## MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL APRIL 28, 2009

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero. Absent: Erickson. Thereafter, Phelan made a motion, seconded by Weiner, to excuse Alderman Erickson. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the safety of our armed forces, police, firefighters, paramedics, and for the deceased Violet O'Connor, mother of Mayor O'Connor.
- 3. The Open Forum Portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized Steve Shonder, 3101 Wesley who thanked the Mayor for his four years of service to Berwyn, Berwyn Fire Chief, Denis O'Halloran announced the Grand Opening of the 16<sup>th</sup> St. Firehouse to be held on Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> at 10 am and invited all to attend, Alderman Chapman announced the Kiwanis Pancake Day breakfast being held on Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Berwyn Park District Liberty Center and also announced Bloom and Zoom in the Depot District on May 9<sup>th</sup>, Resident of 1330 Scoville thanked outgoing Mayor O'Connor and congratulated Mayor elect Lovero and wished him well.
- 4. The minutes of the regular meeting held on April 14, 2009 were submitted. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to reconsider item #11 of said meeting. The motion carried. Thereafter Skryd made a motion, seconded by Lovero, to concur and **adopt** the Resolution regarding the Volume Capitalization as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Day, Lovero. Nays: Weiner, Phelan. Excused: Erickson. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to amend item #10 of the April 14, 2009 minutes regarding the Resolution for "Neighborhood Stabilization Project" and for the minutes to read "adopt the Resolution, contingent on final proposal". The motion carried by a voice vote.

Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Day, to approve the Council minutes as amended and to approve the Committee of the Whole as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 8. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding property at 1535 Clarence Home and Land. Thereafter, Lovero made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 9. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding Stimulus Funding from the State of Illinois and Federal Government. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 10. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding an amendment to the Main Street Agreement. After discussion, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to defer and place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> agenda of May 12<sup>th</sup>. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Skryd, Day, Lovero. Nays: Weiner, Phelan. Excused: Erickson
- 11. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the old Berwyn Police Department station and Miller's Pub property. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to refer the matter to the Committee of the Whole. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 12. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding a guardrail at 2812 Ridgeland. After discussion, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to refer the matter back to the Traffic Engineer. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 13. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding parking at 21<sup>st</sup> Street and Wesley Avenue. Thereafter, Phelan made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and refer the matter to the law department to draft an ordinance to enact. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 14. The City Clerk submitted a communication regarding the approval of closed Committee of the Whole minutes of March 10 and March 24, 2009. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Day, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote
- 15. A deferred communication from Alderman Ramos regarding stop signs at 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and Clarence Avenue, previously referred to the Traffic engineer. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur with the recommendation of the Traffic engineer to update school crossing pedestrian cross walk signage. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 16. A deferred communication from Alderman Ramos regarding Emmanuel Bible's Church request for approval of access to handicap ramp. Thereafter, Ramos made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth item I-3, a deferred communication from Ramos regarding Emmanuel Bible's Church request for approval of alternate plans and to withdraw both items I-2 and I-3. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 17. The Public Works committee submitted a communication regarding Seasonal Planting bid award of contract with the recommendation of the committee to award the contract to Landscape Concept Management. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 18. The Public Works committee submitted a communication regarding the Landscape Maintenance bids award of contract with the recommendation to award the contract to B. Davids for Ogden Avenue and the Depot District and to McAdams for Cermak Road. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 19. The Police Chief submitted a communication regarding the swearing in of Probationary Police Officer, John McGrath. Thereafter, the Clerk administered the Oath of Office and extended congratulations. Thereafter, Lovero made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and accept the

appointment as informational. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
