MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL May 13, 2014

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Fejt, Santoy, Polashek, Avila and Laureto.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was given for the family of Elizabeth Gambina, former 5th Ward Alderman and wife of the late 5th Ward Alderman Sal Gambina; Jeanette Marzullo, mother of former Berwyn Chief of Police Frank Marzullo, mother-in-law of Berwyn Police Sgt. William Ruscitti, mother-in-law of former Police Cmdr. Claudio Paolucci, grandmother of Berwyn firefighters Jerry Marzullo and Russell Marzullo; the family of Abel Sandoval, father of State Senator Martin Sandoval and for the men and women protecting our safety on the streets of Berwyn and in the Armed Forces.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Patricia Maietta of 6543 28th Street spoke regarding feral cats. Mayor will refer to Berwyn Building Department and Animal Control. Alderman Avila spoke regarding the Cancer Walk at Jefferson School on May 14 and the Moving Wall fundraiser on Friday May 16, at the 16th Street Bar & Grill. Alderman Fejt spoke regarding the 4th Ward Clean-up event on Saturday May 17 at 9:30 a.m. The Mayor spoke regarding home values and sales increasing in Berwyn.
- 4. Minutes of the Berwyn City Council regular meeting and Committee of the Whole held April 22, 2014, were submitted. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. Alderman Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to suspend the rules and bring forward agenda item J-7. The motion carried by a voice vote. J-7 is a communication from the Secretary of Berwyn Police and Fire Commission regarding Probationary Police Officer Appointments of Matthew Pechota, Salvatore Virzi, Nicholas Mantucca and Sergio Mereno Jr. Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve the appointments as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the Oath of Office.

- 6. Alderman Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to suspend the rules and bring forward agenda item F-1. The motion carried by a voice vote. F-1 is a proclamation from the Mayor proclaiming May 2014 as National Preservation Month. Boyajian made a motion, second by Laureto to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, the Mayor recognized and presented same to Rebecca Houze of the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission. Ms. Houze then presented plaques to the owners of the recent Berwyn Landmarks: Bungalow at 2440 Wesley, (Policastro/Clarke-Doane,) Bungalow at 2532 Wesley, (Walega) and 6945 Riverside Drive, (Dvorak House/Kasparas residence.)
- 7. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding a TIF application for Mike & Sons Auto, 6333 Ogden Avenue. The Mayor recognized Anthony Griffin, Executive Director of the BDC, who reviewed same. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur, approve as submitted in an amount not to exceed \$6,200. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE May 13, 2014

- 1. Mayor Lovero called the Committee of the Whole to order at 6:04 p.m.; upon the call of the roll the following responded present: Chapman, Paul, Fejt, Polashek, Avila and Laureto. Absent: Boyajian and Santoy. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to excuse Alderman Boyajian and Santoy. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 2. The Mayor recognized City Administrator, Brian Pabst for the BNSF update. Pabst reviewed the 9' underground pipeline project just east of Ridgeland Avenue which is almost complete, according to the engineer. Pabst reviewed item J-1 and his recommendation for the commuter facility HVAC be awarded to Martin Aire Heating and Cooling. Additional bid requirements for Oak Park Station, for brick and mortar, will delay the process and completion.
- 3. Financial Audit Report. The Mayor recognized Assistant Finance Director Rasheed Jones, who gave a brief overview of the 2013 financial statements and the future goals. Finance Director David Jelonek and Financial Consultant Dan Denys were available for questions. Denys addressed the goal and process for reducing/eliminating the annual debt refunding, maintaining fund reserves and bond issuance. Jelonek addressed the capital/infrastructure improvement needs as well. Jones reviewed item J-9, line of credit request and its usage to fund bond interest payment due June 1, 2014, noting the short term loan is at a lower interest rate versus a bond issue, with associated fees, for repayment. Also, noting that the December bond call and reissuance will refund the loan. Clerk Pavlik noted that there is an attached resolution to item J-9 for adoption.
- 4. Alderman Laureto noted she will bring forward item K-4 from the consent agenda regarding a rummage sale at the United Church of Christ and will deny the requested May dates, as it will conflict with Memorial Day weekend, but will allow the single date of June 7th.
- 5. The Mayor asked for a motion to close the Committee of the Whole for personnel, real estate and land acquisition. Thereafter, Polashek made a motion, seconded by Avila, to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:54 p.m. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE ____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 801.10 AND 864 AND ADDING CHAPTER 879A TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF BERWYN REGARDING BUSINESS LICENSES FOR CERTAIN BUSINESSES IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the orderly development and operation of businesses within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has received an influx of applications for business licenses and development approvals including, without limitation, building permits and zoning relief (collectively, the "Applications"), for businesses desiring to provide gold and other precious metal selling, buying, or trading, title loan services, payday loan services, pawn shops, and cash/currency exchanges (collectively, the "Businesses") within the City; and

WHEREAS, the current Code of Ordinances of Berwyn (the "City Code") does not impose a limitation on the number of business licenses that the City may issue for the Businesses; and

WHEREAS, in order to, among other things, ensure that businesses located within the City are developed and operated in accordance with the best possible use and to ensure uniformity in the application and enforcement of its licensing and permitting, the policies governing the Businesses must be revised; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that limiting the number of business licenses that may be issued by the City for the Businesses at any one time will create a more stable and prosperous economic environment within the City; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary for the public health, safety, and welfare of the City to implement the limitations by amending Chapters 801.10 and 864 and adding Chapter 879A to the City Code, as set forth herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, through the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1.00 The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2.00 The amendments and additions to the City Code are hereby adopted. The Corporate Authorities hereby approve the amendments and the additions to the City Code, as described below.

Section 3.00 Chapter 801.10 of the City Code is hereby amended as follows:

- (C) *Change of location*. The licensee may change the location of the licensed business, provided that he or she:
 - (1) Approval of License Officer. Obtains written permission from the City License Officer for the change of location; and
 - (2) Fee. Pays a removal fee of \$25 to the License Officer-; and
 - (3) Limitations on Number of Licenses. All limitations on the number of business licenses the City may issue for certain businesses, as set forth in the Code, shall apply to a change of location of such a business and those businesses shall not be grandfathered in.

Section 3.01 Chapter 864.01 of the City Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 864.01 LICENSE REQUIRED.

No person shall operate a business selling, buying, or trading precious metals or gems, including without limitation, cash for gold businesses or other similar businesses, without first obtaining a business license therefor from the City Collector and paying the scheduled fee.

Section 3.02 Chapter 864.06 is hereby added to the City Code as follows:

§864.06 LIMITATION OF NUMBER OF LICENSES.

The total number of business licenses for businesses selling, buying, or trading precious metals or gems issued and in force at any one time shall not exceed two.

Section 3.03 Chapter 879A.01 is hereby added to the City Code as follows:

§8.79A.01 LICENSE REQUIRED.

No person shall engage in the business of operating a pawn shop or providing title loan services, payday loan services, or cash/currency exchange services without first obtaining a business license thereof, if more than fifty-one percent of the business's total annual revenue is derived from providing the above outlined services or a combination thereof.

Section 3.04 Chapter 879A.02 is hereby added to the City Code as follows:

§879A.02 LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF LICENSES.

The total number of business licenses issued at any one time under this Chapter shall not exceed the following limitations set forth below:

Pawn shops....2

<u>Title loan services.... 2</u>

Payday loan services....2

Cash/currency exchange services....3

If the maximum number of licenses has been reached for any of the above-outlined businesses, existing business licenses holders cannot expand their businesses by more than ten (10%) or relocate their existing business locations. Additionally, the City License Officer may deny a business license regulated by this Chapter, if the number of existing business licenses currently issued is over the above-outlined limitations.

Section 3.05 Chapter 879A.03 is hereby added to the City Code as follows: §879A.03 PENALTY.

See § 202.99 for general code penalty if no specific penalty is provided.

Section 4.00 The officers, employees, and/or agents of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees, and/or agents of the City are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 5.00 All prior actions of the City's officials, employees, and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 6.00 The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute, or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable, and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid, and in full force and effect.

Section 7.00 All ordinances, resolutions, rules, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Purchase of Ford E350 Van for Recreation Department

The Recreation Department has historically used the Police Explorer passenger van for day camp purposes during the summer months. Due to the exciting rise in Police Explorer participation and programming, it is no longer feasible for the two departments to share the van.

In an effort to mitigate the expense of a new van, staff initiated an exhaustive search for a used, high quality passenger van. Joe Rizza Ford was able to provide an exemplary vehicle at a reasonable price. Attached to this memo, please find the price quote for a 2010 Ford E350 Super Duty Van.

Due to the nature of purchasing used vehicles, it is nearly impossible to find exact cost comparisons between competing vendors. In order to ensure a fiscally responsible decision, staff used the industry leading Kelly Blue Book to determine value. The provided Kelly Blue Book Value report places a similar vehicle at a cost of \$17,990 however staff was able to negotiate the total price down to \$16,694; a savings of \$1,296. In addition to the cost savings, staff negotiated a 7-year/100,000-mile power train warranty as well as a 12-month/12,000-mile comprehensive warranty. The van is being offered through the manufacturer as a certified pre-owned vehicle.

Joe Rizza Ford advised that they may not be able to hold the vehicle. Therefore, I am requesting immediate approval. The monies are budgeted in the Recreation Department capital line item.

Recommendation:

Approve the purchase of a Ford E350 van from Rizza Ford in the amount \$16,694.
