The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was given for the families of Tom Weil, beloved father-in-law of Berwyn Firefighter Richard Chaput, Jr.; Lawrence McDonnell, beloved father of Berwyn Police Sergeant James McDonnell; Clara Reato, beloved grandmother of Berwyn Police Officer Nicholas Mantucca; Theresa Marando, beloved mother-in-law of Berwyn Fire Lieutenant Mike Chiappetta and the men and women protecting our safety on the streets of Berwyn, in the Armed Forces and for all Veterans.
- 3. The open forum portion of the meeting was announced. Alderman Laureto invited all to attend the Green Mile event on 3/11/16 from 5 p.m. until 11 p.m. The Youth Crossroads gave a presentation regarding their Service Trip to New Orleans on 3/27/16 through 4/3/16 and are seeking funding. Alderman Laureto passed out a pledge sheet for donations to help assist the Youth Crossroads.
