The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Fejt, Santoy, Avila and Laureto. Absent: Polashek. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to excuse Alderman Polashek. The motion carried by a voice vote.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was had for the Men and Women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety, along with the Men and Women in the Armed Forces.
3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. There being no speakers the open portion was declared closed.
4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council meeting and the Committee of the Whole held May 28, 2013 were submitted. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.
5. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding a TIF request for Parrilla Express, 6401 West 34th Street. The Mayor recognized Kurtis Pozsgay, Urban Planner for The Berwyn Development Corporation, who reviewed same. Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur, and approve for payment in an amount not to exceed \$20,000.00. The motion carried with a unanimous roll call vote.

Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve for payment in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00. The motion carried with a unanimous roll call vote.



 - 3822 Ridgeland – 2 qualified submittals. 1st Osiris McEnroe and Tracy Ito, 2nd Jesus Camacho


Summers noted six more properties are still available in the program and that a lottery for the next three will take place on July 9, 2013.

Report:

The Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission held a public hearing on June 13, 2013, which was publicized as required by the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance. Five members of the Commission were present:

The subject of the hearing was the nomination of the Policastro/Clarke-Doane bungalow, located at 2440 Wesley Avenue, as a Berwyn Historic Landmark. Following is a report on those proceedings:

The Chair of the Commission, Lori Thielen, opened the proceedings and reviewed the procedures for conducting the public hearing. The Chair then opened the floor to questions and comments. There were several questions and comments by Commissioners. The Commission then voted to accept the nomination, with all six members present voting to recommend that the 2440 Wesley be designated as a Berwyn Historic Landmark.

Based on the evidence presented at the public hearing, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission recommends that City Council designate the bungalow at 2440 Wesley as a Berwyn Historic Landmark. We find that the building satisfies the following Criteria for designation as a Berwyn Historic Landmark according to the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance:

-Significance as an example of the architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social development or heritage of the city, the state or the United States. "Significance" means the relative importance of the property when viewed in the property's architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social context.

-Representation of an architectural, cultural, economic, historic or social theme, style or period, expressed in distinctive areas, districts, places, buildings or structures that may or may not be contiguous.

A summary of the evidence presented at the hearing, which provides information about the history and design of PCC South Family Health Center, can be found in the nomination form, attached.

Recommendation:

The Commission therefore recommends that the City Council designate 2440 Wesley as a Berwyn Historic Landmark pursuant the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance. That section holds that within 30 days of receiving this Report and Recommendation,

City Council shall either designate the historic landmark or reject the nomination by a simple majority vote of the full Council. In making this determination, the City Council shall apply the designation standards set forth in Section 1478.04 above and shall give due consideration to the record of the public hearing(s), and findings and recommendations of the Commission set forth in the Commission's resolution and report and may take public testimony with regard to the same. Upon a majority vote of the City Council to approve designation, the City Council shall enact an ordinance designating the historic landmark, which ordinance shall provide that the newly designated historic landmark shall be the subject to the provisions of Chapter 1478 of the City Code.

What is a Local Historic Landmark?

A local landmark is a house, office building, store, or other structure deemed by the city to be historically significant and thus worthy of protection.

Historic significance can be based on the design of the building or the notability of its architect. It can also be based on the fame of one of its owners or occupants, or on the building's role in a historic event. In addition, as a general rule, a structure should be at least fifty years old to be eligible for landmark status.

Why Seek Landmark Status?

A landmarked building is given extra protection through a city ordinance. Before it can be altered or demolished, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission must review and approve the plans for any such changes. When making changes to a building, any building that is not landmarked only needs a building permit; landmarked buildings need a building permit and a

Certificate Of Appropriateness (COA) from the Historic Preservation Commission.

There can be financial advantages for the owners of landmarked buildings, too. Property taxes can be frozen – meaning no increases – for eight years. Also, in some cases, Federal income tax credits for renovations are possible. Contact the Historic Preservation Commission for more details.

The City of Berwyn gives a landmarked building a bronze plaque denoting the building's historic name and date of construction. The plaque should be affixed to the front façade of the structure, usually near the front door or entrance.

What Else is Involved in Having Landmark Status?

Landmarked structures need to obtain approval before they can be altered. Some minor changes not made to street facing elevations, and certain routine maintenance permits that do not affect the historical integrity of the building may involve an administrative review by the Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission, a process that can be done quickly. Major changes will require a certificate of appropriateness. Most landmark owners find these procedures coincide with their desires to maintain and enhance their historical properties. The Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission can offer assistance in planning for the changes.

Of further interest is that although a landmark has some protection, its neighbors are not necessarily protected unless they, too, are landmarked. To preserve the character of an entire neighborhood or area, a local historic district can be formed. Contact the Historic Preservation Commission for details.

What is a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA)?

A Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) is an approval given to the property owner of a local historic landmark or property in a local historic district for alterations proposed by the property owner. Obtaining a COA assures that your historic landmark maintains its historic integrity. The qualities that make your property either architecturally or historically notable should be maintained or enhanced when alterations are made according to the appropriate guidelines.

What Rules Exist for Altering Landmark Buildings?

The City of Berwyn has a Historic Preservation Ordinance. This ordinance gives guidelines under which a landmark is nominated and details the process that must occur for landmark status to be granted. The Berwyn Historic Preservation Commission recommends nomination to the Berwyn City Council, who in turn, vote to approve all local landmarks.

The guidelines of the Berwyn ordinance are based on a set of federal standards known as the [HYPERLINK "http://www.cr.nps.gov/hps/tps/tax/rhb/stand.htm"](http://www.cr.nps.gov/hps/tps/tax/rhb/stand.htm) Secretary of the Interior's Guidelines. This assures that Berwyn's historic landmarks can meet acknowledged standards of historic preservation.

Another type of landmark status is placement on the National Register of Historic Places, which is granted to very notable buildings and sites. National Register status, however, does not necessarily offer the protection that a local historic landmark can have.

2. Download the nomination and instruction forms from the website of the Berwyn Historic Preservation Agency. Click HYPERLINK "<http://www.berwynpreservation.org/landmarks.html>" here to access that area of their website.

3. Download the BBPI HYPERLINK "http://www.cityofhomes.org/wp-content/uploads/2011/03/Bungalow_Historic_Designation_Document-3-08-11.pdf" documentation for Chicago style bungalow historic landmark nomination, use it as a resource as you complete your nomination form, and attach it to your nomination form upon submission.

What happens after I submit the application?

1. The Historic Preservation Commission convenes to determine whether your property meets the preliminary determination of eligibility. Items that the commission would take into consideration would include whether your house retains sufficient integrity to evoke the character of its style and subtype, boasts the majority of its features, and other factors that the commission may deem as important.

2. If the Commission determines that your property is eligible, it will schedule a public hearing.


3. At the public hearing, a testimony is taken from the nominator, the owner of record, and any other interested parties.

4. If the Commission votes to recommend designation, it will send that recommendation to the City Council that will decide whether to accept or reject the nomination.



The 1925 bungalow located at 2440 Wesley Avenue in Berwyn, IL is a Chicago Style bungalow and exhibits many distinctive features. The exterior is made entirely of brick with a decorative carpet brick



adorning the façade and front columns. In addition, the front of the house includes many decorative architectural features, such as cast concrete planters, limestone steps, limestone plinths and brackets, flower box shelf with adorning brackets, and limestone caps

and pendants imbedded in the columns on the wing walls. The first floor has 20 windows, 16 of which are the original wood windows with crown glass panes and exterior aluminum storm windows, three of which are original decorative stained glass and leaded glass windows, and one of which is a new obscured glass wood window in the bathroom. The current owners recently exposed the two original stained glass windows in the entry room over the fireplace, which had had the casings removed and had been plastered over by previous owners. The house has had a total of three owners and retains its original oak wood floors throughout, elaborate oak moulding and trim (all natural), decorative glazed-brick fire place with built in stained glass bookshelves adorned by matching stained glass doors and tile in the side entryway.



7. Statement of Significance

This home is situated in a true Chicago-style bungalow block. The homes of the area embody bungalow construction of their type and reflect the spirit of the time in which they were constructed. Built with master craftsmanship and attention to detail, each home is unique and simultaneously harmonious amongst its neighbors. In addition their architectural significance, the homes have historic significance as it pertains to the growth and settlement of the City of Berwyn. At the outset of ethnic and immigrant migration from Chicago, Berwyn and its characteristic homes gave rise to the first ring of suburbs in the United States. Unlike other mish-mash suburbs that sprung up around the country, careful city planning and the design and trends of the Chicago-style bungalow helped make Berwyn the "City of Homes" that it is.

As far as this particular home is concerned, it is exemplary in character, quality, and preservation. Modernization and modification of the home has been and continues to be implemented in a fashion consistent with its original character. As other homes in the area are modified without regard to their original intention, this home retains its rich history, and historic status would ensure continued preservation.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 838, SECTIONS 838.02 AND 838.99 AND ADDING SECTION 838.03 TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES REGARDING CONTROL OF FIREARMS AND ASSAULT WEAPONS FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the “City”) is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City and City Council (collectively, the “Corporate Authorities”) are committed to maintaining a safe and healthy environment within the City; and

WHEREAS, Illinois House Bill 183 (the “Bill”), if enacted as currently drafted, would amend Section 13.1 of 430 ILCS 65, to pre-empt municipal regulation of the possession or ownership of assault weapons unless such regulations are enacted on, before or within ten (10) days of the effective date of the Bill; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that assault weapons have additional characteristics that make them more dangerous than ordinary weapons that are typically possessed by City residents for lawful purposes such as self-defense, collecting or hunting; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities also find that assault weapons enable shooters to discharge a high number of shots rapidly and have been declared to be conducive to other criminal activities; and

WHEREAS, in connection therewith, and to ensure that the City’s authority to regulate assault weapons is not pre-empted by the Bill, the Corporate Authorities have

determined that it is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents to amend the Codified Ordinances (the “Code”) to clarify and expand the City’s existing ban on assault weapons; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the City and its residents to amend Sections 838.02 and 838.99 of Chapter 838 and to add Section 838.03 to Chapter 838 of the Code as set forth below; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City’s home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. Chapter 838, Section 838.02 of the Code is hereby amended as follows:

Section 838.02 CONTROL OF FIREARMS AND ASSAULT WEAPONS.

(A) *General provisions.*

(1) *Title.* This section together with Section 838.03 shall be known as the “Berwyn Firearms and Assault Weapons Control Ordinance.”

Section 3. Chapter 838, Section 838.02 of the Code is hereby amended as follows:

~~(C) *Assault weapons.*~~

~~(1) *Assault weapon defined.* For the purpose of this section, the following definition shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.~~

~~**ASSAULT WEAPON.** Any weapon which shoots, is designed to shoot, or can be readily restored to shoot, automatically, more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger. The term shall also include the frame or receiver of any weapon, any part designed and intended for use in converting a weapon into a machine gun, any combination of parts from which a machine gun can be assembled if the parts are in the possession or under the control of a person.~~

~~(2) — Sale prohibited; exceptions; violations.~~

~~(a) — No person shall sell, offer or display for sale, give, lend, transfer — ownership of, acquire, possess, manufacture or distribute any assault weapon within the corporate limits of the city. This division shall not apply to:~~

~~1. The sale or distribution, or the possession for sale and distribution, by an appropriately licensed firearms dealer, of an assault weapon to any officer, agent or employee of the city or of any other municipality, county, body politic or state or of the United States, to members of the armed forces of the United States, to the organized militia of this or any other state, and to peace officers, to the extent that any person is otherwise authorized to acquire or possess an assault weapon and is acting within the scope of his or her duties; and~~

~~2. The lawful transportation of assault weapons if the weapons are broken down and in a nonfunctioning state and are not immediately accessible to any person.~~

~~(b) — Any assault weapon possessed, sold or transferred in violation of division (C)(2)(a) hereof is hereby declared to be contraband and shall be seized and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of division (C)(3) hereof.~~

~~(c) — Any person who, prior to the effective date of this division, was legally in possession of an assault weapon prohibited by this section shall have 14 days from the effective date of this division to do any of the following without being subject to prosecution hereunder:~~

~~1. To remove the assault weapon from within the limits of the city;~~

~~2. To modify the assault weapon, either to render it permanently inoperable or to permanently make it a device no longer defined as an assault weapon; and~~

~~3. To surrender the assault weapon to the Chief of Police of the city or his or her designee for disposal as provided below.~~

~~(3) — Destruction of surrendered or confiscated weapons; records. Whenever any firearm or ammunition is surrendered or confiscated pursuant to the terms of this section, the Chief of Police shall ascertain whether the firearm or ammunition is needed as evidence in any matter. If the firearm or ammunition is not required for evidence, it shall be destroyed at the direction of the Chief of Police. A record of the date and method of destruction and an inventory of the firearm or ammunition so destroyed shall be maintained.~~

Section 838.03 ASSAULT WEAPONS BAN.

(A) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

(1) “Antique weapon” means weapons that have not been manufactured or altered for a period of no less than seventy-five (75) years and are rendered permanently unusable.

(2) "Assault weapon" means:

- (a) A semiautomatic rifle that has the capacity to accept a large capacity magazine detachable or otherwise and one or more of the following:
 1. Only a pistol grip without a stock attached;
 2. Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand;
 3. A folding, telescoping or thumbhole stock;
 4. A shroud attached to the barrel, or that partially or completely encircles the barrel, allowing the bearer to hold the firearm with the non-trigger hand without being burned, but excluding a slide that encloses the barrel; or
 5. A muzzle brake or muzzle compensator.
- (b) A semiautomatic pistol or any semi-automatic rifle that has a fixed magazine, that has the capacity to accept more than fourteen (14) rounds of ammunition.
- (c) A semiautomatic pistol that has the capacity to accept a detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:
 1. Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand;
 2. A folding, telescoping or thumbhole stock;
 3. A shroud attached to the barrel, or that partially or completely encircles the barrel, allowing the bearer to hold the firearm with the non-trigger hand without being burned, but excluding a slide that encloses the barrel;
 4. A muzzle brake or muzzle compensator; or
 5. The capacity to accept a detachable magazine at some location outside of the pistol grip.
- (d) A semiautomatic shotgun that has one or more of the following:
 1. Only a pistol grip without a stock attached;
 2. Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding grip that can be held by the non-trigger hand;
 3. A folding, telescoping or thumbhole stock;
 4. A fixed magazine capacity in excess of five rounds; or
 5. An ability to accept a detachable magazine.
- (e) Any shotgun with a revolving cylinder.
- (f) Conversion kit, part or combination of parts, from which an assault weapon can be assembled if those parts are in the possession or under the control of the same person.
- (g) Shall include, but not be limited to, the assault weapons models identified as follows:
 1. The following rifles or copies or duplicates thereof:
 - i. AK, AKM, AKS, AK-47, AK-74, ARM, MAK90, Misr, NHM 90, NHM 91, SA 85, SA 93, VEPR;
 - ii. AR-10;
 - iii. AR-15, Bushmaster XM15, Armalite M15, or Olympic Arms PCR;

- iv. AR70;
 - v. Calico Liberty;
 - vi. Dragunov SVD Sniper Rifle or Dragunov SVU;
 - vii. Fabrique National FN/FAL, FN/LAR, or FNC;
 - viii. Hi-Point Carbine;
 - ix. HK-91, HK-93, HK-94, or HK-PSG-1;
 - x. Kel-Tec Sub Rifle;
 - xi. Saiga;
 - xii. SAR-8, SAR-4800;
 - xiii. SKS with detachable magazine;
 - xiv. SLG 95;
 - xv. SLR 95 or 96;
 - xvi. Steyr AUG;
 - xvii. Sturm, Ruger Mini-14;
 - xviii. Tavor;
 - xix. Thompson 1927, Thompson M1, or Thompson 1927
Commando; or
 - xx. Uzi, Galil and Uzi Sporter, Galil Sporter, or Galil Sniper Rifle
(Galatz).
- 2. The following pistols or copies or duplicates thereof:
 - i. Calico M-110;
 - ii. MAC-10, MAC-11, or MPA3;
 - iii. Olympic Arms OA;
 - iv. TEC-9, TEC-DC9, TEC-22 Scorpion, or AB-10; or
 - v. Uzi.
 - 3. The following shotguns or copies or duplicates thereof:
 - i. Armstrong 30 BG;
 - ii. SPAS 12 or LAW 12;
 - iii. Striker 12; or
 - iv. Streetsweeper.
- (3) "Assault weapon" does not include any firearm that has been made permanently inoperable, or satisfies the definition of "antique firearm," stated in this section.
 - (4) "Detachable magazine" means any ammunition feeding device, the function of which is to deliver one or more ammunition cartridges into the firing chamber, which can be removed from the firearm without the use of any tool, including a bullet or ammunition cartridge.
 - (5) "Large capacity magazine" means any ammunition feeding device with the capacity to accept more than fourteen (14) rounds, but shall not be construed to include the following:
 - (a) A feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate more than fourteen rounds;
 - (b) A 22 caliber tube ammunition feeding device; or
 - (c) A tubular magazine that is contained in a lever-action firearm.
 - (6) "Muzzle brake" means a device attached to the muzzle of a weapon that utilizes escaping gas to reduce recoil.

- (7) "Muzzle compensator" means a device attached to the muzzle of a weapon that utilizes escaping gas to control muzzle movement.
- (B) Assault weapons and large capacity magazines; sales prohibited; exceptions.
- (1) No person shall manufacture or distribute, sell, offer or display for sale, give, lend, transfer ownership of, acquire or possess any assault weapon or large capacity magazine. This subsection shall not apply to:
 - (a) The sale or transfer to, or possession by any officer, agent, or employee of the City, or of any other municipality, county, body politic or any other state or of the United States, members of the armed forces of the United States; or the organized militia of this or any other state; or peace officers to the extent that any such person named in this subsection is otherwise authorized to acquire or possess an assault weapon and/or large capacity magazine and does so while acting within the scope of his or her duties; or
 - (b) The sale or transfer to, or possession by retired City Police Officers that served ten (10) or more years with the City Police Department and left the City Police Department in good standing; or
 - (c) Transportation of assault weapons or large capacity magazines if such weapons are broken down and in a nonfunctioning state and are not immediately accessible to any person.
 - (2) Any assault weapon or large capacity magazine possessed, sold or transferred in violation of this section is hereby declared to be contraband and shall be seized and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of Section 838.03(C) hereof.
 - (3) Any person who, prior to the effective date of this ordinance codified in this section, was legally in possession of an assault weapon or large capacity magazine prohibited by this section shall have ninety (90) days from the effective date of this ordinance to do any of the following without being subject to prosecution hereunder:
 - (a) To remove the assault weapon or large capacity magazine from within the limits of the City; or
 - (b) To modify the assault weapon or large capacity magazine either to render it permanently inoperable or to permanently make it a device no longer defined as an assault weapon or large capacity magazine; or
 - (c) To surrender the assault weapon or large capacity magazine to the Chief of Police of the City or his designee for disposal as provided below.
- (C) Destruction of weapons confiscated.
- (1) Whenever any firearm or large capacity magazine is surrendered or confiscated pursuant to the terms of this section, the Chief of Police of the City or his designee shall ascertain whether such firearm or large capacity magazine is needed as evidence in any matter.
 - (2) If such firearm or large capacity magazine is not required for evidence it shall be destroyed at the direction of the Chief of Police of the City or his designee. A record of the date and method of destruction and an inventory of the firearm or large capacity magazine so destroyed shall be maintained.

Section 4. Chapter 838, Section 838.99 of the Code is hereby amended as follows:

Section 838.99 PENALTY.

See § 202.99 for general code penalty if no specific penalty is provided.

Any person found in violation of Section 838.03 shall be fined not more than \$750.00 for each and every violation thereof.

Section 5. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 6. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 7. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

Section 8. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication or as otherwise provided by law. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

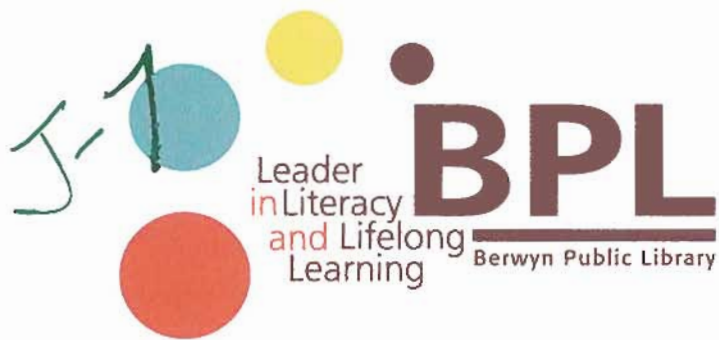

The Library Department is requesting authorization to advertise and replace library staff to fill vacancies. The Library Assistant II – Teen positions were approved in 2012, but unfunded until 2013's budget was approved. These two 13 hour positions were budgeted as Librarian I - Teen positions, but upon Library administration recommendation, the Library Board voted to open these positions at the lower classification. This change will offer a cost savings of about \$600 per year in salaries.

The two part-time positions are new, but included in both 1012 and 2013 budgets. We would like to get these positions filled and staff trained before Morton West High School's classes start in August. 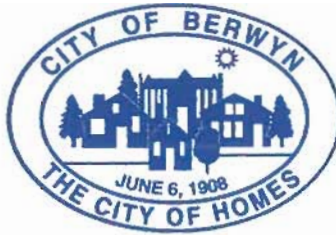
This position was held by Arturo Rodriguez and is a replacement. This is a minimum wage shelving position that is most often held by a student.

Re: **An Ordinance Requesting that the Parcel Located at 2825 Harvey Ave Be Obtained Through the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program**

Staff was recently made aware of a program through Cook County which allows municipalities to acquire properties at no cost that would otherwise be placed for tax sale. The No-Cash Bid Program can be beneficial to municipalities by allowing for control over some properties that are otherwise detracting from the tax base. Once these properties are acquired by the City, the County allows for a variety of acceptable strategies to be implemented ranging from the creation of open space to the redevelopment of the subject parcel.

Upon review of the properties available under the No-Cash Bid Program, staff identified a residential parcel located at 2825 S Harvey that could present an ideal opportunity for Berwyn's first No-Cash Bid acquisition. This property is located mid-block and is a vacant lot surrounded by houses. Due to the amount of back taxes on the property, it is unlikely that the private sector would acquire this property and redevelop under normal market conditions. Further, the City's Blight Department has been maintaining the lot for a significant amount of time.

It would be staff's intent for the City to acquire this property at no cost using the No-Cash Bid Program, extinguish the back taxes and market the parcel to the private sector for residential redevelopment. Upon successful completion, we would hope that this program helps to preserve the neighborhood and grow the tax base.

Recommendation:

Staff requests Council approval of the attached ordinance authorizing participation in the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program.

Section 2. The City of Berwyn formally requests the acquisition by over-the-counter no-cash bid of the Property located in Volume 004 with the property identification number 16-29-319-011-0000.

Section 3. The Assistant City Administrator shall be and is hereby authorized and directed to make an over-the-counter no-cash bid for the Property located in Volume 004 with the property identification number 16-29-319-011-0000.

Section 4. Upon acquisition of the Property through the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program, the City of Berwyn intends to solicit proposals for the redevelopment of the Property, which will include the development of a new taxable residential structure on the Property.

Section 5. Until such time as the City of Berwyn is presented with an acceptable proposal for redevelopment of the Property, it is the intent of the City of Berwyn to file for and maintain property-tax-exempt status for the Property.

Section 6. The City of Berwyn is not currently a party to any agreement with any developer, organization, or other private party regarding the acquisition of the Property through the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program that will result in the conveyance of a perfected tax deed by the City of Berwyn.

Section 7. The City of Berwyn hereby authorizes and directs the City's special counsel attorneys, Del Galdo and Associates, 1441 South Harlem Avenue, Berwyn Illinois 60402 to obtain a tax deed to the Property. The City of Berwyn will bear all legal and other costs associated with the acquisition of the Property.

Section 8. The Assistant City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to submit annual reports on the status of the Property for five (5) years or until development is complete, whichever occurs last, as required by the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program Ordinance, No. 91-0-41, to the Cook County Bureau of Economic Development, 69 West Washington Street, Suite 2900, Chicago, Illinois 60602.

Section 9. The Assistant City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all other documents required for participation in the Cook County No-Cash Bid Program. The Assistant City Administrator will take all necessary steps to implement the objectives described within this ordinance and in accordance with the program requirements as presented by Cook County.

Section 10. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect following its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.



**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF
PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY OF BERWYN, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois encourages intergovernmental cooperation and authorizes units of local government to contract and associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function, in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., and the Illinois Municipal Code 65 ILCS 5/1-1-5, et seq., and 5/11-15.1-1, et seq., authorize units of local government to exercise their powers, privileges and authority for the purposes of intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the West Central Municipal Conference is a not-for-profit corporation comprised of municipal members dedicated to fostering intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, units of local government have joined together in cooperation with the West Central Municipal Conference for the purpose of auctioning or otherwise disposing of surplus vehicles, equipment, and materials; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS, 5/11-76-4 or 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.2 (for municipalities); 70, ILCS 1205/8-22 (park districts); and 60 ILCS 1/30-50 (townships), the following personal property is hereby declared to be surplus and not needed and it is hereby found that it would be best served by the sales to the below described personal property:
