

- The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was had for the family of the deceased Carlos Reyna, son in law of retired City Clerk Louise Sommese, the family of Anne Pavone, former employee of the Finance Department, the family of Bob Russell, VIPS Civilian Coordinator, the family of Carolyn Lazzara, beloved mother of the Building Director Charles Lazzara and for the Men and Women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety, along with the Men and Women in the Armed Forces.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Anthony Griffin, Executive Director of the Berwyn Development Corporation thanked everyone for attending the Pub Crawl on Saturday April 21, 2012, with 208 people in attendance. MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE APRIL 24, 2012

- Mayor Lovero called the Committee of the Whole to order at 6:02 p.m., upon the call of the roll; the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Polashek, and Laureto. Absent: Santoy and Avila.
- 2. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Laureto, to excuse Alderman Santoy and Alderman Avila. The motion carried.
- Gas Tax Open Forum:

Note: Alderman Avila present at 6:03 p.m.

The Mayor introduced a representative for local gas stations owners, Cyriac Chandy, who spoke on the gas tax and noted that gas stations owner's property taxes prices have increased and he personally pays over \$45,000 a year and is against the 2 cent a gallon increase and ask for City Council to rescind the ordnance. The Mayor thanked all for attending and will take the matter under advisement.

- 4. Insurance Renewal Presentation: The Mayor recognized Administrative Assistant, Ruth Volbre, who reviewed this year's premiums, which are reduced by approximately \$5,000 over previous year, with the same coverage. Avila questioned the time frame for coverage. Volbre responded; May 1st coverage for most and June 1st for the Fire Department. The Mayor recognized Peter Lamonica, Vice President with Mesirow Insurance, who reviewed all policies. There were no further questions. The Mayor thanked both for the presentation and noted that this is item J-6 on the City Council Agenda this evening.
- 5. 2012 Integrated Marking Campaign Presentation: The Mayor recognized representatives from the Berwyn Development Corporation, Tony Griffin and Amy Crowther, who gave a Power Point presentation and review same (see attached.) This year's Billboard Campaign, as recommended by the BDC, will be "Believe the Buzz BERWYN." The Aldermen questioned if there were any billboards in the Western suburbs. Griffin answered no; most are in Chicago, where the viewing numbers are higher.

Jim Vasselli and Tony Griffin presented lease agreement and reviewed same, noting that there is a \$281,000 credit for a build out, with no upfront payments from the City. Dear Mayor and City Council,

Applicant is requesting TIF funds for improvements to open a new comedy club within a vacant space in the Depot District. The TIF scope of work includes demolition and interior renovations including demolition, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, carpentry, front façade, fire sprinkler and system, insulation, architectural design and signage. The applicant submitted a Tier II TIF application including a business plan, pro forma and building plans. To this extent, the applicant is requesting TIF funds for redevelopment work at this location in order to fill in the needed gap. Total project costs are expected to be \$292,000.

The application meets the procedural requirements of the Berwyn TIF application which was reviewed by BDC staff and then processed for consideration. A 10-year revenue forecast shows that the business would produce \$225,243 in total tax revenue.

The Berwyn Development Corporation's (BDC) Board of Directors and the Ogden/Depot TIF committee have both agreed to recommend approval of the below specified TIF monies regarding Riddles Comedy Club's TIF eligible project costs.

Based on this information, the City Council is being asked to approve TIF monies to pay only the eligible costs associated with this project up to a maximum of \$93,500. For the benefit of Depot District TIF cash flow, payments will be phased funding of \$75,000 in FY2012; and \$18,500 in 3rd quarter of FY2013. As part of our process, BDC staff will validate work performed and eligibility prior to any payments. Furthermore, the BDC will ensure the applicant will not receive any TIF monies prior to obtaining proper City permits.

With the consent of City Council, Riddles Comedy Club can commence work on their project and contribute to the revitalization efforts taking place in the Depot District.

BDC STAFF TIF APPLICATION ANALYSIS Depot District Development, LLC/Riddles Comedy Club - 6910 Windsor Ave.

Summary of Project:

The co-applicants, Riddles Comedy Club and Depot District Development LLC, are requesting TIF funds for redevelopment work at their vacant commercial space. The TIF scope of work includes, but not limited to, demolition, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, carpentry, front façade, fire sprinkler and system, insulation, flooring, millwork, architectural design, and signage. The applicants submitted a Tier II TIF application including a business plan, pro forma and building plans. To this extent, the applicant is requesting TIF funds for redevelopment work at this location in order to fill in the needed gap.

The applicant is proposing to develop approximately 6,812 sq. ft. vacant commercial space into a new entertainment venue. Riddles Comedy Club currently has an existing unit in Alsip that has been in operation since 1990. Riddles hosts national and local comedians with shows Friday and Saturday nights. They also host open mic nights and open the bar on other nights without entertainment scheduled. The project would create 15 temporary construction jobs and 10 full time positions once open. Additionally, the concept could bring over 640 consumers to the depot District for their Friday and Saturday shows. Riddles has met with the City to review license and permitting requirements for the comedy club operations. The proposed build-out is compatible with current zoning regulations for the property. The property PINs include 16-31-125-004-0000, 16-31-125-005-0000 and 16-31-125-006-0000. The space was formerly occupied by Abram and Sons Funeral Home and has been vacant since 2006.

Past TIF Funding:

The proposed project site has received TIF funding in the past, receiving \$250,000 approved January 21, 2011. The first phase of this development was to acquire and redevelop the site into a new mixed use building with a vanilla shell for retail space then market for potential users. The total project costs for the first phase was \$630,000. It, therefore complies, with the BDC TIF policy referred to below. In creating this new retail space, it was discussed during the application review period that a potential 2nd TIF application would be reviewed to work specifically on retail tenant improvements to secure a quality operation.

17. Limit on TIF Funding: Properties within a TIF district are limited to one (1) approved TIF application per year and two (2) approved TIF applications in five (5) years.

Summary of Costs:

Projects seeking TIF assistance renovation costs can be given funding for the needed work in order to establish a business by filling in the needed gap. Demolition, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, carpentry, façade, fire sprinkler and system, insulation, flooring, architectural, and signage are eligible TIF expenses. The total TIF eligible costs are \$217,000. It is expected that another \$75,000 in projects costs for finishes, fixtures, and equipment along with start-up costs are also needed for the project. BDC staff analyzed the work and costs of the phase I improvements to ensure project completion, not duplicative, and are solely items specific to securing a retail tenant as described in the summary.

Needs Analysis:

The proposed renovations would enable the applicant with necessary renovation work to create this destination and anchor type of tenant within the Depot District. The applicant provided a return on investment analysis showing a loss of 11% without TIF assistance and a reasonable return of 11.5% with TIF assistance; therefore, they are seeking consideration of TIF funds to bridge that gap. The applicant's financial participation has been verified by BDC staff by developer equity, operator equity, and bank financing.

Current Balance of the Respective TIF District:

The Depot TIF program fund balance for 2011 is \$250,000, with a net balance of \$204,510 (minus commitments); therefore, the needed funds for the project are available and agree with the goals of the TIF district to Redevelopment Plan. The goals which the project supports include:



On April 12, 2012, the BDC Commercial Loan Committee provided preliminary approval of the Benny's Pizza loan application which would be used to: 1) payoff an existing 1st mortgage and 2) fund renovation to the existing building. The total loan request is for \$79,000. Benny's is 40-year old restaurant that is owned and operated by the DiNardi family. The business is located at 6800/6810 West 26th Street within Berwyn. The loan is collateralized by a 1st position on the real estate and a first position on equipment and inventory. With this loan serving as a 1st lien position, the loan to value ratio is an outstanding 23%.

After a review of the company's financials and application packet, the committee recommended approval of the application. The recommended loan amount is not to exceed \$79,000.00 amortized over a 15-year period with a floating interest rate of BDC prime plus 1 percent.



RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN MORTON COLLEGE AND THE CITY OF BERWYN

WHEREAS, Morton College, Community College District No. 527 ("Morton") is a public agency of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois provides for the execution of agreements and implementation of cooperative ventures between public agencies of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., as supplemented and amended), authorizes public agencies to exercise any power or powers, privileges or authority which may be exercised by any such public agency individually to be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other public agency in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn ("City") is a unit of local government and public agency of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City is within the District of Morton; and

WHEREAS, Morton does not own suitable baseball and/or softball fields for use in collegiate athletics; and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner and/or permitted user of certain recreational buildings and grounds which are located within the geographical limits of the City, specifically a baseball field located at 29th and East Avenue, commonly known as Baseball Alley, and a softball field located at 28th and East Avenue, commonly known as Janura Park. Baseball Alley and Janura Park may hereinafter for convenience be referred to collectively as the Facilities: and

WHEREAS, with a minimal a worm of upgrading and/or improvements, the Facilities will be suitable for use for use in collegiate athletics; and

WHEREAS, Morton desires to use Baseball Alley and Janura Park for practice and playing fields for its student athletes, specifically its baseball and softball players; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into the Agreement with Morton to allow Morton to use the Facilities for the purpose of carrying out its business and activities related to its baseball and softball programs so as to allow Morton College to focus its funds on providing services to its students in a fiscally responsible manner; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Board of Trustees of Community College District No. 527 (the "Board") has determined that it is in the best interests of Morton to enter into the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A are hereby approved in substantially the same form as provided therein, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Board Chair, Morton President or Attorney executing the same, the execution of such document being conclusive evidence of such approval; and the Morton Board Chair and Morton President are hereby authorized and directed to execute and the Morton Board Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to attest and countersign the Agreement and any and all such other documents as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Resolution.
- 2. The officers, employees and agents of Morton are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated thereby and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith.
- 3. Unless this Resolution is repealed by a majority vote of the Board, the Morton President is authorized and directed to renew the Agreement on substantially the same terms upon the expiration of the Agreement, or terminate the Agreement, whichever is in the best interests of Morton.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Morton College, Illinois Community College District No. 527, a unit of local government ("Morton College") and the City of Berwyn, an Illinois municipal corporation (the "City"), (collectively, Morton College and the City may, for convenience purposes only, be referred to as the "Parties" and each individually as a "Party").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, adopted in 1970, expressly permits units of local government to jointly obtain or share services and to exercise, combine or transfer their powers or functions in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, et seq.) authorizes public agencies, which include units of local government, to jointly enjoy and/or exercise powers, privileges, functions or authority with other public agencies, except where specifically and expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act authorizes public agencies to enter into intergovernmental agreements with other public agencies; and

WHEREAS, Morton College and the City are both public agencies under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City is within the District of Morton College; and

WHEREAS, Morton College does not own suitable baseball and/or softball fields for use in collegiate athletics; and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner and/or permitted user of certain recreational buildings and grounds which are located within the geographical limits of the City, specifically a baseball field located at 29th and East Avenue, commonly known as Baseball Alley, and a softball field located at 28th and East Avenue, commonly known as Janura Park. Baseball Alley and Janura Park may hereinafter for convenience be referred to collectively as the Facilities; and

WHEREAS, with a minimal amount of upgrading and/or improvements, the Facilities will be suitable for use for use in collegiate athletics; and

WHFRFAS, Morton College desires to use Baseball Alley and Janura Park for practice and playing fields for its student athletes, specifically its baseball and softball players; and

WHEREAS, for the consideration set forth herein, the City has agreed to allow Morton College to use the Facilities for the purposed of carrying out its business and activities related to its baseball and softball programs so as to allow Morton College to focus its funds on providing services to its students in a fiscally responsible manner: and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Parties have concluded that it is in the best interests of the Parties to enter into this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

1. RECITALS: The abovementioned recitals, as contained in the paragraphs constituting the preambles to this Agreement, are full, true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if fully restated herein.

2. GENERAL TERMS:

- A. The City shall lease the Facilities to Morton College for the period set forth herein. In return and in anticipation of this Agreement, Morton College contributed seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) towards the improvement of the Facilities. The City acknowledges receipt of the seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00).
- B. Nothing herein shall be deemed or construed to evidence or create an employment, joint venture, partnership or other agency relationship between the Parties hereto. Morton College's staff are not to be considered employees of the City for any purpose, and are not entitled to any of the benefits that accrue to or are provided by the City to its employees, except as otherwise set forth herein, and the City shall not be held liable or accountable for any act by or omission of any staff member or any other party related in any manner to Morton College. The City's employees are not to be considered employees of Morton College for any purpose, are not entitled to any of the benefits that accrue or are provided by Morton College to its employees, except as otherwise set forth herein, and Morton College shall not be held liable or accountable for any act by or omission of an employee or any other party related in any manner to the City.
- D. The Parties shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, sexual preference, genetics, national origin, citizenship status, ancestry, age, marital status, physical or mental handicap, military status or any other factor as protected or prohibited by federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule or regulation.
- E. Each Party shall maintain in force for the entire duration of this Agreement comprehensive general liability and property liability insurance, insuring against any and all claims, liability, demands and losses of judgment arising out of or occurring in connection with any act or omission of their agents, employees and/or students. This policy shall provide coverage against the aforementioned risks in an amount of not less than one million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and one million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$1,000,000.00) aggregate. Such policies shall name each Party and their respective agents, officials, executives, employees, contractors, attorneys and

- students as Additional Insureds and provide that it is primary to, and not contributing with, any policy carried by each Party covering the same loss.
- F. Each Party shall provide the other with certificates of insurance acceptable thereto and evidencing the existence of the coverage described above. The failure to provide acceptable certificates of insurance shall be deemed a breach of this Agreement entitling the nonbreaching Party to pursue any of the remedies authorized by law. All policies of insurance shall provide by endorsement that no coverage may be canceled, terminated, or reduced by the insuring company without the insuring company having first given at least thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the nonterminating Party.
- G. Morton College agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the City, its past and present elected officials, trustees, directors, agents, officers, agents, representatives, attorneys, employees, contractors, successors or predecessors against any losses, damages, judgments, claims, expenses, costs and liabilities imposed upon, incurred by or asserted against the City, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses, arising out of the acts or omissions of Morton College, its officers, agents or employees, or in any way related to the terms of this Agreement (or the discharge thereof).
- H. The City agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Morton College its past and present elected officials, trustees, directors, agents, officers, agents, representatives, attorneys, employees, contractors, successors or predecessors against any and all losses, damages, judgments, claims, expenses, costs and liabilities imposed upon, incurred by or asserted against Morton College, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses, arising out of the acts or omissions of the City, its officers, agents, or employees, or in any way related to the terms of this Agreement (or the discharge thereof).

3. MORTON COLLEGE'S RESPONSIBILITES:

Morton College shall:

- A. Abide by all of the City's ordinances regarding use of the Facilities.
- B. Maintain total responsibility for its entire staff at no cost or expense to the City.
- C. Provide officials for its games.
- D. Certify that it maintains a written sexual harassment policy in conformance with section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/2-105 (III. Gen. Assembly 2006)).
- E. Certify that it provides a drug free workplace in compliance with the Drug Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 580/1, et seq.) (III. Gen. Assembly).
- F. Designate a member of its staff to serve as a liaison to this Agreement and provide the City with the liaison's contact information upon the execution of this Agreement.

4. CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

The City shall:

- A. From March 1st to November 30th during the Term of this Agreement, provide the Facilities to Morton College to allow Morton College to carry out its business and activities related to its baseball and softball programs. Morton College's use of the Facilities is not exclusive, but shall supersede use by others. For purposes of this agreement, the City permits Morton College, its officials, staff, employees, student athletes, and invitees to use, for ingress and egress, the sidewalks, entrances, and passages to the Facilities.
- B. Provide two (2) port-o-lets at the Facilities.
- C. Provide the bases for the Facilities.
- D. Allow Morton College to use the Scoreboard at the Facilities.
- E. Allow Morton College to use the sound system at the Facilities.
- F. Allow Morton College to use the lights at the Facilities.
- G. Allow Morton College to place a portable storage container on the premises of the Facilities.
- H. Allow Morton College to post signage concerning its athletic programs at the Facilities.
- I. Maintain and upkeep the Facilities, such that the same are suitable use in collegiate games, i.e., drag the fields and perform game preparations.
- J. Clean the Facilities after use by Morton College.
- K. Designate a member of its staff to serve as a liaison to this Agreement and provide Morton College with the liaison's contact information prior to the execution of this Agreement.

5. ADDITIONAL TERMS

It is further agreed by the Parties that:

- A. This Agreement shall commence upon the March 1, 2012 and shall continue to November 30, 2015.
- B. Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon providing written notice, as defined herein, ninety (90) calendar days in advance of the proposed termination date.

- C. In the event that said insurance coverage lapses or fails to conform to the requirements stated herein, and such nonconformity continues for thirty (30) calendar days, this Agreement shall automatically terminate.
- D. The terms and conditions of this Agreement may be amended or deleted and new provisions may be added, from time to time, upon written agreement between each Party or an authorized representative thereof. No provision of this Agreement may be waived or discharged unless such waiver or discharge is agreed to in writing and signed by each Party or an authorized representative thereof. No waiver by either Party regarding any breach of a condition or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of similar or dissimilar provisions or conditions of this Agreement. No agreement or representations, oral or otherwise, express or implied, with respect to the subject matter hereof have been made by either Party which are not expressly set forth in this Agreement
- E. This writing shall constitute the sole and entire understanding and agreement by and between the Parties. No representations, promises, agreements or understandings, written or oral, not herein contained shall be of any force or effect. No change or modification hereof shall be valid or binding unless the same is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of each Party
- F. This Agreement is executed by an authorized representative of the City in the representative's official capacity only, and the representative shall have no personal liability under the Agreement. This Agreement is executed by an authorized representative of Morton College in the representative's official capacity only, and the representative shall have no personal liability under the Agreement.

Any notice, request, demand or other communication, provided for by this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly received upon: (a) actual receipt if personally delivered and the sender received written confirmation of personal delivery; (b) receipt as indicated by the written or electronic verification of delivery when delivered by overnight courier; (c) receipt as indicated by the electronic transmission confirmation when sent via telecopy or facsimile transmission; or (d) three (3) calendar days after the sender posts notice with the U.S. Post Office when sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested. Notice shall be sent to the addresses set forth below, or to such other address as either Party may specify in writing.
- Neither Party, by entering into this Agreement, waives any immunity provided by local, state or federal law including, but not limited to the immunities provided by the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1-101, et seq.).

Mayor Lovero:

I am in receipt of an e-mail correspondence that your office sent to Justin DeWitt asking that the Illinois Department of Public Health "Department") send to you directly any Stipulation relating to the Berwyn Community Pool. I am an attorney for the Department that has been assigned to handle this matter.

The Department has agreed to enter into a Stipulation and Agreed Compliance Plan with this facility. I have attached the proposed stipulation, which I understand you have the legal authority to sign on behalf of the facility. You will see in Paragraph B of the Stipulation (very top of page 2) that the Department believes that, based on representations that the facility has made, the Berwyn pool does not represent a significant danger to the users of the facility, and thus, that the pool may be reopened pending completion of the necessary revocations. However, the Department wants the facility to complete all necessary paperwork and make all necessary renovations within the timeframes specified elsewhere in Paragraph B. If the facility fails to live up to its end of the bargain in coming back into full compliance, than the Department reserves its rights to take any action under the law (see Paragraph H).

If the Stipulation and these terms are agreeable to the facility, please execute this document and return to my attention (either by fax, e-mail, or regular mail – my contact information is below). Please be advised that the Department does not authorize reopening of the Berwyn Community Pool without the attached Stipulation being signed and executed by both parties.

STIPULATION AND AGREED COMPLIANCE PLAN

NOW COMES the Illinois Department of Public Health (hereinafter "Complainant" or "Department"), and the BERWYN COMMUNITY POOL (hereinafter "Respondent"), pursuant to Section 100.13(f) of the Illinois Department of Public Health Rules of Practice and Procedure in Administrative Hearings (77 Ill. Adm. Code 100) and for purposes of this Stipulation and Agreed Compliance Plan, state and agree as follows:

- 1. That the Director of the Illinois Department of Public Health, or his designee, has jurisdiction of the parties to this action and to consider the issues herein pursuant to the provisions of the Swimming Facility Act (hereinafter "Act"), 210 ILCS 125/1 et seq., and the Illinois Swimming Facility Code (hereinafter "Code") (77 Ill. Adm. Code 820).
- 2. That Complainant, by Notice of Intent (hereinafter "Notice") dated September 30, 2011, (Exhibit A attached) notified Respondent of Complainant's intention to close Respondent's swimming facility due to noncompliance with provisions of the Act and Code and that Respondent had fifteen (15) days within which to request a hearing.
- 3. That the parties, Complainant and Respondent, now wish to dispose of this matter without consuming further time or expense on the part of the litigants.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby stipulated and agreed by the parties as follows:

- A. Respondent waives its right to pursue any action to challenge the Department's Notice.
- B. Respondent shall obtain a permit for required renovations to its existing pool. Respondent shall submit an application for such a permit within thirty (30) days from the date of entry of a final order approving this Stipulation and Agreed Compliance Plan. Once a permit has been obtained,

Respondent will complete all necessary renovations within thirty (30) days or such additional time as the Department may, in its sole discretion, allow. Respondent has represented to the Department that its swimming facility as currently constituted does not represent a significant danger to users of the facility as the pool has multiple, gravity flow drains that represent a much lower suction entrapment risk. Based upon that representation the Department agrees to allow Respondent to reopen the pool pending completion of the necessary renovations. However, should Respondent fail to promptly apply for and obtain a permit for the necessary renovations or complete the renovations in a timely manner once the permit has been issued, the Department reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to order the facility closed until the renovations are completed.

- C. Respondent agrees that it shall not at any time in the future construct, develop, install, alter, open, establish, maintain, or operate a swimming facility without and prior to obtaining any and all necessary and legally required permits, licenses, or any approval, specifically pursuant to, but not limited to, the Act and the Code. Failure to adhere to any portion of this Paragraph in the future shall subject the Respondent to enhanced sanctions for repeat violations which may result in injunctive action through the Attorney General's Office or the local States' Attorney's Office, license or permit revocations, denials, suspensions, additional fine amounts, and any additional recourse allowed by the full extent of the Act and the Code.
- D. Respondent agrees that the allegations of noncompliance set forth in the Notice shall be considered by Complainant should Respondent in the future be found to be in violation of the Act or Code.
- E. This Stipulation shall become binding on, and shall inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto, their successors, or assigns immediately upon the execution of a final order approving this Stipulation by the Director of Public Health, or his designee.
- F. Respondent acknowledges the Department's authority to summarily close the facility in accordance with the terms of this agreement and Section 21 of the Act.
- G. This Stipulation constitutes the entire agreement of the parties, and no other understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or otherwise, exist or have been made by or between the parties. The parties acknowledge that they, through their respective counsel, have read and understood this Stipulation in all respects. Respondent agrees that this Stipulation resolves all outstanding issues raised by the Notice and that Respondent will not take any action in any forum to revoke, invalidate or otherwise evade the provisions of this Stipulation. In the event Respondent takes any action in any forum to revoke, invalidate or otherwise evade the provisions of this Stipulation, then the default provisions in Paragraph H below will apply.
- H. DEFAULT: Respondent's failure to strictly adhere to the provisions of this Stipulation may result in further enforcement action, including injunctive relief, through the Illinois Attorney General's Office or the local states attorney's office, as well as license or permit revocations, denials, suspensions and any additional relief allowed by the Act, the Code, and any other applicable federal and state laws may also be pursued by Complainant in its sole discretion.

This letter has two purposes: 1) an introduction to the Illinois Youth Club (IYC); and 2) to confirm our state-sanctioned right as a 501-C3 self-sustaining corporation to raise funds in the Berwyn community.

The IYC, Inc. is a part-time activities program designed for teenagers. The IYC is similar to the Boys and Girls Scouts of America in that it is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501 C (3) non-for profit organization that encourages positive youth development. Where we differ is that we have chosen to work with the youth of Illinois who would never join the Scouts – the teens who are most at-risk.

On the surface, our program has the following three objectives: job skills, teen intervention, and recreation. Job skills allows teenagers to develop leadership, responsibility and confidence; teen intervention simply interrupts behavioral patterns that too often lead to crime (either as a perpetrator or victim) – we are also prepared to provide scholarships as well as financial support to needy families who participate in our program. Finally, with respect to recreation, teenagers in our program take part in a wide variety of after school and weekend activities that include recreation, museum tours, movie outings and the like.

What is not so obvious but just as important are the subliminal messages and the collateral growth each and every teen experiences, regardless of the time spent with us. Teens need to know there's a much bigger world than the one they live in; that we all bear a responsibility to each other and that the intrinsic joys of giving are often impossible o measure and just as rewarding as any other.

We are an unusual not-for-profit – we do not receive funding from any government agency. Our design is to raise funds through door-to-door canvassing, selling gowmet items so that teens can care a "legal" dollar and we can bring them the best life-enriching activities any program has to offer.

The IYC is based in Oak Lawn, Illinois but we work with teens throughout the state. What most people so casually call a ghetto is rife with enticements that eventually lead young people to become part of the legal system. They're labeled for life and much too often in a way that they can't escape or overcome.

We've taken on the mission of rescuing these teens who are most-at-risk before they make the kind of choices that can ruin their life and even the lives of others. Nobody wants to be a part of the criminal system; people are not born with the express goal of becoming a criminal. It is a product of the environment, the dearth of role-models and most impacting - a lack of hope.
