MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL JANUARY 27, 2009

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:03 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the safety of our armed forces, police, firefighters, paramedics, and especially for Jimmy Trdowski, who is currently serving in Iraq.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized Steven Petergall, Oak Park resident and Berwyn firefighter, who spoke regarding his recent injury and asked for an apology from the Mayor, see attached statement.
- 4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council meeting and the Committee of the Whole held on January 13, 2009 were submitted. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Replacement of the Cermak Road Clock. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 6. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the 2009 annual event dates. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by the following roll call vote: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero. Nays: Erickson.
- 7. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Parking Structure Construction-Potential Caisson related Change Order. The Mayor recognized Anthony Griffin from the BDC, who explained the request, stating that three separated motions needed to be made.

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur for consideration to release an amount not to exceed \$242,805 from the construction budget to address the caisson change order. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd to concur and approve for payment in an amount not to exceed \$90,000 from the construction budget to put towards the Walker Parking Consultants budget and additional costs associated with the review and redesign of the caisson issue. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve payment in an amount not to exceed \$28,772 from the construction budget, only if the geotechnical test results indicate further TDR testing is necessary and to consider approving the scope of services contract associated with the TDR testing from the company AECOM. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

- 8. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Wireless Network Link, Parking Structure. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve for payment in an amount not to exceed \$14,595.39. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 9. Lovero made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth items J-8, J-9, J-10, and J-11. The motion carried. Item J-8 is a communication from the Law department along with an attached ordinance entitled:
