

Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to excuse Alderman Santoy. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the men and women in the armed forces and for the men and women protecting the streets of Berwyn.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized Clerk Pavlik who announce \$ for Scholars applications are now available in the Clerk's office and \$ for Scholars will be awarding four \$500.00 scholarships to Berwyn's students attending college this fall. Alderman Avila reminded all about Kaboom, North Berwyn Park District park building project on Saturday June 4th between 9am and 2:30pm and encourages all to volunteer. Alderman Skryd reminded all that Berwyn Mail Street has their Rain Barrels on display on Cermak Rd. until August 2nd and they will be auctioned off at National Night Out.

MINUTES

Berwyn City Council COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE May 24, 2011

- The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 6:06 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Polashek, Avila, Laureto. Absent: Chapman, Santoy. Thereafter, a motion by Avila, seconded by Boyajian to excuse Alderman Chapman, Alderman Santoy. Motion carried.
- 2. ComEd presentation briefing on House Bill 14. The Mayor introduced Jeffery Batara and Fobiola Amezcua, who explained the legislation that ComEd Introduced to open up discussing on Infrastructure in Illinois and the need to provide reliable power now and in the future. The Batara spoke regarding modernizing Illinois Electric Grid (see attach informational fact sheet) that Illinois needs to invest more than 2 billion in its Electric Grid over the next 10 years to meet the needs of business and consumers in this rapidly evolving economy.

NOTE Aldermen Chapman present at 6:20.

Batara went on to review propose amendments and Amendment # 4, after lengthy discussions and review in the States legislature (also see attached.) Thereafter, ComEd representatives were available for any questions. Alderman Skryd questioned, does this require state subsidies, answer; no. Skryd also guestioned the work force and if this would be a lost to labor force and an increase to the tech work force, answer; ComEd will not reduce any current work force and will offer re-training opportunities to excising employees and will also create \$2,000 additional jobs. Alderman Polashek questioned if all the new jobs are within Illinois, answer; yes. Batara then stated the legislation it is set to hit the House floor for a vote this Thursday May 26th and if it passes in the House, it is headed to the Senate floor by next week, before the end of the session. Alderman Avila questioned the time frame, answer; the programs will start in January 2012 and the infrastructure potion will start immediately and in the first five years, 1.1 billion will be spent for infrastructure and 1.5 billion in the last 5 years, to Install all of the smart meters throughout the state. Avila questioned the fact that Berwyn is already on the test program with Smart Meters and If we will get up and running with the Smart Grid sooner, answer; yes. The Mayor than asked if ComEd needs anything from the city, in the form of assistance, Batara said ves, reach out to your local State Legislatures and their support. Alderman Boyajian questioned what investments ComEd is making to go green, answer that is through the parent company Exelon, ComEd now only delivers the power and no longer generates.

Re: Modular News Rack System

This memorandum is an update on the installation of modular news rack systems in the recently created Modular Newsrack Districts. A map of the City highlighting the Districts is included with this memorandum.

Earlier this year, the City and BDC issued a RFP for the manufacturing of new structures that contain racks for paid and free newspapers and periodicals. The RFP was a result of the Council revising the existing ordinance regulating existing newspaper racks throughout the City, imposing rental fees for the racks within the Districts and fees for registration and installation of newspaper/periodical racks outside of the Districts, and removing unregistered news racks throughout the City.

The City Clerk received two responses to the RFP issued by the City for modular news rack systems. I have asked the Clerk to place an item on the June 14 City Council meeting agenda for the opening of those responses.

I ask for the matter to be referred to the City Administrator and BDC staff to open the bids, evaluate same, and return to the Council at the June 28 Council meeting a recommendation to pursue a contract with one of the respondents.

ORDINANCE No. _____

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO LEASE CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY TO BERWYN GATEWAY PARTNERS LLC FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Illinois Constitution (1970) and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City owns and/or controls certain real estate located at the address commonly known as Berwyn Gardens, Lot G (the "Subject Property") and legally described as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that the Subject Property is no longer necessary, appropriate, required for the use of, profitable to, or for the best interests of the City; and

WHEREAS, Berwyn Gateway Partners LLC (the "Developer") intends to develop certain real property located in the City for retail purposes (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project will increase the real estate tax revenue base for the City; and
WHEREAS, there is parking congestion within the City and in the area of the Project; and
WHEREAS, the Developer's use of the Property for additional parking in connection with
the Project would alleviate the current parking problem generally and allow for the use of other
parking spaces in the general vicinity of the Property; and

WHEREAS, based on the above findings, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the City and its residents to lease the Subject Property to the Developer; and

WHEREAS, the Developer shall abide by such conditions regarding the use of the Property are as set forth in the terms of the Ground Lease (the "Agreement"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, the Developer and the City shall work together to ensure that the Agreement promotes the goals and intent of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary for the effective administration of government that the City execute, enter into and approve an agreement with terms substantially the same as the terms of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor is authorized to enter into and the City's legal counsel is authorized to revise agreements for the City making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City's legal counsel; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

- Section 1. The statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.
- Section 2. The City Council hereby finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable and otherwise in the best interests of the City to negotiate, enter into, execute and approve an agreement with terms substantially the same as the terms of the Agreement.
- Section 3. The Agreement is hereby approved with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City's legal counsel.

Section 4. The City's legal counsel is hereby authorized to negotiate and undertake any and all actions on the part of the City to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

Section 5. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the applicable Agreement, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City's legal counsel, and the City Council further authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any such documents, as required.

Section 6. All prior actions of the City's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 7. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

Section 8. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

City also holds title to certain property commonly known as _______, Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "East Property"), legally described on Exhibit B attached hereto. The location of the Center Property and the East Property are depicted on the site plan attached hereto as Exhibit C. The Center Property and East Property are separated by a public street now known as Maple Avenue (the "Adjoining Street") and each have access thereto.

In connection with the proposed development of the Center Property, the Center Property requires the use of certain additional parking capacity. City is willing to lease the East Property to Developer and Developer desires to lease the East Property from City for such purposes on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above Recitals and mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>: The following terms shall have the following meanings:
 - (a) "Additional Development Parcel" refers to the property legally described in Exhibit D attached hereto and is further described in Section 4.
 - (b) "Additional Development Parcel Owner" means the holder of title to the Additional Development Parcel following the re-development thereof.
 - (c) Additional Parking Area" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 4.
 - (d) "Adjoining Street" shall have meaning set forth in the Recitals.
 - (e) "Center" shall mean the retail and commercial improvements located on the Center Property.
 - (f) "Center Property" shall have the meaning set forth in the Recitals.

- (g) "Commencement Date" shall mean the date that this Lease has been fully executed and delivered by City and Developer.
- (h) <u>East Owner</u>" shall mean the City and each successor in interest in the East Property or any other person or entity at anytime holding title to the East Property.
 - (i) "East Property" shall have the meaning set forth in the Recitals.
- (j) "Governmental Authority" shall mean any governmental or quasigovernmental department, agency, body or district exercising authority or having jurisdiction over the East Property.
- (k) "Mortgagee" shall mean any holder of a first and senior encumbrance on any of the Center Property or East Property.
 - (1) "Overflow Parking Area" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 4.
- (m) "Permitted Users" shall mean the respective tenants, employees, agents, licensees, customers and invitees of an Developer or a tenant of Developer, having business at the Center Property or the East Property, as the case may be.
 - (n) "Premises" shall also refer to the East Property.
 - (o) "Site Plan" shall have meaning set forth in Recitals.
- (p) "Term" shall mean the period of ninety-nine (99) years from the Commencement Date.

Demise of Premises.

- (a) Grant and Demise of Premises. City hereby leases to Developer and Developer hereby leases from City, for the Term, the East Property in accordance with and subject to the terms, covenants and conditions of this Lease. City grants to Developer and the Permitted Users, the rights to use the East Property, subject to the rights of other parties having rights to use the East Property in common with Developer and the Permitted Users as hereinafter provided.
- (b) <u>Condition of Premises.</u> Developer is leasing the East Property in its current AS IS condition.
- (c) <u>Improvement of Premises.</u> In consideration for the lease of the East Property, Developer shall undertake the following improvements to the East Property. Developer shall, at its sole cost and expense, install and construct such paving, curbing, drainage, landscaping, lighting and other improvements necessary for the use and operation of the East Property for the purposes provided herein (the "Initial Improvements"). Developer shall install the Initial Improvements in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations and permits applicable thereto and in a good workmanlike

manner, free of any liens or other claims. In connection with such construction, Developer agrees to use reasonable efforts (i) to minimize interference with the use of and conduct of business upon the Additional Development Parcel and the use of any appurtenant public rights of way, and (ii) to keep all public rights of way free of debris. Developer shall proceed diligently with all construction of the Initial Improvements during normal construction hours.

(d) <u>Use of the Premises</u>. Developer and Permitted Users of the Center shall use the East Property for the temporary parking of motor vehicles of Permitted Users. Developer acknowledges that Permitted Users of the Additional Development Parcel shall have the right to use the East Property for purposes of pedestrian and vehicular ingress and egress to and from the Adjoining Street and other rights to use the East Property for parking as provided in Section 4 below. Developer shall not use the East Property in violation of applicable law.

City Obligations.

- (a) No Changes affecting the Premise. During the Term, East Owner agrees that it the ingress and egress to and from, the East Property to and from the Adjoining Street shall be maintained shall not be permanently and/or adversely affected nor the Required Parking reduced. East Owner shall not, without Developer's consent, enter into or modify the terms of any agreement binding upon the East Property or consent to any change in the zoning of the East Property which would in any way interfere with or impair Developer's rights to use the East Property in accordance with the terms of this Lease.
- (b) Adjoining Street. City shall not exercise any right to nor consent to any request to vacate the Adjoining Street without granting to or ensuring Developer such other regular access to and from the East Property as Developer shall require and in such instance only East Owner shall have the right to relocate the access to the East Property, provided that (i) during any period of construction, temporary means of ingress and egress to the East Property is provided and (ii) such relocated access is acceptable to Center Owner in its reasonable discretion.

Additional Development.

- (a) Overflow Parking Rights. The City has identified the Additional Development Parcel, lying to the south of the East Property (and east of the Center) for future commercial development. Upon such future development, Developer agrees the Permitted Users of the Additional Development Parcel shall have rights to use the eastern half of the East Property consisting of thirty (30) parking stalls as overflow parking (the "Overflow Parking Area") subject to such reasonable rules as Developer may adopt, provided that the Additional Development Parcel Owner contributes to the costs of maintenance and repair of the East Property on an equitable, pro rata basis.
- (b) <u>Change in Overflow Parking Area</u>. The Overflow Parking Area may be enlarged and the number of parking stalls increased from time to time if the uses of the

Center change as hereinafter provided. As of the date hereof, it is anticipated that the Center will initially be leased to retail tenants occupying 7,250 square feet of area and restaurant tenants occupying 12,660 square feet in the Center. For purposes of calculating parking requirements for the two different types of uses, Developer deems it advisable that for retail use, 4 parking spaces per 1,000 square feet and for restaurant use, 10 parking spaces per 1,000 square feet. If from time to time, the uses at the Center change from restaurant to retail, then the Overflow Parking Area shall be increased by that number of parking stalls equal to 6 parking spaces per 1,000 square feet for the tenant space so affected. Similarly, the Overflow Parking Area, once so enlarged may subsequently be reduced and the number of parking stalls decreased if any use at the Center changes from retail to restaurant, provided that at all times the Permitted Users of the Additional Development Parcel will have the benefit of at least thirty (30) parking stalls in the Overflow Parking Area. Developer shall advise the Additional Development Owner of any change in the Overflow Parking Area when and as appropriate.

- (c) <u>City Commitment</u>. City agrees that in granting any permissions or approvals relating to the Additional Development Parcel that it shall implement the provisions of this Section. In addition, City agrees to cause the Additional Development Owner shall use its best efforts to insure that any snow accumulated in the process of plowing the Additional Development Parcel shall not be deposited so as to interfere with the use of the East Property in accordance with the terms hereof or to reduce the number of available parking stalls thereon.
- Right of First Refusal. If and in the event City shall elect to sell, lease or transfer all or any portion of the Additional Development Parcel or shall receive a bonafide offer from a third party in connection to acquire or lease all or any portion of the Additional Development Parcel, City shall present the salient terms of the offer received from said third party ("Offer"), to Developer and Developer shall have the right and option, within thirty (30) days thereafter, to enter into an agreement for such purchase, lease or transfer on materially the same terms and subject to the same conditions as set forth in the Offer, including, without limitation, any financial assistance or incentives in connection wherewith. Notice of the receipt of such Offer shall be given to Developer in conformance with the requirements hereof. If Developer does not agree to purchase, lease or accept a transfer on materially the same terms and conditions as set forth in the Offer, or does not respond within said thirty (30) day period, the right of first refusal herein contained shall cease and determine and be of no further force and effect with regard to such Offer. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the right of first refusal herein contained shall be exercisable for any bonafide offer (which shall include, without limitations, material modifications to the salient terms of any Offer previously provided to Developer for its review) until such time as a sale, lease or transfer to a third party under an Offer is consummated.

Developer Rights, Obligations and Covenants.

(a) General. Developer shall, at it sole cost and expense: (i) maintain in good condition and repair the East Property and the Initial Improvements and make such repairs and replacements, including patching, resurfacing and restriping, as may be necessary to maintain the East Property and the Initial Improvements in condition

consistent with the other retail, office and commercial properties in the vicinity of the East Property; (ii) maintain the East Property free of snow and ice and other debris; and (iii) provide lighting of the East Property consistent with the other retail and commercial properties in the vicinity of the East Property and applicable laws.

- (b) <u>Improvements</u>. Developer agrees that it shall not construct any structures, improvements, walls, fences or barriers on the East Property which would prevent or impair the use of the East Property by Permitted Users of the Additional Development Parcel as provided herein, provided that reasonable traffic controls may be installed as may be necessary to guide and control the orderly flow of traffic and parking uses. Further, Developer may make such alterations to the configuration of the parking areas on the East Property as Developer deems appropriate.
- (c) <u>Environmental Conditions</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth herein, Developer shall have no obligation to remove, remediate or correct any environmental condition existing on the East Property as of the date hereof. Developer agrees that it shall not use the East Property to generate, treat, store or dispose of any hazardous substance on the East Property.
- (d) <u>Signs</u>. Developer may install such signage on the East Property as Developer deems appropriate to identify parking available to the Permitted Users of the Center, provided that such signage is in accordance with all applicable law, and at the expiration of the Term shall remove all such signs.
- (e) <u>Surrender</u>. Upon the expiration of this Lease, Developer shall surrender the East Property to City in is then physical condition, free of any debris or personal property of Developer.

Insurance and Indemnification.

- (a) <u>Insurance</u>. Developer shall maintain general commercial liability insurance, including contractual liability insurance, covering its rights and obligations under this Lease in an amount not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00), combined single limit per occurrence. Such insurance shall name East Owner (and if requested each Mortgagee), and City as its interest may appear, as an additional insured and shall provide that the other party shall be given at least ten (10) days prior written notice of cancellation of the insurance. Developer shall deliver, concurrently with the execution of this Lease, and thereafter not less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of any such policy, certificates of insurance evidencing such coverage.
- (b) <u>Indemnification</u>. Developer hereby indemnifies East Owner and agrees to defend and save it harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, cost and expense (including without limitation, reasonable attorneys fees and expenses) for death or injury to persons or damage to property arising out of the exercise by Developer or its Permitted Users of the rights granted herein or resulting from the negligent use of any of the East Property by Developer or its Permitted Users, except for such liability, loss, damage, cost and expense resulting from any willful or negligent acts of the indemnitee

or indemnitee's Permitted Users. East Owner hereby indemnifies Developer and agrees to defend and save it harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, cost and expense (including without limitation, reasonable attorneys fees and expenses) for death or injury to persons or damage to property arising out of the exercise by East Owner or the Permitted Users of the Additional Development Parcel of any rights granted herein or resulting from the negligent use of any of them of the East Property except for such liability, loss, damage, cost and expense resulting from any willful or negligent acts of the indemnitee or indemnitee's Permitted Users and from any loss, expense liability or damages (including reasonable attorneys fees and expense) arising from any environmental condition on the East Property.

Default/Remedies.

- (a) If Developer fails to observe or perform any of the other covenants, conditions or provisions of this Lease and fails to cure such default within ninety (90) days after written notice thereof to Developer, but if such other default is of such nature that it cannot be completely cured within such period, if Developer commences such cure within such ninety (90) day period and thereafter proceeds with reasonable diligence and in good faith to cure such default.
- (b) Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, City may at its option, to the extent permitted by law, take exercise either of the following remedies, provided that City first provides Developer at least thirty (30) days prior written notice (and assuming Developer has not cured the Event of Default in such period) an additional written notice of such intent (provided that Developer does not thereafter cure such default within the upon delivery to: (i) take any action permitted at law or in equity as may appear necessary or desirable enforce performance and observance of any obligation, agreement or covenant of Developer under this Lease or for damages sustained as a result of such default; or (ii) terminate this Lease and thereafter by lawful means re-enter and take possession of the Premises, and remove Developer and its property.
- 9. <u>Holding Over</u>. If Developer remains in the Premises beyond the expiration of the Term, such holding over shall be without right and Developer shall be liable to Landlord for any loss or damage incurred by Landlord as a result thereof, and such continued occupancy shall not be deemed to create any tenancy, but the Developer shall be a tenant at sufferance only.
- 10. <u>Assignment.</u> Developer may assign this Lease and its interest hereunder to any lender providing financing with respect to the Center or to any subsequent owner of the Center, without the consent of the City.
- 11. <u>Condemnation</u>. In the event of any condemnation of all or any portion of the East Property, City shall restore the East Property and shall provide Developer with other property adjacent to the Center or the East Property so that Developer shall have the right to park at least sixty (60) motor vehicles during the term of this Lease.
- 12. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice or written communication required or permitted to be delivered under this Lease shall be: (a) in writing; (b) transmitted by personal delivery, express

or courier service, United States Postal Service in the manner described below; and (c) deemed to be delivered on the earlier of the date received or four (4) business days after having been deposited in the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid or on the next business day following deposit with an overnight courier. Such writings shall be addressed to the parties as follows, or to such subsequent address as either party may designate in writing, as follows:

13. Miscellaneous.

- (a) Governing Law/Severability. This Lease shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the internal laws of the State of Illinois. If any clause, sentence or other portion of the terms, conditions, covenants and restrictions herein becomes illegal, null or void, for any reason, or is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be so, the remaining portions of this Lease shall remain in full force and effect.
- (b) <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Lease shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns fo the parties hereto.
- (c) Attorneys' Fees. Any party may enforce this Lease by appropriate action and the party prevailing in such litigation shall be entitled to recover its costs and expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees.
- (d) <u>Captions</u>. The captions appearing in this Lease are for convenience and do not define or describe the scope or intent of a particular section.
- (e) Memorandum. City agrees that Developer may cause a memorandum of this Lease to be recorded in the public records against the East Property and the Additional Development Parcel. Upon expiration of the Term, Developer shall release such memorandum of record.
- (f) Force Majeure. Developer shall not be responsible for any failure to perform nay of its obligations hereunder is such failure is caused by any reason beyond the control of Developer, including, strike, labor unrest, trouble, governmental rule, regulations or ordinances, casualty, civil commotion, war, disruption of utility services or

shortages of material.

(g) <u>Quiet Enjoyment</u> City, so long as it is not in default hereunder beyond any applicable notice and cure periods, shall have and enjoy quiet and undisturbed possession of the East Property without hindrance, ejection or molestation by City or any other person claiming through City.

The Berwyn Development Corporation's (BDC) Board of Directors recommend approval of the below specified TIF monies regarding Automated Lifestyles' project costs.

TIF assistance will be applied to the acquisition of property. The 3,884 sq. ft. commercial space will be used to expand their existing business located at 6840 W. 32nd Street. The space was formerly occupied by Campanile Construction & Design and the Mark News.

Total costs for the project (purchase price) are \$275,000. The applicants have experienced tremendous growth the past 5 years, and without the additional office space, would force the business to look elsewhere to house their operations. The necessary 25% down payment would tie up critical operating capital, and therefore, seeking consideration of TIF funds to assist with the acquisition of additional space. BDC STAFF TIF APPLICATION ANALYSIS

Automated Lifestyles - 3208 Grove Ave.

Summary of Project:

The applicant, Automated Lifestyles, is requesting TIF funds for the purchase of a property to expand their existing business. The TIF scope of work includes the acquisition of property. The applicants submitted a Tier II TIF application including building sales contract and financial information. To this extent, the applicant is requesting TIF funds for purchase assistance at this location in order to fill in the needed gap.

The applicant is proposing to purchase approximately 3,884 sq. ft. commercial space for expansion of their existing business located at 6840 W. 32nd St. Since 1999, Automated Lifestyles has been an industry leader in providing certified, award-winning automation services to residential and commercial clients. Featuring the latest in home automation technology, we have grown to into a full-service firm, specializing in digital media, lighting, security, home theaters, audio, video and gaming entertainment. The proposed use is compatible with current zoning regulations for the property. The property's PIN is 16-31-114-005-0000. The space is currently occupied by Campanile Construction & Design and the Mark News.

Past TIF Funding:



AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE STANDARDS FOR THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the "Prevailing Wage Act," 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the City of Berwyn investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said City of Berwyn employed in performing construction of public works, for said City of Berwyn.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn,

Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Prevailing Wage Act, the general prevailing rates of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of Berwyn is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rates of wages for construction working the Cook County area, as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year (See Exhibit "A"). The definition of any terms appearing in this ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

As required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rates of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June construction undertaken by the City of Berwyn. The definition of any terms appearing in the ordinance which area also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rates of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction undertaken of the City of Berwyn to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 3: The City Clerk shall publicly post this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wages, and keep it available for inspection at the City Hall by any interested party.

A copy of the determination or of the currently revised determination of the prevailing rates of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addressed and have requested copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this ordinance with the Honorable Jesse White, Secretary of State of Illinois, Index Department 111 East Monroe Street, Springfield, IL 62706 and with the Illinois Department of Labor, Fair Labor Standards Division, One West Old State Capitol Plaza, Room 300, Springfield, IL 62701.

SECTION 6: Within thirty (30) days after the filing with the Secretary of State, the City Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City stating:

SECTION 7: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 8: All ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

COOK COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

TRUCK DRIVERS (WEST) - That part of the county West of Barrington Road.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walks, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, data apparatus, coaxial, fibre optic and wireless equipment, appliances and systems used for the transmission and reception of signals of any nature, business, domestic, commercial, education, entertainment, and residential purposes, including but not limited to, communication and telephone, electronic and sound equipment, fibre optic and data communication systems, and the performance of any task directly related to such installation or service whether at new or existing sites, such tasks to include the placing of wire and cable and electrical power conduit or other raceway work within the equipment room and pulling wire and/or cable through conduit and the installation of any incidental conduit, such that the employees covered hereby can complete any job in full.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork,

cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with holst and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.



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AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR THE RESERVATION OF STREET PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, AND AMENDING CHAPTER 484.05 AND CHAPTER 484.055 IN ITS ENTIRETY OF THE TRAFFIC CODE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a Home Rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the city Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate

Authorities") has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that the Reservation of Street Parking for Person with Disabilities must be amended; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

SECTION 2: The Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois is hereby amended by revising chapter 484.05 and 484.055 in its entirety by adding the following new Chapter to read as follows:

484.05 RESERVATION OF STREET PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

- (A) The reservation of on street parking spaces for persons with permanent disabilities or disabled veterans as defined under state law shall be pursuant to the provisions of this section and the applicable portions of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
 - Reserved parking shall be allowed curbside of a public street within residentially zoned areas.
 - (2) The reserved space shall be marked by the posting of two signs, 22 feet apart, erected by the Director of Public Works in the form and manner prescribed under 11-1301 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, 11-1301).
 - (3) The reserved parking space shall be located within the limits of the individual's residence and as close as possible to the frontage of the residence where the permanently disabled person resides. The City reserves the right to post signs at its discretion based on existing conditions, and shall not be permitted in such a manner to unduly harm or cause hardship to other residents residing in the area.
 - (4) The on street reserved parking space shall be placed, provided that all the criteria in the application process have been met, unless specifically exempted by Council.
- (B) The City shall accept applications from residents with permanent disabilities as defined under 1-159.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, 1-159.1) or from a member of the household having direct care of the disabled person. Applicants must agree to participate in a site visit. Applications shall be reviewed to determine whether the criteria included in the Illinois Vehicle Code and listed herein have been met:
 - (1) An application on a form to be prescribed by the Police Department Parking Division has been completed, and verified by the signature of the applicant;
 - (2) The applicant must be an owner of a motor vehicle for which the Illinois handicapped or disabled veteran license plate or handicapped card has been issued and which plate or card is valid at the time of the application (or renewal application). Applicants not owning a motor vehicle may be eligible for a drop-off zone, if the criteria for such a zone is met, or as recommended during the application review process (see Drop-off Zones for Persons with Disabilities);
 - (3) The applicant has no outstanding debts with the City;
 - (4) The person who is permanently disabled or a disabled veteran as defined under state law must be a lawful resident of the city at the address for which the installation of the reserved parking sign is requested. Written evidence of the residency must be provided to the Parking Division at the time the application is submitted;
 - (5) The applicant must verify that neither the permanently disabled or disabled veteran resident involved has reasonable access to a garage or a driveway adjacent to a garage located at the address of the permanently disabled or disabled veteran resident of the city;
 - (6) If the applicant is not the owner of the property at which the permanently disabled or disabled veteran resides, the written approval of the owner or property manager of the property for the installation of the reserved parking space sign must be provided at the time of application. If the property is transferred, a new application, investigation process and approval letter from the new owner shall be required.

- (C) Applications shall be reviewed by the Director of the Parking Division, Traffic Engineer and Director of Public Works. Each determining whether or not additional information or investigation is necessary, reporting their recommendations for approval or denial of the application and the reasons upon which the recommendation is based to the City Council. The City Council shall be the final determiner of eligibility and grant or deny the application.
- (D) There shall be parking by permit for persons holding a Berwyn disabled parking sticker and paying an additional fee of \$10 annually, as well as an initial fee of \$10 to install a reserved parking sign adjacent to the property the applicant resides in.
 - (1) The sticker shall be numbered to correspond to the sign posted or to the property and only the vehicle bearing that disabled parking permit number shall be allowed to park therein.
 - (2) Violators who do not display a valid and current disabled plate or placard are subject to a \$250 fine.
 - (3) Violators who display a valid and current disabled plate or placard but no Berwyn disabled parking permit sticker are subject to a fine for parking in violation of a sign.
 - (4) Disabled parking permits shall only be issued to one vehicle per property and only one disabled parking permit number shall be issued per property.
 - (5) The Director of Public Works shall develop the appropriate signage, in compliance with this section and ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1301 et seq., clearly designating the disabled parking permit number in fluorescent green, so as to highlight the restricted nature of the spot.
- (E) All reserved parking space designations shall expire on October 1 of each year, but may be renewed upon the submission of a renewal application form to be prescribed by the Parking Division, verified by the signature of the renewal applicant meeting the requirements herein and submitted to the Parking Division, along with any verification documentation called for by the renewal application form and the payment of a \$10 fee. The Director of Local Ordinance Enforcement shall review each disabled parking sticker previously issued and all renewal applications, and determine whether or not the need for the sticker still exists.
 - (1) The holder of the disabled parking sticker shall have ten days from the date of the termination notice to object to the action taken and submit to the Director proof of the continuing need for the reserved parking privilege. All objections to the termination notice must be made in writing and received within the ten-day period.
 - (2) Upon expiration of the ten-day period the Director shall cancel and recall the disabled parking sticker previously issued. The Director of Public Works, upon expiration of the ten-day objection period, unless otherwise notified by the Director, shall remove all "Reserved Parking Only" signs posted and erected to accommodate the disabled parking sticker previously issued.
- (F) It shall be the affirmative duty of the person with a permanent disability, their resident family member or caretaker to immediately notify the City if the individual in question no longer meets the requirements under this section or no longer resides at such location. Upon investigation by the Parking Division and notification, the Director of Public Works or his designee shall cause the signs indicating reserved parking to be removed.

(G) Drop-off Zones for Persons with Disabilities. If a permanently disabled resident or Berwyn institution desires a drop-off zone for disabled persons, the application for such a zone shall follow the procedures of this section and criteria listed.

Drop off zones for persons with disabilities shall meet the following criteria:

- (1) The person or entity seeking the drop off zone for persons with disabilities must demonstrate the need for such a zone. Factors to be considered in determining the need for such a drop off zone shall include the following: the number of persons with disabilities traveling to and from the proposed drop off zone location, the frequency of this activity, the difficulties encountered without the proposed drop off zone and the alternate solutions available.
- (2) The proposed drop off zone for persons with disabilities shall not have a substantial negative impact on existing parking and traffic conditions in the area.
- (3) The need which must be demonstrated under this subsection must not be the need for parking for persons with disabilities, but rather the need for a location to stop a vehicle which carries a person or persons with disabilities only long enough to drop off or pick up such person or persons from a designated place. The regular use of special motor vehicles or buses for the transport of persons with disabilities to and from a designated place shall be considered as evidence indicating the need for a drop off zone for persons with disabilities, rather than the need for parking for persons with disabilities.
- (4) Drop off zones can be up to 8 feet in length, based on the review procedures described herein.
- (H) Section 11-1301.3 of the State Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1301.3) is hereby incorporated into this section by reference.
- (I) City Council reserves the right to limit the number of spaces on a block.
- (J) City staff has the right and authority to review and reevaluate the current use of parking spaces for the permanently disabled pursuant to this section and shall make recommendations to the City Council as to any such reserved parking spaces which may no longer be appropriate. The City Council shall have the right to revoke any reserved parking spaces previously approved.
- (K) Applicable portions of this section shall be applied to traffic warning signs for handicapped or disabled residents. These requests shall follow the same application, payment, review and renewal processes described herein. Alternate solutions will be considered prior to the installation of these signs. Approval of these signs shall be subject to the Director of Public Works.
- (L) No person shall sell, assign, rent or lease any disabled parking permit sticker or charge a fee for the use thereof. No person shall file a sworn affidavit, as required herein, which the person knows to be false or believes to be false at the time of filing.
- (M) No person shall continue to display a disabled parking permit sticker which has been terminated, cancelled and recalled pursuant to this section.
- (N) It shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle or stop a motor vehicle for the purpose of loading or unloading persons or things, other than persons with disabilities, in any public parking area posted as a drop off zone for persons with disabilities.

- (O) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined not more than \$250.00, except that anyone who fraudulently uses a handicapped parking permit in violation of this Chapter, shall be subject to a \$500.00 fine.
- SECTION 3: All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage approval and publication as provided by law.

You will find the present Ordinance and applicable State Statute attached for your perusal.

(625 ILCS 5/1-159.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 1-159.1)

Sec. 1-159.1. Person with disabilities. A natural person who, as determined by a licensed physician, by a physician assistant who has been delegated the authority to make this determination by his or her supervising physician, or by an advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the advanced practice nurse to make this determination: (1) cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device; (2) is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that his or her forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest; (3) uses portable oxygen; (4) has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV, according to standards set by the American Heart Association; (5) is severely limited in the person's ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition; (6) cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest because of one of the above 5 conditions; or (7) is missing a hand or arm or has permanently lost the use of a hand or arm. (Source: P.A. 95-186, eff. 8-16-07.)

(6) Uses a temporary visitor parking pass to avoid having to register a vehicle to a Berwyn address.
(Ord. 08-50, passed 7-22-2008)

§ 484.05 HANDICAPPED PARKING STICKERS.

- (A) A resident of the city shall, upon request and the filing of a sworn affidavit with the City Collector, be furnished with two stickers bearing the words "Berwyn Handicapped Parking." The stickers shall be blue in color, circular in shape and have within their borders a white subject in a wheelchair. The stickers shall be issued by the City Collector without charge and shall be displayed by affixing one sticker to the windshield and one sticker to the rear window of the vehicle.
- (B) No person shall sell, assign, rent or lease any handicapped parking sticker or charge a fee for the use thereof. No person shall file a sworn affidavit, as required in division (A) hereof, which the person knows to be false or believes to be false at the time of filing.
- (C) In January of each year, the Director of Local Ordinance Enforcement shall review each handicapped parking sticker previously issued to determine whether or not the need for the sticker still exists. If, after review, the Director finds that there is no longer a basis for a continued handicapped parking privilege, he or she shall immediately notify the City Collector, the Director of Public Works and the holder of the handicapped parking sticker of the Director's decision to terminate the privilege and cancel the sticker.
- (1) The holder of the handicapped parking sticker shall have ten days from the date of the termination notice to object to the action taken and submit to the Director proof of the continuing need for the handicapped parking privilege. All objections to the termination notice must be made in writing and received within the ten-day period.
- (2) The City Collector, upon expiration of the ten-day period, unless otherwise notified by the Director, shall cancel and recall the handicapped parking sticker previously issued. The Director of Public Works, upon expiration of the ten-day objection period, unless otherwise notified by the Director, shall remove all "Handicapped Parking Only" signs posted and erected to accommodate the handicapped parking sticker previously issued.
- (D) No person shall continue to display a handicapped parking sticker which has been terminated, cancelled and recalled pursuant to this section.

 (Ord. passed 11-17-1980)

§ 484.055 RESERVATION OF STREET PARKING FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS.

(A) All street parking spaces reserved for the handicapped shall be marked by the posting of two signs erected under the direction of the Director of Public Works and used to designate the reservation of parking spaces for the handicapped in the form and manner prescribed under § 11-301 of the State

Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-301), provided that all of the following criteria have been met, unless specifically exempted by Council:

- (1) An application on a form to be prescribed by the Police Parking Division has been completed, and verified by the notarized signature of the applicant. The City Council shall determine its approval or disapproval of a properly completed application;
- (2) The applicant must be an owner of a motor vehicle for which the Illinois handicapped or disabled veteran license plate or handicapped card has been issued and which plate or card is valid at the time of the application (or renewal application);
- (3) The person who is handicapped or a disabled veteran as defined under state law must be a lawful resident of the city at the address for which the installation of the restricted handicapped parking sign is requested. Written evidence of the residency must be provided to the Police Parking Division at the time the application is submitted;
- (4) The applicant must verify that neither the applicant nor the handicapped or disabled veteran involved has reasonable access to a garage or a driveway adjacent to a garage located at the address of the handicapped or disabled veteran resident of the city;
- (5) If the applicant is not the owner of the property at which the handicapped or disabled veteran resides, the written approval of the owner or property manager of the property for the installation of the restricted handicapped parking space sign must be provided at the time of application; and
- (6) If known to the applicant or reasonably ascertainable by the applicant, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of persons who reside on any property adjacent to the property on which the handicapped person or disabled veteran resides in the city must be provided at the time the application is submitted.
- (B) There shall be parking by permit for persons holding handicapped parking stickers and paying an additional fee of \$10 annually, as well as an initial fee of \$10 to enact a handicapped permit sign adjacent to the property the applicant resides in.
- (1) The sticker shall be numbered to correspond to the sign posted or the property described in this division, and only the vehicle bearing that handicapped parking permit number shall be allowed to park therein.
- (2) Only vehicles with the corresponding handicapped parking permit number to the posted signage shall be allowed to park in that handicapped parking permit spot.
 - (3) Violations of this section shall be punished by a \$250 fine.
- (4) Handicapped parking permits shall only be issued to one vehicle per property and only one handicapped parking permit number shall be issued per property.

- (5) The Director of the Department of Public Works shall develop the appropriate signage, in compliance with this section and ILCS Ch. 65, Act 5, §§ 11-301 et seq., clearly designating the handicapped parking permit number in fluorescent green, so as to highlight the restricted nature of the spot.
- (C) All handicapped parking space designations shall expire on October 1 of each year, but may be renewed upon the submission of a renewal application form to be prescribed by the Police Parking Division, verified by the notarized signature of the renewal applicant meeting the requirements of division (A)(2) hereof and submitted to the Police Parking Division, along with any verification documentation called for by the renewal application form and the payment of a \$10 fee.
- (D) Section 11-1301.3 of the State Vehicle Code (ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-1301.3) is hereby incorporated into this section by reference.
- (E) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be fined not more than \$250, except that anyone who fraudulently uses a handicapped parking permit in violation of this section shall be subject to a \$500 fine.

§ 484.06 EXCEPTIONS TO CHAPTER.

This chapter does not apply to:

- (A) The portions of the streets contiguous to and adjacent to any public grammar school facility, building, lot, playground or parking lot in the city falling within or adjacent to any defined residential parking zone. However, the exception shall not apply to that portion of the streets across from the public grammar school facility, building, lot, playground or parking lot; and/or
- (B) The parking of any ambulance, emergency vehicle of any mental agency, repair vehicle of any public utility or city-owned vehicle, when the vehicle is being used in the performance of emergency duties.

§ 484.07 EMIL VACIN FAIRWAY PARKING PERMITS.

Parking in the Emil Vacin Fairway shall be regulated as described in this Traffic Code. Vehicles shall be exempt from the parking limitations as described in § 480.07(F)(4) through (7). Overnight parking in the Vacin Fairway is permitted as outlined in § 480.09 and as described herein:

- (A) Vacin Fairway Permits.
 - (1) Permits are available for personal passenger vehicles and motorcycles.



Purchase of a Quint Replacement Fire Department Vehicle

Honorable Mayor Lovero & Members of City Council,

I am requesting permission to enter into a contract with Global Emergency Products to purchase a 2011 Pierce Quint/Fire Engine. Our current Quint is a 1996 Seagrave fire engine. By purchasing this vehicle we will be complying with our long term budget goals of replacing our current Fire Apparatus between 10 and 15 years. This engine is becoming a burden with maintenance cost to repair or replace mechanical parts due to its age and use. The Quint is a specialty vehicle which can perform ladder truck duties and engine duties. This vehicle is located at Station 1 which is south of the railroad tracks. The Quint is also used as our back up ladder truck when the current ladder truck is in need of extended service or maintenance. The City also receives credit for this vehicle in our Insurance Rating Organization (ISO) scoring. A Committee of Firefighters, Lieutenants and Chief Officers have prepared and all reviewed the specifications for this project. We have contacted several of the manufactures that have been awarded the bids through the Northwest Municipal Conference Suburban Cooperative Municipal Joint Purchasing program for Local Government agencies and only two have responded. We also have a unique requirement for these vehicles which require a lower profile (travel height) due to our viaducts in Berwyn. We have contacted and entertained several manufactures of fire trucks during the last two years and only two competitors have responded to our calls. Some manufactures cannot produce a vehicle that will meet our requirements for travel height or to fit in our station due to limited

door heights. We will be using the Joint Purchasing program for Local Government agencies where the

vehicles have already been sent out for the bid process.

It would be my recommendation that we purchase a 2011 Pierce Velocity 100' Medium Duty

Ladder Quint from Global Emergency Product (one of the awarded bidders) for a cost of \$822,956.00.

The other dealer that responded to our request was KME. KME provided us with a quote for a

similar vehicle however the travel height is eleven feet two inches. Our lowest viaduct in Berwyn is

eleven feet three inches. There is not enough clearance with the KME vehicle in my opinion for safety

reasons. The KME quote is \$756,261.00.

I have spoken to Finance Director regarding the financing on this vehicle. Director Wysocki has

advised me that we will be purchasing this vehicle from the 2007 Bond Fund Line item 400-15-5800.

There are several financing options available for this vehicle. See the attached copies of the

financing proposals. It would be my recommendation that we pay the 100% prepay option \$822,956.00

receive a \$26,470.00 prepay discount bringing the cost down to \$796,486.00. It would also be my

recommendation to include a 100% performance bond for a cost of \$2,469.00 to protect our interest in

this project. The total cost for the vehicle with the prepay discount and performance bond would be

\$798,955.00

- Bidders are expected to be fully informed as to the conditions, requirements and specifications before submitting a proposal. The submission of a proposal by a firm implies the firm's acceptance of the terms and conditions herein, unless otherwise stated.
- 3. The Proposer is responsible for all costs related to the preparation of this proposal.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) is defined as a request for an offer, by one party to another, of terms and conditions with reference to some work or undertaking.

This document constitutes a REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL, and is thus a solicitation for responses.

Moreover, any acceptance of a proposal shall NOT result in a binding contract between the City of Berwyn and the Proposer, but instead will simply enable negotiations to take place which may eventually result in a detailed and refined agreement, contract, or purchase order between the Proposer and the City of Berwyn.

"Proposal date" as referenced herein shall mean the local date and time specified in the proposal documents.

A. CONDITIONS FOR PROPOSING

- COMPLETENESS/AUTHORIZATION OF PROPOSAL. Proposer shall supply all information

- 3. PROPOSAL DEADLINE. Proposer shall be responsible for taking whatever measures are necessary to ensure that the proposal reaches the office of the City Clerk on or before the local time and date specified. The City of Berwyn shall not be responsible for, and may not consider, any late proposal, amendment thereto, and request for withdrawal of proposal received after the date specified. Proposals received after the time and dated specified on the Request for Proposal will not be opened and will not be considered for award.
- 4. **PROPOSALS BINDING 60 DAYS.** Unless otherwise specified, all formal proposals submitted shall be binding for sixty (60) days following proposal date, unless the Proposer, at the City of Berwyn's request agrees in writing to an extension.

- 5. COMPETENCY OF PROPOSER. No proposal may be accepted from or contract awarded to any person, firm or corporation who is in arrears or in default to the City of Berwyn upon any debt or contract. Prior failure of a Proposer to perform faithfully on any previous contract or work for the City of Berwyn may be grounds for rejection. The Proposer must have not been suspended or debarred from doing business with the state and/or federal government. The Proposer, if requested, shall present evidence of performance ability and possession of necessary facilities, pecuniary resources and adequate insurance to comply with the terms of these proposal documents. Such evidence shall be presented within a specified time and to the satisfaction of the City of Berwyn.
- 6. <u>COLLUSIVE PROPOSING</u>. The Proposer certifies that the proposal is made without any previous understanding, agreement or connection with any person, firm, or corporation making a proposal for the same project, without prior knowledge of competitive prices, and that the proposal is in all respects fair, without outside control, collusion, fraud or otherwise illegal action.

B. INSURANCE

- 1. **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**. The successful proposer shall provide insurance as follows:
- a. Certificate of Insurance; Cancellation or Modification
 - (1) Before commencing work, the Proposer shall submit to the City of Berwyn for approval a Certificate of Insurance meeting the requirements specified herein, to be in effect for the full contract period. The City must be listed on the Certificate of Insurance.

d. Hold Harmless: Endorsement Required

- (1) The Proposer, including their subcontractor, employees, representatives or agents, shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City of Berwyn and its officers, employees, and agents from any and all liability loss, cost, damage and expense (including reasonable attorney's fees and court cost) resulting from, arising out of, or incurred by reason of any claims, actions or suits based upon or alleging bodily injury including death, or property damage rising out of or resulting from the Proposer's operations under this document.
- (2) Proposer is not, and shall not be deemed to be, an agent or employee of the City of Berwyn.
- (3) Responsibility for Damage Claims Notwithstanding the above, it is specifically agreed between the parties executing this contract that it is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of the contract documents to create in the public or any member thereof a third party beneficiary hereunder, or to authorize anyone not a party to this contract. It is understood that no subcontractor is a third party beneficiary to any contract between the Contracting Authority and prime contractor. Nothing in any special provision or any supplemental specification shall be construed as eliminating or superseding the requirements of this section.

C. SPECIFICATIONS

- FORMAL SPECIFICATIONS. The proposer shall abide by and comply with the true intent of
 the specifications (i.e., not take advantage of any unintentional error or omission.) Any mention
 made herein of a service to be provided in accordance with laws, ordinances, etc., shall be
 construed as the minimum requirements of the specifications.
- 2. PROPOSED ALTERNATE. When an item is identified in the bid document by a manufacturer's name or catalog number, it is understood that the bidder proposes to furnish the commodity and/or service so identified by the City of Berwyn unless the bidder specifically proposes an alternate. In bidding on a proposed alternate, the bidder shall clearly state on his/her bid exactly what he/she proposes to furnish, and forward with his/her bid, a complete description of the proposed alternate, including brand, model number, drawings, performance, and test date, references and any other information necessary for a complete evaluation. Bidder shall include a statement setting forth any changes in other materials, equipment or other work which would be required by incorporation of the proposed alternate. The burden of proof of the merit of the proposed alternate is upon the Proposer.

The City of Berwyn's decision to approve or disapprove of a proposed alternate shall be final.

OUALIFICATIONS, CREDENTIALS AND REFERENCES. The Proposer shall provide a
description of qualification, credentials, experience, and resources as they relate to provision of the
proposal. The Proposer shall also provide a list of clients for whom similar work has been

performed within the last two years, including the firm, contact person, address, and phone number of each contract person.

4. <u>ADDENDUM TO SPECIFICATIONS</u>. Any substantive interpretation, correction or change of the proposal documents shall be made within an addendum. Interpretation, corrections or changes of the proposal documents made in any other manner shall not be binding. Such interpretations, corrections or changes shall not be relied upon by Proposer. Addendums shall be issued by the City of Berwyn within a reasonable time prior to the proposal date.

D. SELECTION OF FIRM

- REJECTION OF PROPOSALS. The City of Berwyn reserves the right to accept or reject any
 or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and/or to request re-submission. The
 City of Berwyn also reserves the right to reject a proposal from a Proposer who investigation
 shows is not in a position to satisfactorily and timely perform the contract.
- 2. <u>SELECTION.</u> The City of Berwyn desires to enter into negotiations and ultimately reach an agreement with a Proposer who demonstrates the best combination of attributes to conduct the project, and who also negotiates a project cost with the City of Berwyn that is fair and reasonable. The City of Berwyn may conduct discussions with any Proposer who has submitted a proposal to determine qualifications, for further consideration. Since the initial review by the City of Berwyn will be deemed preliminary in nature, the document and process will be deemed confidential until such time as the successful Proposer is selected. Criteria for selection will include but not be limited to:
 - Ability to provide the type and quality of service that best meets the needs of the City of Berwyn.
 - Organization, size, management and structure of the firm to provide service.
 - Experience and qualifications of the persons with supervisory and management assignments, especially relating to similar work assignments.
 - · Satisfactory reference checks of clients on similar projects.
 - Previous and existing compliance with laws and ordinances relating to contracts with the City and to the Proposer's employment practices.
 - Whether the Proposer is in arrears to the City, in debt on a contract or is a defaulter on a surety or other agreement with the City.
 - If a reasonable doubt arises as to Proposer's solvency, the City reserves the right to require financial information sufficient to show solvency.
 - Cost estimate; the City is not required to accept the proposal with the lowest cost estimate.

Once the City has reached an agreement with the Proposer, a purchase order will be issued to the awardee. The purchase order will define the conditions between the City of Berwyn and the contractor selected to receive the award.

- 5. PRESENTATIONS. When required and based on evaluation of proposals submitted, the City of Berwyn may select finalists who will be required to participate in interviews, including key personnel designated for the proposal, and to make presentations regarding their qualifications and their ability to furnish the required product to best serve the needs of the City of Berwyn. Formal presentations will be scored and evaluated by the Public Works Director who will make a recommendation to the City Council for final approval. Nothing in the proposal can obligate the City of Berwyn to enter into a contract.
- LOCAL PURCHASES. Unless otherwise specified, cost and other considerations being equal, local firms shall be given first consideration for the project.
- ERRORS IN PROPOSAL. Any ambiguity in any proposal as a result of omission, error, lack of
 clarity or non-compliance by the Proposer with specifications, instructions and conditions shall be
 construed in the light most favorable to the City of Berwyn. Changes in proposals shall be initialed
 and dated.

E. GENERAL CONTRACT PROVISIONS

- 1. CONTRACT AWARD. Upon the City of Berwyn's selection, between the City of Berwyn and Proposer on the work to be performed, a written award in the form of a purchase order, contract or other instrument shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party. The contract shall be on forms provided by the City of Berwyn; or if the Proposer's contract document is used, the City of Berwyn reserves the right to modify and document to conform to the request for proposal and to do so in the light most favorable to the City of Berwyn.
- INSURANCE. Current Certificate of Insurance in the amounts specified shall be on file with the City of Berwyn before work can commence.
- 3. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS. A contract shall be deemed valid only to the extent for appropriations available to each project. The City of Berwyn's extended obligation on these contracts, which envision extended funding through successive fiscal periods, shall be contingent upon actual appropriation for the following fiscal year.
- 4. <u>CONTRACT ALTERATIONS</u>. No alterations or variations in the terms of a contract shall be valid or binding upon the City of Berwyn unless authorized in writing by both parties.
- 5. <u>SUBLETTING OF CONTRACT</u>. Proposer shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the contract or their right, title or interest therein, or their power to execute such contract to any other person, firm or corporation without the prior written consent of the City of Berwyn, but in no case shall such consent relieve the Proposer from their obligations, or change the terms of the contract.

- 6. <u>CONTRACT PERIOD</u>. Contract shall remain in force for the full specified period and until all services have been satisfactorily delivered and accepted and thereafter until all requirements and conditions shall be met, unless:
 - a. <u>Extended upon written authorization of the City of Berwyn and accepted by contractor, for a period negotiated and agreed upon by both parties, when in the best interest of the City of Berwyn.</u>
 - b. <u>Terminated</u> due to the default, as described below, or for no reason at all, as long as the City of Berwyn gives a written 30 day notice.
- DEFAULT. The Contract may be cancelled or annulled by the City of Berwyn in whole or in part by written notice of default to the Proposer upon non-performance, violation of contract terms, delivery failure, bankruptcy or insolvency, or the making of an assignment for the benefit of creditors. The City reserves the right to grant Contractor a specified cure period of during which to cure or remedy the default, which cure period shall be included in the written notice to default. If default is not cured within the specified time, City of Berwyn reserves the right, but is not obligated to, extend the cure period or City Berwyn may deem the contract terminated without further notice. Lack of knowledge by the contractor will in no way be cause for relief from responsibility.
- 8. <u>INDEMNITY</u>. The Proposer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City of Berwyn and its officers, employees and agents from any and all liability, loss, cost, damage, and expense (including reasonable attorney's fee and court costs) resulting from, arising out of, or incurred by reason of any claims, actions, or suits based upon or alleging bodily injury including death, or property damage rising out of or resulting from Proposer's operations under this Contract, whether such operations be by the Contractor or by any Subcontractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either.

Proposer is not and shall not be deemed to be, an agent or employee of the City of Berwyn, but shall be deemed an Independent Contractor.

Proposer further agrees to:

- a. Save the City of Berwyn, its agents and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind for the use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, article or appliance of which the Proposer is not the patentee, assignee, licensee or owner, furnished or used in the performance of the contract.
- b. Obtain all permits and licenses required by the city, state and federal governments and pay all related fees. The Proposer shall also comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the City of Berwyn, State of Illinois and the Federal Government including the Prevailing Wage Act.

NON DISCRIMINATION. Proposer agrees to the following:

- 5) That he or she will submit reports as required by the Department's Rules and Regulations, furnish all relevant information as may from time to time be requested by the Department or the contracting agency, and in all respects comply with the Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations.
- 6) That he or she will permit access to all relevant books, records, accounts and work sites by personnel of the contracting agency and the Department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations.
- That he or she will include verbatim or by reference the provisions of this clause in every subcontract awarded under which any portion of the contract obligations are undertaken or assumed, so that the provisions will be binding upon the subcontractor. In the same manner as with other provisions of this contract, the contractor will be liable for compliance with applicable provisions of this clause by subcontractors; and further it will promptly notify the contracting agency and the Department in the event any subcontractor fails or refuses to comply with the provisions. In addition, the contractor will not utilize any subcontractor declared by the Illinois Human Rights Commission to be ineligible for contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations.

Emergency Warning Tornado Siren

1.0 BASIC REQUIREMENTS

- Quantity of two (2) Federal Signal Model 2001-130, or equivalent, AC/DC operated, rotating uni-directional, electro-mechanical Outdoor Warning Sirens.
- Each siren proposed must produce a minimum SPL (Sound Pressure Level) of 130dBC at 100' on-axis, ± 1dBC.
 Certification of SPL Rating shall be provided with the proposal.
- The warning siren must produce a minimum of three (3) warning signals or tones plus a short growl test (1-2 seconds) and silent test capabilities.
- Each siren must be able to operate on both AC and DC power. Primary AC operation from a 208 240VAC power source must facilitate complete siren operation without the use of the backup batteries. During a power failure, automatic switch-over to (DC) battery operation must occur to maintain the siren's normal operation.
- The slren must contain a battery backup (DC) power source/battery system consisting of four (4) 12VDC batteries for siren and RF control system operation. The battery (DC) power source shall be pole mounted in an aluminum vented enclosure (NEMA 3X rated). Batteries must be deep cycle and maintenance free. Original and replacement batteries must be readily available at local retail sales establishments.
- Warning strens must comply with all applicable government regulatory specifications, particularly FEMA and OSHA.
- Warning siren control equipment model proposed must be specifically listed by Underwriter's Laboratories, no
 exceptions will be allowed. <u>Evidence of UL Listing shall be provided with the proposal</u>.
- Warning siren and siren control equipment proposed must include a minimum warranty of two-years for parts
 and factory-performed labor. The siren head must include a five-year warranty covering parts replacement. A
 copy of the warranty must be submitted with the proposal.
- To insure quality and reliability, the siren manufacturer must be ISO 9001:2000 Certified, no exceptions.

2.0 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

2.1 SIREN HEAD ASSEMBLY SPECIFICATIONS

Warning sirens shall each produce a minimum of 130dBC, ± 1dBC single tone format at 100 feet. All
measurements shall be conducted in free-field conditions at a minimum of 50 feet above ground level on axis.
 Certified Test Results must be submitted with this bid.

- Rotating speed shall not be less than 2.0 nor more than 4.0 revolutions per minute. Rotation must be constant
 and uniform and not vary in relation to sound or chopper motor speed.
- Siren head rotation shall employ the use of a direct drive mechanism coupling the rotation motor and gear reducer assemblies and shall not utilize chains or belts.

 shall not sweep or fluctuate.
- All exposed metal surfaces, unless aluminum or stainless steel, shall be properly finished to inhibit deterioration and corrosion due to the weather and sun.
- Sirens shall operate in temperature ranges of -30 degrees C to +60 degrees C while batteries are maintained at
 -18 degrees C or higher.
- The effects of rain, ice, or snow shall not hinder operations.
- All sirens shall have sufficient mechanical strength and sufficient torque to withstand and operate in winds speeds of up to 100 mph.
- In compliance with FEMA CPG 1-17, the Outdoor Warning Systems Gulde, the Warning Sirens shall not
 produce sound pressure levels greater than 123dB at ground level to prevent hearing damage. Sirens shall not
 produce potentially environmentally hazardous ultrasonic signals. This must be certified by the manufacturer.
- Sirens shall include adjustable mounting brackets for varying size poles, and be easily removable for mounting on flat surfaces of roofs of buildings.

2.2 SIREN CONTROL UNIT SPECIFICATIONS

- Siren control cabinets must be Aluminum in construction with a NEMA 4X rating.
- The battery system shall have the capacity to provide continuous full power for a minimum of 15 minutes at a minimum of 130dBC, ± 1dBC.
- Each siren must be battery operated (DC) with a battery system consisting of no more than four (4) 12V deep cycle batteries for siren and control system operation.
- The siren shall operate with a line current draw of less than 10 Amperes at 120VAC. 3.0 NEW SIREN EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION

- The new Warning Siren Equipment shall be installed on 55', Class II treated wooden poles supplied by the bidder and be installed at a burial depth of 8'. Bidder must include all cost associated with the procurement, delivery and installation of the poles.







We would be very pleased to have you join us as an honored guest. Would you do us the favor of passing this invitation along to the Mayor for us, as well, please.


