Absent: Erickson. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to excuse Alderman Erickson. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. 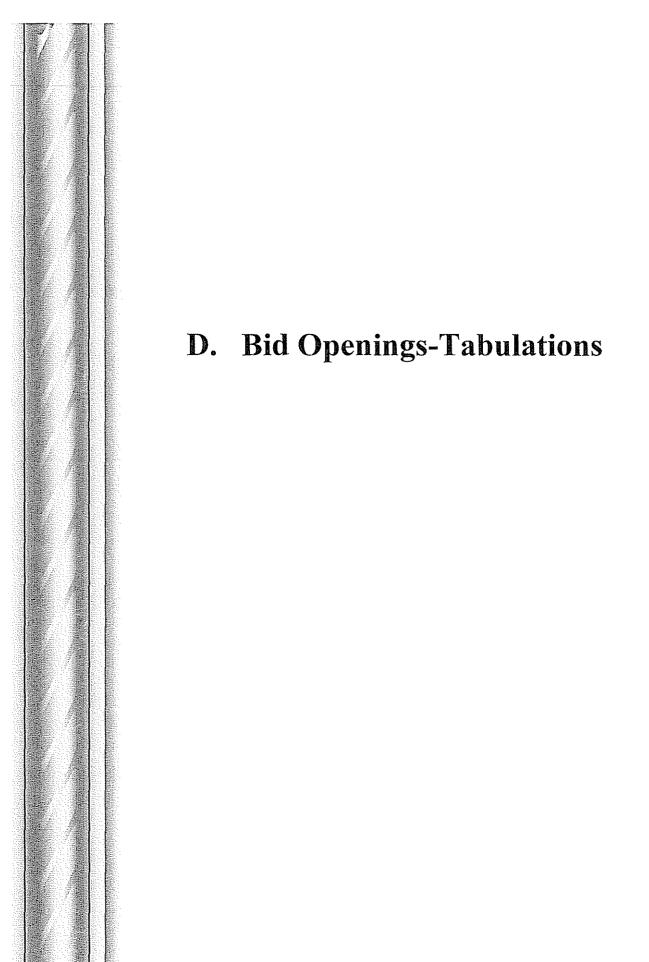

During the past week I have spend numerous hours trying to reorganize the structure of the Department Heads in the City. I have met with many of the outside providers of contractual services to the City. With respect to the appointed position of City Attorney I have decided to appoint Anthony Bertuca. Anthony's salary structure shall remain the same as he is currently receiving. While some of the adjudication responsibilities will be removed from Anthony, he is undertaking many more duties and responsibilities which were previously sent to contractual providers. In addition, to other responsibilities Anthony shall maintain the "legal wheel" for litigation and other matters requiring legal expertise. This system was used extensively during the Lanzillotti administration and proved to be the most fiscal method as well as providing Berwyn with the services of attorneys adeptly skilled in certain matter. This change will definitely result in a financial savings to the City as discussed and confirmed by our Finance Director.

AN ORDIANCE AMENDING SECTION 210.14 ON STANDING COMMITTEES IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of Berwyn's home rule powers as follows:

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it in the best interest of efficient and open government to create a standing committee on Parking and Traffic, which shall be responsible for the duties presently listed in Section 210.15 (g); and

COMMITTEE ON PARKING AND TRAFFIC

The Parking and Traffic committee shall be responsible for the duties presently listed in Section 210.15 (g)

SECTION 2: The following shall be a standing committee of the City Council:

BUSINESS, LICENSING AND TAXATION COMMITTEE

The Business, Licensing and Taxation Committee shall be responsible for regulating all city licenses, business, and all corresponding fees and sources of revenues.

SECTION 3: The present Ordinance and Resolution Committee shall be abolished.

SECTION 4: The present Education Committee shall be abolished.

SECTION 5: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not effect any of the other provisions; of this ordinance.

SECTION 6: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BERWYN CODE TO ELIMINATE UNNECESSARY APPOINTED OFFICERS, AND ADD APPOINTED OFFICERS, IN THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Mayor and City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the exercise of Berwyn's home rule powers as follows:

SECTION 1:

Section 242.03, Chapter 242, Appointed Officers; Appointment Procedure is hereby amended to read as follows; (with proposed additions <u>underlined</u> and proposed deletions stricken):

242.03 APPOINTED OFFICERS: APPOINTMENT PROCEDURE.

- (a) With the exception of the officers listed in Section 242.01, all City officers shall be appointed by the Mayor, by and with the consent of Council. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office provided for in subsection (b) hereof, the Mayor shall present to Council, within thirty days of the occurrence creating such vacancy, the name of the appointee to such office, or shall, within such thirty days, inform Council of a temporary appointment, if such is the case. No person may be appointed to or temporarily hold any office provided for in subsection (b) hereof unless and until such person:
 - (1) Has earned a high school diploma or the equivalent;
 - (2) Is not in arrears in the payment of any tax or other indebtedness due to the City; and
- (3) Is not indicted for nor has been convicted of, in any court located in the United States, and still serving the sentence for any infamous crime, bribery, perjury, or other felony involving the characteristics of dishonesty, falsehood or fraud.

Subsection (a) (1) shall not apply to a person who is being appointed to an office which he or she held with the City prior to January 1, 2004.

(b) Appointed City officers shall include the following:

Administrative Assistant (to the Mayor's Department),

Assistant Fire Chief,

Associate City Attorney,

Building Director,

Chaplains, Police and Fire Departments (two),

City Administrator,

City Attorney,

City Collector,

City Prosecutor,

Director of Information Technology,

Director of Community Outreach,

Director of Finance,

Director of Human Resources,

Director of Neighborhood Affairs

Dear Mayor and Members of the City Council,

It has come to my attention that 2 or more unit buildings are quite possibly the source of some criminal neighborhood activies. I am proposing that the 6th Ward be used as the pilot program for this ordinance.

I am looking forward to working with all of the Alderman to streamline the Crime Free Multi-Unit Ordinance. Time is of the essence to establish a program to ensure a safe haven for all the residents of Berwyn. The number of rental properties and absentee landlords lends itself to not adequately screening renters.

The following is a list of requirements that should be included but not limited to this pilot program.

- 1.) The fee for ROL (rental operations license) would be waived for the first year. The yearly fee would then be \$0 for owner occupied, and \$100 for non-owner occupied. The building owners would register at the Berwyn Police Department with the housing officer.
- 2.) The tenant and the landlord would receive an LO ticket upon the 3rd call for service to the residence when the violation is a quality of life issue, such as peace disturbances, disorderly conduct, loitering, ect. Violations that are of a major offense such as drug and gang activity would be reviewed by the housing officer and the appropriate penalty would be applied to

the offender and the landlord. The fine could be set up to \$750 by the LO court adjudicator. All of the violations would also be subject to our Codified Ordinance 202.99.

- 3.) The landlords would also be voluntarily schooled in Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design, by the certified housing officer.
- 4.) The following sections of the rescinded Ordinance 880 should be added to this pilot program:

880.12, 880.13, 880.14

5.) All landlords will be required to charge an application fee that would cover, credit, Criminal background and renters check. The housing officer would be able to provide established means for such checks.

It would be my recommendation to refer this communication to the law department for the drafting of this proposed Ordinance.

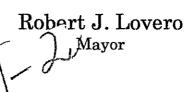

This Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EEBG) require an applicant to complete and submit several specialized reports and future plans prior to the issuance of any funds. CDM, currently contracted by the City to assist in design and grant funding assistance for the water system security upgrades, is proposing to perform all services necessary to successfully complete the application for the EEBG.

Projects under consideration include upgrading the electrical and HVAC system at the Library, replacing the boiler at the City Hall, as well as upgrading the energy efficiency of the Public Works Main Garage.

Recommended Action

Scope of Work for CDM Initial Assistance

Dear Mr. Ryan:

Pursuant to our discussion regarding the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG), Camp Dresser & McKee Inc. (CDM) is pleased to provide you with the following scope of work. CDM's experienced energy management team, understanding of the EECBG process, knowledge in renewable energy alternatives, and local team will provide the quality, value and responsiveness you seek for this project.

Introduction

Funding allocations to local governments totaling \$3.2 billion were announced by the U.S. Department of Energy on March 26, 2009. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) appropriates funding for the Department of Energy (DOE) to provide grants to local governments under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Program. The ARRA's purpose is to stimulate the economy and to create and retain jobs while reducing fossil fuel emissions, reducing local energy usage, and improving energy efficiency in the building, transportation, and other sectors. Grants have been pre-determined by the federal government by formula and are designated for llocal governments.

The grant funds appropriated for the City of Berwyn are \$444,300. The actual grant will be less than this because the federal government will extract some funds for their administrative costs (maximum of 10%). This grant to the City is an entitlement grant and is non-competitive and non-cost-sharing. However, application must be made to the Department of Energy for the City to obtain grant funding. The Grant opportunity deadline, June 25, 2009.

All funds must be obligated/committed within 18 months of the effective date of the award and expended within 36 months of the effective date of the award. Receiving a grant requires the submittal of an application to DOE including registration requirements and submittal of at least nine forms with development of a budget for proposed activities.

The special provisions of the ARRA include access to records by the Inspectors General and the Government Accountability Office; ensuring that iron, steel and manufactured goods are



produced in the United States; and ensuring wage rates are comparable to those prevailing on projects of similar character (Davis-Bacon). The list of eligible activities includes:

- Development of an Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy all applicants must provide this
- Technical consulting services are totally paid
- Energy efficiency retrofits for existing facilities, including pumping facilities
- Energy efficiency and conservation programs for buildings and facilities such as water treatment plants of energy efficient technologies
- Distributed energy such as micro turbines and ground source heat pumps
- Material conservation programs such as recycling
- Reduction and capture of methane and greenhouse gases
- Other appropriate activity

CDM's Scope of Work:

CDM has developed the scope of work below with tasks to assist you in submitting an application to capture the appropriated funds for the City of Berwyn.

Task 1. Submittal of Registration Requirements

CDM will meet with the City of Berwyn to obtain the information necessary to fulfill registration requirements. The City will need to designate the signatory to documents (the authorized official or highest elected official within the City), the City's program manager and contact person and contact information, the City's project managers and contact information for individual projects, employer identification number, and Dun and Bradstreet Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number, the name and contact information for the City's financial officer who will sign appropriate forms and the congressional district of the City. CDM will act as the City's agent and obtain a DUNS number if one does not currently exist. CDM will also act on the City's behalf to register the City with the federal Central Contractor Registration (CCR). CDM will also register the City with FEDConnect which is the portal through which the application will be submitted.



Task 2. Completion of Mandatory Form - SF 424

CDM will populate SF 424 for the City, prepare the unique identification code (UIC) as requested and provide it for signature. A presumption is that a Disclosure of Lobbying Activities form will not be filled out. By the signing of this form by the City, the City is providing written assurance that they will comply with all requirements of the ARRA.

Task 3. Financial Management Assessment

CDM will assist the City's financial manager with completion of Attachment B2, Financial Management Assessment.

Task 4. Energy Efficiency and Conservation Forms

The required components of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation are the measurable goals and objectives which should be aligned with the defined purposes and eligible activities of the EECBG Program. A preliminary schedule is requested for major milestones. An activity sheet must be filled out for each activity (Form B1). These activities must match the activities provided in the application guidance document. These activity sheets require the following information (the best available information will be used for this preliminary evaluation):

- The relationship of each activity to the City's goals and objectives
- Proposed number of jobs created or retained
- Proposed energy saved or renewable energy generated
- Proposed GHG emissions reduced in CO₂ equivalents
- Proposed budget for the activity with allowance for administration by the City
- Metric activity that will be used to monitor the activity (i.e., number of buildings or square footage retrofitted, number of audits performed, number of alternative fuel vehicles purchased, number of workshops held, etc).

Using information provided by the City, CDM will provide the best available estimate to the above quantities and complete the activity sheets based on the lbest available information. CDM will construct a spreadsheet with all activities and the information above along with the budget for each activity and the total budget which will be the sum of the budgets for each activity.

CDM will develop preliminary budget information and complete SF 424 A with the assistance of the City's financial manager. This proposal shall also provide written assurance that all laborers and mechanics on projects funded through the EECBG program are paid wages at rates not less than those prevailing on projects of a character similar in the locality as provided under the Davis-Bacon Act. CDM will prepare a written document to accompany the budget information form for signature by the City stipulating the above wage rates.

Task 6. Submittal of Documents

CDM will coordinate a final review by the City after which CDiM will convert signed documents to .pdf forms and submit all forms through FedConnect.

CDM anticipates completion of the application within three weeks of the notice to proceed.

The City of Chicago has sent notice to the City of Berwyn requesting the re-approval of the exist Water Supply Agreement between the Chicago, Illinois and the City of Berwyn, Illinois for an additional ten year period starting January 1, 2009. This agreement, first enacted in 1999, sets forth the provision for the supply of potable water to the City of Berwyn. A cursory review of the agreement shows it to be a standard boiler plate agreement with no specificity to the City of Berwyn

Recommended Action

Staff recommends the City of Berwyn City Council refer further review of the Water Supply Agreement between the Chicago, Illinois and the City of Berwyn, Illinois to the Public Works Committee. A copy of the current agreement is attached for review.

WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CHICAGO, ILLINOIS AND THE CITY OF BERWYN, ILLINOIS

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the CITY and the PURCHASER previously entered into an agreement for the furnishing from the CITY's water main at the CITY limits, at the ACTIVE LOCATION (as defined below), and, if applicable, for emergency purposes only at the EMERGENCY LOCATION (as defined below), of a supply of water for consumers supplied by the PURCHASER's water system; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the PURCHASER are desirous of and willing to enter into a new water supply Agreement pursuant to which the CITY will furnish from the existing connection to the CITY's water main at the CITY limits, at the ACTIVE LOCATION, and, if applicable, for emergency purposes only at the EMERGENCY LOCATION, a supply of water for consumers supplied by the PURCHASER's water system;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above Recitals which are made a contractual part of this Agreement and the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties agree to the following:

A. DEFINITIONS.

The following terms as used in this Agreement shall have the meanings set forth below unless the context indicates a different meaning:

"<u>ACTIVE LOCATION</u>" shall have the meaning set forth on <u>Exhibit</u> A to this Agreement.

"COMMISSIONER" shall mean the Commissioner of the Department of Water of the CITY.

"EMERGENCY LOCATION" shall have the meaning set forth on Exhibit A to this Agreement, if applicable.

"FACILITIES" shall mean the SERVICE MAINS, all reservoirs within the PURCHASER's water system and all connections to other entities outside the limits of the PURCHASER's water system, including any reservoirs on such entities' water systems.

"REVENUES" shall mean the revenues derived from the operation of the PURCHASER's water system, as stated in 65 ILCS 5/11-124.1.

"SERVICE MAIN" or "SERVICE MAINS" shall mean the primary supply piping between the CITY's water system and the overflow tank at the PURCHASER's reservoir, including the connection to the CITY's water system, the control valve and the meter vault.

"STATE" shall mean the State of Illinois, Department of Natural Resources, or any predecessor or successor to the Department of Natural Resources having authority over the allocation of Lake Michigan water.

"SUBSEQUENT PURCHASER," if applicable, shall mean water users outside of the PURCHASER'S corporate limits which are supplied water by the PURCHASER pursuant to Section (B)(2).

B. SERVICE TO BE FURNISHED.

- (1) The CITY agrees to furnish to the PURCHASER, and the PURCHASER agrees to purchase and take from the CITY under and in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, a supply of water through metered connection authorized by the COMMISSIONER from the CITY's water main at the CITY limits, at the ACTIVE LOCATION, and for emergency purposes only at the EMERGENCY LOCATION, if applicable, to be used by the PURCHASER in supplying water to consumers located within the corporate limits of the PURCHASER. All water usage is to be in accordance with the allocation of the STATE, as set forth on Exhibit A.
- (2) The PURCHASER is further authorized to supply Lake Michigan water obtained from the CITY to ___(not applicable) (collectively, the "SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS," if applicable). All water usage is to be in accordance with the allocations of the STATE. Any increase in the allocation to the SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS, if applicable, shall be subject to the approval of the COMMISSIONER. It is clearly understood by the PURCHASER that this

authorization is non-exclusive and in no way guarantees any rights to re-sell CITY water.

(3) The PURCHASER shall not add any SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS of water supplied by the CITY without the approval of the COMMISSIONER and the Chicago City Council.

C. QUANTITY OF WATER TO BE FURNISHED.

- (1) The quantities of water to be furnished are to be supplied to the PURCHASER and the SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS, if applicable, as set forth on Exhibit A for the years indicated thereon. The individual consumer's quantities of water are included in the allocation made to the PURCHASER. These quantities of water are in accordance with the allocations made to the PURCHASER and the SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS, if applicable, by the STATE in Opinion and Order Number LMO 89-2, as amended from time to time. These quantities of water may be adjusted by the COMMISSIONER if there are any future revisions of the allocation order by the STATE and shall be identified to this Agreement by written addenda.
- (2) The water supplied and taken in accordance with this Agreement shall be withdrawn at a uniform rate during the 24 hours of each day. The maximum hourly rate of withdrawal from the CITY's water main shall not exceed twice the annual average daily contracted amount. The CITY shall have the right to restrict the supply of water to the PURCHASER in order to ensure an adequate water supply to all purchasers of CITY water for public health and fire protection. The PURCHASER shall be responsible for any damage to the water system of the CITY or of any of its customers due to excessive surges caused by the malfunction or misuse of the PURCHASER's water system, including, without limitation, fast-acting valves or booster station operation.
- The PURCHASER shall install, or if previously installed, shall maintain a flow control system and a pressure recording system consisting of a manually operated flow control valve controlled by the CITY at a meter vault on existing water service connection to the CITY's water main at the CITY limits at the ACTIVE LOCATION in order to regulate the flow of water as herein provided. When requested by the COMMISSIONER, the PURCHASER shall provide the necessary equipment to transmit pressures, rates of flow and receiving reservoir elevations, and to convert the manually operated flow control valves to remotely controlled flow All devices necessary for the control and control valves. transmission of pressures and rates of flow of water furnished shall be provided and maintained by the PURCHASER. transmission of pressures and rates of flow readings shall be to a location designated by the CITY and the flow control valve shall be controlled by the CITY.

D. STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

I. GENERAL

- (1) This Agreement shall be in force and effect for a period of 10 years, ending on December 31, 2008; provided, however, that the CITY and the PURCHASER may agree to renew this Agreement for three successive like terms, not to exceed in the aggregate 40 years from the initial date of this Agreement. If either the CITY or the PURCHASER shall desire to renew this Agreement, such party shall provide written notice thereof to the other party hereto by June 1 of the year on which said 10-year term expires. Amounts of water for average daily use shall be the amounts as allocated by the STATE. This Agreement shall be a continuing valid and binding obligation of the PURCHASER payable from REVENUES as hereinafter provided for the term and each separate renewal term thereof (each such renewal term to be treated as the term of a new agreement).
 - (2) No officer, official or agent of the CITY has the power to amend, modify or alter this Agreement or waive any of its conditions so as to bind the CITY by making any promise or representation not contained herein; provided, however, that the COMMISSIONER may make modifications pursuant to paragraph D(7) herein.
 - (3) This Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred by either party.
 - (4) This Agreement shall be subject to cancellation in the event a court of competent jurisdiction restricts or limits, directly or indirectly, any of the CITY's rights to obtain, sell, contract for or distribute Lake Michigan water.
 - (5) The quantity of water supplied under this Agreement shall not exceed the amount of Lake Michigan water allocated annually by the STATE to the PURCHASER and SUBSEQUENT PURCHASERS, if applicable.
 - (6) The CITY shall not be responsible in damages for any interruption or failure to supply water and shall be saved and held harmless from all damage of any kind, nature and description that may arise as a result of making this Agreement and furnishing water hereunder.
 - (7) The PURCHASER shall not permit any water furnished hereunder to be used to supply any party outside the corporate limits of the PURCHASER, except as otherwise specifically provided herein, without the prior written consent of the COMMISSIONER and the Chicago City Council. The PURCHASER may, with the permission of the COMMISSIONER, in an emergency, supply water to other CITY water users who have been previously authorized an emergency connection.

II. REPORTING REQUIREMENT

- (8) At the end of each calendar year during the term of this Agreement and not later than March 31st of each year, the PURCHASER agrees to submit to the COMMISSIONER a written copy of the prevailing water rate schedule as applicable to its water customers. It shall include all rates and relevant information and the premise on which rates have been furnished.
- (9) The PURCHASER shall submit to the CITY by the 10th day of each month, a report showing the amount of water received the previous month from the CITY and the amount furnished to customers of the PURCHASER.
- (10) The PURCHASER shall notify the CITY in writing and keep the CITY informed of the responsible individual in charge of operations of the PURCHASER's water system.

III. RESERVATIONS

- (11) In the event of a default in payment of a water bill by the PURCHASER, the CITY reserves the right to require the PURCHASER to deposit, in advance, a sum equal to the estimated costs for water supply during a period of 90 days at the prevailing metered rate.
- (12) The CITY reserves the right to inspect, test and repair the water meters as required. All such repairs shall be charged to and paid by the PURCHASER.

IV. WATER QUALITY

- (13) The CITY shall supply the PURCHASER with water of a quality commensurate with that furnished to its consumers within the CITY limits.
- (14) The PURCHASER shall receive its supply of water from the CITY by means of a method approved by the COMMISSIONER. The CITY water system must be safeguarded by means of an air gap at the receiving reservoir. When the requirement for a receiving reservoir is waived to permit a direct connection for emergency use, a backflow preventer, approved by the COMMISSIONER, must be installed.
- (15) The PURCHASER bears the responsibility for maintaining the water quality at any point beyond the control valve and within its distribution system. The CITY bears no degree of responsibility for the water quality at any point beyond the control valve.

- (16) The PURCHASER shall immediately notify the COMMISSIONER of any emergency or condition that may affect the quality of water in either party's system.
- (17) The CITY reserves the right to make inspections of those facilities which may affect the quality of the water supplied to the PURCHASER and to perform required tests upon due notice to the PURCHASER.

V. EQUIPMENT OPERATION

- MAINS and valves and bear the costs for connecting said SERVICE MAINS to and severing them from the CITY's water system. The PURCHASER shall also pay any and all costs incurred by or on behalf of the CITY in connection with extending the CITY's water system to the point of connection with the PURCHASER's water system, if such extension is for the sole purpose of supplying water to the PURCHASER's water system. Each SERVICE MAIN shall be equipped with a valve located within the CITY limits and said valve shall be under the sole and complete control of the CITY. This valve shall mark the limit of the CITY's responsibility for maintenance of the piping system. The cost of maintaining or replacing the valve shall be the responsibility of the PURCHASER.
- (19) The PURCHASER shall provide and maintain any and all devices expressly requested by the COMMISSIONER for the purpose of controlling, measuring, transmitting and recording pressures, rates of flow, reservoir levels and other required operational information.
- (20) The PURCHASER shall provide the meters, vaults with sump pumps and related devices, adhering to CITY standard practices, for measuring the supply of water furnished. The meters provided have been, or must be delivered to the CITY meter shop for testing and picked up promptly after testing, all at the expense of the PURCHASER prior to installation by the PURCHASER. Plans, drawings and specifications for the equipment, piping and vault, or other protective structure have been, or must be, submitted to and approved by the COMMISSIONER as a precondition to the issuance of an authorization for installing the meters and related devices. No substitute equipment shall be allowed without written approval of the COMMISSIONER. The meter vault shall be located no farther than 150 feet from the control valve unless the COMMISSIONER consents to installation at a greater distance. The PURCHASER is required to provide a tee and valve downstream of each meter installed in each The tee and valve shall be of a size and in a meter vault. location approved by the COMMISSIONER. The tee and valve shall be a minimum of two inches pipe size. The PURCHASER is required to provide a one-inch pipe size pitometer test tap in the inlet pipe the header pipe in a location approved by the ahead of COMMISSIONER.

- (21) In the event that the PURCHASER should desire to alter the meter installation, the piping configuration, the meter vault or any of the FACILITIES, all drawings, plans and specifications shall be submitted to the COMMISSIONER prior to an application being made for an installation permit and prior to the start of any construction. Alteration of any of the FACILITIES shall include construction of new FACILITIES or changes or additions to existing FACILITIES. All drawings, plans and specifications shall include profiles showing United States Geological Survey elevations and shall be prepared by a professional engineer, licensed to practice in the State of Illinois, all equipment shall be of a manufacture and type approved by the CITY, and all work shall be performed by a plumbing contractor licensed and bonded in the State of Illinois.
- (22) The CITY's representative shall regularly inspect the meters measuring the supply of water furnished and shall repair any meter or part of a meter which is known or suspected to be registering incorrectly. All such repairs shall be made by the CITY's representatives and the PURCHASER shall pay for all repairs made. The PURCHASER shall be responsible for replacing any meters which have been in service for a period longer than authorized or which are defective and not capable of being repaired. All such replacements shall be at the expense of the PURCHASER.
- (23) When it is determined that a water meter registered incorrectly, an estimate of the amount of water furnished through the faulty meter shall be prepared by the COMMISSIONER for the purpose of billing the PURCHASER. The estimate shall be based upon the average of 12 preceding readings of the meter, exclusive of incorrect readings. When less than 12 correct readings are available, fewer readings, including some obtained after the period of incorrect registration, may be used.
- (24) The PURCHASER shall assure that reservoirs of sufficient capacity are provided in its entire system including its own system and the entities served to store twice the annual daily average allocation of water to the PURCHASER and the entities furnished water by the PURCHASER's water system as authorized by the STATE Opinion and Order Number LMO 89-2, as amended from time to time, and any revisions to the allocations. All reservoirs provided by the PURCHASER's water system shall be considered in meeting this requirement. The PURCHASER's water system is to be operated to utilize the reservoirs in a manner to assure that water is withdrawn from the CITY's water system as uniformly as possible.

VI. RATES AND DISCOUNTS

(25) Charges for water furnished to the PURCHASER shall be at such rate or rates as the CITY shall be legally authorized to charge, said rate or rates being fixed by CITY ordinance.

- (26) The PURCHASER shall be entitled to a discount for prompt payment of water bills similar to that allowed to metered customers inside the CITY.
- (27) The PURCHASER shall be charged a penalty for late payment of water bills similar to that charged to metered customers inside the CITY.
- (28) Payments to be made by the PURCHASER hereunder to the CITY for water furnished to the PURCHASER shall be solely from REVENUES. The PURCHASER covenants and agrees to charge such rate or rates for the furnishing of water to its customers so that the REVENUES shall at all times be sufficient to pay in full all amounts due to the CITY from the PURCHASER hereunder.

VII. NOTICES

(29) Unless otherwise specified, any notice, demand or request required hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (a) personal service; (b) electronic communications, such as facsimile; (c) overnight courier; or (d) registered or certified, first class mail, return receipt requested.

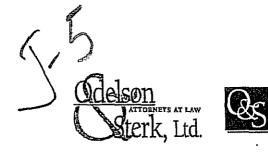

This means that when preservation ordinances are certified by the State Historic Preservation Office, local governments may participate in state and federal incentive programs. Properties located in certified historic districts can qualify for the 20 percent income tax credit. Certification also extends the <u>Property Tax Assessment Freeze</u> benefit to local landmark and residences within local historic districts.

Certified Local Governments are also eligible for matching grant funds to assist in the implementation of their local preservation programs. At least 10 percent of the federal Historic Preservation Fund is set aside specifically for Certified Local Governments. WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn ("Berwyn") is a Home Rule Unit of Government pursuant to and as defined in Article 7 Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, said Section of the Constitution authorizes a home rule unit of government to exercise any power, and perform any function, pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the 1970 Illinois Constitution, Article VII Section 10 and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act also provides authority for intergovernmental cooperation, and

WHEREAS, in February, 2009, the United States Congress authorized Title XII of Division A of the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) to provide additional CDBG funding known as CDBG-R: and

WHEREAS, Berwyn has been allocated \$365,718.00 in CDBG-R Funds pursuant to the funding formula approved by Congress to be available for neighborhood infrastructure projects benefitting low and moderate income persons and areas, and allowable administrative costs; and

WHEREAS, a requirement to receive CDBG-R Funds is the preparation of a Substantial Amendment to the 2008 Action Plan Element of the City of Berwyn's Consolidated Plan for CDBG Funds, previously approved by Berwyn as Resolution 2008 – 072208-1, on July 22, 2008; and

WHEREAS, a 7 day public comment period will begin on May 27, 2009, the Substantial Amendment has been duly posted, and in accordance with federal regulations governing the development of consolidated plans, all comments will be included in the final draft of the Substantial Amendment, along with responses to the comments; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council have determined it is in the best interest of Berwyn to receive and appropriate the CDBG-R Funds; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation the City Council finds it would be in the best interest of Berwyn to approve the Substantial Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1:

That the Corporate Authorities of Berwyn hereby approve the Substantial Amendment to the Consolidated Plan 2008 Action Plan Element in substantially the same format as attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, and said Substantial Amendment is hereby authorized to be submitted as required.

SECTION 2:

That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed and authorized to sign and submit the Substantial Amendment, and any additional documentation required.

SECTION 3:

That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed and authorized, upon approval and funding of CDBG-R Funds, to enter into all other contracts and agreements necessary and proper to fully implement the Substantial Amendment.

SECTION 4:

That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval according to the law.

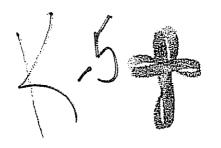
