Minutes Berwyn City Council June 13, 2017



- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Lennon, Ramirez, Reardon, Fejt, Santoy, Ruiz, Avila and Garcia.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was given for the memory of Lawrence Maturo; Godfather and Uncle of Deputy Clerk Lillian Guerrier and for the men and women protecting our safety on the streets of Berwyn, in the Armed Forces and all Veterans.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. They Mayor and City Council members received remarks from the following people who spoke in favor of the City of Berwyn to not opt out of the Cook County minimum wage and sick leave ordinances: Mr. Aldo Reyes who read from an Denver Post article titled: "Nowhere in America can a full-time minimum wage worker afford to rent a two-bedroom apartment" (6/9/2017); Ms. Molly Lavaya read remarks submitted by Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle; Ms. Sara Garzureznic representing David Orr, Cook County Clerk; Ms. Elizabeth Kurr (2521 Euclid); Mr. Jason Girard (Berwyn); Mr. Brendan O'Connor, (Berwyn business owner - Big Guy's Sausage Stand); Mr. Anthony Nelson; Ms. Joan Davis (Oak Park); Mr. Michael DeLonay (Berwyn); Ms. Adrianna Alverez (Cicero); Mr. Marchin Stainthorp (Chicago); Ms. Kate Zeitvogel (Berwyn); Ms. Sara Edgar representing the Berwyn Immigration Working Group (31st/Maple Berwyn); Mr. Kent Dean(Berwyn); Ms. Darlene Yoder (26th/Scoville Berwyn); Mr. Evan Robles (Cicero); Ms. Johanna Ryan (26th/Wesley Berwyn); Mr. Dave Peterson (8th Ward Berwyn); Ms. Alice Gleeson (38th/Highland Berwyn); Mr. Steven Ashby; Ms. Elizabeth Gonzalez (Berwyn); Mr. Henry Folkerson (Oak Park); Mr. Jim Kelly (Oak Park); Ms. Elizabeth Jimenez (Berwyn) and Rev. C.J. Hawking representing Arise Chicago.
- 4. The minutes of the regular Berwyn City Council and of the Committee of the Whole meetings held on May 23, 2017 were submitted. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to approve the minutes as submitted and place same on file for audit. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. Mayor Lovero submitted a proclamation recognizing the accomplishments of Ms. Ella Ortiz. Avila made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, the proclamation was presented to Ms. Ortiz who was accompanied by family members.
- 6. The City Clerk submitted an ordinance entitled: An Ordinance Adopting the Prevailing Wage Standards for the City of Berwyn. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Lennon, to concur, adopt the ordinance as presented and authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

- 7. Alderman Santoy made a motion, seconded by Reardon, to suspend the rules and combine items G-2 (Appointment and Swearing-In of Sandra Anderson as Deputy Clerk) and G-3 (Appointment and Swearing-In of Lillian Guerrier as Deputy Clerk). The motion carried. Santoy made a motion, seconded by Reardon, to concur and approve the appointments as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Paul administered the Oath of Office.
- 8. The Zoning Board of Appeals submitted a communication requesting a side yard variation for 2522 S. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 11. Fire Chief Denis O'Halloran requested permission to promote the next eligible Lieutenant on the promotion list due to the retirement of Lieutenant Michael Chiapetta. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Garcia, to concur and grant permission. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 12. Fire Chief Denis O'Halloran requested permission to contact the Fire and Police Commission to hire one probationary Firefighter/Paramedic due to the Chiapetta's retirement. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Garcia, to concur and grant permission. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 13. Fire Chief Denis O'Halloran requested permission for a seniority promotion of the next Senior Firefighter to the rank of Engineer. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Ruiz, to concur and grant permission. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 14. Fire Chief Denis O'Halloran requested permission to contact the Fire and Police Commission to hire one Probationary Firefighter/Paramedic due to Taylor's resignation. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Ruiz, to concur and grant permission. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 15. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, ILLINOIS:





Re: Tobacco Sales Age Ordinance

Smoking by young adults under the age of 21 leads to detrimental personal and public health issues with far reaching social and economic implications. This issue is not unique to the City of Berwyn but we have the ability as a home rule community to control access to the legal purchase of tobacco and tobacco-related products. Several major cities in the Unites States as well as neighboring municipalities have raised the tobacco sales age to 21 years old in recent years.

Key facts to consider:

- Tobacco use remains a leading cause of preventable premature death in the United States, killing nearly half a million Americans and costing the nation almost \$200 billion in healthcare expenses and lost productivity each year
- Tobacco use also increases the risks of lung cancer, heart disease, stroke, asthma, emphysema, pre-term delivery, low birth weight, and many other types of cancer
- Cigarettes are the only consumer products that, when used exactly as intended, kill up to onethird of regular users
- Ninety-five percent (95%) of all adult smokers start smoking before they turn twenty-one (21) years of age, the transition from experimental to regular smoking typically occurs around twenty years old and most people who are not smokers by twenty-one years of age do not start smoking later in their lives
- There is strong evidence that people who begin smoking at an early age are more likely to develop a severe addition to nicotine than those who start at a later age
- Raising the legal sales age for cigarettes and tobacco products will reduce access to both products in stores among young adults, between eighteen (18) and twenty-one (21) years old, and among youth who are younger than eighteen

- Raising the legal sales age for cigarettes and tobacco products will reduce access to cigarettes
 and tobacco products by youth because youth often acquire such products from older friends:
 ninety percent (90%) of people purchasing cigarettes for minors are between eighteen (18)
 and twenty (20) years old
- See attached informational flyer as provided by the Cook County Department of Public Health

It is my recommendation to raise the tobacco sales age to 21 years of age within the City limits of Berwyn. To this end, I am requesting that this matter be referred to the Legal Department for the drafting of a proposed ordinance and to the Committee of the Whole for discussion and comment.

The initiative to raise the tobacco sales age from 18 to 21

Current tobacco use trends are driving new prevention strategies

- In Illinois, 6,300 teens become new daily smokers each year. In suburban Cook County, 29 percent of high school seniors use tobacco products.²
- While great strides have been made in tobacco prevention, declines in tobacco use rates have slowed and products like cigarillos, hookah, and e-cigarettes are now used at double the rate of cigarettes.²
- Reducing teens' access to tobacco products is a proven means to reduce current use and prevent initiation.

The age of 21 is important for prevention

- 95 percent of smokers start before the age of 21.3
- The majority of underage tobacco users get their tobacco from a peer; however, 90 percent of those suppliers are themselves often under the age of 21.4
- Drawing the line at 21 gets legal tobacco purchasers out of high schoolers' social circles.

Tobacco 21 saves lives and improves health

- The Institute of Medicine projects that Tobacco 21 could reduce overall smoking by 12 percent by the time today's teenagers become adults; the biggest declines in tobacco use would be seen among 15-17 year olds (25%) and 18-20 year olds (15%).5
- Tobacco 21 would immediately improve community health by reducing inflammation, improving immune function, and reducing premature births and SIDS.

The economic impact of Tobacco 21

- Economists project that nationally, Tobacco 21 could save \$212 billion in medical costs.6
- Each year, tobacco use costs Illinois \$5.49 billion in health care costs and \$5.27 billion in lost productivity.
- The impact of Tobacco 21 on retail sales would be minimal since the 18-21 year old age group only accounts for 2 percent of overall tobacco sales.⁷

Tobacco 21 enjoys broad support across Illinois and the U.S., even from smokers!

- A 2015 CDC study found that 75 percent of adults support Tobacco 21, including 70 percent of current smokers.⁸ A recent study also found that 68 percent of 18-24 year olds would support Tobacco 21.⁹
- More than 220 cities across 16 states, plus the states of California and Hawaii, have enacted Tobacco 21.10
- In Illinois, Tobacco 21 has already been adopted by Evanston, Chicago, Oak Park, Highland Park, Naperville, Deerfield and Maywood, and is being considered by dozens more communities.



This results in elevated blood lead levels which can result in behavioral and learning issues. The City of Berwyn has been designated as a high risk zip code by the Illinois Department of Public Health. The Cook County Department of Public Health estimates that 800 children in Berwyn have unacceptable blood lead levels.




