Report and Recommendation of the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission

Date: May 6, 2016

Re: Nomination of 2323 Elmwood Avenue, the Salinas bungalow, as a Berwyn Historic

Landmark

To: Mayor Robert J. Lovero and the Members of Berwyn's City Council

From: The Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission

Report:

The Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission held a public hearing on May 4, 2016, which was publicized as required by the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance. Three of the five active members of the Commission were present:

Emilio Padilla, Interim Chair Michael Pegan, Secretary Edward Brown

The subject of the hearing was the nomination of the Salinas bungalow, located at 2323 Elmwood Avenue, as a Berwyn Historic Landmark. Following is a report on those proceedings:

The Chair of the Commission, Emilio Padilla, opened the proceedings and reviewed the procedures for conducting the public hearing. The Chair then opened the floor to questions and comments. There were several questions and comments by Commissioners. The Commission then voted to accept the nomination, with all three members present voting to recommend that the Salinas bungalow at 2323 Elmwood Avenue be designated as a Berwyn Historic Landmark.

Based on the evidence presented at the public hearing, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission recommends that City Council designate the bungalow at 2323 Elmwood as a Berwyn Historic Landmark. We find that the building satisfies the following Criteria for designation as a Berwyn Historic Landmark according to the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance:

-Significance as an example of the architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social development or heritage of the city, the state or the United States. "Significance" means the relative importance

of the property when viewed in the property's architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social context. (criterion 1)

- -Embodiment of those distinguishing characteristics of significant architectural type, or style, or engineering specimen. "Significant" means the relative importance of the architectural type, or style, or engineering specimen. (criterion 5)
- -Identification as the work of a builder, designer, architect, craftsperson, engineer or landscape architect who individual work is significant in the development of the city, the state or the United States. "Significant" means the relative importance of the builder, designer, architect, craftsperson. engineer or landscape architect. (criterion 6)
- -Representation of an architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social theme, style or period, expressed in distinctive areas, districts, places, buildings or structures that may or may not be contiguous. (criterion 8)

A summary of the evidence presented at the hearing, which provides information about the history and design of the Salinas bungalow, can be found in the nomination form, attached.

Recommendation:

The Commission therefore recommends that the City Council designate 2323 Elmwood as a Berwyn Historic Landmark pursuant the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance. That section holds that within 30 days of receiving this Report and Recommendation,

City Council shall either designate the historic landmark or reject the nomination by a simple majority vote of the full Council. In making this determination, the City Council shall apply the designation standards set forth in Section 1478.04 above and shall give due consideration to the record of the public hearing(s), and findings and recommendations of the Commission set forth in the Commission's resolution and report and may take public testimony with regard to the same. Upon a majority vote of the City Council to approve designation, the City Council shall enact an ordinance designating the historic landmark, which ordinance shall provide that the newly designated historic landmark shall be the subject to the provisions of Chapter 1478 of the City Code.

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING <u>THE BERWYN BUNGALOW AT 2323</u> <u>ELMWOOD AVENUE</u>, AS A HISTORIC LANDMARK, PURSUANT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 1820 OF THE BERWYN CITY CODE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 1820 of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances (the "Historic Preservation Ordinance") provides rules and procedures for designating Historic Landmark and Districts within the City of Berwyn; and

WHEREAS, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance gives the Historic Preservation Commission (the "Commission") responsibility to investigate, review and recommend to the Berwyn City Council those structures or districts that have significant historical, cultural, architectural or aesthetic value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois, or the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Commission received and accepted an application for designation of the bungalow at 2323 Elmwood Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, as a Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission held a public hearing pursuant to the requirements of the Historic Preservation Ordinance on May 4, 2016 to consider the designation of the Berwyn National Bank Building as a Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission unanimously recommended to the City

Council on May 6, 2016 that the bungalow at 2323 Elmwood Avenue represents
a structure that has significant historical, cultural, architectural and aesthetic
value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois, and the
United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINDED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. Findings. Based upon City Council's review of the application, the Resolution and Report of the Commission, and the designation standards set forth in Section 1820.06, the City Council makes the following affirmative determination: the bungalow at 2323 Elmwood Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, embodies significant historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois, and the United States.

Section 2. Adoption. The bungalow at 2323 Elmwood Avenue shall hereafter be designated as a Historic Landmark pursuant to the Historic Preservation Ordinance, and subject to the provisions therein.

Section 3. Filing. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file with the Recorder of Deeds of Cook County, Illinois a certified copy of this designation ordinance.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE HONORARY DESIGNATION OF A PORTION OF ROOSEVELT ROAD – THE BLOCK OF 6733 W. ROOSEVELT ROAD – AS "ROBERT J. (BOB) ROLDER WAY"

WHEREAS, Robert J. (Bob) Rolder was born in Chicago, grew up in Oak Park and attended River Forest High School. He worked for two years on the receiving dock for Sears Roebuck and Co., before joining the Navy and serving at a naval base in San Diego during World War II; and

WHEREAS, after the war, he returned home and to his job at Sears, working his way up to dock foreman. During that time he also worked part time making deliveries for the Friendly Tap, which at that time had a takeout liquor store. He worked there for 20 years, before leaving his job at Sears and buying the tavern in 1968 after having cashed out all his Sears stock; and

WHEREAS, "Bob" was married to his wife, Bonnie, from 1958 until her death in 2009. They had two daughters, Robin and Kerri; and

WHEREAS, Bob Rolder, 40, ran the neighborhood tavern in Berwyn for more than three decades, greeting customers by name as they walked through the door of the Friendly Tap along a stretch of Roosevelt Road now known as "The Veltway"; and

WHEREAS, he opened at 6 a.m. to accommodate his regulars, mostly tradesmen working the night shift – among them carpenters, plumbers, pipe fitters and ironworkers – who would drop by for a beer before heading home; and.

WHEREAS, over the years, Mr. Rolder's warmth and affable nature forged lasting friendships and created a loyal following; and

WHEREAS, after suffering a mild stroke in 1997, "Bob" continued operating his tavern with the help of family members until the sale in 2007; and

WHEREAS, according to family members "Bob" often worked 16 hour days and never drank at the bar, since his mottos were "drink and you drink your profits away" and "always be nice to everyone"; and

WHEREAS, the tavern was a place for coffee and long conversations, as well as an intimate setting for generations of families that gathered to celebrate special occasions such as Birthday and Anniversaries;

WHEREAS, "Bob" died at the age of 90, on April 26, 2016 and is also survived by sisters Jeanne Sikora, Marilyn Noga and three grandchildren.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and the Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers, as follows:

- Section 1. That the above recitals are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
- Section 2. The Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn expressly declare that block of 6733 W. Roosevelt Road, Berwyn, Illinois shall henceforth carry the honorary designation of "ROBERT J. (BOB) ROLDER WAY".
- Section 3. Nothing in this Resolution shall be construed as renaming any portion of Roosevelt Road. The intent of this Resolution is to create an honorary, alternative designation for said portion of Roosevelt Road.
- Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution.

- Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions or motions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Resolution, or any provision thereof, are herby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and publication as required by law.

Re: Remodeling of the Recreation Department Bathrooms

Due to the need for repairs at the Recreation Department men's and women's bathroom facilitates, we applied for a CDBG grant to address broken toilets, ADA door width compliant and ADA toilet stalls and partitions, toilet upgrades, new countertops, sinks, faucets, tile floors and walls, lighting and new paint. The grant is in the amount of \$80,000 and our engineers estimate is \$90,000. Should the lowest best bid (actual cost) exceed the grant, we will utilize monies in the Recreation Department budget.

Staff developed an RFP and ran an ad for competitive bids. Five bid packets were picked up at the Clerk's office, and we expect at least 2, perhaps 3 submittals by Monday, June 27, 2016.

Recommendation: Authorize staff to execute a contract with the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of the bid proposal (to be discussed at the council meeting) plus a contingency of \$5,000 for unforeseen work items.

I am submitting this communication to publicly recognize the following Berwyn Police Officers and Tele-communicators for outstanding work at the Berwyn City Council meeting on June 28, 2016: Tele-communicators Jennifer Owens, Mia Alvarez and Nicolette Malizzio, Watch Commander Michael Ochsner Jr., Sergeants George Janecek and Salvador Gamino, Patrol Officers Daniel DiMenna, Robert Trofimchuk, Gregory Lill, Joseph Pesa, Joseph Manfredini, Casey Stefano, Daniel Piemonte, Detectives Michael Fellows, Michael Gallagher, Gavin Zarbock, John C. McGrath, Tactical Officers Vincent Esposito, Matthew Boskovich, George Audiffred and Evidence Technician/Officer Robert Sepe.

On April 17, 2016 at approximately 7:43pm, three male black offenders entered the Radio Shack/ Sprint store located at 6905 W. Ogden Avenue. The offenders implied that they were armed with a firearm and robbed the store employees of several cellular telephones. The offenders were also handed a telephone containing a GPS Tracking device.

Officers responding to the scene were provided the information from dispatch the direction that the electronic device was moving. Officers were able to locate the suspected offenders who were traveling south on a side street in Stickney and then west on another side street moving towards Harlem Avenue. As officers began closing in on the suspect offenders, they began to flee. Officers began a short vehicular pursuit which resulted in the offending vehicle to crash into a wall at the gas station located at 47th Street and Harlem Avenue. The offenders exited their vehicle and began fleeing on foot, over a large fence, onto railroad tracks and west bound on the railroad tracks into Ottawa Woods, which officers continuing the pursuit on foot.

As the offenders began running into the woods, they began shedding clothing in an attempt to hide from officers in several thickets. The first offender was apprehended just west of Harlem Avenue in the woods. The other offender managed to flee deeper into the woods. Assisting officers from over 15 different police departments arrived into the area to assist in the manhunt of the other fleeing offender. The Chicago/Cook County Helicopter responded into the area to assist in the search.

The perimeter was established from Harlem Avenue to First Avenue from the railroad tracks to Interstate 55. A short time later the helicopter by use of its thermal imaging equipment identified a suspect who was running through the Canal, west towards First Avenue. It appeared that the offender was attempting to conceal himself within the canal to defeat the police officers efforts to

Both suspected offenders were positively identified as being the offenders from the robbery. Both offenders were transported into the Berwyn Police Station, where they were subsequently criminally charged with Felony Robbery. The driver of the offending vehicle was also charged with Aggravated Fleeing and Eluding.

This was a great job by everybody involved on many different levels:

Tele-communicators managed to juggle the 9-1-1 call reporting the robbery, the GPS Satellite signal depicting the direction of the electronic device, radio traffic on both the Berwyn Police Radio while keeping communication lines open with State wide radios and translating the information and other emergency and non-emergency calls that were being received in communications;

Responding officers preserved the original crime scene at 6905 Ogden Avenue, 47th Street and Harlem at the scene of the crash, established a perimeter, conducted vehicle and foot pursuits, located and recovered discarded property and evidence and apprehended and criminally charged two offenders, all while trying to communicate with assisting agencies with limited communication capabilities.
