestone from the City based on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the City and Morton have concluded that it is in the best interest of the Parties to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

1. LOAN OF THE LIMESTONE: The City desires and agrees to load the Limestone onto a truck provided by Morton and to loan the Limestone to Morton on the terms and conditions set forth herein. In consideration of the City loaning Morton the Limestone, Morton agrees, at its sole cost and expense, to haul the Limestone from the City's public works yard and to install the Limestone on a

building or buildings located on Morton's campus. Morton will use necessary care in claiming, hauling and installing the Limestone, however, should the Limestone get damaged for any reason, the City acknowledges that there shall be no liability to Morton. The City shall loan the Limestone to Morton, free of charge, for twenty-five (25) calendar years. Twenty-five (25) calendar years from the Effective Date of this Agreement, if the City has not otherwise reclaimed the Limestone as set forth in Section 2 hereof, ownership of and title to the Limestone shall pass to and vest with Morton.

2. RECLAIMING THE LIMESTONE: The City may, at its sole cost and expense, reclaim the Limestone pursuant to the conditions set forth in this Section. Should the City desire to reclaim the Limestone, it shall provide Morton with at least ninety (90) calendar days written notice of its intent to reclaim the Limestone and its reasoning for the same; provided, however, that if the Limestone is not reclaimed within twenty-five (25) calendar years from the Effective Date of this Agreement, ownership of the Limestone shall have passed to and vested with Morton and Morton shall be entitled to retain the Limestone. If the City provides the required notice, the City may, at its sole cost and expense, remove the Limestone from Morton's building(s). Removal of the Limestone shall be completed at a mutually agreed upon time and shall be conducted in such a manner so as to minimize any disruption to Morton's property and business operations and any damage to Morton's property. Should any damage be done to Morton's property, including to the building(s) where the Limestone was installed, the City, at its sole cost and expense, shall restore the same to the condition that it was in prior to the installation of the Limestone or as near as possible.

The City acknowledges that the Limestone will be hauled and installed on an exterior wall or walls of a building or buildings located on Morton's campus. As such, the City agrees that if it decides to reclaim the Limestone, the Limestone will be returned to the City in a condition reflecting the fact that it has been hauled and its placement in an exterior wall or walls, which condition shall include normal wear and tear and possible damage from the elements and acid rain. In addition to the foregoing, the City acknowledges that Morton is not responsible for taking any steps to ensure the upkeep or maintenance of the Limestone.

3. INDEMNIFICATION: To the fullest extent permitted by law, Morton shall indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless the City and its past and present officials (whether elected or appointed), trustees, directors, agents, officers, representatives, attorneys, independent contractors, employees, successors or predecessors and any other party in any way associated with the City from and against any and all claims, losses, obligations, liens, encumbrances, demands, liabilities, penalties, causes of action, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, orders, judgments, fines, forfeitures, amounts paid in settlement,

reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs), deaths, injuries and damages (whether actual or punitive) (collectively, "Claims") proximately occurring or alleged to have occurred in whole or in part in connection with the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Morton or Morton's President, trustees, directors, officers, administrators, faculty, staff, employees, independent contractors, attorneys, agents or representatives stemming from Morton hauling or installing the Limestone.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the City shall indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless Morton and its past, present or future Presidents, trustees, directors, officers, administrators, faculty, staff, employees, independent contractors, attorneys, agents or representatives and any other party in any way associated with Morton from and against any and all Claims proximately occurring or alleged to have occurred in whole or in part in connection with the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the City or the City's officials (whether elected or appointed), trustees, directors, agents, officers, representatives, attorneys, independent contractors, employees, successors or predecessors and any other party in any way associated with the City and stemming from the City's loan of the Limestone to Morton and the City's removal of the same.

4. RECITALS: The abovementioned recitals constituting the preambles to this Agreement are full, true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if fully restated herein.
5. NOTICES: Any notice, request, demand or other communication, provided for by this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly received upon: (a) actual receipt if personally delivered and the sender received written confirmation of personal delivery; (b) receipt as indicated by the written or electronic verification of delivery when delivered by overnight courier; (c) receipt as indicated by the electronic transmission confirmation when sent via telecopy or facsimile transmission; (d) three (3) calendar days after the sender posts notice with the U.S. Post Office when sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested; or (e) when delivery is refused. Notice shall be sent to the addresses set forth below, or to such other address as either Party may specify in writing.

6. SEVERANCE: The provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed severable, and the invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more of the provisions hereof shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the other provisions hereof. Provided, however, that if permitted by applicable law, any invalid, illegal or unenforceable

provision may be considered in determining the intent of the Parties with respect to the provisions of this Agreement.

7. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding by and between the Parties. No representations, promises, agreements or understandings, written or oral, not herein contained shall be of any force or effect.
8. MODIFICATION: No provision of this Agreement may be modified, waived or discharged unless such waiver, modification or discharge is agreed to in writing and signed by each Party or an authorized representative thereof. No waiver by either Party regarding any breach of a condition or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of similar or dissimilar provisions or conditions of this Agreement. No agreement or representations, oral or otherwise, expressed or implied, with respect to the subject matter hereof have been made by either Party which are not expressly set forth in this Agreement.
9. HEADINGS: The headings used herein form no substantive part of this Agreement, are for the convenience of the Parties only, and shall not be used to define, enlarge or limit any term of this Agreement.
10. CONSTRUCTION AND GOVERNING LAW: Construction and interpretation of this Agreement shall at all times and in all respects be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to its conflicts of laws principles. The Parties acknowledge that they have had an opportunity to review and revise this Agreement and have it reviewed by legal counsel, if desired, and, therefore, the normal rules of construction, to the extent that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting Party, shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement. Neither Party, by entering into this Agreement, waives any immunity provided by local, state or federal law.
11. RIGHT TO COUNSEL: The Parties acknowledges that they were informed that they have the right to consult with an attorney before signing this Agreement and that this paragraph shall constitute written notice of the right to be advised by legal counsel. Additionally, the Parties acknowledge that they had an opportunity to and did negotiate over the terms of this Agreement. The Parties acknowledge that they have been given a reasonable time to consider and sign this Agreement and agree that this consideration period has been reasonable and adequate.
12. COUNTERPARTS AND FACSIMILE: This Agreement may be executed in counterpart originals, each of which shall be deemed to be an original with the same effect as if the signatures thereto were on the same instrument. A signature affixed to this Agreement and transmitted by facsimile shall have the same effect as an original signature.

13. ASSIGNMENT: This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors of the Parties as if each was a party to this Agreement. Neither Party shall have the right to assign the terms of this Agreement, without the prior, written approval of the other Party. No assignment, even if consented to, shall in any way reduce or eliminate the liability of the assignee for obligations accrued prior to such assignment.

14. BREACH: In the event that either Party breaches this Agreement and the breach is litigated before a court of law or an administrative agency, the non-prevailing Party shall be liable to the prevailing Party for the prevailing Party's reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of suits incurred by the prevailing Party. Prevailing Party shall mean any defendant found not liable on any and all counts and/or any plaintiff recovering on any count. Each Party shall be entitled to any and all remedies at law and in equity under this Agreement. In addition to the foregoing, each Party shall be entitled to any and all remedies at law and in equity under this Agreement.

15. LEGISLATION: The Berwyn City Council and the Board of Trustees of Morton shall enact all necessary ordinances or resolutions to effectuate the terms of this Agreement. All provisions of this Agreement shall be carried out and discharged in full compliance with all applicable local, state and federal laws.





REQUESTING THE SUPPORT OF TAXING DISTRICTS TO EXTEND THE LIFE OF
THE AMENDED BERWYN THEATER TAX INCREMENT FINANCING
REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AREA**

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "*City*") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*"); and

WHEREAS, the City has identified an area along Cermak Avenue where there exists a need to encourage private investment, ameliorate blight, expand employment opportunities and increase and further diversify the tax base of the City and other affected taxing districts by the adoption of tax increment financing pursuant to the Illinois Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, 65 ILCS 5/11-74 4-1 *et seq.*, (the "*TIF Act*"), known as the Amended Berwyn Theatre Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Project and Plan (the "*Project Area*"); and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to extend the life of the Project Area for an additional period of twelve years; and

WHEREAS, certain taxing districts are authorized by law to levy *ad valorem* taxes on all real property within the Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the City is requesting the support of said taxing districts in its efforts to secure legislation in the Illinois General Assembly to extend the life of the Project Area; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "*Corporate Authorities*") to provide for the financial stability of the taxing districts throughout the

term of the extension period of the Project Area by declaring each year and distributing on a pro rata basis surplus revenue no less than twenty percent of all incremental real estate tax revenue received from the office of the Cook County Treasurer to the taxing districts in the Project Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety

Section 2. The City hereby agrees to declare and provide for the yearly distribution of certain surplus revenue no less than twenty percent of all incremental real estate tax revenue received from the office of the Cook County Treasurer within the Project Area on a pro rata basis to ensure the fair distribution of surplus revenue to taxing districts within the Project Area, if such taxing districts agree to support the efforts of the City to extend the life of the Project Area for an additional period of twelve years.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.





THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF
THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2008

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, is a home rule municipal corporation under the provisions of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the City Code and Illinois Statute require the annual adoption of an appropriation ordinance following public hearing and applicable public notice; and

WHEREAS, such public notice was published on _____ in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Berwyn, and a public hearing was held on February 12, 2008, with all wishing to attend being heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois the following:

SECTION 1: The following sums of money for each City fund, or as much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and are hereby appropriated for the corporate purposes and objects of the City hereinafter specified for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2008 and ending on December 31, 2008.

SECTION 2: All the appropriation herein made for any purpose shall be regarded only as a maximum amounts to be expended under the respective appropriation funds, shall not be construed as a commitment, agreement, obligation or liability of the City of Berwyn, and each such appropriation being subject to further approval as to the actual expenditure thereof by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn.

SECTION 3: Any unexpected balance of the appropriation for the fiscal years prior hereto are hereby specifically re-appropriated for the same fund purposes for which they were originally made and may be expended in making up any insufficiency in any item or items provided in the Appropriation Ordinance without supplemental appropriation.
