

# MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL APRIL 10, 2013

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Polashek, Avila and Laureto.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was had for the deceased former resident, Frank Juliano and the Men and Women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety, along with the Men and Women in the Armed Forces.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. There being no speakers for the open forum, it was declared closed.
- 4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council and the Committee of the Whole held March 26, 2013 were submitted. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to suspend the rules and bring forward item J-1. The motion carried by a voice vote. J-1 is a communication from the Berwyn's Police Chief Ritz regarding the introduction and swearing in of Probationary Police Officers Jeffery Brenka and Katie Perez. Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur, approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Clerk Pavlik administered the oath of office.
- 6. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a Resolution regarding the Route 66 Car Show and the closure of Ogden Avenue on September 7, 2013. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur, adopt the resolution and authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried with a unanimous roll call vote.

# MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE April 10, 2013

- 1. Mayor Lovero called the Committee of the Whole to order at 6:03 p.m.; upon the call of the roll the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Polashek, Avila and Laureto. Absent: Santoy.
- 2. 2013 Integrated Marketing Campaign Presentation: The Mayor recognized Executive Director of the Berwyn Development Corporation, Anthony Griffin and Amy Crowther who gave a PowerPoint presentation and reviewed the marketing campaign history, evaluated the success since 2007 and reviewed the opportunity to attract new residents and businesses.

Note: Santoy present at 6:05 p.m.

Four different billboard concepts were presented for a survey and the slogan chosen was "Make The Move - Berwyn," with a rising bulls-eye along the Chicago Skyline.

- 3. Real Estate Purchase of Stanley Ave. Property (Kako's:) The Mayor recognized special legal counsel James Vasselli who reviewed the purchase agreement for 6535 Stanley Ave., noting the property is ready to close at a purchase price of \$260,000. Alderman Chapman questioned if there were any additional costs for property. The mayor recognized Public Works Director Robert Schiller who reported he had done his due diligence on the property and that there will be additional costs of approximately \$30,000 to prepare the building for the intended storage use. Schiller stated the cost will be split 50/50 with the city and drug forfeiture funds, along with the purchase price.
- 4. The Mayor stated that Rick Heidner and Frank Thomas will be here at 7:00 p.m. for the Big Hurt Brewhouse Redevelopment Agreement and asked for a motion to go into closed session for pending litigation and that council will come back into open thereafter. Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:12 p.m. The motion carried.
- 5. A motion was made in closed session to re-open the Committee of the Whole by Santoy, seconded by Polashek, at 6:25 p.m. The motion carried.
- 6. Big Hurt Brewhouse Redevelopment Agreement: The Mayor recognized Anthony Griffin who presented and reviewed the agreement, Item E-2. Griffin introduced developer Rick Heidner and Frank Thomas who presented their concept, noting they will own the building jointly. The Mayor then recognized James Vasselli who reviewed the default provisions of the contract, noting the

city has already received a \$50,000 deposit on the Oak Park/Cermak Bank Building project.

Dear Mayor Lovero and Members of the City Council:

Attached for your consideration are Findings of Fact from the Zoning Board of Appeals relative to a request for a Conditional Use filed by Petitioner JenCare Neighborhood Medical Center Berwyn, LLC. The Petitioner seeks to operate a medical office on the first floor of a commercial use building in a retail overlay district within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District at 6326 W. Cermak. The Property is located in a retail overlay district within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, where a medical office larger than 1,000 square feet is a regulated use that, under the circumstances present here, requires a conditional use in order to locate at the Property, pursuant to Section 1258.13 of the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code").

Attached to the Findings of Fact are Exhibits from the Public Hearing, as well as the ZBA packet materials.

The recommendation of the ZBA in this matter was to DENY the request for a conditional use, on a vote of 4-3. In order to concur with the recommendation of denial, the Council only needs to approve a motion. However, because this matter was such a close vote. I am including an Ordinance for your consideration at this time so that the Council has the ability to approve the conditional use if it so desires.

## FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE CITY OF BERWYN ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL

April 16, 2013

APPLICATION: For a Conditional Use to Allow for a Medical Office over

1,000 square feet in a Retail Overlay District at 6326 W.

Cermak Road, Berwyn, Illinois.

PETITIONER: JenCare Neighborhood Medical Center Berwyn, LLC

PROPERTY: 6326 W. Cermak Road, Berwyn, Illinois (the "Property")

**SUMMARY OF REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION:** The City of Berwyn has received a request from Petitioner JenCare Neighborhood Medical Center Berwyn, LLC ("Petitioner") for a conditional use to operate a medical office on the first floor of a commercial use building within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District at 6326 W. Cermak. The Property is located in a retail overlay district within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, where a medical office greater than 1,000 square feet is a regulated use that, under the circumstances present here, requires a conditional use in order to locate at the Property, pursuant to Section 1258.13 of the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code").

Following a public hearing held on April 16, 2013, the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City of Berwyn ("ZBA") recommended denial of the requested conditional use on a vote of 4-3.

**BACKGROUND**: The Property is an existing masonry block building that has been vacant for over two (2) years. Petitioner proposes to locate and operate a medical office within the first floor of the building, pursuant to a site plan that proposes to occupy 8,400 square feet of the Property.

Staff determined that a conditional use was required pursuant to the retail overlay provisions of the Zoning Code. Petitioner then filed an application requesting that the ZBA grant a conditional use to allow the proposed use at the Property.

**PUBLIC HEARING:** At the public hearing on Petitioner's conditional use request held on April 16, 2013, representatives of Petitioner described the history and evolution of their practice and its mission to serve the elderly. They seek to serve Medicare patients in medically underserved areas. Petitioner has a number of facilities, including in Florida, Louisville, and New Orleans. Petitioner is run by a family of doctors. Representatives of Petitioner further described their business model, which focuses on providing one-stop medical shopping for seniors. Unlike a hospital or typical general practitioner, Petitioner's doctors spend more time with each senior patient, and

specialists from all areas of medicine are available within the facility. They provide transportation options for patients. It is a better experience for elderly patients than a hospital. All of their physicians are board certified and they are highly collaborative; the doctors communicate with each other and are required to meet with each other. Petitioner described the business as "high impact, high touch, and high tech." The average wait-time to see a physician is 16 minutes. They have an integrated pharmacy carrying all common medications, and patients are able to get medicines on the spot. The nature of their practice helps keep seniors out of the hospital. They have a higher customer satisfaction rating than Apple – 90% v. 70%. Petitioner participates in community events. If a patient is Medicare eligible, Petitioner wants to help. They are anticipating opening 5 facilities in the Chicago area, and would like to start this year.

Petitioner feels this is a great space for JenCare, and will bring up to 30 jobs to Berwyn. They ultimately hope to grow the practice to 2,500 patients.

The Property is located at 6326 W. Cermak, between Cuyler and Ridgeland. The area trends towards service, with a mix of uses nearby, including a Women's Workout World, currency exchange, tobacco store, pawn shop and senior hearing aid facility.

A representative of the realty company that manages the property testified that he has had no offers to lease the Property these past two years. The Property has been sitting vacant. He feels the character of Petitioner's business will be consistent with the area. The fact that they provide transportation to patients will help alleviate any parking concerns. Patient traffic will be heavlest in morning. The Petitioner will take walk-up patients.

Exhibits marked during the course of the Public Hearing included: Exhibit 1, the published legal notice regarding the public hearing, and accompanying Certification of Publication. The Executive Secretary noted for the record that notice of the public hearing had been published on March 28, 2013, in accordance with the Zoning Code. Exhibit 2 consisted of the full application for the relief sought by JenCare.

There being no further questions or members of the public wishing to speak on the application, the Public Hearing was closed.

The Area Investigator appointed in this matter was ZBA member Alicia Ruiz. Ms. Ruiz discussed her investigation, commenting on Petitioner's history in the business, focus on seniors, tradition of working with hospitals, and community outreach. She noted that Petitioner would be hiring for up to almost 30 jobs, including clerk, receptionists, and physicians. They provide one-stop service, with specialists available on site, leading to a high satisfaction rate. In perusing the immediate area, she noticed a lot of other medical uses already operating, including dental offices, physicians, and eye/ear specialists. She noted that if the JenCare conditional use was granted, there would be seven (7) medical uses in the immediate area. Although Petitioner was proposing a valuable business, she proposed that the request for a conditional use not be approved, due to the proliferation of medical uses already located in the area.

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The other members of the ZBA each then in turn expressed their views on the proposed conditional use.

The ZBA recommended that the City Council deny the conditional use requested by Petitioner, 4-3. All of the members voting for denial were focused on the numerous medical uses already present in the immediate area on Cermak Road, but felt that JenCare was otherwise eligible for a conditional use. The three (3) members voting in favor of granting the relief sought felt that the unique business model of JenCare separated it from any of the current medical uses in the area.

FINDINGS: The ZBA makes the following Findings as to the proposed Conditional Use:

- (A) The proposed use and development at the particular location requested is not necessary or desirable, does not provide a service or a facility which is in the interest of public convenience and will not contribute to the general welfare of the neighborhood or community. A majority of members of the ZBA felt that siting of this non-retail proposed use at the particular location sought was not necessary, as the area already has many medical uses operating within the immediate area.
- (B) The proposed use and development will, under the circumstances of the particular case, be detrimental to the health, safety, morals or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity, or injurious to property values or improvements in the vicinity. A majority of the members of the ZBA felt the proposed use would not benefit the general community and property values in the vicinity by providing a needed service, as the immediate area is already saturated with other medical services and would not therefore provide any benefits at the proposed location or move the area in a positive developmental direction.
- (C) The proposed use and development will not be in harmony with the general and specific purposes for which the Zoning Code was enacted, and for which the regulations of the district in question were established, and with the general purpose and intent of the Official Comprehensive Plan. A majority of members of the ZBA felt that the proposed use, by offering medical services at the proposed location in an area already saturated with medical uses, and failing to generate retail sales tax, is not consistent with the goals and purposes of the retail overlay district.
- (D) The proposed use and development will be constructed, arranged and operated so as not to dominate the immediate vicinity, but may interfere with the use and development of neighboring property. A majority of the members of the ZBA felt that the use, by offering medical services in an area that already has many operating medical uses in the immediate vicinity, will hinder the use and development of this portion of the retail overlay district.
- (E) The proposed use and development will be served adequately by essential public facilities and services such as streets, public utilities, drainage structures, police and fire protection, refuse disposal, parks, libraries and schools, or the applicant

- will provide adequately for the services. The public facilities and services necessary to serve the Petitioner are already in place.
- (F) The proposed use and development will not cause undue traffic congestion nor draw significant amounts of traffic through residential streets. By providing transportation services, Petitioner has helped alleviate any risk that the use will cause undue traffic congestion.
- (G) The proposed use and development will be served by parking areas that are of adequate size, properly located and suitably screened from adjoining residential uses.
- (H) The proposed use and development will not result in the destruction, loss or damage of natural, scenic or historic features of significant importance. The proposed use will be in an existing vacant building and commercial space.
- (I) The proposed use and development will comply with the regulations and conditions specified in the Zoning Code for the use, and with the stipulations and conditions made a part of the authorization granted by Council.

**RECOMMENDATIONS**: Based upon the foregoing Findings, the ZBA, by a vote of 4-3 recommends to the Mayor and City Council that the conditional use requested by Petitioner JenCare Neighborhood Medical Center Berwyn, LLC for operation of a medical office at the Property at 6326 W. Cermak Road, Berwyn, Illinois, in the retail overlay district within the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, be denied.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE FOR A MEDICAL OFFICE IN A RETAIL OVERLAY DISTRICT IN THE C-2 GENERAL COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICT AT 6326 W. CERMAK ROAD, BERWYN, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, a request seeking a conditional use to operate a medical office over 1,000 square feet in size on the first floor in a retail overlay district at 6326 W. Cermak, Berwyn, Illinois, (the "Subject Property"), in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District, was filed by JenCare Neighborhood Medical Center Berwyn, LLC (the "Applicant") with the City of Berwyn; and

WHEREAS, in a retail overlay district, a medical office of over 1,000 square feet located on the first floor requires a conditional use in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District pursuant to the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Subject Property is legally described in **Exhlbit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the application has been referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City ("Board of Appeals") and has been processed in accordance with the Zoning Code, as amended; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2013, the Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the Application pursuant to notice thereof given in the manner required by law, and, after considering all of the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing, the Board of Appeals recommended denial of the Application by a vote of 4-3, all as set forth in the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals in this matter ("Findings and Recommendation"), a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City have duly considered the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals, and all of the materials, facts and circumstances affecting the Application, and, contrary to the Findings and Recommendation of the Board of Appeals, find that the Application satisfies the standards set forth in Section 1268.05 of the Zoning Code relating to conditional uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County and State of Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: <u>Incorporation</u>. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Section 1 by reference as findings of the City Council.

Section 2: Approval of Conditional Use for a Medical Office. The City Council, acting pursuant to the authority vested in it by the laws of the State of Illinois and the Zoning Code, hereby approves a conditional use permit for a medical office of over 1,000 square feet to locate on the first floor of a commercial building within a retail overlay district in the C-2 General Commercial Zoning District on the Subject Property located at 6326 W. Cermak, Berwyn, Illinois, as legally described in Exhibit A.

Section 3: Violation of Condition or Code. Any violation of any term or condition stated in this Ordinance or of any applicable code, ordinance, or regulation of the City shall be grounds for the immediate rescission by the City Council of the approvals made in this Ordinance.

Section 4: Severability and Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances. Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the unconstitutionality or invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>: <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

During the budget review process, staff identified that there is a significant amount of outstanding revenue owed to the City that is uncollected. When businesses and individuals choose to not pay everything from water bills to blight tickets, an unfair burden is placed upon Berwyn taxpayers.

Attached is a contractual agreement between the City of Berwyn and the law firm of Heller and Frisone, Ltd. This collection services agreement will allow the City of Berwyn to remit unpaid debt information to Heller and Frisone and begin the collections process. While most collection firms charge a percentage fee of what is *owed* on an outstanding debt, Berwyn has negotiated an agreement with Heller and Frisone that charges a percentage fee on only the debts that are *collected*. This seemingly small variation will benefit the City by allowing our Legal Department to negotiate debt settlements and create payment plans in certain circumstances.

#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the approval of the attached Collection Services Agreement with Heller and Frisone, LTD.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR COLLECTION SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH HELLER & FRISONE, LTD. FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Illinois Constitution (1970) and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, various parties are in debt to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to enter into a debt collection agreement to collect the aforesaid debt; and

WHEREAS, Heller & Frisone, Ltd. desires to provide debt collection services to the City and has provided the City with a debt collection agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to use its home rule powers to enter into the Agreement; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

- Section 1. The statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.
- Section 2. The City Council hereby finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable and otherwise in the best interests of the City to approve an agreement with terms substantially the same as the terms of the Agreement.

- Section 3. The Agreement is hereby approved with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City's legal counsel.
- Section 4. The City's legal counsel is hereby authorized to negotiate and undertake any and all actions on the part of the City to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.
- Section 5. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the applicable Agreement, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City's legal counsel. The City Council further authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City are authorized and directed to take all action necessary or reasonably required by the City to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transaction contemplated herein and shall take all acts necessary in conformity therewith. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any such documents, as required.
- Section 6. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.
- Section 7. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.
- Section 8. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

As such the City may request that accounts be 22 closed or withdrawn from the collection process at which time Heller does agree to close 23 its file. 24 WHEREAS, in order to avoid any liability that may result from redundant or 25 simultaneous collection attempts concerning the debt(s) contemplated herein, the 26 Parties agree that any account placed for collection with Heller that has not been closed 27 or withdrawn by the City, shall not also be placed for collection with any other 28 individual, company, business or other entity involved in the business of debt collection 29 unless the City has first directed or does direct Heller to close its file; 30 31 WHEREAS, Berwyn has determined that Heller possesses the knowledge and

experience necessary to provide the above stated debt collection services, together with

6	independent contractor regarding any and all services it provides to Berwyn pursuant to
7	the terms and condition of this Agreement;

13	WHEREAS, Heller agrees and acknowledge that the terms and conditions of this
14	Agreement and corresponding mutual obligations of the Parties are all subject to the
15	general supervision and direction of the Mayor of Berwyn and/or his designee(s);

17	NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the mutual promises
18	and covenants contained herein, and for such other good and valuable consideration, the
19	receipt and sufficiency of which is herein acknowledged, the Parties, hereby agree as

23	1. Retention and Compensation. Pursuant to the terms and conditions of this
24	Independent Contractor Collection Services Agreement, Berwyn does hereby retain
25	Heller to handle all claims referred by Berwyn to Heller for collection, and agrees to pay
26	Heller as compensation for the legal services provided in connection with the collection
27	of those referred claims, a sum equal to twenty five (25%) percent of any amounts
28	collected or recovered prior to the commencement or filing of any legal proceedings.
29	(Pre-Litigation Claims) The Parties further agree that if any referred claim warrants
30	litigation, Heller must receive written authorization from Berwyn prior the

commencement or filing of any such legal proceeding. The Parties further agree that any compensation to Heller from Berwyn for the legal services Heller may provide to Berwyn in connection with any referred claim that the Parties determine warrants litigation, shall be set forth under a separate agreement or as an addendum to this Agreement. (Litigation Claims)

2. <u>Payment/Settlement Notification</u>. Berwyn agrees to promptly notify Heller of any and all direct payments received by Berwyn in connection with any account referred for collection by Berwyn to Heller and further agrees to notify Heller of any and all settlement agreements or payment arrangements made directly by and between the customer (debtor) and Berwyn;

3. Berwyn Claims /Heller Compensation Specified. Heller understands and acknowledges that any claim referred to Heller for collection belongs to Berwyn and as such, the Parties agree that Berwyn has the absolute right to settle any referred claim as it may deem appropriate. Heller agrees and acknowledges that in the event Berwyn does decide to settle a referred claim for less than the full account balance referred to Heller for collection, Heller shall be compensated as set forth above based upon the settlement amount paid and not based upon the original amount of the referred claim;

4. <u>Authorization, Endorsements and Deposits</u>. Berwyn authorizes Heller to endorse and deposit into its client escrow account all checks, money orders and/or other forms of payment received on any Berwyn claim referred for collection and further authorizes Heller to execute in its name and on its behalf, any and all documents necessary for the handling of any claim referred to for collection;

5. <u>Disclosure of Account Information</u>. Heller shall not use or disclose any debtor account information to any third party, except as is lawful and necessary in connection with attempting to collect the claim;

6. Monthly Payment Remittance. Heller shall remit all payments it receives on behalf of Berwyn to Berwyn on a monthly basis by the 10<sup>th</sup> day of each and every month. The Parties agree that each monthly remittance shall include a monthly Client Statement containing the Client account information, the debtor's name, the amount of the payment and the corresponding amount deducted by Heller representing its 25% contingency fee pursuant to the terms of this Agreement;

7. Best Efforts; Inducements. Heller agrees that at all times it will faithfully, efficiently and to the best of its abilities and talents perform all of the duties that may be required of and from it, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Heller shall abide by all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, orders, rules and regulations and shall at all times comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct. Heller shall act in the best interests of Berwyn at all times and acknowledges herein that it has not provided any gift, gratuity, service or other inducement to any Berwyn official or employee or to any entity or individual involved in retaining Heller's services;

8. Conflict of Interest. Heller represents and warrants to Berwyn that it has performed a conflict of interest search and has determined that it is not bound by any other contract, agreement or commitment and therefore, has no other obligation, contract, agreement or commitment that would, in any way, prevent, restrict, hinder or interfere with its ability to provide the services contemplated under this Agreement. Heller agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless, Berwyn, its officials, elected and appointed, employees, consultants and agents for and against any liability Berwyn may incur as the result of the existence of any such Heller conflict of interest which Heller is unable to resolve.

9. <u>Professional Liability Insurance.</u> Heller agrees to maintain at its own expense, professional liability insurance with a reputable carrier in an amount not less than one million dollars. Heller further agrees to keep its professional liability insurance in good standing during the entire term of this Agreement. Heller shall provide Berwyn

with a copy of the current declaration page indicating the amount of coverage, the effective date(s) of coverage and any other pertinent information concerning same.

10. Representations and Warranties. Heller represents and warrants to Berwyn that the statements and other representations made by Heller to Berwyn in connection with the services provided to Berwyn by Heller under this Agreement are true and correct.

Information" concerning the Berwyn accounts referred to Heller for collection or otherwise, to any other person or entity, except when during the course of its representation of Berwyn, it is required due to so under the particular circumstance or as may required by law. For purposes of this Agreement, "Confidential Information" shall include that information provided to Heller which has been identified by Berwyn as "confidential information," and or that information which has been previously identified and agreed upon between the Parties to be "confidential information." Heller's obligations herein with respect to this provision may extend beyond the term of this Agreement and shall terminate only when such information ceases to constitute Confidential Information. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Parties agree to in all instances, abide by all legal disclosure requirements including but not limited to subpoena and FOIA requests

12. <u>Indemnification</u>. Heller agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless, Berwyn from any liability incurred by Berwyn for any negligent act or omission undertaken by Heller in connection with the services contemplated herein, which act or omission could have or should have been known to Heller prior to its performing of the act. However, the Parties agree that Heller shall not be liable to Berwyn in any manner if Heller's act or omission was based solely upon and in reliance upon the account information provided by Berwyn to Heller during the course of its representation. In these circumstances, Heller agrees to use its best efforts to resolve any and all customer discrepancies and/or disputes resulting from Heller's attempt to collect any Berwyn

account referred for collection. If Heller is caused to have to indemnify Berwyn, the Parties agree that the indemnified parties hereunder shall include Berwyn, its officials (whether elected or appointed and including, but not limited to the Mayor), officers, employees, attorneys and agents. The indemnification by Heller to Berwyn shall be provided to the fullest extent of the law. For the defense of this claim, the Parties agree that Berwyn shall have the right to select its own counsel.

13. Notice of Impending Claims. The Parties agree that throughout the entire term of this Agreement, including all times wherein this Agreement may have been extended by the Parties mutual consent, Heller shall have a continuing obligation to notify Berwyn of any claims, either filed or threatened to be filed, which materially affect, or could materially affect Berwyn;

14. <u>Preambles & Approvals</u>. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Agreement are true and correct and are adopted as part of this Agreement. Where approval is required pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, no unreasonable request shall be denied;

15. Construction and Governing Law. Construction and interpretation of this Agreement shall at all times and in all respects be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to its conflicts of laws. The Parties acknowledge that they have had an opportunity to review and revise this Agreement and that they have had the opportunity to have the same reviewed by legal counsel, if desired. Therefore, the Parties agree that normal rules of construction, to the extent that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party, shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement;

16. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this **Agreement** shall be deemed severable, and the invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more of the provisions herein shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the other provisions herein;

  - 19. <u>Headings</u>. The headings used herein form no substantive part of this Agreement, are for the convenience of the Parties only, and shall not be used to define, enlarge or limit any term of this Agreement;

This Agreement may be executed in counterpart originals, each of which shall be deemed to be an original with the same effect as if the signatures thereto were on the same instrument. - 21. Assignment. This Agreement is personal in character and as such, neither Heller nor Berwyn shall assign any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other. No assignment, even if consented to, shall in any way reduce or eliminate the liability of the assignor for obligations accrued prior to such assignment.

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AN ORDINANCE ADDING SECTION 1610.03 TO CHAPTER 1610 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES REGARDING OPEN BURNING WITHIN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to maintaining a safe and healthy environment within the City; and

WHEREAS, in connection therewith, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare to amend the Codified Ordinances (the "Code") to prohibit open burning within the City; and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the City and its residents to add Section 1610.03 to Chapter 1610 of the Code as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. Chapter 1610 of the Code is hereby amended by the addition of Section 1610.03, which Section shall read as follows:

#### OPEN BURNING PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS.

It shall be unlawful to burn or cause the burning at any location within the City of any paper, cardboard, leaves, twigs, branches, wood, grass, grass clippings or other refuse from farming or gardening, or other combustible materials of any nature whatsoever, except as follows:

- (A) Burning any combustible materials wholly within a building in a fireplace or other equipment or facility designed and constructed for such purpose; provided, that any refuse-burning incinerator installed in any residence building shall comply with the rules and regulations of the state air pollution control board as the same may from time to time be in effect;
- B) Burning charcoal briquettes, natural gas, propane, approved wood, or commercially prepared seasoned wood chips in conjunction with any of the foregoing for cooking purposes, provided, however that the following restrictions shall apply to multi-family buildings:
  - 1. Charcoal burners and other uncovered open flame cooking devices shall not be operated; and
  - 2. Burning of charcoal briquettes, approved wood or commercially prepared seasoned woodchips shall not be allowed.
- (C) Burning combustible materials in a high temperature incinerator providing complete combustion and complying with the rules and regulations of the state air pollution control board as the same may from time to time be in effect;
- (D) Burning approved wood, as defined in paragraph (G), in an outdoor bonfire as a gathering conducted by religious, educational or other not-for-profit organization; provided, that a permit therefore is previously issued by the Fire Prevention Bureau and that such bonfire is supervised by one ore more adults and adequate safety equipment as approved by the Fire Prevention Bureau is available; and
- (E) Burning any combustible material other than those listed in the first paragraph herein for recognized silvicultural or range or wildlife management practices or prevention or control of disease or pests; provided that:
  - 1. The Fire Prevention Bureau shall find that the burning thereof will not constitute a danger to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and residents of the City or of other communities surrounding the City, or constitute a danger of air pollution in any other respect;
  - 2. The Fire Prevention Bureau shall issue a permit therefore; and

- 3. Any such burning shall be attended by adequate personnel and safety equipment as approved by the Fire Prevention Bureau.
- (F) Burning approved wood in an approved container for recreational campfires, as defined in paragraph (G) in a safe and controlled manner; provided that:
  - 1. Such fire shall be under the control of and attended at all times by a person 18 years of age or older;
  - 2. A portable fire extinguisher having a minimum rating of 4-A or other approved extinguishing agent such as sand, dirt or water in sufficient quantity shall be available for immediate use;
  - 3. Such fire shall at all times be safely managed and shall not be permitted to create excessive flames, flying cinders or smoke;
  - 4. Such fire shall be located in an area separated from any structure by not less than fifteen (15) feet;
  - 5. Such fire shall not be used in such a manner as to emit offensive or objectionable smoke or odors or when other circumstances make such fires hazardous; and
  - 6. At no time shall such fire be utilized for waste disposal purposes.
- (G) For purposes of this Section the following definitions apply:

Approved Container. A commercially manufactured device specifically designed, intended, advertised, and utilized, for the purpose of recreational campfires, such as chimneas and outdoor fireplaces. Such container must be located above ground and in no event shall be built into the ground or located below grade.

Approved Wood. Seasoned dry firewood of dimensions appropriate to safely fit within the container. In particular, but without limitation, approved wood shall not include any green or fresh vegetation materials; nor shall it include any leaves, grass, bushes, roots or other similar materials, nor shall it include any construction materials, such as created woods, plywood or pressure-treated wood or any other materials which produce excessive smoke, cinders or other emissions characteristic of non-seasoned wood.

**Bonfire.** A safely conducted and controlled outdoor fire utilized for ceremonial purposes.

Recreational Campfire. A safely conducted and controlled outdoor fire utilized for comfort or relaxation.

Section 3. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendment contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the City are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 4. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 5. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication or as otherwise provided by law. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

Re: Purchase of a Fire Department Vehicle

Honorable Mayor Lovero and City Council Members,

I am requesting permission to enter into a contract to purchase a new 2013 Ford Expedition 4 x 4 that will become the Fire Chiefs vehicle. This purchase has been researched, and it has been concluded that through past experience with this model, fleet continuity considerations, and cost, that this model best suits the department's needs. If approved, the vehicle will be purchased through the Joint Purchasing program for Local Government Agencies (The Suburban Purchasing Cooperative). This program complies with necessary bid process requirements, as the contract has already been competitively bid throughout the state. If approved, the vehicle will be purchased through Landmark Ford in Springfield, Illinois (contract # 117A).

As you may or may not be aware, it has been a past practice that when a new staff vehicle is purchased, that it is assigned to the Fire Chief and his vehicle is passed "down the line" to other staff members. In this instance the Chiefs current vehicle will be passed to the Asst. Chief, and the A/C's vehicle will be passed to the Battalion Chief in charge of Fire Prevention. BC Manfredini will use that as his daily vehicle and respond after normal business hours to certain emergency situations, i.e. confirmed structure fires, imminent life safety violations involving occupancy load violations, etc.

It is my recommendation that we purchase a 2013 Ford Expedition 4 x 4. The cost of the vehicle is \$29,968.00. The vehicle must be equipped with emergency lighting, siren, opti-com, radio accessories and other electronics. These required emergency vehicle accessories would be provided and installed by a vendor utilized by the Fire Department for the current fleet. These items and installations will bring an additional cost of \$7.589.60 which brings the total projected cost for this vehicle to \$37,557.60.

This future expenditure has been planned for in the 2013 Budget in the Capital Outlay line item. Thank you for your consideration in this matter.

For the past eight years the Berwyn Fire Department has participated in a fire prevention program that works in conjunction with the National Fire Safety Council Inc. The Fire Pup program solicits funds from Berwyn Businesses and Organizations; on our behalf Fire Pup will send out a letter signed by Fire Chief O'Halloran to this targeted audience, all monies received to our Department are then sent out to the Fire Pup Coordinator who then purchases and prepares fire safety materials for all schools in Berwyn. The Fire Pup program brought in \$4,219.50 and we were able to supply 2,616 children with Educational Materials in 2012. On or before Fire Prevention Week our Firefighters visit every school targeting kindergarten through 3rd grade to give Safety Talks and pass out all materials that were purchased through the Fire Pup program.
