MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL NOVEMBER 12, 2013

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Fejt, Santoy, Polashek, Avila and Laureto.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was given for Carl Swiecionis, father of Patrolman Chris Swiecionis, the victims of Typhoon Haiyan in the Phillippines, all our servicemen and women, and the men and women protecting our safety on the streets in Berwyn.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Alderman Polashek announced an informational session on the Affordable Care Act to be held at 6:30 p.m., December 9, 2013 at the Berwyn Public Library.
- 4. Minutes of the Berwyn City Council regular meeting and Committee of the Whole held October 22, 2013, were submitted. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as submitted. Motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding land acquisition and an attached ordinance entitled:

An Ordinance Authorizing the Dismissal of Cook County Case Number 2013 L 050495, the Issuance of a New Offer for the Voluntary Acquisition of the Property Commonly Known as the "Dominguez Parcel," and the Re-Filing of Eminent Domain Proceedings to Acquire the "Dominguez Parcel" if Voluntary Negotiations are Unsuccessful.

The Mayor recognized Anthony Griffin, Berwyn Development Executive Director, who reviewed same. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur, **adopt** the ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE November 12, 2013

- 1. Mayor Lovero called the Committee of the Whole to order at 6:02 p.m.; upon the call of the roll the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul Fejt, Polashek, Avila and Laureto. Absent: Santoy. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to excuse Alderman Santoy. The motion carried.
- 2. Renewal of Liability Insurance: The Mayor recognized Ruth Volbre, Administrative Assistant to the mayor and City Administrator, who reviewed the renewal process and recommends renewing policy with Munich with a minimal 3.9 % increase in premium. The Mayor recognized insurance broker Megan Parrilli of T.A. Cummings Jr. Co. Inc. Parrilli reviewed coverage and noted that the national wide average increase in premiums is between 6-10%, but was able to negotiate the renewal at 3.9%. The Mayor thanked Ms. Volbre and Parrilli and noted the item is on tonight's agenda.

- 3. City of Homes Presentation regarding Bungalow on the National Register: The Mayor recognized Nasri Mansour of City of Homes who gave a brief presentation regarding a preliminary survey for the recommendation to the National Registry. The area includes over 1,400 properties from Cermak to 26th Street, Home Ave. to just east of Ridgeland Ave. Mansour reviewed the potential tax freeze benefits and guidelines for maintaining properties to be considered. A grant application has already been submitted for funding the one year project to perform a survey of the proposed area. If awarded, 75% of cost would be offset by the grant funds, with the balance coming from the City of Homes organization, so no City of Berwyn tax dollars would fund this project.
- 4. There being no further business for the Open Committee of the Whole, the Mayor asked for a motion to go into closed session for Real Estate and Pending Litigation. Thereafter, Polashek made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:26 p.m. The motion carried.
- 5. A motion was made in closed session to re-open the Committee of the Whole by Santoy, seconded by Boyajian, at 7:28 p.m. The motion carried.
- 6. A motion was made by Avila, seconded by Chapman, to adjourn the Committee of the Whole at 7:28 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.



Mayor Lovero and City Council Members:

In February 2011 we entered into an agreement with Global Connect to provide an "Emergency Notification System" for public safety emergencies, as well as a community based message system. Global Connect was recently acquired by Code Red who has agreed to honor all contracts currently in place but is requiring all users to transition to their "Code Red" product. The transition from Global Connect has not been easy, as the Code Red system is not as flexible as the Global Connect System. In addition, our contract is set to expire December 31, 2013.

Since September of this year, we have reviewed products from six different vendors in this field and have gone through demonstrations of their systems. The system that has the options and flexibility that fit our needs and meets our requirements is a product by Everbridge. Everbridge has submitted a proposal with the first year costs at \$15,700.00, which includes a one-time set up fee of \$1,200.00, and four one year options at \$14,500.00 per year. Although this proposal is the second lowest priced proposal we received, the product best fits the needs of the City of Berwyn and its residents.

Enclosed is the Everbridge quotation, the quotes from the other vendors reviewed and evaluations of all the systems we assessed in 2013. We have also included the price comparisons from 2011 for your reference. Additional product information is available by request and was not included in this packet in order to save on copying expense.

The original cost for the Global Connect system was paid for through a grant that has since expired. The cost of the new system has been included in the police department's 2014 budget.

As a result of the extensive due diligence already completed, we respectfully request the formal RFP process be waived and that an agreement be executed with Everbridge for an Emergency Notification System for a period of five years.

RECIPROCAL REPORTING SYSTEM AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BERWYN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION SCHOOL DISTRICT 98 COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

This agreement is entered into between the Berwyn Police Department ("the Police Department") and the Board of Education, School District #98 ("the School District").

WHEREAS, the Illinois School Code, 105 ILCS 5/10-20.14, requires the School District parent – teacher advisory committee, in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies, to work with the board of education to develop "policy guideline procedures" for the establishment and maintenance of a reciprocal reporting system between the School District and local law enforcement agencies regarding criminal offenses committed by students; and

WHEREAS, under the Illinois School Student Records Act, 105 ILCS 10/6, school student records are considered confidential and no school student records or information contained therein may be released, transferred or disclosed except as permitted by the Student Records Act; and

WHEREAS, under the Juvenile Court Act of 1987, 705 ILCS 405/1-7, law enforcement records are considered confidential and the inspection and copying of such records that relate to a minor who has been arrested or taken into custody before his or her 17th birthday are restricted to those exceptions in the Juvenile Court Act; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois School Student Records Act, 105 ILCS 10/6(a)(6.5), and the General Education Provisions Act, 20 U.S.C. 1232g, authorize school districts to release student records and information to law enforcement officers when necessary for the discharge of their official duties prior to adjudication of the student and upon written certification that the information will not be disclosed to any other party except as provided under law or order of court; and

WHEREAS, the Juvenile Court Act, 705 ILCS 405/1-7(A)(8), authorizes law enforcement agencies to allow appropriate school officials to inspect and copy law enforcement records under a reciprocal reporting system for certain offenses and under certain specified circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the School District and the Police Department agree that enhanced communication between these entities under a reciprocal reporting agreement would promote the safety and well-being of students and community residents; and

WHEREAS, the School District and the Police Department are authorized to enter into this agreement pursuant to the Illinois School Code, 105 ILCS 5/10-20.14, the Illinois Constitution, art. VII, §10(a) et seq., and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq..

NOW THEREFORE, the School District and the Police Department hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **ESTABLISHMENT OF A REPORTING SYSTEM**. The School District and the Police Department hereby enter into this Agreement to establish and maintain a reciprocal reporting system between the School District and the Police Department regarding juvenile and criminal offenses involving students.
- 2. **REPORTING AND INFORMATION SHARING.** The School District and the Police Department acknowledge and agree to act in good faith to comply with the reporting responsibilities and limitations set forth herein, and as required by applicable law.
- 3. **DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVES.** The School District's Superintendent shall provide the Police Department's Chief of Police (the "Police Chief") with a list of administrators to be contacted, as needed, containing regular and emergency telephone numbers, and identifying the particular types of problems for which particular administrators are to be contacted. The administrators identified in the list shall be considered the "Appropriate School Official" for purposes of subsection 1-7(A) (8) of the Juvenile Court Act, 705 ILCS 405/1-7 as amended, whom the School District has determined to have a legitimate educational or safety interest to protect the safety of students or employees in the school and aid in the proper rehabilitation of the child. The Police Chief will provide the Superintendent with a primary and two back-up contacts, who shall be considered the "Department Representatives".
- 4. SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORITY TO REPORT STUDENT CRIMINAL ACTIVITY. The Superintendent or School Principal, or their designee(s), may report any alleged or suspected criminal activities committed by a student enrolled in School District #100 (See 1996 III. Atty. Gen. Op. 96-040).
- 5. SCHOOL DISTRICT DUTY TO REPORT STUDENT CRIMINAL ACTIVITY. The Superintendent and/or School Principal(s), or their designees, must report certain incidents involving firearms, drugs and attacks on school personnel, as set out below. When a report may be required of both the Superintendent and Principal, a single report from one or the other shall meet the duty to report.
 - (a) School **Superintendent**. The School Superintendent (or his/her designee) is to immediately report the following to the Police Department:
 - (i) Firearms. Any verified incident involving a firearm in a school or on school-owned or leased property and on any transportation that is owned leased or used by the school for its students or school personnel. See 105 ILCS 5/10-27.1A, as amended.
 - (ii) **Drugs**. Any verified incident involving drugs in a school or on school-owned or leased property or on any transportation that is owned, leased or used by the school for its students or school personnel. "Drugs" means "narcotic drug" as

defined under subsection (aa) of Section 102 of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, as amended [720 ILCS 570/102], "cannabis" as defined under Section 3 of the Cannabis Control Act, as amended [720 ILCS 550/3], or "methamphetamine" as defined under Section 10 of the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act, as amended [720 ILCS 646/10]. See 105 ILCS 5/10-27.1B

- (b) **School Principal**. The School Principal (or his/her designee) is to immediately report the following to the Police Department:
 - (i) Firearms. Upon receiving a report from any school staff that they have observed any person in possession of a firearm on school grounds, an immediate report of the incident must be made by calling Berwyn Police Department E9-1-1. If the person in possession of a firearm on school grounds is a student, the principal or his/her designee shall also immediately notify the student's parent or guardian. See 105 ILCS 5/10-27.1A, as amended.
 - (ii) Attacks on School Personnel. Upon receipt of a written complaint from any school personnel, all incidents of battery committed against teachers, teacher personnel, administrative personnel or educational support personnel. See 105 ILCS 5/10-21.7, as amended.
 - (iii) Cannabis, Illegal Drugs or Controlled Substances on or Near School Grounds. When becoming aware of, immediately report any violation of the Cannabis Control Act or the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act or the Illinois Controlled Substances Act in a school, on school property, or within 1,000 feet of the school, or on any transportation used, owned or leased by the School District to transport students. See 105 ILCS 127/1, as amended.
- 6. SCHOOL DISTRICT RELEASE OF SCHOOL STUDENT RECORDS AND RECORD INFORMATION TO POLICE DEPARTMENT. School officials shall follow state and federal laws regarding school student records, which are considered confidential, and no school student records or information contained therein may be released, transferred or disclosed except with parental consent or as otherwise permitted by the Illinois School Student Records Act, 105 ILCS 10/1 et seq., as amended. The following exceptions permit the release of student records and information to the Police Department without parental consent:
 - (a) Adjudication of Student by Juvenile Court. School districts can release student records and information to the Police Department, upon the request of the Police Department, when necessary for the discharge of their official police duties, prior to adjudication of the student and upon written certification from the Police Department that the information or records disclosed by the school will not be disclosed to any other party, except as provided by law or order of court. 105 ILCS 10/6, as amended.

- (b) Emergency Release of Information. Records and information may be released to the Police Department if such information is needed by the Police Department to protect the health or safety of the student or other persons, provided that the parents are notified as soon as possible of the information released, the date of release, the fact that the information was shared with the Police Department, and the purpose of the release. The factors to be considered in determining whether an emergency exists requiring the release of student information include:
 - (i) Degree of Threat. Seriousness of threat to health/safety of student or others;
 - (ii) Need. Need for records to meet the emergency;
 - (iii) **Police Involvement**. Whether the Police Department is in a position to deal with the emergency; and
 - (iv) Urgency. Extent to which time is of the essence in dealing with the emergency. 105 ILCS 10/6, as amended; 23 Il.Admin.Code §375.60
- (c) Law Enforcement Records Not School Records. It is recognized that the information maintained by law enforcement officers working in the school are not student records. 105 ILCS 10/2(d), as amended.
- 7. POLICE DEPARTMENT TO SHARE LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA WITH SCHOOL DISTRICT. The Police Department will comply with applicable state and federal law in implementing these procedures. In furtherance of the information-sharing hereunder, a Department Representative may:
 - (a) Students Under 17 Years Old. Provide copies of law enforcement records to, or permit inspection of those records by, the Appropriate School Official or Officials for minors enrolled in the School District if the minor has been arrested or taken into custody before his or her 17th birthday for the offenses listed below, provided that the Police Department or officer believes that there is an imminent threat of physical harm to students, school personnel, or others who are present in the school or on school grounds. Inspection and copying shall be limited to law enforcement records transmitted to the Appropriate School Official or Officials.
 - (i) any violation of Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 1961, as amended;
 - (ii) a violation of the Illinois Controlled Substance Act, as amended;
 - (iii) a violation of the Cannabis Control Act, as amended;
 - (iv) a violation of the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act; as amended; and
 - (v) a forcible felony as defined in Section 2-8 of the Criminal Code of 1961, as amended;
 - (vi) a violation of Section 1-2 of the Harassing and Obscene Communications Act, as amended;
 - (vii) a violation of the Hazing Act, as amended; or
 - (viii) a violation of Section 12-1, 12-2, 12-3, 12-3.05, 12-3.1, 12-3.2, 12-3.4, 12-3.5, 12-5, 12-7.3, 12-7.4, 12-7.5, 25-1, or 25-5 of the Criminal Code of 1961, as amended.

The information derived from the law enforcement records shall be kept separate from and shall not become a part of the official school record of that child and shall not be a public record. The information shall be used solely by the Appropriate School Official or Officials to aid in the proper rehabilitation of the child and to protect the safety of students and employees in the school.

Any information provided to appropriate school officials whom the school has determined to have a legitimate educational or safety interest by the Police Department about a minor who is the subject of a current police investigation that is directly related to school safety shall consist of oral information only, and not written law enforcement records, and shall be used solely by the Appropriate School Official or Officials to protect the safety of students and employees in the school and aid in the proper rehabilitation of the child. The information derived orally from the Police Department shall be kept separate from and shall not become a part of the official school record of the child and shall not be a public record.

- (b) Students Over 17 Years Old. Provide copies to, or authorize inspection by the School District, pursuant to 5 ILCS 140/2.15, as amended, of the following records for persons of 17 years of age or older, who are enrolled in the School District:
 - (i) Arrest Information. Chronologically maintained arrest and criminal history information, including (i) information that identifies the individual, including the name, age, address and photograph, when and if available; (ii) information detailing any charges relating to the arrest; (iii) the time and location of the arrest; (iv) the name of the investigating or arresting law enforcement agency; (v) if the individual is incarcerated, the amount of any bail or bond; (vi) if the individual is incarcerated, the time and date that the individual was received into, discharged from, or transferred to the arresting agency's custody; and
 - (ii) Criminal History Records. Information that may be maintained by the Police Department including, (i) court records that are public; or (ii) records that are otherwise available under State or local law.

8. POLICE DEPARTMENT DUTY TO SHARE INFORMATION WITH SCHOOL DISTRICT.

(a) Report to School District That Student Has Been Detained. The Police Department shall report to the School Principal of any school in the School District whenever a child enrolled in the school is detained for proceedings under the Juvenile Court Act of 1987, as amended, or for any criminal offense or violation of a municipal or county ordinance. This report shall include the basis for detaining the child, circumstances surrounding the events, which led to the child's detention, and the status of proceedings. The report shall be updated as appropriate to notify the Principal of developments and the disposition of the matter. 105 ILCS 5/22-20, as amended.

- (b) Records Regarding Student Detention. Any information provided pursuant to this paragraph 8 must be kept separate from and not become a part of the official school record of a child. Such records are not a public record, and can be used solely by the Appropriate School Official or Officials to aid in the proper rehabilitation of the child and to protect the safety of students and employees in the school. 105 ILCS 5/22-20, as amended.
- 9. COOPERATION BETWEEN SCHOOL DISTRICT AND POLICE DEPARTMENT. Nothing in this policy and procedure is intended to limit or restrict the duty and authority of the School District to request police services for disturbances or other emergencies occurring in or around any of its school buildings, nor is it intended to limit or restrict the duty or ability of any person attending or employed by the School District to provide information or otherwise cooperate in School District and law enforcement investigations, including buy not limited to providing witness statements and testimony in juvenile or criminal adjudications, or in school discipline proceedings.

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING <u>THE BERWYN BUNGALOW AT 2532</u> <u>WESLEY AVENUE</u>, AS A HISTORIC LANDMARK, PURSUANT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 1820 OF THE BERWYN CITY CODE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 1820 of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances (the "Historic Preservation Ordinance") provides rules and procedures for designating Historic Landmark and Districts within the City of Berwyn; and

WHEREAS, the Berwyn Historic Preservation Ordinance gives the Historic Preservation Commission (the "Commission") responsibility to investigate, review and recommend to the Berwyn City Council those structures or districts that have significant historical, cultural, architectural or aesthetic value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois, or the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Commission received and accepted an application for designation of the bungalow at 2532 Wesley Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, as a Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission held a public hearing pursuant to the requirements of the Historic Preservation Ordinance on September 12, 2013 to consider the designation of the Berwyn National Bank Building as a Historic Landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission unanimously recommended to the City

Council on September 13, 2013 that the bungalow at 2532 Wesley Avenue

represents a structure that has significant historical, cultural, architectural and

aesthetic value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois,

and the United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINDED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. Findings. Based upon City Council's review of the application, the Resolution and Report of the Commission, and the designation standards set forth in Section 1820.06, the City Council makes the following affirmative determination: the bungalow at 2532 Wesley Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, embodies significant historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic value as part of the heritage of the City of Berwyn, the State of Illinois, and the United States.

Section 2. Adoption. The bungalow at 2532 Wesley Avenue shall hereafter be designated as a Historic Landmark pursuant to the Historic Preservation Ordinance, and subject to the provisions therein.

Section 3. Filing. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file with the Recorder of Deeds of Cook County, Illinois a certified copy of this designation ordinance.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BERWYN AND THE SOUTH BERWYN SCHOOL DISTRICT 100 REGARDING THE TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF SECURITY SYSTEM CAMERAS AND EQUIPMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the SOUTH BERWYN SCHOOL DISTRICT 100 (hereinafter referred to as the "District") and the CITY OF BERWYN POLICE DEPARTMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), both municipal corporations located in the County of Cook, State of Illinois;

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Illinois statutes provide that public agencies may share powers through intergovernmental agreements pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. (1991)); and

WHEREAS, the City owns and operates a security video system, purchased for use to increase safety of the City's schools under the *Security for Schools Grant*; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is feasible and appropriate that ownership of all equipment purchased through the *Security for Schools* grant, be transferred to the District; and

WHEREAS, the City and the District wish to associate, cooperate and share services to achieve the goals and objectives expressed herein and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement that so provides.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants contained in this Agreement, the District and the City agree as follows:

Section 1: The City shall transfer all ownership of the security system equipment located at each school building purchased through the *Security for Schools* grant to the District.

Section 2: Upon transfer of ownership, the District shall absorb costs, present and future, associated with the installation, removal, maintenance and use of all security equipment contained within the *Security for Schools* grant. The City shall absorb costs associated with manpower needed to review video for legal reasons.

Section 3: The District shall indemnify the City from all losses associated with the transfer of ownership, relocation, or repurposing of the security equipment governed by this agreement.

Section 4: The District shall grant access to view, via the Internet (World Wide Web), the security system and all cameras within their school buildings, without fee or cost of any nature, to the City per request of the City. Viewing of the cameras and footage will be for Emergency situations, monitoring of safety concerns or legal investigations.

Section 5: If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid for any reason, such invalidation shall not render invalid other provisions of this Agreement, which can be given effect without the invalid provision.

Section 6: This Agreement shall be effective when executed by the District and City. Otherwise terminated by either party, this Agreement shall be effective for a term of one (1) year and be automatically renewed for successive terms of one (1) year each unless either party notifies the other in writing of non-renewal at least ninety (90) days before the end of the applicable term.

Section 7: Either party hereto may terminate this Agreement for any violation of its terms by providing the offending party with thirty (30) days advance written notice. Either party hereto may also terminate this Agreement for any reason or no reason at all by giving the other party at least ninety (90) days advance written notice.

Section 8: Any other agreement or agreements between the parties hereto concerning the subjects hereof are terminated and canceled upon approval hereof, and this Agreement shall be the only agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof.

Section 9: Notice or other writings which any party is required to, or may wish to serve upon any other party in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

In 2012, the City of Berwyn suffered major power outages resulting from a severe storm in the area. The 19th Street pumping station was without power for two days. As a result of this extended outage, Berwyn's water supply was severely depleted due to the extended power outage. Staff has been working to try to determine the correct information to properly size a diesel generator for the 19th St pumping station with limited success.

In order to prepare the appropriate design and bid documents for the proper equipment, I am requesting assistance with this part of the project from Patrick Engineering. The scope of the attached proposal is to meet with key staff, perform site visits to determine location and current control panel condition, evaluate the various options for a successful installation. Dear Mr. Schiller:

This letter presents Patrick Engineering Inc. (Patrick's) proposal to the City of Berwyn (City) to provide preliminary engineering services for design of a new emergency standby generator to be located at the 19th Street Pump Station. This proposal is submitted in accordance with your verbal request. The following presents our understanding of the project background, proposed scope of work, pricing and schedule for the project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Patrick understands the City desires to install an emergency standby generator at the 19th Street Pump Station, which is located at the intersection of 19th Street and Highland Avenue in Berwyn (Site). The 19th Street Pump station has four vertical turbine pumps with below floor discharge heads in wet wells.

There is a four million gallon underground reservoir located at the Site which ties into the transmission main. Water is pumped from the underground reservoir into multiple mains which feed the north side of Berwyn as well as tie into transmission mains which connect to the elevated water tower at the public works facility and feed the south side of Berwyn.

The station does not currently have emergency power and there is no electrical infrastructure at the Site to tie in the emergency standby generator. The purpose of this preliminary engineering study is to determine the required size and infrastructure needs to provide an emergency standby generator in the event of a power outage.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Patrick's proposed scope of services to evaluate design and installation of standby generator includes:

- 1. Meeting with Berwyn staff at City offices to discuss project technical requirements, permit requirements and City expectations.
- Site walkdown with Patrick's evaluation team, to inspect the proposed generator location and existing site conditions and infrastructure. Patrick's evaluation team will include Gary Goodheart, Howard Firestone (Vice President of Engineering), and Don Freeston (senior electrical engineer) and possibly others.

- 3. Evaluating various options and necessary work to install standby emergency generator (size, location, security, infrastructure, phase in requirements, etc.).
- 4. Preparation of a brief letter report to the City summarizing our evaluation and recommendations to design and install a standby generator in a secure location.
- 5. Preparation of ballpark cost estimates associated with design and installation of a standby emergency generator.
- Participation in meetings with City staff to review and discuss the various options, required equipment and Site improvements, and limitations associated with installing a new standby emergency generator.
- 7. Project Management and coordination.

We anticipate the deliverable for this evaluation will be a short letter report to the City summarizing proposed steps and timetable to design an emergency standby generator for a secure location selected by the City.

STAFFING AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Patrick is available to begin this work immediately. This project will be managed and executed by our staff in Lisle, Illinois. Patrick's Project Director and coordinator will be Gary Goodheart. Mr. Goodheart will serve as primary liaison with the City of Berwyn, make sure the project is appropriately managed and staffed, and that Patrick has sufficient resources to complete the project on time and on budget.

Patrick's Project Manager for engineering evaluation for the new emergency generator will be Don Freeston. Messrs. Goodheart and Freeston will be assisted by other Patrick electrical and civil engineering staff, as necessary.

SCHEDULE

Patrick can begin work on this project within two to three days of receiving Notice to Proceed. We anticipate the Kickoff Meeting and Site walkdown will take one day to complete. We currently anticipate a draft letter report with our recommendation will be forwarded to the City within three weeks of beginning work on the project.

PROJECT FEE

Patrick will conduct the engineering evaluation described herein on a time and material basis in accordance with the attached 2013 Patrick Fee Schedule. We suggest the City establish a budget of \$20,000 for this assignment.

Our estimated fee includes time for the Site walkdown, meetings with City, and preliminary engineering to determine the recommended generator size, Site improvements, and permitting and regulatory liaison requirements, and to prepare a letter with recommendations for design and installation of the standby emergency generator.

CLIENT PROJECT AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

ENGINEERING

This Agreement between Patrick Engineering Inc. (PATRICK) and City of Berwyn, 1 Public Works Dr., Berwyn, IL 60402 (CLIENT) consists of these terms, the proposal (including attachments thereto) identified as Proposal to Provide Engineering Services for Standby Generator, 19th Street Pumping Station, Patrick Proposal No. 2B3WR0082 and dated November 6, 2013. This Agreement is effective this 6th day of November, 2013.

ARTICLE I: SCOPE OF SERVICES

PATRICK shall perform the Services with the care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of PATRICK's profession practicing in the same locality under similar conditions or circumstances. PATRICK makes no other warranty, guarantee, or representation, express or implied, in connection with this Agreement, the performance of the Services or in any report, opinion or other document developed as part of the Services.

ARTICLE III: CONFIDENTIALITY

PATRICK shall maintain as confidential such information obtained from CLIENT or developed as part of the Services as CLIENT expressly designates in writing as confidential. This obligation shall not apply to information which is or comes into the public domain or which PATRICK is required to disclose by any of PATRICK's insurers as it relates to a claim or incident that may generate a possible claim, law or order of a court, administrative agency or other legal authority. CLIENT acknowledges that certain procedures may cause some damage to land or disruption (e.g., without limitation, soil borings), and that PATRICK shall not be liable for such damage or disruption, and the correction of which shall not be PATRICK's responsibility unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties. CLIENT shall supply PATRICK with information on the existence and location of underground utilities, structures and other hazards. including hazardous wastes or hazardous substances, at any site where the Services are to be performed. PATRICK shall be entitled to rely on the accuracy and completeness of information furnished by others (including the location of underground utilities and data on subsurface conditions) and will not conduct independent evaluation thereof unless specified in the scope of Services. PATRICK shall not be liable for damage to underground utilities or structures not disclosed in writing or incorrectly disclosed to PATRICK, and CLIENT agrees to defend and indemnify PATRICK at its sole expense for any claims against PATRICK arising from CLIENT's failure in this regard.

ARTICLE V: BILLING, PAYMENTS AND COLLECTION

Unless otherwise agreed, CLIENT shall pay for the Services in accordance with PATRICK's schedule of Standard Charges in effect at the time the Services are performed. Invoices will be submitted monthly and are due upon receipt. If CLIENT objects to an invoice, CLIENT shall notify

PATRICK in writing within fifteen days of receipt of the invoice, give the reasons for the objection, and pay that portion of the invoice not in dispute within thirty days of receipt of the invoice. Any unpaid, undisputed invoice which is thirty days past due shall be assessed a late payment charge of 1.5 percent per month. PATRICK shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon ten days notice if payment as to any undisputed invoice is sixty days past due. CLIENT agrees to reimburse PATRICK its full costs of collection of any amounts due and unpaid after sixty days, including reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and the reasonable value of PATRICK's time spent on collection of such amounts.

ARTICLE VI: INSURANCE AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

PATRICK carries substantial insurance coverage including Workers Compensation, Employer's Liability, Commercial General Liability (including contractual liability), Commercial Automobile Liability and Professional Liability. A copy of PATRICK'S current insurance coverages and limits is available upon CLIENT's request. The parties have assessed the relative risks and benefits which will accrue to each in the performance of the Services and have agreed that PATRICK's total aggregate liability to CLIENT (or anyone claiming by or through CLIENT) for any injury to person or property, claims, damages, expenses, costs or losses of any kind, from any cause whatsoever, shall not exceed the total insurance proceeds paid on behalf of or to PATRICK by its insurers in settlement or satisfaction of such claims. If insurance coverage is not provided, then the total liability of PATRICK for such uninsured claims shall not exceed the total fees paid to PATRICK under this Agreement or \$25,000, whichever is less. In no event shall either party be liable to the other in contract or tort for consequential or incidental damages including, but not limited to, lost profits or losses from interruption of business.

ARTICLE VII: INDEMNIFICATION

- (A) To the fullest extent permitted by law, PATRICK shall indemnify, defend and hold CLIENT, its employees and agents, harmless from and against all demands, claims, suits, liabilities and costs including reasonable attorneys fees and litigation costs ("Claims") caused by or arising out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of PATRICK, its employees, agents or subcontractors except to the extent, if any, that any such Claims results from the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of CLIENT, its employees or agents.
- (B) To the fullest extent permitted by law, CLIENT shall indemnify, defend and hold PATRICK, its employees, agents and subcontractors harmless from and against all demands, claims, suits, liabilities, fines, penalties, and costs including reasonable attorneys fees and costs of litigation ("Claim") caused by or arising out of (i) any conditions existing on or beneath CLIENT's property at the time of performance of the Services, including, but not limited to, pollution or contamination of property or (ii) the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of CLIENT, its employees, agents or contractors except to the extent, if any, that any such Claim results from the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of PATRICK, its employees, agents or subcontractors. The indemnity obligations stated herein shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE VIII: NOTICE OF CLAIMS: COOPERATION

If CLIENT discovers any facts that might give rise to a claim arising out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions or willful misconduct of PATRICK, its employees, agents or subcontractors, CLIENT shall immediately notify PATRICK of same in writing. PATRICK shall be entitled to contest any such claim with counsel selected by PATRICK or its insurer and shall be entitled to control any litigation relating to such claim. CLIENT shall not settle or compromise any such claim without PATRICK's prior written consent and CLIENT shall cooperate with PATRICK and its insurer in connection with the defense of any such claim.

ARTICLE IX: WORKSITE SAFETY/PATRICK SITE VISITS

PATRICK will comply with CLIENT's rules and regulations governing PATRICK's activities on CLIENT's premises to the extent that the same are provided to PATRICK prior to the start of the Services. PATRICK will be responsible only for the on-site activities of its employees and subcontractors. If the Services include site visits, for example, to monitor construction activities for compliance with plans and specifications, the parties agree that PATRICK shall assume no responsibility or authority for supervision or control over any contractor's work or worksite safety, shall have no right to stop the work and shall have no responsibility or authority for the means, methods, techniques, sequencing or procedures of construction.

ARTICLE X: REUSE OR ALTERATION OF DOCUMENTS

Documents prepared by PATRICK are instruments of its Work and PATRICK retains all common law, statutory and other reserved rights, including copyright. PATRICK agrees that CLIENT will have the non-exclusive, limited, worldwide, royalty free, non transferable and non-assignable, and non-sublicenseable, right to use the documents on the project identified in the Scope of Services for each Work Order. PATRICK assumes no liability or responsibility if the documents are reused by CLIENT or others on any other project. In the event that others alter the documents without PATRICK's authorization, any and all liability arising out of such alteration is waived as against PATRICK, and CLIENT assumes full responsibility for such changes. Where PATRICK has used due care in the electronic or disk transmission of data, information or documents to CLIENT and its agents, CLIENT shall be responsible for and bear the risk of loss or damages resulting from (i) errors or defects introduced by such transmission; (ii) CLIENT's or its agent's automated conversion or reformatting of the data, information or documents; and (iii) deficiencies, defects or errors in CLIENT's or its agent's software or hardware utilized to receive, transmit, utilize, format or reproduce the data, information or documents.

ARTICLE XI: DELAYS

ARTICLE XII: SUCCESSOR, ASSIGNS

This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties and their respective successors and assigns. Neither party shall assign its interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other.

ARTICLE XIII: TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other. Upon receipt of notice of termination from CLIENT, PATRICK shall immediately cease work and take all reasonable steps to minimize costs relating to termination. CLIENT shall pay for services rendered through the date of receipt of notice of termination, plus any unpaid reimbursable expenses and reasonable costs relating to the termination, including reassignment of staff.

We previously received a permit for solicitation and canvasing that extended from May to September 2013. We would like to extend the permit through April 2014.

We have previously shared with you and Mayor Robert J. Lovero that representatives from the organizations listed above have been conducting the health assessment study in Berwyn, Cicero, Garfield Ridge, and Stickney. As you may recall, the CHANA study has involved four components: community profiles, individual interviews, community inventories, and a residential health survey.

Currently, we have successfully completed three of the four components of the study, and are now preparing for the implementation of the health survey. We completed gathering available health-related materials to build the population and health profile of Berwyn. Subsequently we will add to the report the information we gathered through the individual interviews and the residential surveys.

Residential Health Survey

The health survey involves the random selection of street addresses and the interview of 420 Berwyn residents. We are using a cluster staged sampling approach to select a sample of streets addresses that would represent the diversity of the population in Berwyn. Trained surveyors will then visit the selected street addresses and will solicit the voluntary participation of city residents.

The Institutional Review Board (IRB) at the University of New Mexico, composed of community and academics, reviewed and approved the health survey protocol. From July to October 2013, the board meticulously reviewed the sampling approach and the survey questionnaire. On October 3, we received IRB approval for the continuation of the study and the overall plan for the health survey.

The greatest threat to the success of a survey that uses a randomized sample is low participation of selected residents. We are taking a few measures to address such problem in survey research. The first measure is the delivery of a letter of selection to each chosen address. In this letter, we inform residents about the project and the survey and invite them to contact us for more information.

The second measure to increase participation in the health survey involves soliciting members of the clergy and owners of stores and restaurants to support our efforts by displaying a poster that will advertise the health assessment and the health survey. We will visit the house of prayer and vendor to solicit their voluntary cooperation the week before visiting the selected address.

The third measure to increase participation in the health survey is advertising the study and the survey using temporary lawn signs that we will display in public spaces such as street corners and train stations. We will place the lawn signs in public spaces the week before we conduct the interviews in a given area. Once we complete the interviews, we will remove the lawn signs.

The research director or the project coordinator will accompany trained surveyors during the interview process. We will visit the selected address and ask residents to participate voluntarily in the 15-30 minute interview. We will thank residents for their participation in the survey with a ten-dollar gift certificate. The information gathered will remain confidential and anonymous.

We understand that since the institutions submitting this application are a Charitable Organization and a non-for-profit educational institution, the City of Berwyn will waive the fee for the application and for the persons involved in gathering the information on behalf of the CHANA project. The State of Illinois has registered Alivio Medical Center as a charitable organization.

For your review, we have attached copies of the University of New Mexico Institutional Review Board approval letter, the health survey questioner, and a draft of the lawn sign. Please let us know if you have questions about the project and the application. We thank you and the members of the Berwyn City Council for considering this application to extend the canvasing and solicitation permit.




