MINUTES  
BERWYN CITY COUNCIL  
May 24, 2011

1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Polashek, Avila, Laureto, Absent: Santoy. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to excuse Alderman Santoy. The motion carried by a voice vote.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the men and women in the armed forces and for the men and women protecting the streets of Berwyn.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized Clerk Pavlik who announce \$ for Scholars applications are now available in the Clerk's office and \$ for Scholars will be awarding four \$500.00 scholarships to Berwyn's students attending college this fall. Alderman Avila reminded all about Kaboom, North Berwyn Park District park building project on Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup> between 9am and 2:30pm and encourages all to volunteer. Alderman Skryd reminded all that Berwyn Mail Street has their Rain Barrels on display on Cermak Rd. until August 2<sup>nd</sup> and they will be auctioned off at National Night Out.
4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council Meeting, held May 10, 2011 and the Committee of the Whole, held on May 10, 2011 were submitted. Thereafter Boyajian, made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
5. The Mayor submitted a Proclamation regarding Preservation. Clerk Pavlik read the Proclamation into record, Thereafter, Skryd, made a motion seconded, by Paul to **adopt** the Proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote. Thereafter the Mayor recognized Rebecca House of the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission who presented a plaque to the City of Berwyn recognizing Berwyn City Hall as a local landmark.
6. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding Mayoral Appointments. The Mayor asked for a motion for the item to be deferred. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Boyajian to defer the matter for three weeks. The motion carried by a voice vote.
7. The Finance Director submitted a communication regarding sale of Prudential Stocks, noting the city will receive a check for \$104,360 less fees. The Mayor than noted the city has already received the check and has been deposited. Thereafter Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman to accept the matter as informational with special thanks to Financial Director John Wysocki. The motion carried by a voice vote.

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8. A motion by Chapman seconded by Boyajian, to suspend rules and bring forward item K-9 from Consent agenda, Handicap sign for Garza, 3329 S. Kenilworth and defer the matter for three weeks. The motion carried by a voice vote.
