- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was given in memory for the 7 Berwyn boys who made the supreme sacrifice in the Korean War, for all Korean War Veterans alive and that have passed on, for the men and women protecting our safety on the streets of Berwyn, in the Armed Forces and for all Veterans.
- 3. The open forum portion of the meeting was announced. There bring no speakers, the open forum portion of the meeting was declared closed.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

Ownership of Century Station, Berwyn 47 LLC, is seeking an agreement with the City of Berwyn to make payment in the aggregate of \$200,000 for the three (3) remaining commercial spaces in lieu of future sales tax.

Berwyn 47 LLC has received strong interest from non-sales tax producing medical tenants and this agreement would serve as an amendment to the prior redevelopment agreement in which commercial tenant end users were to be restricted to those primarily involved in sales tax generating businesses.

If approved, Berwyn 47 LLC will make an initial payment upon execution of \$75,000.00 and three (3) equal payments of \$41,667.00 at lease execution of each remaining commercial space. Attached is the drafted PILOT Agreement for further information.

PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES AGREEMENT

This PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES AGREEMENT is to entered into to confirm and govern the mutual understandings of Berwyn 47 LLC, an Illinois Limited Liability Company, the City of Berwyn, Illinois, an Illinois Municipal Corporation, and the Berwyn Development Corporation, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, regarding the proposed development and use of the real property located at the 6800 block of Stanley Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois and for other consideration the adequacy and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the aforesaid hereby makes the following covenants:

- 1. Acknowledgements; Owner. The Parties (as defined below) acknowledge the existence of that certain Redevelopment Agreement incorporated herein by reference (the "Prior Agreement"). The Prior Agreement, along with the requirements of the City of Berwyn's Downtown Retail Overlay District, govern and apply to the Redevelopment Project Area, including- but not limited to- the use and occupancy of the 3 commercial units (the "Commercial Units" with the tenants of the Commercial Units being the "Commercial Tenants") within the building on the Subject Property. The Parties further acknowledge that there is a general requirement that the Commercial Tenants be restricted to end users primarily involved in sales tax generating businesses (the "Restriction upon Tenants"). The landlord of the Commercial Units (the "Owner") is Berwyn 47 LLC and located at 12 Salt Creek Lane, Suite 200, Hinsdale, Illinois 60521. The Owner, the City of Berwyn, Illinois (the "City"), and the Berwyn Development Corporation (collectively, the "Parties") stipulate that to the extent applicable this is an amendment of the Prior Agreement (See Section 12 of the Prior Agreement).
- 2. Assumption of Duties. Intentionally Omitted.
- 3. Four Corners. The Parties agree that this transaction is comprised of the Prior Agreement this Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement (the "PILOT Agreement") and any attached exhibits and schedules to either of the aforesaid. No other terms claimed to be a part of this PILOT Agreement have been accepted, approved and/or reviewed. Any modification of the PILOT Agreement shall be in writing and effective only when executed by all Parties.
- 4. Integration; Conflicts. The Parties agree that in the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this PILOT Agreement and the terms and provisions of the Prior Agreement, the terms and provisions of this PILOT Agreement shall govern and control. Capitalized terms used and not defined in this PILOT Agreement shall have the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Prior Agreement. Except where specifically modified by this PILOT Agreement, the covenants and terms of the Prior Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 5. Reimbursement Formula. Owner and its preapproved successors and assigns agree to pay the City a sales tax reimbursement payment related to the leasing of the Commercial Units in accordance with the following formula:

- A. The Owner shall make the "Initial Payment" concurrently with execution of this PILOT Agreement. The Initial Payment shall be in the amount of \$75,000.00. The Initial Payment shall be made via wire transfer in accordance with the wire instructions attached hereto as Exhibit A; and
- **B.** Subject to the maximum payment amount set forth in Section 5C below, each time the Owner executes a lease with a Commercial Tenant regarding any of the Commercial Units that does not comply with the Restriction upon Tenants, the Owner shall make a "Lease Commencement Payment(s)". Each Lease Commencement Payment shall be in the amount of \$41,667.00. Each Lease Commencement Payment shall be made via wire transfer in accordance with Exhibit A. The Owner shall notify the City of the forthcoming Lease Commencement Payment a reasonable time prior to the anticipated date of making such Lease Commencement Payment and in no event later than the date that the Owner or the Commercial Tenant makes an application for a Business License under the City Code for the City of Berwyn, Illinois.
- C. The Initial Payment and the Lease Commencement Payments collectively shall be known as the "PILOT Payments". The Parties acknowledge that the sum and total of the PILOT Payments shall be \$200,000 (in the aggregate).
- 6. Satisfaction. The Pilot Payments shall be made to replace and satisfy the Restriction upon Tenants. Any assignment, delegation or other transfer of the rights and duties of this PILOT Agreement shall neither limit nor release the Owner of any of its assignments, covenants, or duties under this PILOT Agreement.
- 7. Supplemental Remedies. As a supplement and not a replacement to the remedies as set forth in the Prior Agreement, the City shall have all available remedies in law and equity available to it in the event of Owner's or as applicable Commercial Tenant's default of this PILOT Agreement or the Prior Agreement. Any breach of the Prior Agreement shall be deemed a breach of the PILOT Agreement.
- **8. Signatories.** The Parties agree that all signatories to this PILOT Agreement have the authority to execute the respective document on behalf of the party to be charged.







Waste Management Contract Extension - 0% Increase for First 18 Months

In 2006, the City of Berwyn signed a contract with Waste Management to provide garbage services through December 31, 2013; that initial contract was extended in 2013 for an additional two years and is set to expire December 31st, 2015.

Over the past several months, staff has met with Waste Management officials in order to negotiate a second extension. The objectives for the extension were: 1) minimize any cost increase 2) maintain current level of service 3) expand services to support electronics recycling program. Staff maintained a hard line and was able to secure the following 3-year contract commitment:

January 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017 (18 months): 0% increase
 July 1, 2017 – December 31, 2018 (18 months): 2.5% increase

In addition to the modest 0% and the 2.5% increases, the City protected all beneficial aspects of the contract including:

- Senior citizen discount of 10%
- 250 free roll-off boxes/year
- \$20/ton recycling rebate returned to the City
- Commercial waste service for 11 events and festivals each year

Furthermore, Waste Management will now provide the City of Berwyn \$24,000/year in order to support the Berwyn Public Works electronics recycling program which was at risk of cancellation due to funding cuts from the State of Illinois.

Finally, in order to increase recycling rates, the City will participate in Waste Management's "Recycle Often, Recycle Right" campaign. This campaign will engage residents by educating them on the importance and best practices for recycling. Not only will increased recycling help the environment, it will also return more money to Berwyn through the \$20/ton recycling rebate clause in the contract.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the approval of the attached three year contract extension and rate modification with Waste Management.

Recommendation to award bid for the Windsor & Gunderson Water main replacement.

Bids were opened publicly and read aloud on August 18, 2015 at 10:00 in the presence of the Deputy City Clerk, a member of the consulting engineering firm assisting with this project, and staff for the above mentioned project. Bids were received from five firms, Unique Plumbing, Kovilic Construction, Gerardi Sewer & Water, Riccio Construction and A Lamp Concrete Contractors. The tabulation of bids is included as page 2 of this document. I have secured the appropriate IEPA permits prior to the letting of this project. All the required pressure tests and chlorination is also part of the contract. Therefore, I recommend to award the Windsor & Gunderson Water main replacement project to the low bidder, Girardi Sewer & Water with a bid amount of \$140,596. In addition staff requests approval of a 10% contingency of \$14,000 for any additional, unexpected items outside of the original scope of services. This project will be funded through reimbursements from ComED and AT&T. With the remainder funded from the utilities fund.

Recommended Actions:

Staff recommends award of the Windsor & Gunderson Water main replacement project to Gerardi Sewer & Water for a total project amount of \$154,596 which includes a \$14,000 contingency.

Curfin Oldsmobile, Inc., d/b/a Currie Motors Auto Credit Outlet, ("Currie Motors") has provided written notice to the City of Berwyn (the "City") of Currie Motors' intent to exercise its option to purchase the real property located at 6550 Ogden Avenue (the "Property") from the City for a purchase price of \$350,000.00. Currie Motors' option to purchase the Property is set forth in Section 12 of the ground lease by and between the City and Currie Motors dated December 10, 2013 (the "Ground Lease") and approved by the Mayor and City Council on December 10, 2013 by Ordinance No. 13-36, a copy of which is attached. The Ground Lease does not provide for a purchase price reduction based on rent paid during the rental term.

The Property is located in one of the City's Redevelopment Project Areas and is the last portion of the former, Anderson Ford property to be conveyed by the City. The City published notice setting forth its intent to enter into the Ground Lease and soliciting alternate proposals for the redevelopment of the Property prior to adopting Ordinance No. 13-36, as required by Section 11-74.4-4(c) of the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act (65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-4(c)).

Currie Motors has advised that it would like to close on the purchase of the Property as soon as possible and, in all events, prior to September 9, 2015 in order to achieve the tax benefits of a like-kind exchange of property under Section 1031 of the Internal Revenue Code (the "1031 Exchange"). The City previously agreed to reasonably cooperate, at no additional cost to the City, in Currie Motor's consummation of this transaction through a 1031 Exchange.

ORDINANCE	
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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 232.03(B) AND ADDING SECTION 232.04 TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES TO CREATE AN AUXILIARY REVIEW BOARD FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to protecting the safety, health and welfare of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Berwyn Police Department (the "Department") is responsible for protecting the rights, welfare and property of City residents, preventing crime and ensuring the safety of individuals residing in and visiting the City; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities previously determined that it was in the best interests of the City and its residents to provide for the appointment of auxiliary police officers to serve the City; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued efficient and effective operation of the Department, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and advisable to establish a review board (the "Auxiliary Review Board") to review candidates' application materials, reports and test results and make decisions regarding the appointment and removal of auxiliary police officers; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the City and its residents to amend

Section 232.03(B) and add Section 232.04 to the Codified Ordinances of Berwyn (the "City Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. That the City Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or City Code section to the contrary, by amending Section 232.03, as follows:

§232.03 AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICERS.

 (\ldots)

(B) Appointment.

Auxiliary police officers shall be appointed or removed from time to time by the Auxiliary Review Board of the City of Berwyn, as defined in Section 232.04 of this Code. The Police Chief may appoint or remove an auxiliary police officer as from time to time deemed necessary to serve the law enforcement needs of the city. An auxiliary police officer will be employed on a part-time basis and shall not function on a full-time basis. An auxiliary police officer shall be considered an "at will" employee subject to removal at any time. An auxiliary police officer shall not be under the jurisdiction of the City Fire and Police Commission.

Section 3. That the City Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or City Code section to the contrary, by adding Section 232.04, as follows:

§232.04 AUXILIARY REVIEW BOARD.

There is hereby created the Auxiliary Review Board of the City of Berwyn. The Auxiliary Review Board shall review application materials, reports and test results from candidates applying to serve as auxiliary police officers, as defined in Section 232.03 of this Code. The Auxiliary Review Board shall make determinations regarding candidates' eligibility and fitness for duty. The Auxiliary Review Board shall have the authority to appoint and remove auxiliary police officers from time to time as deemed necessary to serve the law enforcement needs of the City of Berwyn. Membership on the Auxiliary Review Board shall consist of the Director of Berwyn Emergency Services, the Berwyn Police Division Commander, the Berwyn City Administrator and two (2) residents of the City of Berwyn. The Mayor shall appoint the two (2) resident members of the Auxiliary Review Board, with the advice and consent of the City Council. The two (2) resident members of the Auxiliary Review Board shall serve on an at-will basis for terms of two (2) years or until such earlier times as the Mayor may deem necessary.

Section 4. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 5. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified including, without limitation, the prior appointment of the resident members of the Auxiliary Review Board.

Section 6. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

Section 7. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication or as otherwise provided by law. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 232.03(J) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES REGARDING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to protecting the safety, health and welfare of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Berwyn Police Department (the "Department") is responsible for protecting the rights, welfare and property of City residents, preventing crime and ensuring the safety of individuals residing in and visiting the City; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities previously determined that it was in the best interests of the City and its residents to provide for the appointment of auxiliary police officers to serve the City; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued efficient and effective operation of the Department, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and advisable to condition an individual's appointment to serve as an auxiliary police officer on the successful completion of a psychological examination; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the City and its residents to amend Section 232.03(J) of the Codified Ordinances of Berwyn (the "City Code") as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. That the City Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or City Code section to the contrary, by amending Section 232.03, as follows:

§232.03 AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICERS.

(...)

(J) Qualifications.

- (1) An auxiliary police officer must be of temperate habits, of sound health and must be physically able to perform assigned duties. An auxiliary police officer must provide fingerprints, and must submit to and successfully complete a background check and a psychological examination, and not have a felony arrest or conviction or other crime involving moral turpitude, and must possess a valid and current state driver's license and firearms owner's identification card.
- (2) An auxiliary police officer must be at least 21 years of age. An auxiliary police officer must have at least 20/100 vision correctable to 20/20 and be void of color blindness; must have a high school diploma or G.E.D., college preferred; must have the ability to read, write, speak and understand the English language.

Section 3. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City are specifically authorized and directed to

draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 4. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 5. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication or as otherwise provided by law. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.


