PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, autism is a complex neurological disease and developmental disability that robs children of social skills, the ability to talk, interact and do the normal things that are often taken for granted, transcending all social, cultural and geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the CDC recently announced another alarming increase in autism affecting "one in every sixty-eight children" born today and affects boys nearly five times the level of girls (1 in 42 boys & 1 in 189 girls). It has been diagnosed at a higher rate than pediatric aids, juvenile diabetes, down's syndrome, cerebral palsy and all pediatric cancers combined and is considered to be our country's number one medical condition afflicting children today and is considered among the fastest growing global public health crisis; and (30% increase since 2008, 78% increase from 2002, recent increase is noted by 2010 numbers). *Source Center for Disease Controls (CDC)

WHEREAS, autism is treatable through early diagnosis, early intervention including critical intensive medically necessary therapies such as speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, ABA therapy, RDI floor time, and other behavior therapies, combined with medical interventions have been proven to be extremely effective often unlocking the world of autism to enable these beautiful children the ability to communicate and interact with the ultimate goal of an independent and fulfilling productive life; and

WHEREAS, the month of April is World Autism Month and the global autism community will celebrate the seventh annual United Nations-sanctioned World Autism Awareness Campaign to bring awareness. World Autism Awareness Day (WAAD), celebrated on April 2 annually, was adopted by the United Nations in 2007 to shine a bright light on autism as a growing global health crisis. WAAD activities increase and develop world knowledge of the autism crisis and impart information regarding the importance of early diagnosis and early intervention. Additionally, WAAD celebrates the unique talents and skills of persons with autism and is a day when individuals with autism are warmly welcomed and embraced in community events around the globe. Autism is one of only three health issues to be recognized by the United Nations with its own day.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert J. Lovero, Mayor of the City of Berwyn do hereby proclaim the month of April 2014 as Autism Awareness Month in the City of Berwyn to promote awareness and early detection of autism and ask residents to recognize April as "World Autism Awareness Month."

Re: Recent Grant Awards - Informational

Members of City Council:

It is my pleasure to inform you that over the past two weeks, staff has been extremely effective in achieving grant awards for the City of Berwyn. The recent announcements are as follows:

- IHDA Abandon Properties Program \$75,000: The Illinois Housing Development Authority determined that the
 City of Berwyn's Blight Division was a novel and effective method at stabilizing neighborhoods with foreclosures.
 As such, they have agreed to reimburse the City for uncollectible invoices for property maintenance such as
 mowing and board ups. Berwyn was awarded the maximum amount possible through this grant.
- IDOT ITEP East Avenue Bike Plan Implementation \$12,240: This project will consist of installing shared lane
 markings along one of Berwyn's designated bicycle ways, East Avenue. The project will assist the City in
 implementing its City-wide bike plan. The City has placed bike route and destination signage along this particular
 route; the next step is to place pavement markings to further remind drivers that this street is a shared route.
- IDOT ITEP City of Berwyn Sidewalk Improvements \$82,040: This project consists of the installation of sidewalks along City and State owned arterials and collector routes. In addition, it will enhance the existing transportation network and improve the attractiveness and the aesthetics of the area.
- IDOT ITEP Citywide Bike Route Signs \$15,120: The project will consist of installing bike route signage and destination signage along the City's bike network. The City started to sign its bike network in 2011. Positive feedback has been received from bicyclists, pedestrians and drivers. All users of the network indicated that the destination signs are very informational, and the bike route signage has made drivers aware that bicyclists may be within the right-of-way.
- IDOT ITEP Depot District Beautification \$1,535,030: This project will improve the Berwyn Depot District transit corridor by adding visually attractive infrastructure elements, correct non-compliant ADA issues on sidewalks, and retrofit an existing signalized intersection with preemption for emergency vehicles going to the adjacent hospital. Furthermore the area will experience an increase in ridership at the Oak Park Avenue, Harlem Avenue and LaVergne Metra-BNSF commuter rail station by significantly enhancing the transportation experience.

Finally, please join me in acknowledging Nicole Campbell and Evan Summers for all of their hard work and professionalism. Through their efforts, they have brought in over \$1.7 million in this round of grant funding alone.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE FOR A GROUP MEDICAL CENTER IN THE C-2 GENERAL COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICT AT 7000-7002 W. CERMAK ROAD, BERWYN, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, a request seeking a conditional use to operate a group medical center in the one-story commercial building located at 7000-7002 W. Cermak, Berwyn, Illinois, (the "Subject Property"), in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, was filed by Oak Street Health MSO, LLC (the "Applicant") with the City of Berwyn; and

WHEREAS, a group medical center requires a conditional use in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District pursuant to the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property is legally described in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the application has been referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City ("Board of Appeals") and has been processed in accordance with the Zoning Code, as amended; and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2014, the Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the Application pursuant to notice thereof given in the manner required by law, and, after considering all of the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing, the Board of Appeals recommended approval of the Application by a vote of 7-0, all as set forth in the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals in this matter ("Findings and Recommendation"), a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City have duly considered the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals, and all of the materials, facts and circumstances affecting the Application, and, in accordance with the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals, find that the Application satisfies the standards set forth in Section 1268.05 of the Zoning Code relating to conditional uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County and State of Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: <u>Incorporation</u>. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Section 1 by reference as findings of the City Council.

Section 2: Approval of Conditional Use for a Group Medical Center. The City Council, acting pursuant to the authority vested in it by the laws of the State of Illinois and the Zoning Code, hereby approves a conditional use permit for a group medical

center to locate in the vacant, one-story commercial building in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District on the Subject Property located at 7000-7002 W. Cermak, Road, Berwyn, Illinois, as legally described in **Exhibit A**.

<u>Section 3:</u> <u>Violation of Condition or Code</u>. Any violation of any term or condition stated in this Ordinance or of any applicable code, ordinance, or regulation of the City shall be grounds for the immediate rescission by the City Council of the approvals made in this Ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>: <u>Severability and Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances</u>. Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the unconstitutionality or invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>: <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE CITY OF BERWYN ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL

April 15, 2014

APPLICATION:

For a Conditional Use to Allow for a Group Medical

Center in a C-2 General Commercial Zoning District at

7000-7002 Cermak Road, Berwyn, Illinois.

PETITIONER:

"Property")

SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION: The City of Berwyn has received a request from Petitioner Oak Street Health MSO, LLC ("Petitioner") for a conditional use to operate a group medical center in an existing one-story commercial building within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District at 7000-7002 W. Cermak. Group Medical Centers require a conditional use in order to locate at the Property, pursuant to Section 1258.02 of the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code").

Following a public hearing held on April 15, 2014, the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City of Berwyn ("ZBA") recommended approval of the requested conditional use on a vote of 7-0.

BACKGROUND: The Property is an existing one-story commercial structure that has been vacant for some time and is in disrepair. Petitioner proposes to rehabilitate the building and to then locate and operate a group medical center within the building, pursuant to a site plan that proposes to occupy the entirety of the building (approximately 9,400 square feet) on the Property.

Staff determined that a conditional use was required pursuant to the use provisions of the Zoning Code. Petitioner then filed an application requesting that the ZBA grant a conditional use to allow the proposed use at the Property.

PUBLIC HEARING: At the public hearing on Petitioner's conditional use request held on April 15, 2014, representatives of Petitioner described the history and evolution of their practice and its mission to serve the elderly. They seek to serve Medicare patients and elderly patients on fixed incomes. They strive to be a community center; more than just a doctor. Representatives of Petitioner included attorney Bernard Citron, Chief Operating Officer Geoff Price, Vice President of Operations Andrew Leventhal, Property Owner Representative Timothy Hague, and Architect Gil Magnelli.

In the opinion of Petitioner's representatives, the Center will be a benefit to retail development in the area, rather than a detriment, and will have no negative impact. It was noted that the Property had not been a retail use for more than twenty (20) years.

Geoff Price, Chief Operating Officer and a founder of Petitioner spoke. He described the community activities provided at Petitioner's other facilities (Portage Park and Edgewater neighborhoods in Chicago). He also described the mission of Petitioner to take a preventative approach to chronic health problems in the elderly in order to ease the high social burden of such problems.

The average doctor visit is 35 minutes – the elderly need time to talk about their overall health. A model like that proposed for Petitioner has been shown to lower mortality rates and hospital admissions. Petitioner wants to open in Berwyn due to the growing population of diverse older individuals in the community. There will be two (2) full-time physicians to start, and may eventually be as many as five (5). There will be a nurse, social worker and medical assistant for each doctor. Dental care will be provided as well. The practice will be primary care and dental.

Most patients will not drive; almost all will arrive via public transit or a van provided by Petitioner. There will be no issues with parking.

Hours of operation will be 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. They may be open later on Saturday or a particular weekday(s) but generally will be open the same time as retail.

Petitioner expects to have approximately thirty (30) employees. They have had a job fair in Berwyn.

Andrew Leventhal, Vice President of Operations for Petitioner spoke next. There will be a community room in the front of the facility. There will typically be no wait time at the facility – that is part of the value-based system on which Petitioner operates. There will be a community room coordinator who will talk with patients and run any programming, including the provision of computer services, coffee and television. There will also be a conference room. All programming is free and open to the public, not just patients. Petitioner will open the space to community events and groups when not in use.

The dental portion of the practice will be toward the front. There will also be exam rooms. The doctors work in a common area. Some medication will be dispensed on a limited basis for extreme cases.

Retail in the vicinity of Petitioner's other facilities was described. Petitioner works with local stores and elected officials. Petitioner likes to hire locally and to build relationships. Petitioner will do ongoing community outreach and education. Petitioner typically partners with other groups to promote and co-sponsor in making their outreach efforts (monthly luncheons, craft fairs, etc.). Petitioner will work with social service organizations that provide senior services, and with the Township.

Petitioner has taken steps to purchase parking permits for employees. Eight (8) have been purchased so far.

Tim Hague of property owner Keystone Ventures also spoke. Keystone bought the Property as part of the Cermak/Harlem redevelopment to create a Berwyn gateway. The Property was acquired a little over a year ago. Keystone is working the City of Berwyn to redevelop the two blocks to the west of the block on which Petitioner's property is located and plans 17,000 square feet of new retail development. Redevelopment of the Property for a retail use would create parking issues as the existing building uses the whole lot. The building will be gutted down to the masonry. The building was once a cosmetology school. Hague thinks Petitioner's use will work well with retail that is being added in the immediate area. He sees no negative impact from Keystone's perspective; Keystone has big plans and likes Petitioner's proposed use. He has visited Petitioner's Portage Park location — there is no dead space in front and the use acts as an attraction. Petitioner invests in the community. Petitioner produces no noise or smoke. There may be a slight effect on traffic, but a retail use would contribute more traffic.

Exhibits marked during the course of the Public Hearing included: Exhibit 1, the published legal notice regarding the public hearing, and accompanying Certification of Publication. The Executive Secretary noted for the record that notice of the public hearing had been published on March 27, 2014, in accordance with the Zoning Code. Exhibit 2 consisted of the full application for the relief sought by Petitioner. Exhibit 3 was a folder containing an overview of Oak Street Health, a "Welcome" packet given to patients, and other materials. Exhibit 4 was a power point presentation.

Various members of the ZBA asked questions of Petitioner's representatives. It was established during questioning that Petitioner will have a 15-year lease with a 5-year option, Petitioner has had talks with the City about a drop-off zone, Petitioner is not affiliated with any particular local hospitals, but instead works with them all, Petitioner is IDPH certified, the doctors at the site will be the patient's primary care physicians, the building will be sprinklered, there will be no kitchen, about 30% of patients are expected to come from a 1 mile radius, with 70% coming from a three (3) mile radius, and that the JenCare Group Medical Center is two (2) miles to the east on Cermak and is owned by an insurance company.

There being no further questions or members of the public wishing to speak on the application, the Public Hearing was closed.

The Area Investigator appointed in this matter was ZBA Chair Joel Chrastka. Chairman Chrastka discussed his investigation, commenting on the lot, Petitioner's other facilities, the parking situation and the single-family residential uses in the area. Chairman Chrastka noted that there are a number of other medical offices in the area. He distributed notices in the area and met with representatives of Petitioner and Keystone.

The other members of the ZBA each then in turn expressed their views on the proposed conditional use.

Chairman Chrastka made a motion to recommend to the City Council that it approve the request of Petitioner for a conditional use to operate a group medical center in the commercial building on the Property at 7000-7002 W. Cermak. The motion was seconded by Executive Secretary Malina. The vote on the motion was seven (7) in favor and zero (0) against.

FINDINGS: The ZBA makes the following Findings as to the proposed Conditional Use:

- (A) The proposed use and development at the particular location requested is necessary or desirable, provides a service or a facility which is in the interest of public convenience and will contribute to the general welfare of the neighborhood or community. The ZBA felt that Petitioner's mission of serving seniors in the area was both necessary and desirable. The testimony of Petitioner and the property owner established that this site was not particularly appropriate for retail and the proposed medical use would complement nearby retail uses. The community-based approach of Petitioner will contribute to the general welfare of the neighborhood and community.
- (B) The proposed use and development will, under the circumstances of the particular case, not be detrimental to the health, safety, morals or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity, or injurious to property values or improvements in the vicinity. The members of the ZBA felt the proposed use, including the community room, would benefit the general community and property values in the vicinity by providing a needed service, and would have no negative impact on the area. The rehabilitation and use of a long vacant building would provide benefits to the neighborhood.
- (C) The proposed use and development will be in harmony with the general and specific purposes for which the Zoning Code was enacted, and for which the regulations of the district in question were established, and with the general purpose and intent of the Official Comprehensive Plan. The members of the ZBA felt that the proposed use would provide a complement to the existing and planned retail uses in the immediate area, and was consistent with the goals and purposes of the Zoning Code.
- (D) The proposed use and development will be constructed, arranged and operated so as not to dominate the immediate vicinity or to interfere with the use and development of neighboring property. The proposed use will complement the existing and planned retail uses in the immediate vicinity, and will not therefore hinder the use and development of this portion of Cermak Road.
- (E) The proposed use and development will be served adequately by essential public facilities and services such as streets, public utilities, drainage structures, police and fire protection, refuse disposal, parks, libraries and schools, or the applicant will provide adequately for the services. The public facilities and services necessary to serve the Petitioner are already in place.

- (F) The proposed use and development will not cause undue traffic congestion nor draw significant amounts of traffic through residential streets. By providing transportation services, Petitioner has helped alleviate any risk that the use will cause undue traffic congestion.
- (G) The proposed use and development will be served by parking areas that are of adequate size, properly located and suitably screened from adjoining residential uses. While there is no on-site parking, the parking traffic to be generated by Petitioner is expected to be minimal. Petitioner is exploring with the City the possibility of creating a drop-off zone.
- (H) The proposed use and development will not result in the destruction, loss or damage of natural, scenic or historic features of significant importance. The proposed use will be in an existing vacant building and commercial space.
- (I) The proposed use and development will comply with the regulations and conditions specified in the Zoning Code for the use, and with the stipulations and conditions made a part of the authorization granted by Council.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Based upon the foregoing Findings, the ZBA, by a vote of 7-0, recommends to the Mayor and City Council that the conditional use requested by Petitioner Oak Street Health MSO, LLC for operation of a group medical center at the Property at 7000-7002 W. Cermak Road, Berwyn, Illinois, in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, be approved. The use should be conditioned on the obtaining of dedicated parking spaces for employees and the ability to operate Monday through Saturday.

Re: Minutes for the Parking and Traffic Committee Meeting of April 15, 2014

Ladies and Gentlemen:

A meeting of the Parking and Traffic Committee was called to order on April 15, 2014 at 5:30 p.m. in the 2nd floor conference room of City Hall. Members of the committee in attendance were Alderman Polashek, Alderman Avila, and Alderman Paul. City staff attending included Robert Schiller, Nicole Campbell, Marcia Cohen, Jeanette Rendon, and Margo Ramondi. Alderman Fejt attended the meeting as a guest.

Parking Sticker Fee Policy for 2014:

City staff informed the committee about the preparations made to handle the new parking sticker fee policy. The chair called for suggestions on how to publicize the new fees and the sticker sales start date. Nicole Campbell will provide Aldermen with an electronic copy of a flier that can be sent out to contact lists and residents. Ald. Avila volunteered to contact School District 98 and the North Berwyn Park District and ask them to put the information on respective web sites. Ald. Paul will contact District 100, District 201 and the Berwyn Park District. The committee will ask the council to assist in spreading the word about the parking sticker fee structure. Also discussed was a plan to have yard signs printed and displayed in areas with a lot of visibility. Since there is no budget for advertising/promotion, the committee will ask the other aldermen to pay for the costs of the signs out of their expense accounts if the price of printing seems feasible.

Parking Sticker Fees for 2015:

At the request of Ald. Polashek, the committee briefly discussed the merits of waiving the parking sticker fee for all members of the Armed Services. This would expand the class of residents who currently receive free parking stickers. The committee plans to revisit this issue at a later time following the conclusion of the roll out of the new 2014 policy.

Handicapped Parking:

Ms. Cohen advised the committee of issues the Berwyn Police Department and the Public Works Department have concerning residents failing to submit their handicapped parking renewals in a timely fashion. Residents are notified that they must renew their handicapped parking permits two months prior to the December deadline. Residents who fail to renew are sent two reminders. Staff states that those who fail to renew at that point do so only after the signs have been taken down.

The fee for renewal is \$10.00/year. The cost of installation of signs and posts is approximately \$75.00. This amount does not include the cost of approximately 2 man hours of labor to the City.

A discussion ensued as to how we could encourage residents to renew in a timely fashion. The committee members and staff agreed that charging residents a fee of \$55.00 to re-install handicapped parking signs after they had been removed for failure to renew would be appropriate. Staff also recommended changing the renewal period by moving up the renewal date to October would also help staff over see the process. Staff will draft changes to the City Ordinance. The committee will convene to review the draft at a later date and then submit it to the City Council.

Street Sweeping and Parking on 26th Street:

Ms. Campbell advised the committee about complaints from business owners on 26th St. about the lack of parking. Specifically, Ms. Campbell had conducted a study and found that there was a need for 2 hour parking in certain sections of 26th Street to accommodate customer parking. Compounding the parking problem was the fact that on two days per week, cars were prohibited from parking either on the north or south side due to the street sweeping schedule. Ms. Campbell presented the committee with a plan to include 2 hour parking regulations in certain areas of 26th street and a revised street sweeping schedule. The plans met with committee and staff approval. Ms. Campbell will work to revise the parking ordinances relating to the change and present the revisions to the City Council.

With all business of the committee concluded, the Chair ended the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

At the council meeting of January 28, 2014, council approved the drafting of an agreement between the Berwyn Public Health Department, the Township of Berwyn, and the City of Berwyn regarding emergency cooperation. That agreement included the hiring of a SNS mass dispensing volunteer coordinator whose salary of \$12,000.00 is to be split equally among the three entities. This agreement is set for a two year period; the three parties shall meet to discuss continued and future funding before the end of the two year period.

The position of SNS mass dispensing volunteer coordinator was advertised; the applications were then reviewed by the planning team consisting of Anthony Laureto (NIMS/Emergency Management Coordinator,) John Novacek (Department of Homeland Security,) Mayor Lovero, and Township Supervisor Pechous. The planning team recommends the hiring of Gregory Pyshny to the position of SNS mass dispensing volunteer coordinator. His resume and NIMS certifications are attached for review.

I ask that you concur with my recommendation of the hiring of Mr. Gregory Pyshny to the position of SNS mass dispensing volunteer coordinator.

For over 15 years, the West Cook Municipal Conference (WCMC) has partnered with Perspectives, Ltd. to administer an affordable and effective Employee Assistance Program (EAP) to member communities. By pooling all of the member communities under one account, WCMC has achieved an economy of scale which controls costs.

Staff has spent the past month investigating the EAP to analyze its benefits and has determined the following:

- Participation in the EAP would provide a low-cost enhancement to the City of Berwyn benefits package;
- Would provide management with additional tools to work through human resource issues;
- The City is contractually required to offer an EAP in accordance with Local 506's contract.

The EAP will cost the City of Berwyn \$17.61 per employee per year and will only cover benefit eligible employees; this equates to a total of \$6,093.06.

Recommendation:

Staff requests the approval of the attached contract and initiate an employee assistance program for eligible employees.

CONSULTING AGREEMENT

THIS CONSULTING AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of the 1st day of January 2008, by and between PERSPECTIVES, LTD., an Illinois corporation, ("Perspectives") and the West Central Municipal Conference (the "Client").

Perspectives is a consulting firm that provides services related to the development, implementation, and management of Employee Assistance Programs ("EAPs") and WorkLife services; and

Client intends to offer EAP & WorkLife services to organizations choosing to participate in the Client's EAP Consortium ("Customers"); and

Client desires to retain Perspectives to perform certain services for its Customers (as listed in Appendix A) and Perspectives desires to perform such services, all upon the terms and conditions set forth herein;

In consideration of the premises set forth above, the promises and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Client and Perspectives agree as follows:

- 1. Term. Unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided, the term of this Agreement (the "Term") will consist of an initial term and one extension term. The initial term (the "Initial Term") will be for two year(s), commencing on January 1, 2008, and ending on December 31, 2009. The Initial Term can be extended for one additional year through December 31, 2010 (the "First Extension Term"), by the Executive Director of Client serving written notice on Perspectives. Failure of Client to provide notice of its desire to extend this Agreement through the First Extension Term shall not result in the automatic renewal of this Agreement and this Agreement shall end on December 31, 2009. Should this Agreement be extended through the First Extension Term, the compensation for any services provided by Perspectives shall be in accordance with the rates set forth in Section 3A of this Agreement, unless the compensation is otherwise renegotiated by the parties and set forth in a written amendment to this Agreement, signed by authorized representatives of Perspectives and Client.
- 2. <u>Services of Perspectives</u>. Perspectives will provide the following EAP and WorkLife services to Client and its Customers:
 - A. Implementation Services to be provided in the Initial Year:
 - 1. Program design services, which will include an Implementation/Reintroduction Planning Meeting with each Customer to review the full scope of EAP services, establish EAP policies and procedures develop implementation and program promotion strategies and gather healthcare benefit coverage for cases needing referral.
 - 2. Unlimited EAP Core Supervisory Training sessions, including manuals, for Customers.

- 3. Unlimited Employee Orientation sessions for Customers.
- 4. Preparation of a letter describing EAP and WorkLife services that is to be sent by Customers to their employees' home address. Perspectives will also provide a refrigerator magnet for this mailing in late 2007 or early 2008.
- 5. Unlimited brochures, posters and wallet cards for program promotion.
- B. Additional Annual Training and Program Promotion:
 - 1. Unlimited brochures, posters and wallet cards for program promotion.
 - 2. Up to 32 hours annually of seminars and training (above and beyond the Core Supervisory Training and Employee Orientations cited in 2A2, 2A3, 2B6 and 2B7 of this Agreement). Perspectives will also provide 8 additional hours of seminars per calendar year directly to the Brookfield Zoo. Seminars and training, (other than those cited in 2A2, 2A3, 2B6 and 2B7 of this Agreement), beyond 32 hours in a year plus 8 hours for Brookfield will be billed at \$150.00 per hour.
 - 3. Perspectives will provide the following monthly program promotion items to the Client for distribution to Customers:
 - > Front Line Supervisor newsletter
 - > Employee article or payroll stuffer
 - > Perspectives Online e-mailer
 - > Perspectives HR/liaison newsletter
 - 4. Perspectives will participate in Visibility Tables, Health Fairs and other on-site promotional activities.
 - 5. For new Customers signing on after Year One of this Agreement, program design services, which will include an Implementation Planning Meeting to review the full scope of EAP services, establish EAP policies and procedures, develop implementation and program promotion strategies and gather healthcare benefit coverage for cases needing referral.
 - 6. For new Customers signing on after Year One of this Agreement, unlimited EAP Core Supervisory Training sessions, including manuals, for Customers to implement the program.
 - 7. For new Customers signing on after Year One of this Agreement, unlimited Employee Orientation sessions for Customers to implement the program.
- C. Services to Employees, Families and Significant Others:
 - 1. Perspectives Online will provide online access to articles, self-guided assessments, links, calculators and information in the following areas:

- emotional well being, family & care giving, health & wellness, working well and daily living.
- 2. Perspectives will provide a professional masters-level staffed Call Center and 24-hour, toll-free access to its master's level clinical staff.
- 3. Perspectives will provide assessment and referral services to Customers' employees, their spouses, dependents and significant others (collectively referred to as "Participants"), which services will be conducted in from one (1) to three (3) sessions per Participant. Referrals, when necessary, will be made to pre-screened providers and will be coordinated with the Customers' insurance when appropriate.
- 4. Perspectives will provide the Substance Abuse Professional services required under the Department of Transportation regulations.
- 5. Perspectives will provide brief goal-focused counseling of up to 10 sessions to those Participants for whom, in the sole discretion of Perspectives, such counseling will be effective.
- 6. Perspectives will monitor and provide follow-up services to all Participants for up to two (2) years after the initial meeting of the Participant with Perspectives.
- 7. Perspectives will cause to be provided by work/life contractors ("Work/Life Contractors") financial consultation as follows:
 - (a) Customers' employees and their family members will have access to the Financial Connection program, which will offer the following services:
 - (1) Debt Counseling: Referral to consumer credit counseling agencies.
 - (2) Financial Planning Consultation: Free consultation with financial planners regarding taxes, college planning, retirement planning and investment strategies.



D. HR/Management Consultation:

- 1. Upon the request of a Customer supervisor, Perspectives will consult with the supervisor concerning the problems of an individual employee and make recommendations to the supervisor as to how to encourage the employee to participate in the EAP, if Perspectives determines such participation in the EAP is appropriate or advisable.
- 2. Perspectives will provide consultation in EAP and WorkLife-related HR Policy development (i.e. DOT, Sexual Harassment, Substance Abuse, Workplace Violence, Disaster Preparedness, etc.).

E. Additional Services:

- 1. Perspectives will submit its standard report on the utilization of the EAP on a quarterly basis as follows: aggregate consortium summary after the 1st and 3rd quarters; aggregate consortium full report with individual Customer reports at the 2nd and 4th quarters.
- 2. Perspectives will be available to assist in defusing and debriefing members involved in unpredictable traumatic workplace events.
- 3. Perspectives will assign an Account Manager to coordinate the administrative activities of EAP and WorkLife services.
- 4. Perspectives will be available to present its services, both written and inperson, to organizations interested in joining the WCMC EAP Consortium and to WCMC-related organizations with constituencies potentially interested in the WCMC EAP Consortium.
- F. Optional Services the following services are available to those Customers that choose to offer them to their employees and their employees' families for the additional fees quoted in Section 3C of this Agreement:

Perspectives will cause to be provided by work/life contractors ("Work/Life Contractors") dependent care resource and referral and legal consultation as follows:

- 1. Customers' employees and their family members will have access to the Family Resource Link program, which will offer the following services:
- (a) Child and Elder Care Employee Education: Educational materials regarding child care, elder care and other related issues will be provided to employees and family members calling for assistance on these issues. These include "How To Choose" booklets re: childcare, elder care and pet care as well as a variety of tip sheets.
- (b) Child and Elder Care Resource and Referral: Provider profiles will be made available for employees and family members calling and/or visiting Family Resource Link Online for resources for child care, elder care,

- adoption, summer camp, college planning, tutoring and other related issues.
- (c) LiveConnect will provide 24/7 web access to WorkLife consultants.
- (d) Provision of quarterly LifeLine newsletter and tip sheets.
- (e) Availability to our monthly WorkLife webinar.
- (f) Convenience and Concierge Services: Referrals to convenience services such as pet care, home repair, cleaning/errand/shopping services, house/apartment sitters. Concierge services which will assist in finding and/or coordinating in the following areas entertainment, event planning, gift services, personal reminders, ticket alerts, family activities.
- 2. Customers' employees and their family members will have access to the Legal Connection program, which will offer the following services:
- (a) Legal Consultation: Free phone consultation with an attorney and, when necessary, referral to an attorney, which includes a one-half (1/2) hour free in-person consultation and a twenty-five percent (25%) fee discount.
- (b) Will Preparation: After a phone consultation, an attorney will provide a will kit for will preparation.
- G. Other Services Perspectives is available to develop programs beyond the scope of the EAP that would bring our expertise and services to Client and Customer constituents other than the employees of the Customers.

3. Compensation.

A. For the services provided for in Sections 2A through 2E of this Agreement, during the Initial Term and the First Extension Term, Client agrees to pay Perspectives a per employee per year fee based on the full WCMC EAP Consortium employee census as detailed below. The number of employees Perspectives will use to bill will be the number covered by all participating Customers in the WCMC EAP consortium. However, the census used to identify the per employee per year fee in the table below will include the number of employees covered by Perspectives through its EAP contract with the Village of Oak Park.

- B. For the services described in Section 2F of this Agreement, the Client will pay Perspectives a fee of \$4.20 per employee per year for Customers' employees covered in the Family Resource Link program and \$1.32 per employee per year for Customers' employees covered in the Legal Connection program. These fees apply only to those Customers that choose to offer these particular programs to their employees and employees' families. However, if all Customers, at any one time, determined to offer these programs to their employees and employees' families, the above fees would be reduced to \$3.60 per employee per year and \$1.20 per employee per year respectively. If all Customers chose to offer these programs, then new Customers coming into the consortium for the six months following the inclusion of Family Resource Link and Legal Connection for all Customers would have these reduced prices extended to them.
- C. For the services provided for in Section 2A through 2F of this Agreement, for any additional Extension Terms, Client and Perspectives shall negotiate in good faith as to the fee that Client shall pay Perspectives for each such Extension Term. Any change in the fee for any Extension Term thereafter will be memorialized in a written amendment to this Agreement, signed by authorized representatives of Perspectives and Client.
- D. Client shall promptly reimburse Perspectives for all expenses incurred on behalf of Client should the Client want to produce a tailored brochure or other tailored materials. Perspectives agrees to provide Client with documentation of any such expenses.
- E. [OPTION 1] During each year of the Term, Client shall pay the fee due to Perspectives in a lump sum annual payment within thirty (30) days of the commencement of the year based on the current WCMC census as defined in Section 3A. If paid annually, the fee will be reduced by 5%. During the course of the calendar year, the parties will reconcile for any necessary adjustments due to changes in the employee census as a result of Customers being added or subtracted from the WCMC EAP Consortium. Client will pay Perspectives a prorated amount for new Customers entering the WCMC EAP Consortium during a program year.

4. Additional Obligations of Client.

In addition to Client's obligations under Section 3 of this Agreement, Client shall:

- A. provide a positive endorsement of the EAP and WorkLife services to Customers' supervisors, employees, and their families;
- B. notify Perspectives of any complaints about EAP or Work/Life services within a reasonable time and assist in their investigation and resolution.
- C. provide Perspectives with an accurate employee census on a quarterly basis.
- 5. <u>Confidentiality</u>. The parties recognize and agree that the EAP and WorkLife records of Participants are confidential and shall not be disclosed without the consent of the Participant. The EAP records of Participants shall be retained by Perspectives.

6. Location and Timing of Services.

- A. Orientation, training sessions, and seminars will be held at locations mutually agreed upon by the Client and/or Customers and Perspectives.
- B. Assessment and referral services will be provided at the offices of Perspectives or its affiliates or at any other site that Perspectives designates.
- 7. Payment for Referral Services. The costs of any and all services performed by community resources are not the responsibility of Perspectives. Participants who will be referred for services not covered under the EAP will be informed that the costs of such services will be their responsibility.
- 8. Solicitation of Employees. During the Term, and for a period of twelve (12) months after its termination for any reason, Client or Customers shall not induce, influence, or cause, or seek to induce, influence, or cause, any person who is engaged by Perspectives as an employee to terminate his or her employment with Perspectives, or, directly or indirectly, employ or engage, or solicit for employment or engagement, or advise or recommend to any other person or entity that such person or entity employ or engage or solicit for employment or engagement, any person employed by Perspectives during any portion of the Term. During the Term, and for a period of twelve (12) months after its termination for any reason, Perspectives shall not induce, influence, or cause, or seek to induce, influence, or cause, any person who is engaged by Client or Customers as an employee to terminate his or her employment with Client or Customers, or, directly or indirectly, employ or engage, or solicit for employment or engagement, or advise or recommend to any other person or entity that such person or entity employ or engage or solicit for employment or engagement, any person employed by Client or Customers during any portion of the Term.

9. Insurance.

A. Perspectives shall maintain professional liability insurance in ISO form or other form which provides coverage at least as broad, with a minimum combined single limit of One Million and No/100 U.S. Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). The abovementioned policy shall name Client as an

- additional insured and any other insurance or self-insurance maintained by Client shall be in excess to and shall not contribute to the protection Client receives as an additional insured on the insurance required by this Agreement.
- B. Perspectives further agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Client and Customers from and against any claim, loss, damage, liability, demand, penalty, cause of action, cost or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of and to the extent of any act, error, or omission of Perspectives in the performance of this Agreement.
- C. Client and Customers agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Perspectives from and against any claim, loss, damage, liability, cost or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of and to the extent of any act, error, or omission of Client and/or Customers in the performance of this Agreement, except for any loss which is paid by Perspectives' insurance.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The parties agree that Perspectives is an independent contractor and is not an employee, agent or representative of Client or its Customers.
- Term of this Agreement, elect to terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) calendar days written notice to Perspectives. Either party to this Agreement may terminate this Agreement at any time for Cause. For purposes of this Agreement, "Cause" means any of the following:

 (a) any material breach of this Agreement; (b) Perspectives' or the Client's fraud or dishonesty in connection with the performance or acceptance of the services, which has a materially detrimental effect on the other party; or (c) acts or omissions constituting gross negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct on the part of either party with respect to that party's obligations or otherwise relating to the business of the other party.

12. Miscellaneous.

A. Notices. Except for the statements to be sent from Perspectives to Client, and except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, all notices, requests, consents, and other communications required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by the party giving notice, and shall be deemed to have been given when hand-delivered by personal delivery, or by Federal Express or similar courier service, or when transmitted by facsimile, or three (3) business days after being deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, with postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed as follows:

- or to such other address as either party may designate for itself by notice given to the other party from time to time in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.
- B. <u>No Waiver</u>. No delay on the part of any party in the exercise of any right or remedy shall operate as a waiver thereof, and no single or partial exercise by any party of any right or remedy shall preclude other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right or remedy. The waiver of any breach or condition of this Agreement by either party shall not constitute a precedent in the future enforcement of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- C. <u>Section Headings</u>. The headings of Sections and subsections contained in this Agreement are merely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the interpretation of any of the provisions of this Agreement. This Agreement is deemed to have been drafted jointly by the parties, and any uncertainty or ambiguity shall not be construed for or against either party as an attribution of drafting to either party. Whenever the context so requires, the singular shall include the plural and vice versa. All words and phrases shall be construed as masculine, feminine or neuter gender, according to the context. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns.
- D. <u>Severability</u>. Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any party or circumstance shall be prohibited by or invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remainder of such provision or any other provision of this Agreement or the application of such provision to other parties or circumstances.
- E. Entire Agreement. All discussions, correspondence, understandings, and agreements heretofore had or made between the parties are superseded by and merged into this Agreement, which alone fully and completely expresses the agreement between the parties relating to its subject matter, and the same is entered into with no party relying upon any statement or representation made by or on behalf of any party not embodied in this Agreement. Any modification of this Agreement may be made only by a written agreement signed by both of the parties to this Agreement. Sections 5, 8, 9(B), and 9(C) shall survive the termination of this Agreement or its Term.
- F. Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Illinois applicable to agreements made and to be performed entirely within the State of Illinois, without regard to the conflicts of laws principles of the State of Illinois or any other state.
- G. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither party will be responsible for delays or failures of performance resulting from acts beyond the control of such party. Such acts include acts of God, strikes, lockouts, riots, acts of war, epidemics, government

regulations superimposed after the fact, fire, communication line failures, power failures, epidemics, earthquakes, floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, other disasters, or failure or inability of third-party contractors to provide services. Such delays or failures do not include failure to pay invoices when due.

- H. Authority. The parties represent and warrant to each other that they have read this Agreement in its entirety, that they understand the terms of this Agreement and understand that the terms of this Agreement are legally enforceable, that they have had ample opportunity to negotiate with each other with regard to all of its terms. that they have entered into this Agreement freely and voluntarily, that they intend to and shall be legally bound by this Agreement, and that they have full power, right, authority, and competence to enter into and execute this Agreement.
- I. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any one or more counterparts. each of which shall constitute an original, no other counterpart needing to be produced, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Through a series of negotiations to reduce rates and per transaction fees for credit card processing, the City's Finance Department was able to obtain considerable savings in comparison to the previous year. Through an agreement with World Data Systems, the City has been able to obtain a reduction in per transactions fees of 50% and a reduction in discount rate of 60%. Based upon the City's fee structure and transaction activity in 2013, the overall savings to the City is estimated to be approximately 56% from the prior year for a dollar savings estimated to be nearly \$9,300.
