

MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL NOVEMBER 23, 2010

- I. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:01 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Polashek, Avila, Laureto.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the men and women on the streets of Berwyn protecting our safety.
- The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor 3. recognized residents from the 6400 block of Fairfield and 2700 block of Clinton who spoke regarding the Tot Gym Program at the Recreation Department, which is now being taken over by the Berwyn Park District. The Mayor stated that the program will not be dropped and that the problem was with the staffing and that the Berwyn Park District is taking it over, that the services will still be provided to the residents of Berwyn. The Mayor recognized a resident from the 3200 block of Clarence regarding same issue and also expressed her dissatisfaction on the way the Recreation Department staff handled the matter. The Mayor recognized a resident from the 3400 block of Wenonah who was supportive of parents in favor of the Tot Gym Program, but was speaking against the Methadone Clinic and the zoning changes to allow it to be opened in Berwyn. The Mayor recognized a resident from Riverside Drive who spoke on new residents on the block being happy with the city services provided and also expression appreciation for resolving a sidewalk issue. Alderman Skryd read a letter from the 16th Street Theater regarding the upcoming 2011 Season and the goal to raise \$10,000 and asked all for support.
- 4. The minutes of the regular City Council meeting, and the Committee of the Whole, for November 9, 2010 were submitted. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. The Mayor submitted a proclamation declaring November 30, 2010 as Morgan Borkovec Day in the City of Berwyn in recognition for her achievement of being chosen as recipient of the Cook County Sheriff's

Youth Service Medal of Honor. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and **adopt** the proclamation as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 6. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to suspend the rules and bring forth item J-8. The motion carried by a voice vote. Item J-8 is a communication from Police Chief Ritz recognizing Sergeant George Janecek and Officer Charles Schauer for being honored at the Cook County Sheriff's Law Enforcement Award Ceremony. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, the Mayor recognized and thanked the officers.
- 7. The Clerk submitted a communication regarding the approval of closed Committee of the Whole minutes of September 14th, 28th, and October 12th and 26, 2010 as reviewed in closed session on November 9, 2010. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 8. A deferred communication from the City Attorney was submitted along with an attached ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TEXT OF THE ZONING CODE OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS TO ESTABLISH A C-4 RESTRICTED COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICT

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and **adopt** the ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

9. A deferred communication from the City Attorney was submitted along with an attached ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS TO ESTABLISH A C-4 RESTRICTED COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICT

After discussion, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to amend the text on face to read: **Restricted Commercial District and Restricted Services Zoning District**, striking the word, **General** and to eliminate from the map the Harlem-Windsor, Harlem-Stanley, and Harlem-Cermak wrap around area. The motion to amend, carried by a unanimous roll call vote. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and **adopt** the ordinance as amended on face and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

10. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring forth item J-4 and make germane to item J-3. The motion carried by a voice vote. Item J-3 is a communication from the City Attorney with an attached ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 804 SECTION 804.06 A, B, AND C OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, REGARDING ALCOHOL LIQUOR DEALERS Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and adopt the ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Boyajian, Santoy, Polashek, Avila, Laureto. Nays: Paul, Skryd.

- 11. The City Attorney submitted a communication regarding the settlement of Case No. 08WCO2815 and Case No. 08WCO2816 in the total amount of \$150,000. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 12. The City Attorney submitted a communication regarding the City of Berwyn and Berwyn Park District, Mutual Service Agreement. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and authorize the corporate authorities to enter into an agreement and to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 13. The City Administrator submitted a communication requesting to fill the vacated position of Receptionist at City Hall, to waive the hiring freeze, and allow advertisement for replacement. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur, waive the hiring freeze and grant permission to advertise for position. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 14. The Berwyn Police Department, Division Commander, Administrative Services Chairman of the E.T.S.B. requesting to establish a new Public Safety position. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur, waive the hiring freeze and allow the position to be filled with funds provided from the Emergency Telephone Systems Board. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 15. The Finance Director submitted a communication with an attached ordinance entitled:

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS ADJUSTING SOLID WASTE COLLECTION FEES FOR THE 2011 FISCAL YEAR

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and **adopt** the ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

- 16. The Finance Director submitted a communication regarding the 2010 Tax Levy, to be collected in 2011 and requested a Public Hearing to be held at 5:45 p.m. on Tuesday, December 14, 2010. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and to grant permission for posting and publication of the legal notice for the proposed 2010 Tax Levy and Public Hearing on Tuesday, December 14, 2010 at 5:45 p.m. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to refer the proposed ordinance to levy taxes for the General Corporate and Special Purposes for the Tax Year 2010 to the Public Hearing scheduled for Tuesday, December 14, 2010 at 5:45 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 17. The Public Works Director submitted a communication regarding the 2010 C.D.B.G. Sidewalk Replacement Project #09-21, with a recommendation to approve Contractor Pay Estimate #1 in the amount of \$38,948.40. Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve as submitted for payment. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Santoy, Polashek, Avila, Laureto. Nays: Skryd.
- 18. The Public Works Director submitted a communication requesting permission to bid Contractual utility locating services. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and grant permission. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 19. The Public Works Director submitted a communication regarding the 2011 MFT Maintenance. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to withdraw the communication. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 20. The City Attorney submitted a communication along with an attached ordinance entitled:

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to amend the cover page on face striking the word amending and inserting the word

authorizing. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and **adopt** the ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

- 21. The Traffic Engineer submitted a communication regarding Model Communities Grant. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to concur and grant permission and to authorize the Traffic Engineer to apply for the grant. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Wilson, 2100 Kenilworth, approve K-6-Piper School, fund raiser, November 16th through November 26, 2010 Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve by Omnibus Vote Designation.
- 23. Alderman Chapman called a Budget Committee meeting for Tuesday, November 30, 2010 at 4:00 p.m.
- 24. Alderman Boyajian called a Public Works Committee meeting for Monday, December 6, 2010 at 4:00.
- 25. Alderman Paul announced a Parking and Traffic Committee meeting, as previously called, for Monday, November 29, 2010 at 5:30 p.m.
- 26. Alderman Skryd announced an Administration Committee meeting, as previously called, for Monday, December 13, 2010 at 5:30 p.m.
- 27. The Mayor announced a Public Hearing for the proposed 2010 Tax Levy for Tuesday, December 14, 2010 at 5:45 p.m.
- 28. There being no further business to come before the meeting, same was, after a motion by Laureto, seconded by Avila, to adjourn at the hour of 8:48 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE NOVEMBER 23, 2010

- The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 6:05 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Polashek, Avila, Laureto. Absent: Skryd, Santoy.
- 2. Avila made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to excuse Aldermen Skryd and Santoy. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 3. Proposed Ordinance establishing a C-4 District-Mayor Lovero stated that this will be the portion that may be addressed in open session and stated that the litigation portion of this ordinance will be discussed in the closed session later. The Mayor recognized Attorney Mark Sterk of Odelson & Sterk who reviewed the proposed ordinance. The Mayor questioned the map and wrap around and how the Council would go about amending to remove. Sterk stated that you may just x out those parcels and amend accordingly and or amend prior to passage.

Alderman Skryd present at 6:10 p.m.

- Alderman Chapman noted the parcels that the Council wishes to remove from the map, noting the wrap around for Windsor and Harlem, Stanley and Harlem, and Cermak and Harlem and would like to have these eliminated from the zoning map.
- Alderman Avila questioned limitation to second story offices. Sterk explained that this would not serve the purpose of establishing a C-4, due to the limited spaces in ADA elevator accessible locations.

Alderman Santoy present at 6:13 p.m.

Discussion ensued on amending the district or limiting parcels after passage. Sterk stated yes, you may amend at any time to add or remove parcels and you can amend tonight on face or amend the Licensing ordinances of the City of Berwyn accordingly.

- Alderman Paul questioned Permitted Use or General Use and questioned Conditional Uses. Sterk explained Conditional Use applies for example to C-2 zoning district as it applies to the Overlay or Conditional requirements
- Alderman Paul questioned if Conditional Use always goes in front of the Zoning Board. Sterk replied, yes.
- Alderman Paul questioned if we can place Transitional Conditional Use on Medical Use facilities. Sterk replied, yes as you identify Conditional Use, you can amend the ordinance later or as they arise.
- Alderman Paul questioned how this ordinance applies to parking spaces per square foot. Sterk answered this only amends the current ordinance and includes C-4 as an amended portion of our Zoning

ordinance and that the City did not rewrite the whole ordinance, so existing requirements such as for parking, still exist in the code.

- 4. The Mayor asked if there were any other questions on agenda items before the Council went into closed session.
 - Alderman Paul questioned item J-6, City of Berwyn and the Berwyn Park District Mutual Service Agreement. The Mayor said that this is addressing any workman's compensation issues and emergency situations that may arise, such as the recent flooding this summer

The Mayor then recognized Public Works Director Schiller, who discussed situations that arose during the storms and the flood and the sharing of equipment and manpower to address needs in an emergency situation.

- 5. Clerk Pavlik noted that item J-14 was included on the Council agenda in error and a motion to withdraw the item would be in order.
- 6. Alderman Skryd questioned item J-16, Traffic Engineer's Model Communities Grant and if this is addressed in the City's budget along with any cost involved. The Mayor recognized Traffic Engineer, Nicole Campbell, who stated that the city would be reimbursed for any cost regarding implementations if awarded the grant.
- 7. The Mayor asked for a motion to close the Committee of the Whole for pending litigation. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Polashek, to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:28 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 8. Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to reopen the Committee of the Whole at 7:53 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 9. Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to adjourn the Committee of the Whole at 7:53 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.

WHEREAS, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the BERWYN ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS, (the "BOARD"), in a PUBLIC MEETING of the BOARD on the 17th day of August, in the year 2010, having considered all the facts presented at the Hearing of this matter;

WHEREAS, the APPLICANT has been duly informed that if: (a) the BOARD fully or partially approves the request of the APPLICANT; OR (b) the BOARD has rejected the request of the APPLICANT; OR (c) the BOARD has made no recommendation to the CITY COUNCIL; and the CITY COUNCIL wholly or partially approves the request of the APPLICANT, the APPLICANT must obtain a building permit within SIX (6) MONTHS after the date that the ORDINANCE is enacted;

The BOARD has reached its decision after considering the testimony of the witnesses and the documents presented both prior to and during the Hearing, briefly set forth as follows:

- 1. Mr. Jeff Fields, Office Manager, and employee at present Cicero location, 6041 W 26th Street, testified on behalf of the applicant, Let's Play, Inc., with the help of Dulce Sanchez, daughter of the main principal owner, Caroline Sanchez, the registered agent of the corporation, and Dulce is an employee at the present location in Cicero, Illinols. The witnesses were told that the Child Day Care business is designated as a Conditional Use in the Zoning Code.
- 2. Mr. Fields testified that the corporation has signed a contract to purchase the real estate involved in this petition to operate a licensed Child Day Care business which is the same kind of business as is in existence at their Cicero location. The contract is contingent upon approval of their request for a Conditional Use.
- 3. The Real Estate is improved with a commercial building, which is presently vacant, and the lot is triangular in size, measuring 142.50' at the Ogden Avenue north lot line, 142.22' at the west lot line, 186.75' at the east lot line, and then tapers down to 73.80' at the alley south lot line. The parcel consists of 4 lots, starting at the east lot line with lot 1-measuring 67.50' in width, then lots 2, 3 and 4 all measuring 25 feet in width. The commercial building covers most of the lot except for an 8 foot set back off Ogden Avenue at lots 3 & 4 and an open area covered by a car port roof at the rear of the lots estimated to be in excess of 500 square feet. Previous use of the building was for a patio and furniture business a number of years ago.
- 4. The building has no basement and there are stairs leading to a Mezzanine area above the first floor level. The first floor and Mezzanine are presently open areas except for a few partitions. The furnace is located at the rear of the building and the air conditioning equipment is located on the roof and on the outside of the building. Presently the main entrance is off Ogden Avenue, and there is an entrance to an office at the Ogden side and another smaller entrance to the building next to it. There is an emergency exit located at the Harvey side near Ogden Avenue, and there are no Fire Sprinklers in the building.
- 5. The Petitioner intends to occupy the portion of the building on lots 1 & 2, about 1,700 square feet, but may expand into the entire building, including lots 3 & 4, in the future. Plans call for replacing all the heating and air conditioning equipment, generally renovating the premises, partitioning off sections for their business, and changing the

main entrance to the Harvey side of the building near Ogden Avenue, making the Ogden Avenue entrance as the emergency exit, with two more emergency exits. One at the Harvey Avenue side, and the second at the south rear alley lot line.

- 6. The general plan at the present is to partition off two rooms at the North Ogden Avenue end, the west room for use of 5 year old children and the east room for 3 year old children; then an aisle south of those rooms; a room for 2 year old children south of the aisle; a room for 15 month old children south of that room; a room for infants south of that room; a room for after school children just west of the latter named two rooms; a wash room, storage area, and a kitchen north of the after school room; and an office for the staff just east of the 2 year old children's room. The Mezzanine area will probably consist of more offices for the staff. They intend to use the open area under the car port at the rear alley side of the building for parking and there are about 16 diagonal street parking spaces available on Harvey Avenue, and parking spaces around the corner on Highland Avenue. Their business shall be open seven days a week with extended hours of operation at this location from approximately 5:00 A.M. 12:00 A.M.
- 7. The Day Care Staff shall initially consist of two Directors; one Sub-Director, who is also qualified as a full Director and used when needed; Nutritionist, three Teachers; and one Office Qualifications for a Director regulres about 60 credit hours of study in early childhood education and 2 years actual experience and Teachers need 30 hours of credit in Child Care Education and at least one years experience, and all must be licensed and/or approved by the State, have CPR training, and abide by the rules and regulations under the authority of the Department of Children Family Services. Although they will have no medical person on staff, the parents must give them the name of a doctor to call if needed, and they will also call an ambulance and/or 911 for any emergency medical situations. The training and education they will provide is as recommended generally as standard in the child care field of training both from a general and emotional standpoint and will include subjects, and projects to improve their skills, development, and emotional commensurate with the age group of the children. The after school group, which range in age anywhere from 5 to 12, are dropped off in the early morning by their parents and the after school children will be transported by school bus or by private vans to their local school, returned to the premises after school, and picked up by their parents as agreed. They will always have a staff on hand regardless of the

hour of the day and night, and how many shall depend on the allowed ratio of Teachers and Directors to the number of children present. They estimate that they will never have more than 30 children after school hours, and cots will be provided for sleeping.

- 8. There will be no area available on the parcel outside of the building to be used for outdoor activities, so they will take the children to the local parks for exercise and other outdoor activities weather permitting. They will also have exercise routines for the children on the inside of the building when they cannot go outside. The trained Nutritionist shall have the responsibility of providing breakfast, lunch, and later snacks and meals as agreed with the parents, and this will also be in conformity with the rules and regulations of the Berwyn Health Department.
- 9. Parents will drop off children at Harvey Avenue, which is a one way street going south and also pick them up at that location. The witness stated that they will stagger the times for parents to drop off and pick up the children to avoid any congestion, and no drop off or pick up should last for more than 5 minutes. Maximum number of children on the premises at their present Cicero location is about 60 and they will double that number at this location to about 120. They will continue their business at the Cicero location regardless of the decision in this case. The average cost for a child per week will be around \$60.00 and some parents may qualify for State assistance depending on their income. Children with some limited handicaps will also be accepted. Plans will include adequate outside lighting for security in addition to security cameras at all entrances, and Mr. Fields stated that they have had no problems at their Cicero location that would require the attention of the Police.
- 10. They will include some landscaping as is available on the parcel of land and will install a sign on the Ogden Avenue side of the building. Both witnesses stated that they will comply with all City of Berwyn Ordinances and Codes, which will include a sprinkler system. (Mr. Fejt, a Berwyn Fireman, informed the witnesses that they will have to install the sprinkler system throughout the entire building, and judging from their reaction, this was not their previous understanding.)
- 11. Purchase price for the building is \$800,000.00 and the approximate cost for the renovation will be \$325,000.00.

- 12. Mr. Dominic Castaldo, the Area Investigator, made his inspection of the subject property on Wednesday, August 4th, 2010, in presence of Mrs. Sanchez, her husband, her daughter, Dolce Sanchez, and Mr. Fields, and his written report is incorporated by reference in this resolution. The building is located at the southwest corner of Ogden and Harvey. Applicant wants to purchase the property to operate a licensed Child Care business. The inside of the building will be completely remodeled with separated areas for various groups of children. Children will be dropped off and picked up on Harvey Avenue from traffic on Ogden Avenue. There is residential housing south of the building on Harvey; to the east and west are empty commercial buildings; and on the north side of Ogden is a Gas Station and Repair Shop. Mr. Castaldo talked to some of the people in the area and all were in favor of the Conditional Use. Mr. Castaldo voted in favor of granting the Conditional Use.
- 13. Messrs: Malina, Miller, Fejt, Chrastka, Persin and Mrs. Hernandez, all agreed with the area investigator and voted in favor of granting the Conditional Use. Although there was some concern about the extended hours, comments were that such a Child Day Care business, with extended hours, will be a great benefit to those parents that work odd hours and at night. The final vote was 7 to 0 in favor of granting a Conditional Use to allow the applicant, Let's Play, Inc., to operate a Child Care business on the subject property, in accordance with the testimony at the hearing, documents presented, and the content of this resolution.

This resolution contains the facts as stated to the Board Members by the witnesses at the hearing on the 17th day of August, 2010.





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TRAFFIC CODE OF THE CITY OF BERWYN REGARDING VEHICLE SEIZURE AND IMPOUNDMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the ACity@) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the AHome Rule Powers@); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn (the "Corporate Authorities") has adopted a Traffic Code, which has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that the enforcement of the traffic regulations must include a program of immobilization, towing and impoundment; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities determine that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City to amend the Codified Ordinances as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

- Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.
- Section 2. Chapter 426 of the Codified Ordinances is modified by adding the following (Additions are bolded and underlined):

§ 426.04 VEHICLE SEIZURE AND IMPOUNDMENT; USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR UNLAWFUL PURPOSES.

(A) Definitions. For the purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

- **BUSINESS DAY.** Any day in which the office of the City Clerk of the City of Berwyn is open to the public for a minimum of seven hours.
- **MOTOR VEHICLE.** Every vehicle which is self-propelled, including but not limited to automobiles, trucks, vans, motorcycles and motor scooters.
- **OWNER OF RECORD.** The record title holder(s) of the vehicle as registered with the Secretary of State, State of Illinois or if not registered in Illinois, the particular state where the vehicle is registered.
- (B) Conduct prohibited. A motor vehicle that is used in connection with any of the following violations may be subject to seizure and impoundment by the city, and the owner of record of the vehicle shall be liable to the city for an administrative penalty of \$500, plus any applicable towing fees if:
- (1) The vehicle is operated by a driver under the influence of alcohol, other drug or drugs, intoxicating compound(s) or any combination thereof, as provided in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-501(a);
- (2) The vehicle is operated by a driver while driver's license, permit or privilege to operate a motor vehicle is suspended or revoked, as a result of suspension related to conviction for drugs, alcohol, intoxicating compound or any combination thereof, pursuant to ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-501(a), as provided in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 6-303 or is suspended or revoked for any other reason and the vehicle is being operated in violation of ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 6-303;
- (3) The operation of any motor vehicle with open alcohol in violation of ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 11-502;
- (4) Any vehicle operated and occupied solely by minors wherein alcoholic beverages, whether open or sealed, are found in violation of the Codified Ordinances of the city, § 804.27(B);
- (5) Any vehicle being operated wherein there is found in excess of two and onehalf grams of cannabis in violation of State Cannabis Control Act (ILCS Ch. 720, Act 550, § 4); or
- (6) Any vehicle being operated or having been operated while the operator or occupants of the vehicle are in the commission of or fleeing from the commission of a crime constituting a charge of a Class A misdemeanor, or any felony.
- (7) A violation of ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-14, "Prostitution," of the Illinois Criminal Code of 1961, as amended, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-14.1, "Solicitation of a Sexual Act," of the Illinois Criminal Code of 1961, as amended, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-15, "Soliciting for a Prostitute," of the Illinois Criminal Code of 1961, as amended, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-15.1, "Soliciting for a Juvenile Prostitute," of the Criminal

Code of 1961, as amended, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-18, "Patronizing a Prostitute," of the Illinois Criminal Code of 1961, as amended, ILCS Ch. 720, Act 5, § 11-18.1, "Patronizing a Juvenile Prostitute," of the Illinois Criminal Code, as amended, or Chapter 660, "Public Morals Nuisance Violations," of the Codified Ordinances of the city.

- (8) Any vehicle being operated by a driver upon a highway in the State when such driver does not possess a valid license or permit or a restricted driving permit in violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, 625ILCS 5/6 101 (A).
 - (C) Seizure and impoundment..
- (1) Whenever a police officer has a reason to believe that a vehicle is subject to seizure and impoundment pursuant to this section, the police officer shall provide for the towing of the vehicle to a facility approved by the Chief of Police. This section shall not apply if the vehicle used in the violation was stolen at that time and the theft was reported to the appropriate police authorities within 12 hours after the theft was discovered or reasonably should have been discovered.
- (2) The police officer shall notify any person identifying himself or herself as the owner of the vehicle or any person who is found to be in control of the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation, if there is a person, of the fact of the seizure and of the vehicle owner's right to request an administrative hearing to be conducted under this section.
- (D) Administrative hearing. Within five days after a vehicle is seized and impounded pursuant to this section, the city shall notify by personal service or by certified mail the owner of record of the owner's right to request a hearing to challenge whether a violation of this section has occurred. The owner of record seeking a hearing must file a written request for a hearing with the Chief of Police or his or her designee no later than ten business days after notice was mailed. The hearing date must be scheduled no more than ten business days after a request for a hearing has been filed. All interested persons shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard at the hearing. The formal rules of evidence shall not apply at the hearing and hearsay evidence shall be admissible. Within seven days after the hearing, if the Hearing Officer determines by a preponderance of the evidence that the vehicle was used in violation of this section, then the Hearing Officer shall enter an order finding the owner of record of the vehicle civilly liable to the city for the administrative penalty of \$500. If, after the hearing, the Hearing Officer does not determine by a preponderance of the evidence that the vehicle was used in a violation, the Hearing Officer shall enter an order finding for the owner and for the return of the vehicle. If the owner of record requests a hearing but fails to appear at the hearing or fails to request in a timely manner, the owner of record shall be deemed to have waived his or her right to a hearing and the Hearing Officer shall enter a default order in favor of the city in the amount of the administrative penalty. However, if the owner of record pays the penalty and the vehicle is returned to the owner, no default order need be entered if the owner is informed of his or her right to a hearing and executes a written waiver, in which case an order of liability shall be deemed to have been made when the city receives the written waiver.

- (E) Disposition of impounded vehicle. A penalty imposed pursuant to this section shall constitute a debt due and owing the city. A vehicle impounded pursuant to this section shall remain impounded until:
- (1) The penalty of \$500 is paid to the city and all applicable towing fees are paid to the towing agent, in which case the owner of record shall be given possession of the vehicle;
- (2) A bond in the amount of \$500 is posted with the Police Department and all applicable towing fees are paid to the towing agent, at which time the vehicle will be released to the owner of record; or
- (3) The vehicle is deemed abandoned, in which case the vehicle shall be disposed of in the manner provided by law for the disposition of abandoned vehicles.
- (F) Posting of bond. If a bond in the amount of \$500 is posted with the Police Department, the impounded vehicle shall be released to the owner of record; the owner of the vehicle shall still be liable to the towing agent for any applicable towing fees. If a \$500 penalty is imposed for violation of this section, the \$500 bond will be forfeited to the city; however if a violation of this section is not proven by a preponderance of the evidence, the \$500 bond will be returned to the person posting the bond. All bond money posted pursuant to this section shall be held by the city until the Hearing Officer issues a decision, or if there is a judicial review, until the Court issues its decision.
- (G) Vehicle possession. Any motor vehicle that is not reclaimed within 30 days after the expiration of the time during which the owner of record may seek judicial review of the city's action under this section, or the time at which a final judgment is rendered in favor of the city at the time a final administrative decision is rendered against an owner of record who is in default, may be disposed of as an unclaimed vehicle as provided by law, provided, however, that where proceedings have been instituted under state or federal or asset forfeiture laws, the subject vehicle may not be disposed of by the city except as consistent with those proceedings.

- Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
- Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. Any non-preemptive state statute in conflict hereof with this Ordinance is hereby superseded to the full extent of such conflict pursuant to the exercise of the Home Rule Powers of the City.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.




Subject: Internal Service Fund

In 2007, City Council adopted a funding policy for the Internal Service Fund (ISF) whereby ISF revenues would be equal to 115% of the prior year's expenses of that fund. The ISF accounts for workers compensation and liability claims and related insurance premiums. The revenues of the fund come from charges to other funds and departments.

The 2010 bond issue provided for \$1 million to be transferred to the ISF to reduce the deficit in that fund. Therefore, I am requesting that Council approve an amendment to the ISF funding policy for 2010 whereby the charges to other funds and departments would be reduced by the \$1 million provided by the bond issue.

This would not only provide the same level of funding as would have been provided by adherence to the policy but would also provide a reduction of the ISF deficit since claim costs are down for 2010 and some larger claims have been settled for less than the reserved amounts.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Subject: Transfer from the Debt Service Fund

As discussed at previous Council meetings, one of the goals of the bond refunding that was completed on October 28, 2010 was to make available for the General Fund and Internal Service Fund additional property tax revenues.

Now that the principal and interest payments due on existing debt have been paid with the bond proceeds, excess funds are available in the Debt Service Fund. Attached is an ordinance authorizing the transfer of these funds from the Debt Service Fund to the General Fund and Internal Service Fund. I request your approval of this ordinance. Thank you.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE DEBT SERVICE FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND AND INTERNAL SERVICE FUND OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, the City adopted Ordinance No. 10-64, on October 12, 2010, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Issuance of General Obligation Bonds of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois in the Aggregate Principal Amount Not to Exceed \$10,000,000 for the purpose of refunding a portion of the City's outstanding bonds and paying for the costs of certain capital projects including water projects and other economic development projects and costs related thereto and to the issuance of such bonds and for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds." (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the sale of the bonds approved in the Ordinance has been completed and all required payments on the refunded bonds due during 2010 have been made; and

WHEREAS, one of the purposes of the bond sale was to address budgetary and financial constraints by allowing the City of Berwyn to use property taxes that the City would otherwise use to pay interest and principal on the refunded bonds for General Fund purposes and to reduce the Internal Service Fund deficit; and

WHEREAS, property taxes have been (or will soon be) collected and are now (or will soon be) on hand and on deposit in the Debt Service Fund but are not needed to pay principal and interest on existing debt during 2010;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois by and through its Home Rule Powers as follows:

SECTION 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

SECTION 2: The City Finance Director shall transfer from the Debt Service Fund the following to the extent that such funds are available:

- a. to the Internal Service Fund, \$1,000,000 and
- b. to the General Fund, any excess available funds for the purpose of building a positive fund balance, and
- c. the actual amount of transfers shall be reported to City Council after all year end accruals are finalized.

SECTION 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5: Any non-preemptive state statute in conflict hereof with the ordinance is hereby superceded to the full extent of such conflict pursuant to the exercise of the Home Rule Powers of the City.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Subject: 2010 Budget Amendment

Historically, near the end of the year or when appropriate, the Finance Department requests Council approval regarding supplemental appropriations. State law allows for the adoption of a supplemental appropriation ordinance provided that there are additional revenues or fund balance available to cover the supplemental appropriation. In addition, state law allows for transfers between departments by a two-thirds vote of Council.

I have attached four supplemental appropriation ordinances for your approval for the: general fund, debt service fund, motor fuel tax fund and Cermak TIF fund.

In the case of the general fund, the total appropriation is not increasing. Rather, it is simply being reallocated among departments. For the debt service fund, unbudgeted expenditures for bond issuance costs will be paid for by the additional revenues generated from the bond issue. For the motor fuel tax funds, unbudgeted expenditures will be paid for from additional revenues received from the State's capital bill. For the Cermak TIF, additional development expenditures will be paid for by drawing on the accumulated fund balance.

I ask that you please approve these four ordinances. Thank you for your consideration of this matter and please feel free to contact me with any questions.

ARTICLE III MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

3.1 Change In Relmbursement. Effective January 1, 2011, the Plan's definition of "Medical Expenses" under the Health Care Reimbursement Arrangement or Health Flexible Spending Account is amended by the addition of the following:

Notwithstanding anything in the Plan to the contrary, a Participant may not be reimbursed for the cost of any medicine or drug that is not "prescribed" within the meaning of Code Section 106(f) or is not insulin. In addition, only medicine or drugs considered to be prescription drugs under Code Section 106(f) (not "over-the-counter" drugs obtained under prescription) shall be able to be purchased by debit and/or credit cards issued to be used in conjunction with the Plan.

3.2 Dependent. The Plan's definition of "Dependent" is amended by the addition of the following:

"Dependent" shall include any child of a Participant who is covered under an Insurance Contract, as defined in the Contract, for under the Health Flexible Spending Account] as allowed by reason of the Affordable Care Act.

A Participant's "Child" includes his natural child, stepchild, foster child, adopted child, or a child placed with the Participant for adoption. An Employee's Child will be an eligible Dependent until reaching the limiting age of 26, without regard to student status, marital status, financial dependency or residency status with the Participant or any other person. When the child reaches the applicable limiting age, coverage will end at the end of the calendar year.

The phrase "placed for adoption" refers to a child whom the Participant intends to adopt, whether or not the adoption has become final, who has not attained the age of 18 as of the date of such placement for adoption. The term "placed" means the assumption and retention by such Participant of a legal obligation for total or partial support of the child in anticipation of adoption of the child. The child must be available for adoption and the legal process must have commenced.

3.3 Dependent. The Plan's Change in Status provisions are amended by the addition of the following:

Notwithstanding anything in this Section to the contrary, the gain of eligibility or change in eligibility of a child up to the end of the year in which a child attains age 26, as allowed under Code Sections 105(b) and 106 and IRS Notice 2010-38, shall qualify as a change in status.

ARTICLE IV SIMPLE CAFETERIA PLAN PROVISIONS

4.1 SIMPLE PROVISIONS

- a. This Plan is intended to be a "simple cafeteria plan" which satisfies the requirements of Code Section 125(j).
- b. The provisions of this Article apply for a Plan Year only if the following conditions are met:
 - The Employer adopting this provision is an eligible employer. An "eligible employer" means, with respect to any
 year, an Employer that employed an average of 100 Employees or fewer on business days during either of the two
 preceding years.
 - 2. If the Employer was not in existence during the preceding year, the determination of the number of employees shall be based on the average number of employees that is reasonably expected to be employed by the Employer on business days in the current Plan Year.
 - 3. An eligible employer that has elected to use the simple provisions but fails to be an "eligible employer" for any subsequent year, is treated as an "eligible employer" for any subsequent year with respect to employees (whether or not employees during a qualified year) of any trade or business which was covered by the plan during any qualified plan.
 - The Employer shall cease to be an eligible employer if the Employer employs an average of 200 or more employees
 on business days during any year preceding any such subsequent year.
- c. To the extent that any other provision of the Plan is inconsistent with the provisions of this Article govern.

4.2 DEFINITIONS

- a. "Compensation" means, for purposes of this Article, the sum of the wages, tips, and other compensation from the Employer subject to federal income tax withholding (as described in Code Section 6051(a)(3)) and the Employee's salary reduction contributions made under any 401(k) plan, and, if applicable, elective deferrals under a Code Section 408(p) SIMPLE plan, a SARSEP, or a Code Section 403(b) annuity contract and compensation deferred under a Code Section 457 plan, required to be reported by the Employer on Form W-2 (as described in Code Section 6051(a)(8)). "Compensation" also includes amounts paid for domestic service (as described in Code Section 3401(a)(3)). The provisions of the plan implementing the limit on Compensation under Code Section 401(a)(17) apply to the "compensation" under this Article.
 - "Compensation" also includes elective contributions that are made by the Employer on behalf of a Participant that are not includible in gross income under Code Sections 125, 402(e)(3), 402(h)(1)(B), 403(b), and 132(f)(4).
- b. "Eligible Employee" means, for purposes of this Article, any employee who has completed at least at least 1000 Hours of Service during the preceding Plan Year and is eligible to participate. Regardless of anything in the Plan to the contrary, any group excluded at Section 2.2 shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan.
- "Qualified employee" means, for purposes of this Article, any employee who is not a Highly Compensated Employee or a Key Employee.
 - "Highly Compensated Employee" means an Employee described in Code Section 414(q) and the Regulations thereunder, and generally means any Employee who:
 - (a) was a "five percent owner" of the Employer at any time during the "determination year" or the "look-back year." "Five percent owner" means any person who owns (or is considered as owning within the meaning of Code Section 318) more than five percent of the outstanding stock of the Employer or stock possessing more than five percent of the total combined voting power of all stock of the Employer or, in the case of an unincorporated business, any person who owns more than five percent of the capital or profits interest in the Employer. In determining percentage ownership hereunder, employers that would otherwise be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be treated as separate employers; or
 - (b) for the "look-back year" had 415 Compensation from the Employer in excess of \$80,000 [and, if elected in any other plan of the Employer, was in the Top-Paid Group for the "look-back year."] The \$80,000 amount is adjusted at the same time and in the same manner as under Code Section 415(d), except that the base period is the calendar quarter ending September 30, 1996.

The "determination year" means the Plan Year for which testing is being performed, and the "look-back year" means the immediately preceding twelve (12) month period. However, for purposes of (b) above, the "look-back year" shall be the calendar year beginning within the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the "determination year."

In determining who is a Highly Compensated Employee, Employees who are nonresident aliens and who received no earned income (within the meaning of Code Section 911(d)(2)) from the Employer constituting United States source income within the meaning of Code Section 861(a)(3) shall not be treated as Employees. If an Employee who is a nonresident alien has U.S. source income, that Employee is treated as satisfying this definition if all of such Employee's U.S. source income from the Employer is exempt from U.S. income tax under an applicable income tax treaty. Additionally, all Affiliated Employers shall be taken into account as a single employer and Leased Employees within the meaning of Code Sections 414(n)(2) and 414(o)(2) shall be considered Employees unless such Leased Employees are covered by a plan described in Code Section 414(n)(5) and are not covered in any qualified plan maintained by the Employer. The exclusion of Leased Employees for this purpose shall be applied on a uniform and consistent basis for all of the Employer's retirement plans. Highly Compensated Former Employees shall be treated as Highly Compensated Employees without regard to whether they performed services during the "determination year."

- 2. "Key Employee" means an Employee as defined in Code Section 416(i) and the Regulations thereunder. Generally, any Employee or Former Employee (as well as each of the Employee's or Former Employee's Beneficiaries) is considered a Key Employee if the Employee or Former Employee, at any time during the Plan Year that contains the "determination date" is described in one of the following categories:
 - (a) an officer of the Employer (as that term is defined within the meaning of the Regulations under Code Section 416) having annual 415 Compensation greater than \$130,000 (as adjusted under Code Section 416(i)(1)).

- (b) a "five percent owner" of the Employer. "Five percent owner" means any person who owns (or is considered as owning within the meaning of Code Section 318) more than five percent (5%) of the outstanding stock of the Employer or stock possessing more than five percent (5%) of the total combined voting power of all stock of the Employer or, in the case of an unincorporated business, any person who owns more than five percent (5%) of the capital or profits interest in the Employer. In determining percentage ownership hereunder, employers that would otherwise be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be treated as separate employers.
- a "one percent owner" of the Employer having an annual 415 Compensation from the Employer of more than \$150,000. "One percent owner" means any person who owns (or is considered as owning within the meaning of Code Section 318) more than one percent (1%) of the outstanding stock of the Employer or stock possessing more than one percent (1%) of the total combined voting power of all stock of the Employer or, in the case of an unincorporated business, any person who owns more than one percent (1%) of the capital or profits interest in the Employer. In determining percentage ownership hereunder, employers that would otherwise be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be treated as separate employers. However, in determining whether an individual has 415 Compensation of more than \$150,000, 415 Compensation from each employer required to be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be taken into account.

In determining percentage ownership hereunder, employers that would otherwise be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be treated as separate employers. In determining whether an individual has 415 Compensation of more than \$150,000, 415 Compensation from each employer required to be aggregated under Code Sections 414(b), (c), (m) and (o) shall be taken into account.

4.3 CONTRIBUTIONS

- a. Salary Reduction contributions. Each Eligible Employee may make a salary reduction as set forth in the Plan.
- b. Employer contributions. An Eligible Employer must make the contribution selected at Section 2.3. It may also make additional Employer Contributions as set forth in the Plan.

4.4 NONDISCRIMINATION TESTS

The Plan is treated as meeting the requirements of Code Sections 79(d), 105(h), 125(b), and 129(d)(2), (3), (4) and/or (8) for any Plan Year for which the provisions of this Article are effective and satisfied.



On December 1, 2010 members of the Berwyn Finance and Police Department met with GovPayNet a company based out Indianapolis, Indiana that specializes in the facilitation of bond payments through the use of proprietary credit card processing suite.

The course of the meeting provided a wealth of information in regards to providing the Berwyn Police Department with critical infrastructure and software applications designed to make our prisoner bonding process more efficient, while potentially lowering department costs and liabilities. GovPayNet has a standing contractual relationship with the Cook County Government that allows us to directly deposit bond money into their segregated account when we bond an individual out from our agency. Several agencies in the area are utilizing similar setups, but the process can be cumbersome due to the requirement of phone transactions by multiple parties. The use of GovPayNet's proprietary software provides the same result, but in a more efficient and effective manner.

It is the intention of the Berwyn Police Department to utilize GovPayNet for the processing of credit cards in order to bond out incarcerated individuals in the custody of the Berwyn Police Department. The collaborative inter-agency agreement is offered through GovPayNet at no charge.

The equipment and software suites are provided by a third party vendor, while a standardized fee of ten (10) percent of the total charged is fully incurred for each transaction by the individual at the time of release. The ten (10) percent service charge is retained by GovPayNet for any associated credit card fees, and for continued operation of the program which includes free equipment replacement as well as twenty-four (24) hour customer service and a guarantee on no charge backs.

GovPayNet will provide a truly valuable service to our department while advancing the Berwyn Police Department's goal of becoming more efficient and effective in its daily operations.

Honorable Mayor and City Council Members:

This letter is to request permission to purchase two new ambulances to replace the two 2005 ambulances in our existing fleet through a lease purchase agreement. The 2010 Wheel Coach ambulance cost \$130,893 each, for a total cost of \$261,687.00 (this includes a multi unit discount). I am seeking approval to enter into a lease purchase agreement for 4 years with a \$34,988.56 payment per year. The yearly cost is included in the 2011 Budget line item.

It was my intention to purchase these units in the 2011 calendar year's budget, but it has become apparent that the manufacture only has approximately thirty 2010 units left in stock. In 2011 the EPA will require upgrades to the emission systems with substantial increases in cost per unit at \$7500.00 each for a total of \$15,000.00 for both units. Once ordered the vehicles take approximately 60 days to build. The payments will not have to be made until we receive the vehicles next year.

Due to only thirty 2010 units remaining to date, and the substantial cost increase in 2011, I am asking Council to approve a waiver for the competitive sealed bid process and allow me to enter into an agreement to purchase two 2010 E-450 type III Ambulances for a cost of \$130,839.00 each for a total of \$261,678.00 for two. For consistency reasons, I would like to purchase the same models in our fleet presently the Wheel Coach E-450 type III.
