MINUTES BERWYN CITY COUNCIL JANUARY 27, 2009

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 8:03 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero, Erickson.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the safety of our armed forces, police, firefighters, paramedics, and especially for Jimmy Trdowski, who is currently serving in Iraq.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. The Mayor recognized Steven Petergall, Oak Park resident and Berwyn firefighter, who spoke regarding his recent injury and asked for an apology from the Mayor, see attached statement.
- 4. The minutes of the Berwyn City Council meeting and the Committee of the Whole held on January 13, 2009 were submitted. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Replacement of the Cermak Road Clock. Thereafter, Erickson made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and approve for payment. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 6. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the 2009 annual event dates. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Ramos, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by the following roll call vote: Yeas: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Phelan, Lovero. Nays: Erickson.
- 7. The Berwyn Development Corporation submitted a communication regarding the Parking Structure Construction-Potential Caisson related Change Order. The Mayor recognized Anthony Griffin from the BDC, who explained the request, stating that three separated motions needed to be made.

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Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur for consideration to release an amount not to exceed \$242,805 from the construction budget to address the caisson change order. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd to concur and approve for payment in an amount not to exceed \$90,000 from the construction budget to put towards the Walker Parking Consultants budget and additional costs associated with the review and redesign of the caisson issue. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to concur and approve payment in an amount not to exceed \$28,772 from the construction budget, only if the geotechnical test results indicate further TDR testing is necessary and to consider approving the scope of services contract associated with the TDR testing from the company AECOM. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.

MINUTES COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE JANUARY 13, 2009

- 1. The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 6:13 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Weiner, Skryd, Day, Lovero, Erickson. Absent: Ramos, Phelan.
- Chapman requested Mayor O'Connor to recognize John Chrastka President 2. of the Berwyn Public Library Board to speak on item F-6 the Mayors' Library Budget and Sunday Hours Communication. Mayor O'Connor then recognized Mr. Chrastka who asked, if the City Council could approve the library budget now to allow the library to implement the Sunday hours and the new fee schedules. Mr. Chrastka explained, that the library would like to start up Sunday hours as soon as possible and would need to work out the staffing for the additional 72 man hours, giving the library enough time to implement and work out the logistics. Also stating it will already be a short spring Sunday hour's season, because the library still plans on resuming summer hours. Alderman Weiner stated, that he was cautious about approving the Library Budget by pulling it out of the overall budget, but is comfortable with a straw poll consensus. Discussion ensued on giving the okay to the Library Board to implement the project and to affirm the budget with the overall budget that will be approved in March. Mayor O'Connor then asked for a consensus on giving the okay for the Library to move forward and present the Library's portion of the budget intact to the Council for approval in March. Consensus 6-0 in favor.
- 3. Day made a motion, seconded by Chapman to excuse Alderman Ramos and Alderman Phelan. The motion carried.
- 4. A motion by Skryd, seconded by Chapman to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:21pm for Union Negotiations, Pending Litigations and Personnel. Mayor O'Connor explaining that the personnel is regarding union negotiations. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. The open portion of the Committee of the Whole reconvened at 8:07 pm.
 - Note: Alderman Phelan now in attendance. Alderman Chapman now absent.
- 6. Superblock Agreement changes. Mayor O'Connor recognized Anthony Griffin of the BDC to review the Superblock Amended Redevelopment Agreements (see attached).

There after Mayor O'Connor summarized the plan for the medical building to be occupied west of the bank building, stating there will be first floor retail with medical offices above and this will be the first portion of the development and then the bank building will be redeveloped. Griffin stated he was referring this to the Committee of The Whole for consideration and asked the City Council to consider placing it on the next City Council Agenda along with the next C.O.W Agenda.

7. A motion was made by Phelan, seconded by Skryd, to adjourn the Committee of the Whole at 8:20 pm. The motion carried.

MINUTES COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE January 15, 2009

- 1. The Committee of the Whole was following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Skryd, Lovero. Absent: Day, Phelan, Erickson. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to excuse Alderman Day, Phelan and Erickson. Motion carried.
- 2. Budget items: Mayor introduced John Wysoki who presented updated pages to the 2009 proposed budget document. See attached. See document by going to cities website.

http://www.berwyn-il.gov/pdf/Clerk/Prop.changes.2009.budget.pdf. John Wysocki briefly reviewed the changes which reflected decreases in proposed revenues because the city council voted down the gas tax and vehicle sticker increase ordinances. Wysoki reported the budget is now at a net \$400,000.00 deficit. See summary page 12. John reported a reduction was also made in the expenditure for the Berwyn Housing Authority with a \$25,000.00 reduction. Alderman Lovero questioned the fine collections and discussion ensued on Red Speed revenues. See page 18 and Fees see page106. Discussion ensued on the internal service funds. See page 197 on the original proposed 2009 budget document. Questions regarding how the projected numbers are figured and projected at a net deficit. Lovero also questioned the license and permit page 12, the proposed versus the amended changes and questioned what the fund is comprised of. Alderman Skryd questioned the Berwyn Park District revenue sharing from ticket writing. If they have been paid and where it is shown in the budget. Mayor and Wysoki had no answer and the Mayor questioned if the Berwyn Park District had ever submitted a bill and that he assumed it was handled by Marsha Cohen in the Collections Department of the Berwyn Police Department. Lovero then questioned changes in the Mayor's budget regarding proposed staffing increase. It was stated this was for a Mayoral Assistant to be implemented in the second half of the year. Loveroquestioned capitol line item and why it was up from \$477,404.00 to \$901,596.00. Wysocki answered it was for the new fire truck that was approved in 2008 but will be delivered and has to be shown in the 2009 budget. Skryd questioned why the \$50,000.00 was still in budget for the strategic planning proposal. The Mayor stated it was voted down and now it can be removed from the budget. Lovero once again questioned the statutory line item, Wysocki explained. Skryd questioned the \$30,000.00 for lights for the Recreation Department and asked which location, Mayor stated this is for Janura Park to finish the lighting project. Alderman Skryd questioned the drug forfeiture fund pay back and where it will come out of. Wysoki answered the general fund. Skryd questioned the

Status. Discussion ensued. Alderman Chapman questioned the Kronos lease and how long it is for and Wysoki answered three years and that it will be paid up this year in June or July and then only a small maintenance fee in licensing software will be billed on a yearly basis. Chapman then questioned the status of the implementing Kronos and questioned the fact that we have been paying for over two and a half years and the system is still not fully implemented. Chapman questioned if the licensing inspector for the multi-unit housing inspector was still in the budget, answer yes. Chapman then questioned where the salary for Dawn Reinhart was paid out of and the Mayor answered 90% CDBG 10% city. Chapman questioned where it is reflected in the budget and Wysoki answered off the spreadsheet from the CDBG fund. Chapman questioned the salary for Frank Paduch, answered paid from the CDBG funds and that Paduch actually took the place of Myrtle Slawko. Alderman questioned lawn services and snow removal and discussion ensued on senior services and how they were removed from the community outreach department. Chapman still questioned where the 10% for Reinhart's salary was reflected and Lovero then requested a spreadsheet for a salary breakdown for CDBG and the Police Department. The Mayor requested that John Wysoki supply an end-of-year salary spreadsheet to all the aldermen. Discussion on CDBG grant funds and how it is budgeted, discussion ensued.

3. Mayor stated that he did not want to keep the council past 9:00 p.m..

Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded to adjourn at the hour of 8:58 p.m. The motion carried.

MINUTES COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE January 22, 2009

- The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor O'Connor at 7:09 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Ramos, Weiner, Phelan and Lovero. Absent: Skryd, Day Erickson. Also present: Attorney Anthony Bertuca, Finance Director, John Wysoki. A sign-in sheet attached.
- A motion by Phelan, seconded by Chapman to excuse Alderman Skryd, Day, and Erickson. Motion carried.
- 3. 2009 proposed budget. Mayor reported that at the last meeting the council just reviewed the changes and that questions and answers took place relating to the budget and asked how the City Council would like to proceed tonight. Alderman Lovero questioned if the Mayor or the Finance Director have come up with any new revenue proposals. The Mayor answered, not at this time, they are not ready.
- Mayor then recognized Anthony Bertuca who reported to the council on the Red Speed camera situation at 22nd and Harlem Ave. Bertucca reported that we have the OK to proceed with two cameras at that location and we still need the state approval to install. Bertuca reported that Red Speed wants to discontinue the camera at 26th and East Avenue because violations have drastically reduced.

Note: Alderman Skryd present at 7:15 p.m.

Bertuca reported that we now only have to get one new camera and we can relocate the other to 22^{nd} and Harlem. Alderman Ramos questioned the possible income generated for two cameras at 22^{nd} and Harlem. Bertuca reported that there are no estimates currently available. Lovero suggested going forward and getting state approval for two cameras to be located at 22^{nd} and Harlem. Mayor then asked for consensus to move one Red Speed camera from 26^{th} and East Ave. to the intersection of 22^{nd} and Harlem plus the one additional camera. The consensus 5 - 1 in favor with Phelan against. Mayor stated that he will recommend that in a communication to the City Council.

Mayor recognized Finance Director, John Wysoki, who reported on the budget short-fall now being at \$368,000.00 after the last meeting with the few cuts that were made. The Mayor then once again recognized Anthony Bertuca to inform the Council on Berwyn Park District tickets that was questioned at the last meeting of the Whole. Bertuca briefed the City Council on the procedures involved. Bertucca now also reported that he is now working with the owners of

the Marathon station on 16th and Oak Park regarding the surplus property which they would like to purchase from the city.

Alderman Chapman questioned how Robert Dwan and Dawn Reinhart get their 10% of payroll from the city. CDBG submits payroll to the Feds and is reimbursed by the city and the city credits back to CDBG out of the General Fund for the difference. Mayor reported that Dwan's salary is 90% CDBG and 10% city and Dawn Reinhart's salary is 75% CDGB and 25% city general fund. Total salaries for CDBG is \$396,918.00. Chapman then questioned how the Senior Advocate gets paid and the Mayor stated 100% from CDGB.

He reported that Frank Paduch's secretary and the bus drivers get paid by the city. Lovero questioned the fund that this comes out of and Wysoki answered Fund 32 and referred to the attached salary detailed report provided to the aldermen. Discussion ensued on salaries and the hiring freeze. Ramos stated that he is only in favor of hiring replacements and not new hires. Ramos suggested eliminating the administrative assistant new position budget for 6 months at \$62,500.00 and also eliminating the \$30,000.00 plus benefits budgeted for the new IT department position. Ramos also questioned the salary for the multi-unit housing inspector. Wysoki stated it was \$31,000.00 plus benefits. Ramos then stated if we could eliminate these three positions from the budget we would be well on our way to cutting that \$368,000.00 deficit in half. Alderman Phelan questioned the Mayor on how the funds already collected regarding the multi-unit housing ordinance will be used if there is no inspector hired. The Mayor stated that portions of the monies collected will be used toward the Fire Department salaries for doing commercial building inspection and their line item will be reimbursed for the time. Also, detective Joe Green is doing the Police Department end of complying with the ordinance. The Mayor then went on to state that the ordinance has to be enforced unless it is repealed. The Mayor stated that eventually he will try to have the Fire Department do the residential inspections also. The Mayor then discussed the need for the need of the Administrative Assistant and would not be in favor of eliminating the position. Skryd then stated that the Mayor is unwilling to compromise on any items that he has submitted. Discussion ensued. Chapman once again questioned the time left on the lease for Kronos and how it is reflected in the budget. Wysoki explained Lovero questioned the Berwyn Housing Authority's \$225,000 00 budget per year and stated it only would take a 90 day notice for the city to end the agreement. Discussion ensued regarding the need for the Berwyn Housing Authority. Discussion reverted back to the Senior Advocate position and the question of it being paid out of the general fund and that the budget does not reflect CDGB reimbursement. Wysoki explained.

7. Alderman Ramos stated that he needed to be excused from the meeting Thereafter, Phelan made a motion, seconded by Chapman to excuse Alderman Ramos at 8:07 p.m. Motion carried.

- 8. Budget discussion continued. Aldermen questioned the Fire Department and the Police Department retirement fund being separated from the General Fund on levy. Discussion ensued.
- The Mayor then requested Aldermen to prepare questions for department heads ahead of time and he will submit them to the department heads so they can answer their questions prior to the next Committee of the Whole meeting. Alderman Lovero suggested that the Mayor and the Finance Director prepare new revenue or item cuts and stated that if the Mayor can present ideas for new revenue streams that maybe the Aldermen wouldn't request staffing cuts and eliminating positions from the budget.
- 10. A motion by Weiner and seconded by Phelan to adjourn the Committee of the Whole at 8:13 p.m. Motion carried.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

The City of Berwyn and the Village of Oak Park secured, in partnership an "Illinois Tomorrow" grant through the Illinois Department of Transportation to create a study of the Roosevelt Road Corridor. The study, known as the Farr Plan, was adopted by the City Council in 2003. In 2006 the Town of Cicero joined with Berwyn and Oak Park to work collaboratively in an effort to improve the Roosevelt Road Corridor, this led to the Intergovernmental Agreement signing in April of 2007. In November 2007, City Council approved an RFP drafted by the Roosevelt Road Advisory Committee. The RFP was for consulting services for the creation of a uniform streetscape design plan and comprehensive zoning regulations throughout the corridor. With the streetscape concept design being completed in 2008, the next step is construction drawings and permitting for the actual streetscape construction improvement.

To this end, the RRAC interviewed three qualified firms to complete this needed work in late 2008. Following a review of submittals by all three municipalities' staff and the RRAC committee, Terra Engineering was chosen as the recommended consultant team. Staff then negotiated a lower price for services to comply with budgeted amounts for the project.

Attached for review is the consultant contract with Terra Engineering. Also, a continuation of the current and previously approved intergovernmental agreement with Oak Park and Cicero will be the mechanism to complete the multijurisdictional work. The IGA holds all municipalities equally liable and states the financial obligations; Oak Park 50%, Berwyn 42%, Cicero 8% (based on linear square feet of the corridor). The contract was reviewed by Odelson & Sterk in representation of the City of Berwyn.

We are recommending the approval of the contract with Terra Engineering in an amount not to exceed \$247,380. The amount and expense was an expected and budgeted cost within the Roosevelt Road TIF fund in 2009. Upon the approval by all three municipalities, work will commence with the consultant team.

In consideration of the mutual promises set forth below, the Village of Oak
Park ("Oak Park"), an Illinois municipal corporation, the City of Berwyn ("Berwyn"), an
Illinois municipal corporation, the Town of Cicero ("Cicero"), an Illinois municipal
corporation, (collectively, Oak Park, Berwyn and Cicero shall be referred to as the
"Owner" for convenience purposes only) and TERRA Engineering, Ltd. (d/b/a
), a corporation ("TERRA"), make this
contract ("Contract") as of the day of 200_ [Oak Park] day of
200 [Cicero and Berwyn], and hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I: THE SERVICES

1.1 Contract Price; Performance of the Services

TERRA shall provide the road design, document preparation, construction management and other construction engineering services (the "Services"), which are more specifically set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, in connection with the Owner's redevelopment and revitalization of Roosevelt Road (the "Project"). The Owner shall pay TERRA five hundred eighty-nine thousand and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$589,000.00) (the "Contract Price") for providing and performing the Services.

TERRA shall provide the Services in three (3) phases, as is specified in Exhibit A. Phase I and Phase II shall be submitted concurrently to the Illinois Department of Transportation ("IDOT") for review. If IDOT accepts the plan submitted regarding Phase I and Phase II without requiring substantive revisions, then TERRA shall provide the Phase III Services for no additional cost. TERRA shall work in good faith and utilize its best efforts to have IDOT accept the Phase I and Phase II plans without substantive revisions.

Should IDOT not accept the Phase I plan and instead require a full Project Development Report including a complete and separate Phase I, then the Owner shall have the option to either terminate this Contract or to proceed with receiving the Phase I Services from TERRA. The Owner also has the option to terminate this Contract in the event IDOT does not accept the Phase II without substantive revisions. Should the Owner terminate this Contract in either event, the Owner agrees to pay TERRA for all reasonable costs expended, as is further set forth in Section 1.9 of this Contract. If the Owner decides, in its sole option, to proceed with obtaining a full Phase I and Phase II to the satisfaction of IDOT, and TERRA provides such Services, the Owner shall pay TERRA the Contract Price and upon completion of the Phase I and Phase II Services, the Owner, at its sole option, may commission TERRA to

provide and perform the Phase III Services for an additional two hundred fifty thousand and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$250,000.00). The Owner shall notify TERRA within fifteen (15) days after the completion of the Phase II Services as to whether it will exercise its right to receive Phase III Services.

The party municipalities shall be responsible for payment to TERRA for the Services in the following percentages and in accordance with "An Intergovernmental Agreement by and between the Village of Oak Park, the City of Berwyn and the Town of Cicero to Contract for Construction Engineering Services in Connection with the Development of Roosevelt Road," incorporated herein by this reference:

Oak Park - 50% Berwyn - 42% Cicero - 8%.

Oak Park shall act as administrator for this Contract, as is provided for the previously incorporated Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village of Oak Park, the City of Berwyn and the Town of Cicero.

TERRA shall provide and perform the Services in a proper and workmanlike manner, consistent with standards of professional practice followed by firms providing similar services and in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract.

1.2 <u>Commencement and Completion Dates</u>

TERRA shall commence the Services not later than March 1, 2009 (the "Commencement Date") and shall diligently and continuously prosecute the Services in accordance with the time of commencement, rate of progress and time of completion set forth in the Preliminary Project Schedule, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B. The period of time specified in the Preliminary Project Schedule, is referred to in this Contract as the "Project Schedule."

1.3 Required Submittals

- A. <u>Submittals Required</u>. TERRA shall submit and coordinate this project directly with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) with copies to the assigned Owner's representative (or Project Manager) all reports, documents, data, and information set forth in Exhibit A or otherwise required to be submitted by TERRA under this Contract (the "Required Submittals").
- B. <u>Time of Submission and Owner's Review</u>. All Required Submittals shall be provided to Owner no later than the time, if any, specified in Exhibit B or otherwise in this Contract. If no time for submission is specified for any Required Submittal, such Submittal shall be submitted within a reasonable time in light of its purpose and within five (5) business days of Owner's reasonable written request given adequate time frame and

notifications to complete the request within the applicable industry standards. Owner shall have the right to require such corrections as may be reasonably necessary to make any Required Submittal conform to this Contract. Owner's review of any Required Submittal shall not relieve TERRA of the entire responsibility for the performance of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to this Contract, and shall not be regarded as any assumption of risk or liability by Owner except to the extent that the Owner has approved or authorized any deviation from the Contract requirements. TERRA shall not be responsible for the delays resulting from the adequate review time provided to the Owner's representative and IDOT and as stated in exhibit B referenced as Project Schedule.

C. Responsibility for Delay. TERRA shall be responsible for any delay in the Services due to a delay in providing Required Submittals conforming to this Contract. TERRA shall not be responsible for delays resulting from circumstances over which the TERRA cannot reasonably be expected to have control. TERRA shall not be responsible for any delays as a result of the review time used by the owner's representative of IDOT. The delays resulting from the owner's review time or the IDOT's review time will have an effect on carrying out the next steps outlined in (exhibit B) the project schedule.

1.4 Review and Incorporation of Contract Provisions

TERRA represents and warrants that it has carefully reviewed, and fully understands and has had an opportunity to discuss with an attorney, this Contract, including all of its Exhibits, all of which are by this reference incorporated into and made a part of this Contract.

1.5 Financial and Technical Ability to Perform

TERRA represents and warrants that it is financially solvent, and has the financial resources necessary, and that it is sufficiently experienced and competent, and has the necessary capital, facilities, plant, organization, and staff necessary, to provide, perform, and complete the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract.

1.6 Time

TERRA represents and warrants that it is ready, willing, able, and prepared to begin the Services on the Commencement Date and that the Project Schedule is sufficient time to permit completion of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract.

1.7 TERRA's Personnel and Subcontractors

A. <u>TERRA's Personnel</u>. TERRA shall provide all personnel necessary to complete the Services. TERRA shall provide to Owner telephone numbers and e-mail addresses at which the key project personnel can be reached during business hours. Prior to terminating the employment of any key project personnel, or reassigning any of the key project personnel to other positions, or upon receiving notification of the resignation of any of the key project personnel, TERRA shall notify Owner as soon as practicable in advance of such proposed termination or reassignment. TERRA shall submit justification, including a description of proposed substitute personnel, in sufficient detail to permit evaluation by Owner of the impact of the proposed action on the Services. No such termination or reassignment shall be made by TERRA without prior written approval of Owner. TERRA shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price, or for a delay or extension of the Project Schedule as a result of any such termination, reassignment, resignation, or substitution.

- B. Approval and Use of Subcontractors. TERRA shall perform the Services with its own personnel and under the management, supervision, and control of its own organization unless otherwise approved by Owner in writing. All subcontractors and subcontracts used by TERRA shall be acceptable to, and approved in advance by. Owner in writing. Owner's approval of any subcontractor or subcontract shall not relieve TERRA of full responsibility and liability for the provision, performance, and completion of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract, All Services performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all of the provisions of this Contract in the same manner as if performed by employees of TERRA. Every reference in this Contract to "TERRA" shall be deemed also to refer to all subcontractors Every subcontract shall include a provision binding the of TERRA. subcontractor to all provisions of this Contract.
- C. Removal of Personnel and Subcontractors. If any personnel or subcontractor fails to perform the part of the Services undertaken by it in a manner satisfactory to Owner, TERRA shall immediately upon notice from Owner remove and replace such personnel or subcontractor. TERRA shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price, or for a delay or extension of the Project Schedule as a result of any such removal or replacement.

1.8 Owner's Responsibilities

Owner shall, at its shared cost and expense and except as otherwise provided: (a) designate in writing a person with authority to act as Owner's representative and on Owner's behalf with respect to the Services except those matters that may require the approval of the Owner's President(s) and Board(s) of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities"); (b) provide to TERRA all criteria and full information as to Owner's requirements for the Project and Services or work related thereto, including Owner's objectives and constraints, schedule, space, capacity and performance requirements, and budgetary limitations relevant to the Project; (c) provide to TERRA all existing studies, reports, and other available data relevant to the Project; (d) arrange for access to and make all provisions for TERRA to enter upon public and private

property as reasonably required for TERRA to perform the Services; (e) provide surveys describing physical characteristics, legal limitations for the Project and the services of geotechnical engineers or other consultants when such services are reasonably requested by TERRA, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Exhibits; (f) review and comment on all Required Submittals and other reports, documents, data, and information presented by TERRA; except as otherwise provided in Exhibit A; (g) provide approvals from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project when such Services are reasonably requested by TERRA, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Exhibits; (h) except as provided in Article IV of this Contract provide, all accounting, insurance, and legal counseling services as may be necessary from time to time in the judgment of Owner to protect Owner's interests with respect to the Project; (i) attend Project related meetings; and (j) give prompt verbal or written notice to TERRA whenever Owner observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of the Services provided, however, the failure to give such notice shall not relieve TERRA of any of its responsibilities under this Contract.

1.9 Owner's Right to Terminate or Suspend Services for Convenience

- A. <u>Termination or Suspension for Convenience</u>. Owner shall have the right, for its convenience, to terminate or suspend the Services in whole or in part at any time by providing written notice to TERRA. Every such notice shall state the extent and effective date of such termination or suspension. On such effective date, TERRA shall, as and to the extent directed, stop Services under this Contract, cease all placement of further orders or subcontracts, terminate or suspend Services under existing orders and subcontracts, and cancel any outstanding orders or subcontracts that may be canceled.
- B. Payment for Completed Services. In the event of any termination pursuant to Section 1.9A above, Owner shall pay TERRA (1) such direct costs, including profit and overhead, as TERRA shall have paid or incurred for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract up to the effective date of termination and (2) such other costs pertaining to the Services as TERRA may have reasonably and necessarily incurred as the result of such termination. Any such payment shall be offset by any prior payment or payments and shall be subject to Owner's rights to withhold and deduct as provided in this Contract.

ARTICLE II: CHANGES AND DELAYS

2.1 Changes

Owner shall have the right, by written order executed by Owner, to make changes in the Contract, the Project, the Services, and the Project Schedule within the general scope of this contract ("Change Order"). If any Change Order causes an increase or decrease in the amount of the Services, an

equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Project Schedule or both may be made if the schedule is not constrained to the extent that the TERRA cannot perform the services and provide an acceptable standard of care. TERRA shall submit written notice of a request for the issuance of a Change Order to each Owner's President, Board of Trustees and Project Manager/Planner. A Change Order shall only be issued in conformity with the provisions of Section 33E-9 of Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/33E-1 et seq.).

2.2 Delays

For any delay that may result from causes that could not be reasonably avoided or controlled by TERRA, TERRA shall, upon timely written application, be entitled to issuance of a Change Order providing for an extension of the Project Schedule for a period of time equal to the delay resulting from such unavoidable cause. No extension of the Project Schedule shall be allowed for any other delay in completion of the Services.

2.3 No Constructive Change Orders

No claims for equitable adjustments in the Contract Price or Project Schedule shall be made or allowed unless embodied in a Change Order. If Owner fails to issue a Change Order including, or fully including, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Project Schedule to which TERRA claims it is entitled, or, if TERRA believes that any requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision of Owner entitles TERRA to an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Project Schedule that has not been included, or fully included, in a Change Order, then TERRA shall submit to Owner a written request for the issuance of, or revision of, a Change Order. including the equitable adjustment, or the additional equitable adjustment, in the Contract Price or Project Schedule that TERRA claims has not been included, or fully included, in a Change Order. Such request shall be submitted no later than five (5) business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision. Unless TERRA submits such a request within five (5) business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision, TERRA shall be conclusively deemed to have waived all claims based on such Change Order, requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision.

ARTICLE III: TERRA'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR SERVICES

3.1 Responsibility for Services

TERRA shall exercise reasonable care in efforts to ensure that the Services and all of its components shall be free from defects and flaws in design; shall strictly conform to the requirements of this Contract; shall be fit, sufficient,

and suitable for the purposes expressed in, or reasonably inferred from, this Contract.

3.2 Corrections

TERRA shall be responsible for the quality, technical accuracy, completeness, and coordination of all reports, documents, data, information, and other items and services under this Contract. TERRA shall, promptly and without charge, provide, to the reasonable satisfaction of Owner and complying with all applicable industry standards, all corrective Services necessary as a result of TERRA's errors, omissions, and negligent acts.

3.3 Risk of Loss

Except as provided otherwise in this Contract, the Services and everything pertaining thereto shall be provided, performed, and completed at the sole risk and cost of the TERRA. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract, TERRA's obligations under this Section 3.3 shall exist without regard to, and shall not be construed to be waived by, the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of Owner or TERRA, to indemnify, hold harmless, or reimburse TERRA for such damages, losses, or costs.

ARTICLE IV: FINANCIAL ASSURANCES

4.1 Insurance

Contemporaneous with TERRA's execution of this Contract, TERRA shall provide certificates and policies of insurance naming the Owner as an additional insured and evidencing at least the minimum insurance coverage and limits, as follows: General Liability Insurance, including Automobile Liability Insurance, with coverage limits of three million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate and one million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence for personal injury and coverage limits of one million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$1,000,000,00) in the aggregate and three hundred thousand and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$300,000.00) per occurrence for property damage; worker's Compensation Insurance coverage in accordance with statutory limits and Professional Liability Insurance with minimum coverage limits of one million and no/100 U.S. dollars (\$1,000,000.00). For good cause shown, Owner may extend the time for submission of the required policies of insurance upon such terms. and with such assurances of complete and prompt performance, as Owner may impose in the exercise of its sole discretion. Such policies shall be in a form reasonably acceptable to Owner and from companies with a general rating of A and a financial size category of Class VII or better, in Best's Insurance Guide. Such insurance shall provide that no change, modification in, or cancellation of any insurance shall become effective until the expiration of thirty (30) days after written notice thereof shall have been given by the insurance company to Owner. TERRA shall, at all times while providing. performing, or completing the Services, including, without limitation, at all times while correcting any failure to comply with Section 3.2 of this Contract, maintain and keep in force, at TERRA's expense, at least the minimum insurance coverage and limits. TERRA expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection furnished by TERRA hereunder shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify and save harmless the Owner pursuant to the terms of this Agreement nor be used to offset TERRA's indemnification obligations. TERRA shall require all subcontractors and independent contractors to procure and maintain insurance as required herein and submit documentation of the maintenance of such insurance from time to time as may be reasonably required by the Owner.

4.2 Indemnification

TERRA agrees to indemnify, save harmless and defend the Owner, their officials, agents, servants and employees, and each of them against and hold it and them harmless from any and all claims, actions, causes of action, demands, rights, damages, costs, loss of service expenses, compensation, court costs and attorneys' fees which now has/have or which may hereafter accrue, directly or indirectly, for or on account of any and all known and unknown, foreseen and unforeseen, bodily and personal injuries to any person, or any death at any time resulting from such injury, or any damage to any property and the consequences thereof, which may arise or which may be alleged to have arisen out of or in connection with Services covered by this Contract.

To the extent permissible by law, TERRA waives any limits to the amount of its obligations to indemnify, defend or contribute to any sums due under any claims, actions, causes of action, demands, rights, damages, costs, loss of service expenses, compensation, court costs and attorneys' fees, including any claim by any employee of TERRA that may be subject to the Workers Compensation Act, 820 ILCS 305/1 et seq. or any other related law or judicial decision (such as Kotecki v. Cyclops Welding Corporation, 146 III.2d 155 (1991)).

The proportion of any liability of Owner shall not exceed each Owner's proportion of payment, which is set forth as a percentage in Section 1.1 of this Contract. TERRA acknowledges that the requirements set forth in this section to indemnify, keep and hold harmless and defend the Owner are separate and apart from and not limited by TERRA's duties under this Agreement, including the insurance requirements. The indemnities in this Article shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement for matters occurring or arising prior to such termination or expiration.

ARTICLE V: PAYMENT

5.1 Contract Price

Owner shall pay to TERRA, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Article V, and TERRA shall accept in full satisfaction for providing, performing, and completing the Services the Contract Price

subject to any additions, deductions, or withholdings provided for in this Contract.

5.2 <u>Taxes, Benefits, and Royalties</u>

The Contract Price includes all applicable federal, state, and local taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Services as well as all taxes, contributions, and premiums for unemployment insurance, old age or retirement benefits, pensions, annuities, or other similar benefits and all costs, royalties, and fees arising from the use on, or the incorporation into, the Services, of patented equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes, or inventions. All claim or right to claim additional compensation by reason of the payment of any such tax, contribution, premium, costs, royalties, or fees is hereby waived and released by TERRA.

5.3 Progress Payments

- A. <u>Payment in Installments</u>. The Contract Price shall be paid in installments not more frequently than once each month ("Progress Payments"). Payments will be made within thirty (30) days of receipt of TERRA's pay request in the amount of ninety (90%) of the amount approved, with the ten (10%) being held as a reserve and payable upon the completion of the Services or early termination via delivery.
- B. Pay Requests. TERRA shall, as a condition precedent to its right to receive each Progress Payment, submit to Owner an invoice accompanied by such receipts, vouchers, and other documents as may be necessary to establish costs incurred for all labor, material, and other things covered by the invoice and the absence of any interest. whether in the nature of a lien or otherwise, of any party in any property, work, or fund with respect to the Services performed under this Contract. In addition to the foregoing, such invoice shall include (a) employee classifications, rates per hour, and hours worked by each classification, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (b) total amount billed in the current period and total amount billed to date, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (c) the estimated percent completion, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase. TERRA shall submit pay requests by the 10th day of the month or submit a pre-arranged payment schedule for invoicing in conjunction with Scope of Services and the Project Schedule. TERRA shall provide, upon written request from Owner, certified lien waivers of work performed, as applicable.

5.4 Final Acceptance and Final Payment

The Services shall be considered complete on the date of final written acceptance of the Services by Owner, which acceptance shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. As soon as practicable after final acceptance, Owner shall pay to TERRA the balance of the Contract Price

including the reserve amount, after deducting therefrom all charges against TERRA as provided for in this Contract ("Final Payment"). The acceptance by TERRA of Final Payment with respect to the Services shall operate as a full and complete release of Owner of and from any and all lawsuits, claims, demands, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses of, by, or to TERRA for anything done, furnished for, arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Services, except for such claims as TERRA reserved in writing at the time of submitting its invoice for Final Payment.

TERRA understands that the Owner will rely on the professional performance and ability of TERRA. Any examination by the Owner, or any acceptance or use of the work product of TERRA, will not be considered to be a full and comprehensive examination and will not be considered an approval of the work product of TERRA that would relieve TERRA from any liability or expense that would be connected with TERRA's sole responsibility for the propriety and integrity of the professional work to be accomplished by TERRA pursuant to this Agreement. That further acceptance or approval of any of the plans or work of TERRA by the Owner or of payment, partial or final, will not constitute a waiver of any rights of the Owner to recover from TERRA damages that are caused by TERRA due to error, omission or negligence of TERRA in its work. TERRA's legal liability for all damages incurred by Owner caused by error, omission or negligent acts of TERRA will be borne by TERRA without liability or expense to Owner.

5.5 Deductions

Owner's Right to Withhold. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Α. Contract and without prejudice to any of Owner's rights or remedies, Owner shall have the right at any time or times to withhold from any payment such amount as may reasonably appear necessary to compensate Owner for any actual or prospective loss due to: (1) Services that are provided by TERRA that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete; (2) damage for which TERRA is liable under this Contract; (3) claims of subcontractors, suppliers, or other persons performing engineering services that are under contract with TERRA; (4) delay in the progress or completion of the Services resulting from TERRA's inability to perfom the necessary services; (5) inability of TERRA to complete the Services; (6) failure of TERRA to properly complete or document any pay request; (7) any other failure of TERRA to perform any of its obligations under this Contract; or (8) the cost to Owner, including attorneys' fees and administrative costs, of correcting any of the aforesaid matters or exercising any one or more of Owner's remedies set forth in Section 6.1 of this Contract. Owner must notify TERRA of cause for withholding within fourteen (14) days of receiving invoice. The owner shall not withhold any payment as a result of delays from any unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of TERRA's which might include acts of nature, vandalism, fire, theft or others circumstances.

B. <u>Use of Withheld Funds</u>. Owner shall be entitled to retain any and all amounts withheld pursuant to Section 5.5A of this Contract until TERRA shall have either performed the obligations in question or furnished security for such performance satisfactory to Owner and as required by this contract for providing the necessary services. Owner shall be entitled to apply any money withheld or any other money due to TERRA under this Contract to reimburse itself for any and all costs, expenses, losses, damages, liabilities, suits, judgments, awards, attorneys' fees, and administrative expenses incurred, suffered, or sustained by Owner and chargeable to TERRA under this Contract.

5.6 Accounting

TERRA shall keep accounts, books, and other records of all its billable charges and costs incurred in performing the Services in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices, consistently applied, and in such manner as to permit verification of all entries. TERRA shall make all such material available for inspection by Owner, at all reasonable times during this Contract and for a period of three years following termination of this Contract. Copies of such material shall be furnished, at Owner's expense, upon request.

ARTICLE VI: REMEDIES

6.1 Owner's Remedies

If it should appear at any time prior to Final Payment that TERRA has failed or refused to prosecute, or has delayed in the prosecution of, the Services with diligence at a rate that assures completion of the Services in full compliance with the requirements of this Contract, or has attempted to assign this Contract or TERRA's rights under this Contract, either in whole or in part, or has falsely made any representation or warranty in this Contract, or has otherwise failed, refused, or delayed to perform or satisfy any other requirement of this Contract or has failed to pay its debts as they come due ("Event of Default"), and has failed to cure, or has not reasonably commenced to cure any such Event of Default within fifteen (15) business days after TERRA's receipt of written notice of such Event of Default, then Owner shall have the right, at its election and without prejudice to any other remedies provided by law or equity, to pursue any one or more of the following remedies:

- Owner may require TERRA, within such reasonable time as may be fixed by Owner, to complete or correct all or any part of the engineering Services that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete and to take any or all other action necessary to bring TERRA and the engineering Services into compliance with this Contract.
- 2. Owner may accept the defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, incomplete, or dilatory engineering Services or part thereof and make an equitable reduction in the Contract Price.

- 3. Owner may terminate this Contract without liability for further payment of amounts due or to become due under this Contract except for amounts due for services properly performed prior to termination.
- 4. Owner may withhold from any Progress Payment or Final Payment, whether or not previously approved, or may recover from TERRA, any and all costs but not exceeding amount of consultant fee, including attorneys' fees and administrative expenses, incurred by Owner as the result of any Event of Default or as a result of actions taken by Owner in response to any Event of Default.
- 5. Owner may recover any damages suffered by Owner but not exceeding amount of consultant engineering fee.

ARTICLE VII: LEGAL RELATIONSHIPS AND REQUIREMENTS

7.1 Binding Effect

This Contract shall be binding on Owner and TERRA and on their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns. Every reference in this Contract to a party shall also be deemed to be a reference to the authorized officers, employees, agents, and representatives of such party.

7.2 Relationship of the Parties

TERRA shall act as an independent contractor in providing and performing the Services. Nothing in, nor done pursuant to, this Contract shall be construed (1) to create the relationship of principal and agent, partners, or joint ventures between Owner and TERRA or (2) to create any relationship between Owner and any subcontractor of TERRA.

7.3 No Collusion

TERRA hereby represents and certifies that TERRA is not barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of (1) a delinquency in the payment of any tax administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue unless TERRA is contesting, in accordance with the procedures established by the appropriate revenue Act, its liability for the tax or the amount of the tax, as set forth in 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1; or (2) a violation of either Section 33E-3 or Section 33E-4 of Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/33E-1 et seq.) TERRA hereby represents that the only persons, firms, or corporations interested in this Contract are those disclosed to Owner prior to the execution of this Contract, and that this Contract is made without collusion with any other person, firm, or corporation. If at any time it shall be found that TERRA has, in procuring this Contract, colluded with any other person, firm, or corporation, then TERRA shall be liable to Owner for all loss or damage that Owner may suffer thereby, and this Contract shall, at Owner's option, be null and void.

7.4 Assignment

Except for the performance of TERRA's services by TERRA's subcontractors as approved by Owner, neither Owner nor TERRA shall (1) assign this Contract in whole or in part or (2) assign any of their respective rights or obligations under this Contract. TERRA shall not assign any payment due or to become due under this Contract without the express written approval of the Owner, which approval shall not unreasonably be withheld; provided, however, that Owner's prior written approval shall not be required for assignment of accounts, as defined in the Illinois Commercial Code, if to do so would violate Section 9-318 of the Illinois Commercial Code, 810 ILCS 5/9-318.

7.5 Confidential Information

All information supplied by Owner to TERRA for or in connection with this Contract or the Services shall be held confidential by TERRA and shall not, without the prior express written consent of Owner, be disclosed for any purpose other than performance of the Services or as otherwise allowed in this Contract.

7.6 No Waiver

No examination, inspection, investigation, test, measurement, review, determination, decision, certificate, or approval by Owner, nor any order by Owner for the payment of money, nor any payment for, or use, possession, or acceptance of, the whole or any part of the Services by Owner, nor any extension of time granted by Owner, nor any delay by Owner in exercising any right under this Contract, nor any other act or omission of Owner shall constitute or be deemed to be an acceptance of any defective, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete Services, nor operate to waive or otherwise diminish the effect of any representation made by TERRA; or of any requirement or provision of this Contract; or of any remedy, power, or right of Owner. Any failure or delay by Owner or TERRA to assert its rights under the Contract or applicable law against the other party in any given instance or number of instances shall not result in a waiver of the right to timely assert such rights under the Contract or applicable law in any other instance.

7.7 No Third Party Beneficiaries

No claim as a third party beneficiary under this Contract by any person, firm, or corporation other than TERRA shall be made or be valid against Owner.

7.8 Notices

All notices required or permitted to be given under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed received by the addressee thereof when delivered in person, or delivered by commercial courier or messenger service

or sent via fax on a business day at the address or fax number set forth below or on the third business day after being deposited in any main or branch United States post office, for delivery at the address set forth below by properly addressed, postage prepaid, certified or registered mail, return receipt requested.

By notice complying with the requirements of this Section 7.8, Owner and TERRA each shall have the right to change the address or addressee or both for all future notices to it, but no notice of a change of address or addressee shall be effective until actually received.

7.9 Governing Laws

This Contract and the rights of Owner and TERRA under this Contract shall be interpreted according to the internal laws, but not the conflict of laws rules, of the State of Illinois. This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois in all respects as to interpretation and performance. Any and all legal proceedings of any kind arising in connection with this Contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois. TERRA expressly agrees to submit to the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois for all purposes and intents. TERRA agrees that service of process on it may be made, at the option of the Owner, by certified mail addressed to any party or office as provided in the section marked as Notices of this Contract, or by personal

delivery on any officer, director or legal representative of the TERRA as provided in the section marked as Notices of this Contract.

7.10 Changes in Laws

Unless otherwise explicitly provided in this Contract, any reference to laws shall include such laws as they may be amended or modified from time to time; provided that TERRA shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment in the Contract sum and time for any changes in services required by such amendment or modification.

7.11 Compliance with Laws and Grants

TERRA shall give all notices, pay all fees, and take all other action that may be necessary to ensure that the Services are provided, performed, and completed in accordance with all required governmental permits, licenses, and other approvals and authorizations that may be required in connection with providing, performing, and completing the Services, and with all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including without limitation the Fair Labor Standards Act; any statutes regarding qualification to do business; any statutes prohibiting discrimination because of, or requiring affirmative action based on, race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, or other prohibited classification, including, without limitation, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq., and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq. TERRA shall also comply with all conditions of any federal, state, or local grant received by Owner or TERRA with respect to this Contract or the Services.

TERRA shall be solely liable for any fines or civil penalties that are imposed by any governmental or quasi-governmental agency or body that may arise, or be alleged to have arisen, out of or in connection with TERRA's, or its subcontractors', performance of, or failure to perform, the Services or any part thereof.

7.12 Documents

Drawings, plans, specifications, photos, reports, information, observations, calculations, notes and any other reports, documents, date or information, in any form, prepared, collected, or received by TERRA in connection with any or all of the Services ("Documents") shall be and remain the property of Owner upon completion of the project and payment to TERRA all amounts then due. At Owner's request, or upon termination of this Contract, the Documents shall be delivered promptly to Owner. TERRA shall have the right to retain copies of the Documents for its files. TERRA shall maintain files of all Documents unless Owner shall consent in writing to the destruction of the Documents, as required by this paragraph. TERRA shall make, and shall cause all of its subcontractors to make, the Documents available for Owner's review, inspection and audit during the entire term of this Contract. TERRA shall give notice to Owner of any Documents to be disposed of or destroyed and the intended date, which shall be at least ninety (90) days after the effective date

of such notice of disposal or destruction. Owner shall have ninety (90) days after receipt of any such notice to given notice to TERRA or any of its subcontractors not to dispose of or destroy said Documents and to require TERRA or any of its subcontractors to deliver same to Owner, at Owner's expense.

- 7.13 TERRA shall have the right to include among TERRA's promotional and professional materials those drawings, renderings, other design documents and other work products that are prepared by TERRA or its subconsultants under this Contract (collectively "Work Products"); provided that such Work Products which TERRA will have the right to use pursuant to this Paragraph 7.13 shall not include Owner's or third parties' confidential or proprietary information if Owner has previously advised TERRA in writing of the specific information considered by Owner or such third parties to be confidential or proprietary. Owner shall provide professional credit for TERRA in Owner's development, promotional and other materials which include TERRA's Work Products.
- 7.14 Owner acknowledges and agrees that the Work Products which TERRA or its subconsultants will be preparing and delivering to Owner under this Contract will be conceptual or schematic in nature and therefore for illustrative purposes only and not for use for construction. Owner also acknowledges and agrees that the Work Products will not be intended for use as the basis for preparing more detailed and refined drawings and other design documents, including but not limited to construction drawings, specifications and other construction documents, without independent review and verification as to the appropriateness, constructability, construction cost and safety of the design by one or more other design professionals who are licensed or registered and otherwise authorized to practice design professional services in the jurisdiction where the Project is to be located.

7.15 <u>Time</u>

Except where otherwise stated, references in this Contract to days shall be construed to refer to calendar days.

7.16 Severability

The provisions of this Contract shall be interpreted when possible to sustain their legality and enforceability as a whole. In the event any provision of this Contract shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, in whole or in part, neither the validity of the remaining part of such provision, nor the validity of any other provisions of this Contract shall be in any way affected thereby.

7.17 Entire Agreement

Other than the Intergovernmental Agreement dated March 29, 2007 between the Village of Oak Park, Town of Cicero, and City of Berwyn, this Contract, including exhibits, sets forth the entire agreement of Owner and TERRA with respect to the accomplishment of the Services and the payment of the Contract Price therefore, and there are no other understandings or agreements, oral or written, between Owner and TERRA with respect to the Services and the compensation therefore.

7.18 Amendments

No modification, addition, deletion, revision, alteration, or other change to this Contract shall be effective unless and until such change is reduced to writing and executed and delivered by Owner and TERRA.

7.19 Non-Liability of Public Officials

TERRA shall not charge any official, employee or agent of Owner personally with any liability or expenses of defense or hold any official, employee or agent of such other party personally liable to them under any term or provision of this Agreement or because of the Owner's execution, attempted execution or any breach of this Agreement. The limitation on liability survives expiration or termination of this Agreement for matters occurring or arising during the Term or as a result of or during TERRA's performance of services beyond the Term.

- Prepare Maintenance of Traffic Analysis.
- Preliminary cost estimate.



7. Landscape/Streetscape Design

- Solicit further feedback on specific landscape items.
- Gather and present options for each of the streetscape features.
- Prepare composite of streetscape finishes.
- · Prepare landscaping exhibits to be used for presentations

8. Traffic Signals/IDS

- Review existing traffic signal timing and identify any upgrades.
- Revise traffic signal timing and cross walk configurations.
- Investigate opportunities for traffic signal coordination.

- Prepare Intersection Design Studies (IDS) as necessary and submit to IDOT.

9 Lighting

- Review existing lighting conditions.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

The BDC is seeking consideration of the 2009 Integrated City Marketing Program. The program is funded by the TIF districts and a budgeted cost within the respective TIF budgets. Attached is the integrated marketing campaign program budget and supporting real estate portfolio for the proposed 2009 program.

The approach in 2009 is a reduced program budget (27% reduction) by focusing on quality rather than quantity. Same as the previous program years, the BDC will oversee and handle the logistical coordination of all activities relating to this program and would operate with a budget cap set at a maximum amount (\$100,000). Also same as previous programs, all requests for payments would be forwarded to the appropriate City staff with a detailed cover memo for payment.

The BDC evaluated four real estate portfolios and pricing over the last several months to determine best locations and pricing for one component of the program (outdoor advertising). After careful consideration, Clear Channel provides the best package for both their quality locations and value of their proposal. The site locations for the billboard advertising component of the program is captured in the attached list and portfolio.

Our recommendation at this time is to approve the 2009 Integrated City Marketing Campaign with a budget of \$100,000. This approval will allow the City to lock in the prime real estate locations and begin the design services with Tommaso Lesnick Design. After the design and market testing of the work product is complete, the BDC will present the 2009 concept to the City Council.







WHEREAS, the APPLICANT has been duly informed that: (a) if the BOARD fully or partially approves the request of the APPLICANT and the CITY COUNCIL concurs in such decision; or (b) if the CITY COUNCIL fully or partially approves the request even though the BOARD has rejected the request of the APPLICANT or if the BOARD has made no recommendation to the CITY COUNCIL; the APPLICANT must obtain a building permit within SIX (6) MONTHS after the date that the ORDINANCE is enacted;

The BOARD has reached its decision after considering the testimony of the witnesses and the documents presented both prior to and during the Hearing, briefly set forth as follows:

- 1. Mr. Jose Arreola testified that he purchased a residence which included a vacant adjacent lot in May of 2005. The building and the lot were registered under one Pin number and he then had the lot divided and the vacant lot was given its own pin number, address of 3742 S. Gunderson Avenue, and final dimensions of the lot are 30.50' X 139.36'
- 2. The applicant, who is a real estate agent and contractor, then built a single family residence on the lot measuring 24.15' X 55.10'. The residence has a full finished basement with a bathroom. The first floor has a living & dining room, 2 bedrooms, bathroom and kitchen, and the second floor level has two more bedrooms, one being a master bedroom; a library room, and two bathrooms. The attic area is only about 3 feet high and not usable.
- 3. Cost to construct was around \$300,000.00 and the lot value is about \$40,000.00. The residence has been for sale on the open market for over a year and no one has made any offers. However, he does have interested buyers if he can convert the building and sell as a two flat.
- 4. The conversion will include a stairwell both at the front and side of the building with access to the first & second floors and basement, and a kitchen replacing the library room on the second floor, He intends to use the present furnace and air conditioner for both apartments, and only one meter for electricity.
- 5. He built a similar home in Cicero and sold it as a single family residence last October.
- 6. The area investigator, Nora Laureto, presented a written report which is incorporated by reference in this resolution and she met with Mr. Arreola on January 18th, 2009. This property is located in an A-1, Single Family District and he and his wife, Irma, purchased the house to the north of this location and the lot on which this residence was built was a side yard to the house they purchased. They eventually had the property divided with separate pin numbers and sold the house. The house now rents for \$1,600.00 a month, but the taxes are close to \$10,000.00 and he wants to sell the property. The front entrance allows access to the basement and first floor and the second floor can be accessed from the rear entrance. A hallway leads to an alcove and into what is now the master bedroom. He intends make the alcove on

the second floor a kitchen area. The two car garage at the rear of the building seems to be in good condition and the applicant stated that he owns the alley behind it which allows parking for two other cars. There are two other two flats on the block at 3704 and 3746 Gunderson and all other homes on the block are a mix of single family homes, stucco and frame. She distributed notices of the meeting to all the homes on the 3700 block of Gunderson and also spoke with a resident who was actually surprised that this is a single family residence. He stated that parking is not usually a problem on the weekends, but gets worse during the week because they are close to the park and school. Mrs. Laureto voted against granting the requested variation to convert the building into a two flat.

7. Messrs: Fejt, Miller, Persin and Mrs. Hernandez all agreed with the area investigator and voted against granting a variation to allow conversion of the property into a two flat. Comments of those against were that the applicant was well aware of the zoning when he built the residence, and as a real estate agent and contractor this venture was subject to the same business risks that confront many other contractors, and only economic hardship usually is not enough reason to grant a change to a two flat. Mr. Chrastka stated that since there are other two flats in the area, he is voting in favor. The final vote was 5 to 1, against granting a variation to allow the conversion of the building to a two flat status.

This resolution was adopted on the 20th day of January, 2009.

The BOARD has reached its decision after considering the testimony of the witnesses and the documents presented both prior to and during the Hearing, briefly set forth as follows:

- 1. Mr. Christopher Magana testified that he owns the property with his wife, Sonia, and that they purchased the one story brick residence in July of 2000. They had one child, a daughter that was 3 years old at that time. They now have another daughter and son, for a total of three children.
- 2. The building consists of an unfinished basement and a front room, dining room, kitchen, bathroom and two bedrooms on the first floor, with a 9 foot ceiling. There are stairs in the kitchen area leading to the upstairs attic and basement. There also is another entrance to the basement at the rear of the building. The attic is one open space, is not heated, and is presently used for storage. The building has forced central gas heat with the present furnace in the basement, but they will add a furnace for the second floor addition to be located in the rafters of the building with a pull down ladder and the air conditioning equipment will be mounted separately on the outside. There is a little dormer on the roof of the building about 7 feet from the bearing wall. Height to the gutters is about 13 feet and about 21 feet to the peak of the roof.
- 4. The applicant proposes to construct new frame dormer with insulated siding up to the south bearing wall to allow an additional room in the attic with ceiling height of 8 feet. The new room will have 3 bedrooms and two washrooms. Plans include the elimination of one bedroom on the first floor and the new stairs will be located in that area leading to both the second floor and basement. The measurements of the three bedrooms will be approximately 11-7" X12'-3", 10'-10" x 14', and a master bedroom measuring about 12'-5-1/2" X 17'-6". The smaller bath room measuring about 5' X 6', with only a toilet and sink, will be located in the master bedroom. Plans include a deck at the rear of the second floor, with sliding doors, which will not extend beyond the rear wall line, measuring about 7' X 15'.
- 5. The side yard to the west is about 7.5' and 5' to the east. The distance between this building and the adjacent buildings is about 19 feet to the west and 15 feet to the east and new gutters will be installed. There is a frame garage measuring 20.4' X 20.5' at the rear of the lot. Their two daughters will occupy one bedroom on the second floor, their son one bedroom, and he and his wife will occupy the master bedroom. His older daughter will move down to the first floor bedroom in a few years.

- 6. He will hire a contractor to tear down the existing dormer and build a dormer shell at an estimated cost of \$18,500.00. Mr. Magana is a painter by occupation and has construction experience so he will finish the dormer and other work, including electrical, with the help of his contractor friends, and they will comply with all City building codes. He estimates that it will take about 2 months to complete the entire project.
- 7. The area investigator, Mrs. Mary Esther Hernandez, presented a written report which is incorporated by reference in this resolution. She stated that the building now has 2 bedrooms and one full bathroom and an unfinished basement. The reason for the additional room is that they need to accommodate their growing family. Plans are for a room addition in the attic with 3 bedrooms and a full bath with a separate heating system near the roof, and pull down staircase for access. The front bedroom will be removed on the first floor and a new staircase will be located in that area. The other bedroom on the first floor will be used as a guest/computer room and the front of the new dormer will go to the original roof line. There will be different dimensions in the roof structure to give it character. Notices of the meeting were distributed on the 6400 and 6500 blocks of 33rd Street. Mrs. Hernandez voted in favor of granting the variation requested.
- 8. Messrs: Fejt, Miller, Chrastka & Persin, and Mrs. Laureto all agreed with the area investigator and voted in favor of granting the variation requested. Comments were that the extension of the dormer to the bearing wall was necessary to allow the three bedrooms in the attic area to accommodate the growing family of the applicant and there is sufficient space between the buildings on each side. The final vote was 6 to 0 in favor of granting the variation to extend the dormer to the bearing wall and complete the additional room in the attic generally in accordance with the testimony at the hearing, the documents presented, and this resolution.

To the Honorable Mayor O'Connor and members of the City Council,

Thank you for reviewing our request for zoning relief to allow the Children's School to place modular classrooms on the campus of St. Mary of Celle (SMC), where we currently rent facilities to operate a K-5th grade elementary school.

Interest in our program is growing. However we have significant space constraints in the existing facility. While SMC's property is large and features four large buildings, all of the usable spaces are already fully inhabited by the Rectory, Convent, Catholic Charities St. Mary of Celle Family Center, and the building we rent which wraps around the Church. Of the 9 rooms in our facility, we have access to 8–7 rooms that serve as classrooms and a lunch room, and an office. The remaining room is still used by the Church for their Religious Education program.

In June, 2008, our Board of Directors approved expanding our educational offerings over the next three years to incorporate a full K-8th grade offering. For safety and curricular reasons we also wish to keep our student body on a single campus. Working together with the leadership of St. Mary of Celle, we propose to meet our space constraints by adding at least one, and no more than three, modular classrooms on the existing campus. We understand from Mr. White, principal of St. Leonard's school at 3322 S Clarence, that these facilities offer excellent, secure, and flexible teaching spaces. (For about eight years now St Leonard's has been using a rather typical modular classroom with an overhead electrical line and external electric heater.)

The Children's School was established in the fall of 2004 with a kindergarten and first grade class. Our intent was to bring progressive education ideals to the western suburbs through project-based learning—a unique educational approach not available anywhere else near Berwyn. The progressive education model is familiar, though, in the Chicago area where schools such as The University of Chicago Laboratory School, Francis Parker, and Baker Demonstration School (operated by National Louis University) thrive. Currently, The Children's School is the only primary school in all the western suburbs following the philosophy of progressive education.

Progressive education uses project-based lessons, discourse, and ageappropriate curriculum to allow a child's curiosity, cooperation, and love of learning to thrive. The school addresses all local, state, and national learning goals. Faculty hold certificates and/or degrees in education and have classroom teaching experience. The curriculum is complemented with study in Spanish language, choral and recorder music instruction, and physical education. We have 75 students, 7 full time staff, 2 part-time staff, and contract with 4 specialty teachers. We also offer a before-school care program, and an after-school arts program. We are tuition-based, and offer need-based tuition assistance.

In 2008 we hosted the 4th annual conference of the Progressive Education Network, a network of professional educators trained in and advancing progressive education elementary schools throughout the country. With our featured speaker Alfie Kohn, an internationally renowned leader of the Progressive Education field, we were able to attract attendance literally from across the nation. The conference drew positive attention for The Children's School and for Berwyn, because progressive educators throughout the United States are now aware of the range of exciting educational opportunities in Berwyn, IL.

In the current year, kindergarteners have explored written communication by creating a school-wide mail system where letters are delivered daily by the students to children throughout the school. In the 4th grade, children studied important inventions through the ages and recreated a de Vinci glider. Through a grant from the Toshiba America Foundation (see http://www.toshiba.com/ tafpub/jsp/recentgrants/K6.jsp), the 4th grade is now studying machines and creating their own inventions with Lego building sets and motors. The children do more than learn in the classrooms--for the past 2 years, The Children's School has proudly supported the PADS program at St Mary of Celle. On a monthly basis, The Children's School community contributes to make and pack lunches for the homeless that seek shelter at St Mary of Celle when they are a PADS site.

Our goal is to provide a school that is accessible to all families in the community while nurturing each child's innate love of learning. To maintain accessibility to our school we have worked hard not only to keep tuition low (less than \$7000 for the 2009-2010 year; compared to \$18,000 for comparable programs offered in Chicago), but have also offered scholarships to families at need for the past 3 years. Our students come from Berwyn, Oak Park, Maywood, Forest Park, River Forest, West Chester, LaGrange, Meirose Park and Chicago.

Due to the need for a school such as ours and because of requests from families at our school to continue to the 8th grade, we are requesting assistance to bring modular classrooms to The Children's School so we may continue to meet the community's needs.

Mayor O'Connor and the Berwyn City Council Regarding: Budget Deficit Reduction – Anticipated Continuing Economic Downturn

Ladies and Gentlemen:

In order to eliminate the budget deficit and prepare for the anticipated continuing economic downturn over the next few years, I recommend that we take the following action.

- 1: Suspend city and Cermak TIF funding of the Main Street program for a period of two years before considering the appropriateness of resuming the program in 2011. There are some very talented Berwyn residents who may be willing to pursue the program on a volunteer basis. Suspending the program would reduce the city's budget by \$52,950 and increase the Cermak TIF account by \$123,550.
- 2: Suspend the regional housing authority for a period of two years before considering the appropriateness of resuming the authority in 2011 Suspending this program will reduce the budget by \$225,000 annually.
- 3: Ask our State Senator and Representative to support a bill that would enable us to enact special legislation to shift at least 30% of all uncommitted TIF funds to the city's general fund for the next three years during this time of financial hardship. Currently the Cermak TIF has \$750,000 of uncommitted cash in its account, Roosevelt has \$250,000 of uncommitted cash in its account, the Depot District has \$500,000 of uncommitted cash in its account, and the Ogden TIF has \$250,000 of uncommitted cash in its account. This, of course, would require the BDC to tighten its belt along with all other government and quasi-governmental agencies and departments. With a total of \$1.75 million in uncommitted cash, a shift of 30% would shift over a half a million dollars into a special fund created by the city. The purpose of the fund would be to help fill the void created by reduced sales tax and transfer tax revenues. These figures do not include the potential for an additional \$1,000,000 of uncommitted cash in the Cermak TIF once the closing on Superblock occurs in July or August. In this eventuality, the city would receive an additional \$300,000 under this proposal

This would be a minor amendment to the existing TIF law. As such, this amendment would not be passed until the end of 2009 at the earliest and, when passed, would be made retroactive to January 1, 2009 thereby providing immediate additional fiscal relief for many cities at the time of passage. TIF funds in the amounts itemized must be set aside and remain unused within the TIF Districts.

I understand that an otherwise equitable distribution of a TIF transfer via the declaration of surplus would normally include all taxing bodies. However, I am merely suggesting that, in these difficult and unsteady times, we need to think outside the box and take unusual measures to protect the best interests of Berwyn residents

The money could serve as a cash reserve and be used to help cover short-falls over the next few years of economic hardship to meet the essential needs of Berwyn residents while avoiding the need to raise taxes.

Once the economy starts improving, amounts remaining in the special fund could be used to pay down the city's debt service that burdens Berwyn residents.



- That should the improvements be abandoned at any time after the ENGINEER has performed any part of the services provided for in paragraphs 1a and 1g, and prior to the completion of such services the LA shall reimburse the ENGINEER for his actual costs plus 185 percent incurred up to the time he is notified in writing of such abandonment "actual cost" being defined as material costs plus actual payrolls, insurance, social security and retirement deductions. Traveling and other out-of-pocket expenses will be reimbursed to the ENGINEER at his actual cost.
- That should the LA extend completion of the improvement beyond the time limit given in the contract, the LA will pay the ENGINEER, in addition to the fees provided herein, his actual cost incurred beyond such time limit "actual cost" being defined as in paragraph 4 above.

It is Mutually Agreed,

- That any difference between the ENGINEER and the LA concerning the interpretation of the provisions of this AGREEMENT shall be referred to a committee of disinterested parties consisting of one member appointed by the ENGINEER one member appointed by the LA and a third member appointed by the two other members for disposition and that the committee's decision shall be final.
- This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at his last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LA all drawings, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data if any from traffic studies and soil survey and subsurface investigations with the understanding that all such material becomes the property of the LA. The ENGINEER shall be paid for any services completed and any services partially completed in accordance with Section 4 of THE LA AGREES.
- 3. That if the contract for construction has not been awarded one year after the acceptance of the plans by the LA and their approval by the DEPARTMENT, the LA will pay the ENGINEER the balance of the engineering fee due to make 100 percent of the total fees due under the AGREEMENT, based on the estimate of cost as prepared by the ENGINEER and approved by the LA and the DEPARTMENT.
- 4. That the ENGINEER warrants that he/she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the ENGINEER, to solicit or secure this contract and that he/she has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the ENGINEER, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For breach or violation of this warranty the LA shall have the right to annul this contract without liability.
