The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:00 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Polashek, Avila, Laureto, Absent: Santoy. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to excuse Alderman Santoy. The motion carried by a voice vote.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the deceased Maria Mendoza, Mother-in-law of Berwyn Police Detective Gavin Zarbock and for the Men and Women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety, along with the Men and Women in the Armed Forces.



1. Mayor Lovero called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., upon the call of the roll, the following responded present. Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Avila, Laureto, Absent: Chapman, Santoy and Polashek.
2. Alderman Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd to excuse Alderman Chapman, Alderman Santoy and Alderman Polashek. The motion carried by a voice vote.
3. Homes for Changing Region. The Mayor introduced Robert Dwan, CDBG Director, who introduced Alison Milld, Director of Housing Initiatives for Metropolitan Mayor Caucus, Metro Planning Council and Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMPA,) who gave a power point presentation regarding CMAP Local Technical Assistance; which consist of:
 - New or updated comprehensive plans
 - Revisions to zoning ordinances or other local regulations
 - Small-area studies or plans
 - Topic-specific projects-water, sustainability, housing, others

Milld went on to review the project history which was originally a partnership between Chicago Metropolis 2020 and the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus. Also reviewed the history of projects between other municipalities which included Aurora, Libertyville, Oak Forest, Gurnee, Montgomery, North Lake, Blue Island, Plainfield and Woodstock; with an overview consisting of:

- Review of homes process and products
- Updated data on current housing and future forecasts
- Draft capacity analysis
- Next Steps
 - Select focus area
 - Prepare for workshops

- Analysis of community's existing housing supply, including the matches and mismatches by age, household and tenure (rental or owner-occupied.)
- Capacity Analysis - Estimated the amount of vacant land and redevelopment potential by zone for each pilot municipality using local GIS data
- Adjustments, as needed, based on special census and feedback from the communities
- Design, planning and facilitation of one public or stakeholder workshop for your community.
- A sub-regional housing analysis which identifies opportunities and gaps in the housing profile and looks for opportunities for collaboration between your community and your neighbors.
- A workforce housing analysis which focuses on the match between the sub-region's key employment sector and the housing in the community.
- An analysis of market segments using Claritas PRIZM NE data. Recommendations will focus on meeting the current and future needs of each segment, along with strategies for attracting targeted segments.
- Series of policy and strategic recommendations for creating a balanced, sustainable future housing supply along with targeted goals that can be used to determine a community's future progress in implementing the plan.
- Strategic housing recommendations use public investments to encourage private housing development.
- Document design and layout process.

Ms. Milld went on to review the population, median household income, race/ethnicity and defining affordability in homes, housing affordability for renters, housing affordability for owners, home owner vs. renters, projected household growth 2010-2040.



Ms. Milld also reviewed the 1993 Comprehensive Plan for Berwyn, with the next step being feedback and refine the capacity analysis with the help of the council and the city staff. Conduct marketing analysis and prepare for and market public workshops.

The Mayor than stated that he thought we should focus on single family homes development vs. multi-family and the possibility of de-converting illegal multi units back to single unit housing. Once again the next step prepare for and market public workshops, to determine date, time and locations.

4. Agenda items; Alderman Skryd questioned agenda item J-3, the 2010 MFT Maintenance Sidewalk, Curb & Gutter Repairs, Pocket Park Redevelopment Change Order # 1. Questioned if there was any further remediation necessary. The City Administrator Pabst stated there are not going to be any further digging or excavation planned for the parcel, therefore no further remediation would be necessary. Alderman Paul questioned the long term plan for Pocket Park. The Mayor stated that the Berwyn Park District will keep it as a green space. Alderman Paul stated she thought the work should have gone out to bid vs. being included in a change order on the MFT project.

Re: Roosevelt Road lighted crosswalk change order

Dear Mayor and City Council,

The Berwyn Development Corporation (BDC) and Construction Engineer (Terra Engineering) are recommending the approval of a change order for the lighted crosswalk component of the new Roosevelt Road streetscape project.

The original streetscape budget approved by City Council is as follows:

- Hard Costs	\$730,338.33	A-Lamp
- Design/Construction Engineering	\$383,802.28	Terra Engineering
- Streetscape Equipment	\$34,101.06	Landscape Forms
	\$17,958.00	Old Town Fiberglass
	\$5,155.16	Estimate
- Lighted Crosswalk	\$ 50,000.00	Estimate
- Contingency	\$122,135.48	10%

The total approved budget was \$1,343,490.30 which is the net costs to the City of Berwyn due to achieving over \$6M in grants for the overall project from the federal and state government.

The bids for the lighted crosswalks were recently received and are more than originally estimated. The low bid came in at \$59,079.67 plus design engineering of \$8,861.95 for the City of Berwyn crosswalk at Home Avenue. The construction bid has been recommended by Terra Engineering after scrutinizing the cost estimates. Oak Park and Cicero have approved their respective amounts for the lighted crosswalks.

As background information of what led to the initiative, the City of Berwyn and the Village of Oak Park secured, in partnership, an "Illinois Tomorrow" grant through the Illinois Department of Transportation to create a study of



the Roosevelt Road Corridor. The study, known as the Farr Plan, was adopted by the Berwyn City Council in 2003. In 2006 the Town of Cicero joined with Berwyn and Oak Park to work collaboratively in an effort to improve the Roosevelt Road Corridor, this led to the Intergovernmental Agreement signing in April of 2007. The current streetscape construction is an action step for the previous adopted corridor study.

City Council is being asked to approve the change order for the lighted crosswalks of \$17,941.62 which would be funded from the already allocated contingency. Overall funding for the improvement is from the Roosevelt Road TIF district.

With the consent of the City Council, the City of Berwyn can sign the change order to commence work on the Roosevelt Road Streetscape project and contribute to the revitalization efforts taking place along Roosevelt Road.

WHEREAS, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the BERWYN ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS, (the "BOARD"), in a PUBLIC MEETING of the BOARD on the 19th day of July, 2011, having considered all the facts presented at the Hearing of this matter;

WHEREAS, the APPLICANT has been duly informed if: (a) the BOARD fully or partially approves the request of the APPLICANT; OR (b) the BOARD rejects the request of the APPLICANT; OR (c) the BOARD has made no recommendation to the CITY COUNCIL; and the CITY COUNCIL wholly or partially approves the request of the APPLICANT, the APPLICANT must obtain a building permit within SIX (6) MONTHS after the date that the ORDINANCE is enacted;

The BOARD has reached its decision after considering the testimony of the witnesses and the documents presented both prior to and during the Hearing, briefly set forth as follows:

1. Mr. Marvin Britt testified on behalf of the applicant. He stated that he and his mother, Willene, have entered into a contract to purchase the property at 6401-6413 W. 16th Street, and that contract is contingent upon approval of their requested Conditional Use to operate a Day Care business. If approved, then they will operate the business under the corporate name of "Fresh Start Day Care, Inc., and that corporation will lease the premises from them. Ms Willene Britt is the President of that Illinois corporation.

2. This is a one story brick building situated on a lot measuring 90 feet in width from north to south and 122.13' in length from east to west. (Mr. Chrastka, the area investigator states that according to his measurements, the length is closer 110 feet.) The building, measuring from 16th street north at the west lot line is 70 feet and there is a 20 foot asphalt area from the north wall of the building to the north lot line. There is a garage like building at the northeast rear of the lot measuring about 17 feet from north to south, and 50 feet from east to west, with a space of about 3 feet between the north wall of the main building and the south wall of the garage. About Eighty Percent (80%) of this building has been unoccupied for quite some time and about 20% of the building area is occupied by a barber shop, that is leasing on a month to month basis. Someone apparently started to rehab the building awhile ago and then abandoned the project, so most of the building is still gutted. The applicant is proposing to have a loading zone for drop off of the children at the east Ridgeland side of the building, and that area is about 30 feet to the street. They have discussed the usage of this area and possibility of a curb cut and usage of part of the sidewalk for temporary use as parking spaces with the Building Director. Parents will drive through this area in a southerly direction, exit from the cars, walk their children to the front 16th street entrance about 40 feet, and then return to their cars and exit from the area onto 16th street.

3. The applicant proposes to use the entire building for operation of a Day Care Center for whatever capacity is allowable, presently estimated at 100 to 110 children, ranging in age from 6 weeks to 12 years. They propose to completely refurbish the inside of the building, including new plumbing, electricity, heating and air conditioning which will probably be located on the roof top, and partition off at least seven

(7) class rooms, with 4 childrens bath rooms, one adult bathroom, and a full kitchen. There presently are five (5) entrances to the building at 16th street which will remain, with one entrance to be designated as the main entrance, and the other entrances to be used in emergency situations. In addition to street parking, they may be able to set aside 2 to 3 parking spaces in the asphalt area. Mr. Miller and Mrs. Hernandez pointed out that there is a bus stop at 16th and Ridgeland, and only 2 hour parking between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on 16th Street. The witness stated that they may request a change in parking on 16th street to more than 2 hours, as has been done in other areas with similar businesses, and that many of the employees will live in close proximity to this building and can walk or take public transportation to the site, and parents will only leave their cars in the loading zone for a short while when dropping off their children.

4. The witness testified that for the last 12 years they have been operating a successful Day Care business located at Harlem and North Avenue in Chicago, and also another location at 5858 w. Roosevelt Road, with about 105 children in attendance, and those facilities shall remain open. This business will be regulated and licensed by the Illinois Department of Children's Family Services (DCFS), and must renew their license every 3 years. Proposed hours of operation shall be from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, with no evening or week end hours. Considering their estimate of children to attend, they will probably hire about 20 employees, those that are teachers, should have at least an associates degree with some training and/or experience in child care, and teachers assistants should have at least a high school diploma. They will provide preparation for Kindergarten up to 5 years of age, and the curriculum for the other ages shall be suited for that age group, with most of the teaching from 3 years of age and up, to be provided by tested and approved computer programs. The children get points for completing various programs. They will have parent-teacher sessions to evaluate the progress of each child and will work closely with the Public School System and the Head Start Systems to help prepare the curriculum.

5. The food will be catered for breakfast, lunch and afternoon snacks, with an occasional use of the kitchen for preparing other foods. One person with kitchen and dietary food training, shall supervise the kitchen operation. They will also be supervised by the Berwyn Health Department and obtain a license to serve food if necessary. There may be some subsidies to children to help pay the cost from the

Federal or State Governments, but as is the case in their present locations, they do not expect to be restricted in any way by the parents accepting such funds.

6. The number of teachers they will hire shall depend on the ratio of teachers to children, as follows:

15 months to 23 months. 1 teacher for every 5 children;
24 months to 35 months. 1 teacher for every 8 children;
36 months to 5 years. 1 teacher for every 10 children;
6 years to 12 years. 1 teacher for every 20 children.

7. Their records shall contain names of the family doctor and others that can be notified in case of an emergency, and in serious medical emergencies they will call the 911 number. Parents, in almost all cases, shall schedule their children for a 10 hour session each day, and the starting times can vary. They also plan to tuck point the front of the building and install some canopies. Any signs will be affixed to the canopies. The witness indicated that their present Chicago location is very similar to this site so they feel very confident that they can control the parking and traffic flow in a way not to add to the overall congestion in the area.

8. They have no special plans for the garage at the rear of the building so it probably will be used for storage initially. The asphalt area shall be fenced and part will be used for outside activities for the children.

9. Willene Britt testified that the Easter Seal Governing Body will get involved in recommending some of the curriculum programs.

10. Mr. Chrastka, the appointed area investigator, presented a written report which is incorporated by reference in this resolution. He met with Ms Willene Britt at the proposed site on July 9th, 2011 and distributed notices of the meeting on both sides of the 1500 blocks of Ridgeland and Elmwood Avenues and the north side of 16th street from Ridgeland to Elmwood on July 16th, 2011. The main building faces 16th street and measures approximately 110' west to east and 70' north to south. Its west and south walls are on or close to the lot line. An 8' wide public sidewalk extends from the building to the curb parallels and the public entrance is from 16th street.

The east wall which faces Ridgeland Avenue runs north and south for about 90 feet and the east wall is the east wall of both the main building and the secondary building located at the northeast portion of the lot, so it gives the appearance of being just one building on the site. Mr. Chrastka describes the main building, secondary building, and open spaces on the site in great detail in his report.

The buildings occupy 80 to 85% of the site, and about a quarter of the main building is in use as a barber shop. The rest of the building is vacant- either being rehabbed or gutted. The secondary building at the northeast rear of the lot, measures about 50' east to west by 18' north to south, and is separated from the main building by about 4 feet. The separation provides rear entry to some of the store fronts facing 16th street. The secondary building at the northeast corner of the lot appears to be unoccupied.

There is an open area on the north side of the building measuring about 20' north to south. It opens to the alley on the west and is bounded on the south and east by the structures. The north end is bounded by a fence between the site and the neighbors property. It appears that the people involved with the barber shop park their cars in that space.

There are two electric meters on the building behind the barber shop and there are empty service positions for electric meters behind the unoccupied spaces, and one gas meter on the building with remaining four meter positions on the gas manifold missing and removed.

The applicant intends to convert the entire building into a Day Care Center for children ages 6 weeks to ten. (Applicant said 12 years in his testimony). The open area on the north side of the building will be made into a play area. The applicant said that they are discussing nine private parking spaces in the loading zone with the Building Director. The concept is to create diagonal spaces by reconstructing the existing parkway and sidewalk areas using the 90' north to south and unspecified width east to west. For comparison purposes a nearby diagonal parking facility has space for nine cars in a 120' X 11' area.

The site would be compatible with Lincoln middle school and the Berwyn Cultural Center which is kitty corner across 16th street and Havlicek grade school which is a block to the north. Commercial


activity is a gas station and an auto repair shop on opposite corners, and the remaining area is residential.

Mr. Chrastka voted in favor of granting a Conditional Use to operate a Day Care Center as requested. Messrs: Malina, Castaldo, Fejt, Persin, and Mrs. Hernandez, all agreed with the area investigator and voted in favor of granting a Conditional Use to operate a Day Care Center as requested, and Mr. Miller voted against granting a Conditional Use. Those in favor stated: (1) That the parking and traffic problems are not insurmountable; (2) The applicants, have a good track record and have had success in other locations in solving these problems; (3) This usage will eliminate a gutted building that has been vacant for many years and will greatly improve the area; (4) Granting this Conditional Use will be in harmony with the schools and the cultural center in the area. Mr. Miller stated that parking is too much of a problem and that he could not approve the Conditional Use for a Day Care Center at this location.

The final vote was 6 to 1 in favor of granting a Conditional Use to allow the operation of a Day Care Center in accordance with the testimony at the hearing, documents presented, and this resolution.

This resolution was prepared from the notes taken at the meeting of all the witnesses, questions that were asked & answered, and the votes and comments that were given by the Board Members at the meeting.

Re: Restricted parking on the 2500 Block of Wesley

Dear Mayor and members of the Council:

I received a request from a resident on the 2500 Block of Wesley asking me to review the parking regulations for her block to implement a possible change. The block currently has Super Zone status. The current parking restriction states: "No parking anytime. Violators will be towed except vehicles displaying zone 4-1 permit."

I reviewed the parking regulation for the 2500 Block of Wesley with Traffic Engineer Nicole Campbell who was instrumental in helping me find the history of the implementation of the parking restriction. Please note: the City of Berwyn Municipal Ordinances do not contain any reference to the parking restriction. Ms. Campbell's review of official city records shows that the City Council voted favorably to establish the Super Zone on the motion of Alderman Pechota on March 22, 2005. I have attached a copy of the Minutes and Agenda for March 22, 2005 for your review. The action of the council was not codified.

The 2500 Block of Wesley is split between the 3rd and 4th Wards. I conducted a canvass of the 3rd Ward neighbors who overwhelmingly asked that the parking restriction remain in place. I spoke with Alderman Skryd about the matter. She agrees that the parking regulation, as it is enforced today, should be continued.

I respectfully request that the council agree to continue the parking regulations as enforced and send this matter to the city Legal Department to draft an ordinance to include this block among the list of Super Zone areas listed in Section 484.02 of the Berwyn Municipal Code.

2011-12 City of Berwyn and Berwyn Main Street Agreement

The Berwyn Main Street Organization was established to coordinate Berwyn's Cermak Road commercial revitalization effort and to provide design assistance to property owners, manage business recruitment activities, conduct special events and develop an image campaign. As part of its activities BMS will, on an annual basis, conduct a minimum of one (1) workshop for businesses, serve as primary sponsor/organizer of at least two (2) special events and strive to achieve a ground floor commercial vacancy rate of no more than 20 percent on an annual basis in the BMS District. Other services will be provided by BMS in an on-going and "as requested" basis.

In order for the program to continue to be successful, the City of Berwyn needs to commit to the program for a period of not less than sixteen (16) months. Therefore, the City hereby agrees to a sixteen (16) month contract (effective immediately) with the BMS organization. The Council shall also appoint a City liaison to the Main Street Board on a yearly basis. As stated in our cover letter, BMS will waive its 30% funding from the City's general fund.

The City will fund the amounts agreed to in the Cermak TIF budget, in the following manner:

- The TIF amount for the year 2011 is \$129,500 and will be paid to BMS in full no later than August 31, 2011.

In addition, the BMS organization will provide an annual report to the Mayor and City Council on its progress in achieving these objectives. Such report will include an approximate net of new businesses, the number of building renovations, and public and private reinvestment statistics occurring in the corridor. Such data will be made available in the reports produced by BMS.

The term of this contract is for a period of sixteen (16) months, commencing immediately and ending on December 31, 2012.

The National Trust Main Street Center's experience in helping communities bring their commercial corridors back to life has shown time and time again that the Main Street Four-Point Approach succeeds. That success is guided by the following eight principles, which set the Main Street methodology apart from other redevelopment strategies. For a Main Street program to be successful, it must whole-heartedly embrace the following time-tested Eight Principles.

- **Comprehensive:** No single focus — lavish public improvements, name-brand business recruitment, or endless promotional events — can revitalize Main Street. For successful, sustainable, long-term revitalization, a comprehensive approach, including activity in each of Main Street's Four Points, is essential.
- **Incremental:** Baby steps come before walking. Successful revitalization programs begin with basic, simple activities that demonstrate that "new things are happening" in the commercial district. As public confidence in the Main Street district grows and participants' understanding of the revitalization process becomes more sophisticated, Main Street is able to tackle increasingly complex problems and more ambitious projects. This incremental change leads to much longer-lasting and dramatic positive change in the Main Street area.
- **Self-help:** No one else will save your Main Street. Local leaders must have the will and desire to mobilize local resources and talent. That means convincing residents and business owners of the rewards they'll reap by investing time and money in Main Street — the heart of their community. Only local leadership can produce long-term success by fostering and demonstrating community involvement and commitment to the revitalization effort.
- **Partnerships:** Both the public and private sectors have a vital interest in the district and must work together to achieve common goals of Main Street's revitalization. Each sector has a role to play and each must understand the other's strengths and limitations in order to forge an effective partnership.
- **Identifying and capitalizing on existing assets:** Business districts must capitalize on the assets that make them unique. Every district has unique qualities like distinctive buildings and human scale that give people a sense of belonging. These local assets must serve as the foundation for all aspects of the revitalization program.
- **Quality:** Emphasize quality in every aspect of the revitalization program. This applies to all elements of the process — from storefront designs to promotional campaigns to educational programs. Shoestring budgets and "cut and paste" efforts reinforce a negative image of the commercial district. Instead, concentrate on quality projects over quantity.

- **Change:** Skeptics turn into believers and attitudes on Main Street will turn around. At first, almost no one believes Main Street can really turn around. Changes in attitude and practice are slow but definite — public support for change will build as the Main Street program grows and consistently meets its goals. Change also means engaging in better business practices, altering ways of thinking, and improving the physical appearance of the commercial district. A carefully planned Main Street program will help shift public perceptions and practices to support and sustain the revitalization process.
 - **Implementation:** To succeed, Main Street must show visible results that can only come from completing projects. Frequent, visible changes are a reminder that the revitalization effort is under way and succeeding. Small projects at the beginning of the program pave the way for larger ones as the revitalization effort matures, and that constant revitalization activity creates confidence in the Main Street program and ever-greater levels of participation.

RE: City of Berwyn Litigation Costs

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Illinois Lawsuit Abuse Watch (I-LAW), which was formed in 2002 with the mission of being the state's legal watchdog group has recommendations for municipalities.

Many cities spend millions to defend themselves against lawsuits. Travis Akins, I-LAW executive director said "Our purpose is to really showcase the fact that cities are often the target of litigation and that a tremendous amount of money is going toward fighting litigation when it could be used for other things."

The city of Chicago has been taking steps to do what I-LAW recommended in its study and is in the process of trying to cut costs associated with hiring outside counsel.

Known as the bulk case program, the city of Chicago law department retains outside law firms to handle nonmeritoriously police lawsuits that have a value of less than \$100,000 and are defensible. The city pays these firms a flat fee of \$35,000 a case and gives them a \$15,000 bonus if they win.

According to a spokesperson for the city of Chicago this policy has resulted in a nearly 50 percent reduction in the number of lawsuits filed against the Chicago Police Department from 2009 to 2010.

Fighting these lawsuits rather than settling them, as well as paying outside firms a flat fee instead of an hourly rate, has helped save the city money.

Many municipalities are often viewed as an entity with deep pockets, which make them a target for lawsuits.

It would be my recommendation to refer this to the Mayor's office to investigate and implement a bulk case program for litigation for the city of Berwyn.

RE: Storm Water Utility

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Storm Water Utility Background

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II requirements issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency seek to implement a program to protect the quality of surface waters (such as lakes and streams) by controlling pollution from storm water discharges. What this means for the City of Berwyn, and most other cities, is enhanced storm water sewer system maintenance, and the implementation of new storm water management activities.

These activities include public education programs, public participation in storm water management functions, controls on storm water runoff from new developments both during and after construction, an ongoing search for illicit discharges into the storm sewer system, and municipal pollution prevention programs such as increased frequency of street sweeping.

All parcels, regardless of their location in a watershed, have an impact on our water resources. Pervious surfaces, such as lawns, allow rain to seep into the ground. Impervious surfaces, such as roofs and parking lots, block this absorption, which increases runoff volumes. The City of Berwyn's storm water management system collects the runoff through a series of gutters, inlets, storm sewers. In the City, the existing sewer systems are "combined" sewers. A combined sewer conveys both domestic sewage and storm water runoff in the same pipe.

Why is a Storm Water Management Utility Needed?

In the past, storm sewer system planning focused on flood control, utilizing sound practices of sewer system sizing, flood routing, and storm water detention. The growing pressures of urbanization and increased federal regulation have dictated that modern storm water system management must take a total water resources management point of view, considering not only the volume of storm runoff, but also pollution prevention.

Most people think storm water runoff is a relatively harmless, natural occurrence, and do not realize it has the potential to pollute one of our most precious natural resources, our lakes and streams. Storm water frequently has high levels of sediment, litter, phosphorus, nitrogen, heavy metals, oil, grease, and organic materials.

The City Berwyn needs to take a socially responsible, proactive approach to systematically manage the storm water discharged by our community. By managing runoff and preventing the pollutants from entering the environment, we are striving to avoid the potentially high costs of flooding, future treatment and increased federal regulation.

Funding Storm Water Management

Federal Mandates have increased the demand for storm water improvements thereby requiring a significant increase in the amount of revenue devoted to storm water management.

Historically, a Sanitary Sewer Fund has paid the operating costs of all the sanitary sewers, combined sewers and storm sewers. Charges on the water bill were based upon a customer's consumption of drinking water. This was an easy system to administer and understand, but there is no direct relationship between drinking water and storm sewer demand. Rather than increase the Sanitary Sewer rates to cover the increasing storm sewer system costs, the City of Berwyn needs to investigate the creation of a Storm Water Utility that would allow storm sewer system costs to be spread among the users in a more equitable manner.

The creation of the Storm Water Management Utility allows the City to establish a major source of dedicated revenue which will adequately support storm water management through a fair and equitable billing system.

It is a commonly accepted principle that residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and governmental customers should pay for their water and sanitary sewer service based on their relative use of these systems as measured by their water meters. The fairest method for determining residential property fees for storm water service is according to the gross size of their parcels (gross area of parcel, including both pervious and impervious areas). Commercial, industrial, institutional, and governmental customers will pay based upon estimates of each parcel's impervious areas. All fees are in addition to the Water Utility fees. A rate study would need to be completed before implementation of said fees.

All parcels in the City containing developed land shall be charged storm water service charges, except pedestrian/bicycle trails, and streets and highway right-of-ways owned by Cook County, the City of Berwyn, or the State of IL.

It would be my recommendation to refer establishing a Storm Utility for the city of Berwyn to be used as a dedicated and reliable funding source with an equitable fair share fee structure to the Public Works committee and the Public Works Director .

The City of Berwyn opened bids for the above mentioned project on March 14, 2011. This contract was awarded to Unique Plumbing Co. in the amount of \$54,758. Due to the severe storms that the City has experienced this year, in addition to the age of our sewer system, we have experienced several large diameter pipe failures including the collapse of a 36 inch diameter pipe at Oak Park and 29th. In order to continue to repair these failures on deep sewers, I am requesting the "not to exceed" amount of this contract be increased to \$125,000. This will allow us to continue to make the necessary repairs to the sewer system for the balance of the year. This project is budgeted within the Water & Sewer Fund.

Recommendation: Approval of the amendment to the Unique Plumbing 2011 sewer and water maintenance contract from \$54,758 to \$125,000.

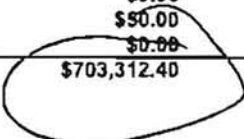

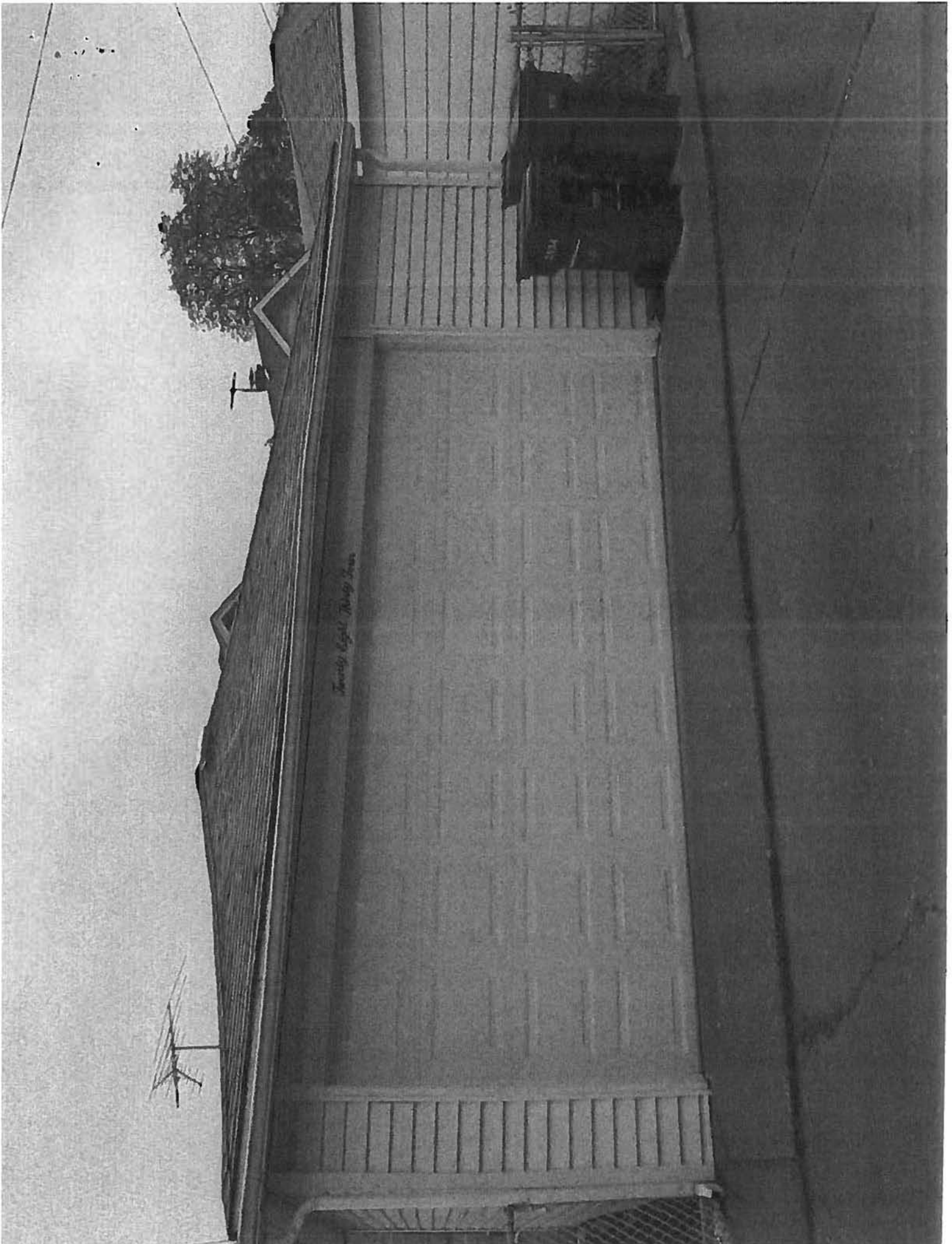
