

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

MAY 26, 2009**

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:14 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Polashek, Avila, Laureto.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the deceased Ms. Metido mother of Fire Engineer Carmen Metido, for the safety of our service men and women, police, firefighters, paramedics.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Resident Sandy Van Goethem spoke regarding the Tribune article in which Berwyn was recognized and also stated that the 16<sup>th</sup> Street theater has extended their performance of "Unveiled" for an additional week, Rick Toman, former 3<sup>rd</sup> ward alderman congratulated the new administration, resident, Joe Counsell spoke and asked questions regarding construction on Roosevelt Road, the Mayor read a letter from Commander Ben Pennacchio, Commodore Barry Post 256, thanking Alderman Laureto and volunteers for cleaning and decorating Commodore Barry's monument for the Memorial Day celebration, Alderman Skryd asked for volunteers for the Clean City Commission
4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council meeting of May 12, 2009, 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, were submitted. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.

9. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the City Attorney and the appointment of Anthony Bertuca to the position. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve the appointment as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
10. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the Administrative Assistant and the appointment of Jynette Ayala to the position. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and approve the appointment as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

17. Alderman Chapman submitted a communication regarding consideration of Suburban Dodge Economic Incentive Agreement penalty enforcement. Thereafter, 2 motions were made by Chapman. 




Elected Officials:

The parking structure being constructed at 3320 Grove Avenue is being construction within two feet of the building on the adjacent property to the north, 3306 Grove Avenue. The owners of this building have expressed a number of concerns, including:

1. The view from the five windows in their south wall will be completely obstructed by the solid north wall of the parking structure.
2. The windows will be less secure because they will not be visible from Grove Avenue.
3. Access to perform maintenance on the exterior of their south wall will be significantly curtailed.
4. The space between the two buildings may be conducive to vandalism or other undesirable activity.

The BDC and Alfred Benesch (Owner's Representative) have met with the property owners to discuss these issues in detail. Based upon these discussions and the opinion of the Owners' Representative it is recommended that funding be specifically approved for the following work, as agreed to by the property owners:

1. Fill in five windows with masonry (exterior) and drywall on stud framing (interior) and repaint the interior of the south wall in affected rooms.
2. Repair cracks in exterior masonry and apply weatherproof sealant to the south wall exterior surface.
3. Install a lockable chain link gate across the west end of the two-foot space between the existing building and the parking structure.

The effect of this work will be to improve the security of the building at 3306 Grove Avenue by preventing access from the south and to substantially increase the time before the south wall of that building will require maintenance.

The most efficient way to have this work performed is by Power Construction Company and their subcontractors, so that the work may be coordinated with similar and adjacent work on the parking structure. Power has submitted a cost proposal, which is currently being negotiated.

We are requesting Council's consideration to approve the release of \$70,000 to cover the cost of this work, based on Power's initial cost proposal and including a 25% contingency. The precise scope of work has a degree of uncertainty due to unknowns in the construction of the existing wall, which will only be resolved when the windows are removed. The Change Order to Power's contract will stipulate a base fee for the basic scope of work, with any additional work required to be paid on a time and material basis. In this way, we hope to keep actual costs to a minimum. Approval of these funds will enable the proposed work to proceed on an optimum schedule, utilizing subcontractors when they have already mobilized to the project site for work on the parking structure.

The project is still under budget and this release of funds will not jeopardize the project being delivered within budget.

Attached for your review, is the Owner's Representative recommendation regarding the aforementioned release of funds.

The Berwyn Municipal Parking Structure is being constructed within two feet of the building on the adjacent property to the north, 3306 Grove Avenue. The owners of this building have expressed a number of concerns, including:

1. The view from the five windows in their south wall will be completely obstructed by the solid north wall of the parking structure.
2. The windows will be less secure because they will not be visible from Grove Avenue.
3. Access to perform maintenance on the exterior of their south wall will be significantly curtailed.
4. The space between the two buildings may be conducive to loitering, vandalism or other undesirable activity.

As it is our understanding that the Berwyn Development Corporation and the City of Berwyn wish to address these concerns, within the budget allocated for the parking structure project, we recommend that funding be specifically approved for the following work, as agreed to by the property owners:

1. Fill in five windows with masonry (exterior) and drywall on stud framing (interior) and repaint the interior of the south wall in affected rooms.
2. Repair cracks in exterior masonry and apply weatherproof sealant to the south wall exterior surface.
3. Install a lockable chain link gate across the west end of the two-foot space between the existing building and the parking structure.

The effect of this work will be to improve the security of the building at 3306 Grove Avenue by preventing access from the south and to substantially increase the time before the south wall of that building will require maintenance.

Re: Parking Structure Proposed Rates

Elected Officials:

We are requesting Council's consideration to approve the proposed rate structure below for parking in the 3320 Grove Avenue parking structure. The rates were determined based on fair market rates of other local communities, the BNSF lease agreement, the Metra grant agreement, City Traffic Engineer and City Finance Director input. These rates could be altered in the future depending on consumer response (it would require reprogramming the payment machines and installing new rate signage).

The BDC worked with the City's Traffic Engineer in determining final rates and relevant details. As part of the rate approval, several city parking ordinances will need to be amended. The Traffic Engineer will be bringing these proposed ordinance changes for Council review in September, 2009.

**Proposed Rates**

• Daily Rate, defined as parking in deck between 5am-midnight, seven days a week.

\$0.25 per hour (\$3 maximum per day)

• Overnight Rate, defined as parking in deck between midnight and 5am.

\$2 per night

*\*Commuter rates were already established at \$330 per year*

Attached is a detailed memo showing not only the rate structures, but also other relevant information such as: rates charged by other communities and forecasted revenue estimates. The Traffic Engineer has also submitted a letter of rate recommendation for Council which is attached to this packet.

Re: Parking Structure Proposed Rates

Below is the proposed rate structure for the new municipal parking structure located at 3320 Grove Avenue. The rates were determined based on fair market rates of other local communities, BNSF lease agreement and Metra grant agreement. These rates can be changed depending on consumer response, once programmed into the payment machines, (altering payment structure would require new payment signage).

The term "*Commuter Use*" is defined as Monday-Friday, 6am-6pm, per the City's grant agreement with Metra.

### Reserved Parking Spaces (Former Grove Lot Reserved Spaces)

Prior to construction of the deck, the site was used as a municipal parking lot. Because it was solely owned by the City of Berwyn, no additional levels of approval were necessary by Metra or BNSF in reference to rates charged, usage etc. Previously people were able to purchase reserved parking spaces, for commuter and business purposes, at an increased amount of \$390 per year.

Because the new parking structure is being partially funded through Metra and due to the commuter parking relocation agreement, the City needs Metra approval to alter the rates or use of commuter parking. After discussing this with the Director of Community Affairs for Metra, the option of creating reserved commuter spaces within the deck is not available. Metra requires all commuter spaces to be available on a first come, first serve basis both in the deck and along the rail right of way.

During Metra designated commuter hours there are 300 spaces reserved for commuters and 78 remaining, a good portion of the remaining spaces will be assigned to incoming retail tenants of the structure. Therefore, it appears to be the best option to no longer allow reserved parking, on the basis there will be plenty of commuter spaces and remaining available parking spaces will be charged a very low rate for use.

### Parking Space Allocation

- Total Spaces: 378
- Reserved for Commuter Use: 300
- Open Business Parking during Commuter Use: 78
- Open parking evenings and weekends: 378

## Rates

- Daily Rate, defined as parking in deck between 5am-midnight, seven days a week

## ORDINANCE \_\_\_\_\_

### **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BERWYN CITY CODE TO ADD AND RECOGNIZE THE APPOINTED POSITION OF DEPUTY POLICE CHIEF IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of Berwyn's home rule powers as follows:

#### **SECTION 1:**

Section 242.03, Chapter 242, Appointed Officers; Appointment Procedure is hereby amended to read as follows; (with proposed additions underlined and proposed deletions ~~stricken~~):

#### **242.03 APPOINTED OFFICERS: APPOINTMENT PROCEDURE.**

(a) With the exception of the officers listed in Section 242.01, all City officers shall be appointed by the Mayor, by and with the consent of Council. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office provided for in subsection (b) hereof, the Mayor shall present to Council, within thirty days of the occurrence creating such vacancy, the name of the appointee to such office, or shall, within such thirty days, inform Council of a temporary appointment, if such is the case. No person may be appointed to or temporarily hold any office provided for in subsection (b) hereof unless and until such person:

- (1) Has earned a high school diploma or the equivalent;
- (2) Is not is arrears in the payment of any tax or other indebtedness due to the City; and

(3) Is not indicted for nor has been convicted of, in any court located in the United States, and still serving sentence for any infamous crime, bribery, perjury, or other felony involving the characteristics of dishonesty, falsehood or fraud.

Subsection (a) (1) shall not apply to a person who is being appointed to an office which he or she held with the City prior to January 1, 2004.

(b) Appointed City Officers shall include the following:

Building Director,  
Chaplains, Police and Fire Departments (two),

**SECTION 2**

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

All ordinances conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict

**SECTION 4**

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on or after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.







**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING

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**WHEREAS**, the State of Illinois has enacted the “Prevailing Wage Act,” 820 ILCS 130/1 *et seq.* (the “Act”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Act requires that the City of Berwyn investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said City of Berwyn employed in performing construction of public works, for said City of Berwyn.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers as follows:

**SECTION 1:** To the extent and as required by the Prevailing Wage Act, the general prevailing rates of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of Berwyn is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rates of wages for construction working the Cook County area, as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year (*See Exhibit “A”*). The definition of any terms appearing in this ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

As required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rates of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department’s June construction

undertaken by the City of Berwyn. The definition of any terms appearing in the ordinance which area also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

**SECTION 2:** Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rates of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction undertaken of the City of Berwyn to the extent required by the Act.

**SECTION 3:** The City Clerk shall publicly post this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wages, and keep it available for inspection at the City Hall by any interested party. A copy of the determination or of the currently revised determination of the prevailing rates of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

**SECTION 4:** The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addressed and have requested copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

**SECTION 5:** The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this ordinance with the Honorable Jesse White, Secretary of State of Illinois, Index Department 111 East Monroe Street, Springfield, IL 62706 and with the Illinois Department of Labor, Fair Labor Standards Division, One West Old State Capitol Plaza, Room 300, Springfield, IL 62701.

**SECTION 6:** Within thirty (30) days after the filing with the Secretary of State, the City Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City stating:

**SECTION 7:** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 8:** All ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 9:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Re: Traffic Concerns in the east-west alley south of 26<sup>th</sup> Street between Highland and Harvey Avenues

In response to the reports of heavy traffic and speeding vehicles and concerns of child safety for the above mentioned alley, I have done speed and traffic counts. The counter was in place Friday May 29 at 12:00pm until Thursday June 4 at 9:00am.

28 houses use the north-south alley that intersects the east-west alley in question, and a 44 unit, 1 – 2 bedroom condominium building uses the east-west alley to gain access to the parking behind the building and the overhead door to parking within the building.

An average of 154 vehicles use the east-west alley per day. The traffic counts performed during the weekday were higher than those for the weekend. The A.M. peak hours ranged anywhere from 8:15 am to 12:45 pm, but maxed out at 12 vehicles per hour or 1 vehicle every 5 minutes. The P.M. peak hours during the week ranged from 3:00 pm to 7:30 pm and maxed out at 21 vehicles per hour or 1 vehicle every 2.9 minutes. This was Wednesday night from 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm. The P.M. peak hours during the weekend (Friday-Sunday) ranged from 3:45pm to 9:45 pm and maxed out at 23 vehicles per hour or 1 vehicle every 2.6 minutes. This was Friday night from 8:45 p.m. to 9:45 p.m. I would assume that a limited number of children would be playing in the alley during this busiest time.

The traffic volumes appear to be in concurrence with the land use surrounding the area, in respects to the 28 homes along the north-south alley and the 44 unit condo located on the corner.

Of the 950 cars recorded at this time, 85% were traveling at 14.3 mph or lower and the maximum speed recorded was 21.7 mph. Illinois vehicle code states that the speed limit of alleys is to be 15 mph unless deemed otherwise by an engineering study. Traffic engineers use the 85 percentile speed, which is the speed that 85% of the traffic is traveling at (this case is 14.3 mph), when setting speed limits. In this case the traffic is traveling at the appropriate speed for an alley.

The most that I would feel comfortable recommending at this alley would be to install a "No Thru Traffic" sign and/or a "15 mph" sign, to remind the small percentage of cut-through and/or speeding traffic of the City's traffic laws.


Please be advised that the Parking and Traffic Committee met on June 3, 2009. Traffic Engineer Nicole Campbell attended. Ms. Campbell brought to our attention the need for a policy concerning residents' requests for traffic control devices such as stop signs, speed bumps, etc.

Ms. Campbell is currently fielding requests for such devices from Aldermen and directly from residents. She has experienced an unusual volume of calls which delay other vital aspects of her work. She has requested that the Parking and Traffic Committee determine the feasibility of implementing a standardized procedure for submitting requests for traffic control devices. She submitted the attached documents (Glenview Traffic Committee, Village of Riverside Resident Letter) for our review.

The Committee has determined that it is authorized under section 210.15 (g) of the City of Berwyn Administration Code to undertake this matter. Therefore, the Parking and Traffic Committee will begin the process of assessing the situation brought to our attention. Our goals are: 1) to review the current City policies and procedures pertaining to traffic control device requests, if any, 2) to meet with police officials, City Department heads, and the Traffic Engineer to discuss amending existing, or otherwise develop, policy for resident requests for traffic control devices, and 4) present to Council our findings and recommend appropriate changes, amendments, or ordinances if warranted.



The Village also has a **Traffic Committee**: a multi-disciplinary group of professionals comprised of members from the Engineering Division and Fire, Police and Public Works Departments, as well as the Village Manager's Office. The Committee meets regularly to review and investigate all requests or inquiries relating to traffic safety, including requests for the installation of traffic control devices. **Recommendations made by the Committee will be based on law, the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), and other professional traffic engineering standards.**

All traffic safety concerns must be submitted --- **in writing** --- to the attention of the Traffic Committee Chairperson. Clearly and explicitly outline the traffic safety issue, and include your name and address. Concerns may be sent to the Traffic Committee c/o the Village Manager's Office.



Dear Resident:

In regard to your request for a (new stop, no parking, or other sign; speed survey; traffic engineering study; or placement of a sign), this letter explains the steps you must take for your request to be reviewed by the village and why we use this procedure.

Each year the Village of Riverside receives several requests from residents for new stop signs, other signs, speed surveys, and traffic engineering studies. These studies and surveys require a tremendous amount of police employee hours (which reduce the number of officers available for crime prevention and patrol). The surveys also can be costly as, occasionally, the village must hire other consultants with civilian traffic engineering expertise to evaluate the data.

Many times, these well-intentioned requests are negated as they do not meet standardized traffic warrants which are enforceable in court *or* they are countered by other residents who oppose the requests.

Due to the aforementioned, the Village of Riverside approved a resolution which states: It is the policy of the Village that whenever a resident requests the installation of a new traffic device or sign, speed surveys, or other traffic data gathering, a petition must be submitted to the Chief of Police, 31 Riverside Rd., Riverside, IL 60546.

Please see the attached documents and follow the instructions for the petition. When you obtain the appropriate signatures, return the petition to me.

I will then forward your request and petition to the *Public Works Director* and the *Safe Environment Commission* so that they may review and determine the feasibility of the request. If the request is approved, it will finally be forwarded to the **Board of Trustees** for their consideration and final approval.

In addition to your petition, please prepare a cover letter stating the reason you feel the traffic device/ sign/ survey is needed and submit it with the petition. Attached is a sample petition and regulations for installation of traffic signs/devices to help you with your request.

## REGULATORY SIGN WARRANTS

---

### 2-3.5

First, let's talk about STOP signs. STOP signs should not be used for speed control.

STOP signs may be warranted for use at:

- an intersection of a major roadway facility and a minor street, when used to control traffic on the minor street and where applications of the normal right-of-way is unduly hazardous.
- an intersection where a combination of the following conditions exist:
  - high speed traffic
  - restricted view
  - a history of intersection related traffic accidents
  - a street entering a through highway or street

(Ref MUTCD Section 2B-5)

### 2-3.6

When an intersection exists where traffic or physical conditions do not justify conventional traffic signals but where high accident rates indicate a special hazard, the MUTCD allows the use of a flashing signal light in combination with the STOP sign installation to bring attention to the STOP sign. When used, a red indication should face the STOP sign controlled approach. This combination of traffic control devices should not be substituted for correcting a sight distance problem that could be eliminated by removing an obstruction, and a STOP sign should never be used in combination with a green or yellow signal combination.

(Ref MUTCD Section 4E-3)

### 2-3.7

Multi-way stop control, which describes an intersection where more than two approaches are controlled by a STOP sign, should be used only when warranted.

### 2-3.8

How many of you have heard this remark from angry citizens: "Is someone going to have to be killed before you put in STOP signs at the end of my street?" Unfortunately, regular speeders rarely stop completely for STOP signs, especially when they can see that there is not side street traffic. Instead of being effective, when STOP signs are installed at intersections where they are not needed, they can create a false sense of security for pedestrians, especially children, who think that because a STOP sign is in place, they can walk, cycle, and play in the street. Speeders will actually go faster between STOP signs to make up for lost time.

### 2-3.9

So we have to be very careful about the way we use STOP signs. The decision to employ STOP signs in this manner should be made only after a complete warrant analysis has been made.

2-3.10

A warrant analysis consists of looking at the existing conditions and the history of accidents at an intersection to determine whether or not conditions could be improved by implementing a multi-way stop.

2-3.11

One of the first things that is usually considered in a multi-way STOP sign warrant analysis of an intersection is whether or not the roadways at that intersection generate approximately equal volumes of traffic. If they do not, it is unlikely that a multi-way stop will be effective.

2-3.12

Conditions that may warrant an intersection for multi-way STOP control include:

1. Intersections where traffic signals are warranted and urgently needed, the multi-way STOP is an interim measure that can be installed quickly to control traffic while arrangements are being made for the signal installation.
2. Intersections where at least 5 accidents of a type that could potentially be reduced by the installation of multi-way stop control have occurred in a 12-month period.
3. Intersections with a total vehicular volume entering the intersection from all approaches averaging at least 500 vehicles per hour for only 8 hours of an average day, and the combined vehicular and pedestrian volume from the minor street or highway must average at least 200 units per hour for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the maximum hour, but when the 85 percentile approach speed of the major street traffic exceeds 40 miles per hour, the minimum vehicular volume warrant is 70 percent of the above requirements.

(Ref. MUTCD Section 2B-6)

As you can see, justifying a multi-way stop controlled intersection requires an in depth analysis of what the conditions of the intersection really are. Depending on the division of the responsibility in your organization, you may at one time or another be asked to collect data for the traffic engineer who will study an intersection for possible installation of a multi-way stop.



**AN ORDINANCE  
ESTABLISHING RESIDENT PERMIT PARKING AT CERTAIN LOCATIONS ALONG  
21<sup>ST</sup> STREET AND AMENDING CHAPTER 484 OF THE TRAFFIC CODE OF THE  
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "*City* ") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*");

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "*Corporate Authorities*") has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time;

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that the regulation of parking on its streets is a matter pertaining to its government and affairs;

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities declare that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of its residents to provide for Resident Permit Parking at certain areas along 21<sup>ST</sup> Street due to the development of multi-unit residential buildings in the surrounding area.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 1:** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2:** The Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended by adding the following new Chapter to read as follows:

**484.09 PERMIT PARKING AT CERTAIN LOCATIONS ON THE 6700 WEST BLOCK OF 21<sup>ST</sup> STREET**

- (a) Parking spaces located on the north side of the 6700 West block of 21<sup>st</sup> Street from Wesley Avenue west to the first alley intersecting 21<sup>st</sup> Street thereafter shall be designated as twenty-four (24) hour permit parking only spaces, excepting street maintenance restrictions. Such parking spaces shall be designated by signs indicating "21<sup>st</sup> Street Permit Parking Only."
- (b) Permits for parking within the applicable area described in subsection (a) hereof, shall be issued only in accordance with the following:
  - (1) Availability. Parking permits will be issued for each calendar year on an as-available basis by the City Collector upon application and payment of all applicable fees identified herein to any resident who is domiciled in a multi-unit building bordering the applicable area described in subsection (a). Such parking permits shall be valid from January 1 through December 31 of each calendar year and limited to one per household. No resident parking permit shall be issued to a vehicle with outstanding City parking tickets.
  - (2) Application. Applications for parking permits under this Chapter shall be submitted to the City Collector on a form to be provided by the City Collector. Such application shall include:
    - (i) Name, address, and proof of residence;
    - (ii) Vehicle make, City vehicle sticker number and license plate number; and
    - (iii) Such other information as the City Collector may reasonably require to implement this Chapter.
  - (3) Fees. The yearly permit fee for a resident parking permit under this Chapter shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). All fees paid pursuant to this Chapter shall be nonrefundable. Any such permit fees shall be prorated after July 1st of each calendar year.
  - (4) Form. The parking permits shall be in placard form and in colors uniquely designated by the City Collector for each calendar year. The parking permits shall be numbered and shall state the date of expiration.
- (c) The City Collector shall promulgate 21<sup>st</sup> Street Permit Parking Rules and Regulations to supplement the requirements set forth herein. A copy of such rules and regulations shall be available to such permit holders in the City Collector's Office and

shall be made available to each permit holder when a renewal permit is issued if substantive changes are made to the rules and regulations.

- (1) Parking permits shall be displayed on passenger-side dashboards of the vehicles;
  - (2) Resident parking permits shall be nontransferable;
  - (3) No person shall use a resident parking permit on a vehicle for which such permit was not issued;
  - (4) No person shall duplicate or attempt to duplicate such resident parking permit; and
  - (5) Any permit issued pursuant to this Chapter may be revoked for any violation herein.
- (d) No vehicle which does not bear a 21<sup>st</sup> Street Parking Permit shall park in those spaces identified as "21<sup>st</sup> Street Permit Parking Only" within the applicable area described in subsection (a) hereof. All such spaces shall be designated as tow zones.

**Section 3.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

**Section 4.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


