MINUTES BERWYN CITY HALL SEPTEMBER 22, 2009

- 1. The regular meeting of the Berwyn City Council was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 8:03 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Santoy, Avila, Laureto. Absent: Skryd, Polashek. The Mayor stated that Alderman Skryd was in the building but asked for a motion to excuse Alderman Polashek. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to excuse Alderman Polashek. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence was observed for the police, firefighters, paramedics, and armed forces.

 Alderman Skryd present at 8:04 p.m.
- 3. The Open Forum portion of the meeting was announced. Alderman Laureto announced the Grand Opening of Just Cause, Dance Studio on Saturday, September 26th and the Grand reopening of McDonald's on Roosevelt Road on September 26, 2009. Alderman Santoy reminded all of the 5th Ward Town Hall meeting on September 28, 2009 at the Community Center at 7:30 p.m. Alderman Paul announced the 3rd Ward Town Hall meeting on October 14, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at Emerson and Heritage Schools.
- 4. The minutes of the regular Berwyn City Council and Committee of the Whole meetings held on September 8, 2009 were submitted. Thereafter Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to concur and approve as submitted. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. A motion by Avila, and seconded by Chapman, to suspend the rules and bring for item 4. The motion carried by a voice vote. Item I-4 is a communication from Alderman Avila regarding Hispanic Heritage Month Celebration with an attached Proclamation, proclaiming September 15th through October 15th as Hispanic Heritage Month in the City of Berwyn. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to concur and **adopt** the Proclamation as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto and to also concur with the North Berwyn Park District's request for the Festa Nuertras Raices, on Saturday, October 10, 2009. The motion carried by a voice vote. Thereafter, the Mayor

introduced State Representative, Lisa Hernandez, and presented her and Joe Vallez of the North Berwyn Park District with the Proclamation in honor of the celebration. Thereafter, a Mariachi Band performed for all in attendance.

- 6. The Public Works director submitted a communication requesting the bid opening for the CDBG Sidewalk Improvement Program. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to grant permission and to authorize the corporate authorities and any other interested parties to proceed to the Conference room to open, tabulate, and return to the Council Chambers for reading. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 7. The Mayor submitted a communication regarding the appointment of Robert P. Schiller, Jr. as Director of Public Works. Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Avila, to concur and approve the appointment as presented. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 8. A deferred communication from the Zoning Board of Appeals regarding Clearwire Legacy, LLC, 6500-6514 Cermak Road. Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to concur and **adopt** the Resolution and Ordinance as presented and to authorize the corporate authorities to affix their signatures thereto. The motion carried by the following roll call: Yeas: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Santoy. Nays: Skryd, Avila, Laureto. Excused: Polashek.
- 9. The Zoning Board of Appeals submitted a communication regarding Aztec America Bank, 2136 S. Oak Park Avenue. After discussion, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to **deny** the request. The motion to deny was carried by a unanimous roll call vote with Polashek excused.
- 10. Alderman Paul submitted a communication regarding Reduced Vehicle Registration fees for Antique Vehicles. Thereafter, Paul made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to refer the matter to the Budget Committee and the Business, License, and Taxation Committee. The motion carried by a voice.
- 11. Alderman Paul submitted a communication regarding the October 7, 2009 International Walk to School Day in Berwyn. Thereafter, Paul made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to refer the matter to the City Administrator to draft a Proclamation. The motion carried by a unanimous roll call vote.
- 12. Alderman Boyajian submitted a communication regarding signs at various locations in the 2^{nd} Ward. Thereafter, Boyajian made a motion, seconded

by Paul, to refer the matter to the Traffic Engineer and the Parking and Traffic Committee. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 13. The combined committees of Business, License, and Taxation and the Building, Zoning, and Planning submitted a report from a meeting held on September 15, 2009, regarding a proposed change in the Ordinance regarding the change of time for construction work with the recommendation to keep the current time of 7:00 a.m. Also, discussed was referral item #15 regarding "Impact Fees", which will be discussed at a later time. Thereafter, Laureto made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 14. The Police and Fire Committee submitted a report from the meeting held on September 9, 2009 regarding the Chief of Police hiring 3 new police officers with the recommendation to defer the matter until the next committee meeting. Thereafter, Skryd made a motion, seconded by Chapman, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 15. The Police and Fire Committee submitted a request for the removal of referral items. Thereafter, Chapman made a motion, seconded by Avila, to accept the matter as informational. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 16. The Parking and Traffic Committee submitted a report from the meeting held on September 17, 2009 regarding Parking fees for Vacin Fairway permits. Thereafter, Paul made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to suspend the rules and bring forth item I-9 and mark as germane. The motion carried. I-9 is the Committee's recommendation for the Vacin Fairway, Cermak Road Corridor, and the Harlem parking area, with the recommendation that the legal department revise ordinances 484.07, 480.03, and 480.07, and that the Public Works Department seek bids from private contractors for the replacement of signage as directed by the Traffic Engineer. Thereafter, Paul made a motion, seconded by Skryd to refer the matter to the Committee of the Whole for consideration. The motion carried by a voice vote
- 17. The Parking and Traffic Committee submitted a report from the meeting held on September 17, 2009 with a recommendation that the Public Works Director conduct an inventory of parking and related signage. Thereafter, Paul made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to refer the matter to the Mayor's office for implementation. The motion carried by a voice vote.

- 1. The Committee of the Whole was called to order by Mayor Lovero at 6:06 p.m. Upon the call of the roll, the following responded present: Chapman, Boyajian, Paul, Skryd, Santoy, Laureto. Absent: Polashek, Avila.
- 2. Boyajian made a motion, seconded by Santoy, to excuse Aldermen Polashek and Avila. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 3. Chapman made a motion, seconded by Boyajian, to close the Committee of the Whole at 6:07 p.m. for pending litigation. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 4. Skryd made a motion, seconded by Avila to reopen the Committee of the Whole at 6:45 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.
- 5. Lions Club Candy Day request-The Mayor referred to the Clerk, who submitted a late request to the Council for consideration, see attached. The Mayor asked for a consensus to allow, with 7-0 in favor.
- 6. The Mayor brought a request from City Administrator, Brian Pabst regarding data entry of vehicle and pet registration applications, see attached. The Mayor stated that this matter will be on the next Council agenda.
- 7. Bond Refinance-The Mayor referred to Finance Director, John Wysociki, who introduced members from G. K. Baum, Dan Austin and Meade Financial, regarding the bond refinance and gave a power point presentation, see attached. Thereafter, discussion ensued on the City's current bond rating which is at A- that will be re-reviewed by Standard and Poor's, next week. In conclusion, Wysocki stated that the appropriate ordinances will be presented at the next City Council for adoption, for the re financing of the City's debt, which will restore the stability to the City's operating fund, eliminate the fund deficient, repay loans from other funds, and build a reasonable reserve and will make the level of debt payment affordable and eliminate any peak increases through 2012. It will also address the current shortfall of \$1.3 million and create a \$3.5 million General Fund Balance which will reduce the interest cost and add stability.
- 8. The Mayor took questions regarding other Council agenda items. Alderman Paul questioned the Safespeed deferral item, J-1. The Mayor referred to Detective Mike Oschner to address any questions. Thereafter, the Mayor

referred to the Tribune article, stating that Michael DelGaldo is not a corporate officer of Safespeed and reiterated that Michael DelGaldo has no financial interest in this contract with the City nor did Michael DelGaldo bring this to the Mayor's attention.

- 9. Alderman Chapman questioned item I-9 on the Council agenda. Item I-9 is regarding Parking and Traffic Committee's recommendations and restrictions. The Mayor suggested referring this matter to the Committee of the Whole for further discussion. Alderman Chapman then referred to the map from the Traffic Engineer, see attached, regarding Cermak Road and Vacin Fairway parking. The Mayor also questioned item I-8 as being germane and asked that the item be referred to the Committee of the Whole. Thereafter, Alderman Santoy inquired about the status of the 2 recent requests that have been referred to Parking and Traffic.
- 10. There being no further business to come before the meeting, the Mayor asked for a motion to adjourn. Thereafter, Avila made a motion, seconded by Skryd, to adjourn at the hour of 7:49 p.m. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Dear Mayor and Council:

As the project commonly referred to as Superblock progresses, one of the key components will be the vacation of the alleyways south of Cermak between Grove Ave and Oak Park Ave as well a portion of the north-south alley. The vacated alley will be used by the developer in their land plan for parking.

On Monday September 14, 2009 a public hearing was held at City Hall to discuss the vacation with surrounding residents. Roughly 10 residents were in attendance for the meeting and voiced their collective concerns regarding access. Currently the alley is gated off and there are problems ranging from timely waste removal to snow removal. Upon hearing these concerns it was decided that in addition to the vacation of the alley, an access easement be created on the property to allow residents and service vehicles easier ingress and egress. The ordinance and plats of vacation have been updated to reflect this access easement.

Attached to this correspondence is the ordinance and corresponding plat for the vacation of the alleyways and creation of the access easement for your consideration.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AUTHORIZING THE VACATION OF CERTAIN PORTIONS OF ALLEYS BETWEEN GROVE AVENUE AND OAK PARK AVENUE LYING SOUTH OF CERMAK ROAD

WHEREAS, on or about August 24, 2009, legal notice of the public hearing was mailed by both United States certified and regular mail to the owners of the properties abutting and lying adjacent to those portions of the alleys being contemplated for vacation to advise said of the public hearing to discuss the vacation of the portions of the alleys, herein described; and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2009, a public hearing was held in the City Hall of the City at which time owners of abutting, adjacent and nearby properties as well as interested parties were in attendance and each was given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the relief to the public from the further burden and responsibility of maintaining a16-foot wide east/west public alley between Grove Avenue and Oak Park Avenue approximately 120 feet south of Cermak Road as well as an approximate 45-foot portion of a 16-foot wide north/south public alley between Grove Avenue and Oak Park Avenue approximately 125 feet west of Oak Park Avenue (the "*Property*") does constitute a valid public interest authorizing the vacation thereof, the Property being further identified and legally described, as follows:



Whereas, the City is a Home Rule Municipality, Article 7 Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution of 1270; and

Whereas, the Legislature has expressly authorized the exercise of the powers herein; pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-11.2-2), which provides the corporate, authorities may make contracts for Planning, Zoning and Urban rehabilitation; and

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

The City grants to the BDC the right, privilege and license for the administration of the City's TIF district programs and projects, Marketing Program and additional projects as assigned by the City Council during the term of and in accordance with the provisions contained in this Agreement, commencing on January 1, 2010 until and through December 31, 2013.

With the agreement of the BDC, the City shall have the option to extend this Agreement for the period of an additional four (4) years, by providing the BDC with written notice of the City's intention one hundred and twenty (120) days prior to its expiration.

The BDC shall annually submit a budget to the City administration for review no later than October 31.

The City will fund the amounts agreed to in the budget in the following manner:

- One half of the TIF funded amounts will be paid to the BDC no later than March 31 of the current year
- The Second half of the TIF funded amounts will be paid to the BDC no later than September 30 of the current year. The funding may be offset by the excess reserve, as defined below
- The General Fund portion of the BDC's budget, to administer to the Commercial Loan Program, will be paid within 30 days of the receipt of the BDC's audited financial statements.

The reserve amount is to be calculated as 50% of the prior year's actual expenses plus restricted funds. Any unrestricted funds, as of December 31 of the previous year, over the reserve amount will be considered to be the excess reserve amount and may be

deducted from the second installment above. The City, with the express consent of both the Mayor and Council, can choose to enforce this deduction.

The Mayor shall appoint a City liaison to the BDC board on a annual basis or provide this authority to the current BDC President.

In addition, the BDC will provide audited financial statements to the City. The BDC shall attempt to have these financial statements issued by May 31, annually. If they are unable to complete the audit by May 31, the City may request that the BDC change the contract with the auditing firm to ensure compliance with that date or use a different auditing firm.

As an element of the intergovernmental agreement (IGA) by and between the Village of Oak Park, the City of Berwyn, and the Town of Cicero, each community is required to appoint members to the Roosevelt Road Advisory Committee (RRAC) to coordinate planning and redevelopment efforts. The redevelopment efforts, consisting of a streetscape plan and new zoning regulations for the corridor, are being administered by the RRAC Committee. Each municipality appointed two economic development employees or City Staff, one citizen, and one business owner for a total of twelve members. Nicole has been involved with the streetscape planning and engineering plans for the current phase and will be a valued added addition to the advisory committee.

In October, 1964, four Morton High School students got together in a basement on Riverside Drive. Their goal was to form a rock band. With hard work and determination, those students became the band, *The Ides of March*.

Nearly 45 years later, all four original members (Jim Peterik, Larry Millas, Bob Bergland, and Mike Borch) still play together in the band. As the band evolved, the band added a horn section, and once again, Morton High School students filled the bill. The *Ides* went on to share the concert stage with Jimi Hendrix, Janis Joplin, *Led Zeppelin*, *Boston, Heart, 38 Special, The Beach Boys, REO Speedwagon and Credence Clearwater*, just to name a few

The fact that all four original members are still together in the band is unique in rock history. This fact has been acknowledged by no less an authority than Chicago radio icon, Dick Biondi. Dick Biondi is in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, and has been the concert MC for many bands including *The Beatles* and *The Rolling Stones*.

In 1970, Jim Peterik's wrote the classic hit, *Vehicle*, which is still played regularly on the radio. It has been used in commercials (General Motors), and on TV (American Idol). Jim was in the band, *Survivor*. He wrote the classic rock song, *The Eye of the Tiger*. He has won a Grammy award, a People's Choice Award, and an Oscar nomination. He has written countless hit songs for many other bands

I have known the band members since high school, and I am still amazed and impressed with their success. I understand that demographics and musical tastes change. However, the lesson to be learned from the determination of these Morton High School graduates is timeless.

The fact that *The Ides of March* is a band from Berwyn is mentioned at every concert. Their web site references their Berwyn roots, and also gives the Berwyn weather forecast. www.theidesofmarch.com (They did have to drop the nickname of the horn section from *the Troy Store Horns*, since McDonald's took over the southwest corner of Cermak Road and Ridgeland Avenue years ago.)

I think the City of Berwyn should acknowledge the accomplishments of these boys from Berwyn. Larry Millas still lives in Berwyn, and all of them live in the area. I know that the City of Berwyn has dedicated honorary streets in the past. I think that a dedication of this sort would be appropriate, especially if it was placed near Morton High School. A permanent reminder of the accomplishments of *The Ides of March* could act as an inspiration to aspiring musicians and the student body in general, conveying the message that hard work and dedication can pay off. Students can also see that the personal achievements of singing or playing an instrument are activities that can be used for a lifetime.

Champaign has a street dedicated to the band *REO Speedwagon*, and Westmont dedicated a park to the late blues legend, Muddy Waters.





Dear Mayor Lovero & Members of the City Council,

After extensive discussions with our City Administrator and other department heads, I would like to recommend that City Council approve the new position of Grant Coordinator, which is discussed herein. The position should be publicly and openly posted for qualified applicants.

The City has been very successful in obtaining numerous grants in recent months, and pursuant to a previous communication from the Treasurer, we have increased our efforts substantially to pursue available grant funds and we expect to receive more grants in the future. The grant writing effort has now been centralized under the Treasurer's office and writing responsibilities have been delegated to a team of several individuals, including department heads and other designated employees, members of various commissions, and resident and District 100 School Board Member James Swicionis and the Treasurer.

Through our research and past experience, we have found that subsequent to a specific grant being awarded, there is typically a significant amount of administrative duties associated with each grant Examples of these duties include numerous functions such as preparation of grant billings, reports, budget amendments, plan changes, program evaluations, maintaining spreadsheets and documentation to support grant expenses, ongoing monitoring of grant budgets and expenditures to ensure targets are met, ongoing monitoring of grant program goals and monthly performance, gathering data for reports to ensure proper records are maintained, communicating relevant grant information with departments and all appropriate internal users, preparing written and statistical reports for various audiences and meeting requirements for all state and federal grant awards.

All of these administrative duties have proven to be extremely time consuming for the various department heads who have been handling the grant administration up to now (for public improvement grants in particular), and therefore we believe that this necessitates a new full-time position for someone that has a specific background in grant administration/coordination (minimum 2 years experience). We are recommending a salary range between \$40,000 and \$60,000 for this new position, but believe the salary should be commensurate with the level of experience of the applicant. In addition, we would also like this position to supplement our grant writing efforts and specifically write and submit grant applications for public improvement projects.

According to the City Administrator, if the administrative functions of existing grants are not followed through with in a timely and correct manner, the City stands to lose hundreds of thousands of dollars (if not more through the loss of grant funds that have already been awarded but not paid out). We believe that this new position will be a small investment compared to the funds that we will save and the new grants that we will be able to pursue if we have the added capability of administering them via this position.

VEHICLE STICKER V-PAY SOFTWARE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between Third Millennium Associates, Incorporated (TMA), its subsidiaries and assigns, located at 1952 McDowell Road, Naperville, Illinois, 60563, an Illinois corporation, hereinafter referred to as Licensor, and the City-of-Berwyn located at 6700 West 26th Street, Berwyn, IL 60402-0701, hereinafter called Licensee, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Licensor has certain proprietary rights to the copyrighted software originated by it, (the software), that facilitates the secure internet data entry for approximately 25,000 vehicle applications.

WHEREAS, Licensor will lease such software to Licensee on a non-exclusive basis for use by Licensee only at its premises specified above, for use in Licensee business operations only in association with TMA billing services or Licensee internal billing and mailing, with no right accorded Licensee to relocate, to sublicense or in any other manner to disclose any part of such Software except as permitted hereinafter, all or part of the Software to anyone not a party to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, affiliates, joint venture partners, subcontractors, marketing survey firms or consultants working with or providing support to Licensee;

NOW THEREFORE, for the mutual covenants, considerations and promises as hereinafter set forth, the Licensor and Licensee do hereby agree as follows:

- 1(a) Licensor hereby grants to Licensee, and Licensee hereby accepts, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, a non-exclusive, non-assignable license to use the Software for the purposes set forth above in perpetuity, or until Licensee discontinues its use of the Software. Either Licensor or Licensee may terminate this agreement prior to that date only if the other party has received written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, that it is in default and such default has not been corrected within thirty calendar days after the mailing date of such notice. The return receipt shall be conclusive proof of the delivery of such notice of default.
- (b) (1) The Licensee shall pay a vehicle sticker e-pay software license fee to Licensor of \$1,495 at the execution of this agreement, or as otherwise agreed. No portion of which shall be refundable.
- (2) The Licensee shall pay an annual Software maintenance fee to the Licensor of \$495 at the execution of this agreement and annually thereafter, no portion of which shall be refundable. Licensor shall provide its services for maintaining and providing common usage upgrades to the Software, such fee to be adjusted by TMA, at its option at annual intervals. However, in no event shall the increase in the annual fee exceed the Chicago area CPI as published by J.P. Morgan-Chase. - 3(b) Information within the Software shall not be considered proprietary or subject to confidentiality protection if it:
 - (1) Is already known to Licensee and Licensee informs Licensor of that fact;





Subject: Ordinance for the Issuance of GO Bonds

Attached is the ordinance for the issuance of 2009 General Obligation Bonds that I will be bringing to the October 13, 2009 City Council meeting for your approval This bond issue will refund several existing bond issues as discussed at the September 22 Committee of the Whole meeting as the third part of a four year bond restructuring plan. The ordinance delegates the final terms of the sale to City Officials. The reason for this approach is the Columbus Day Holiday that makes selling the bonds on Tuesday (the first business day after the holiday) difficult. However, we will have a firm idea of the sales terms of the bonds at the meeting

I am also pleased to inform you that Standard & Poors (S&P) has affirmed our A- bond rating A team that included the mayor, city administrator, BDC executive director, our financial advisor, our bond underwriters and me made a presentation to S&P that was instrumental in their decision to maintain our rating in spite of the challenging financial situation that we face As noted in the Outlook Section of their report which is also attached, the City's commitment to its financial plan was the only reason we were not downgraded. This rating will allow us to complete our bond issue at favorable interest rates Were we downgraded, the City would have paid an estimated \$1.8 million in higher interest costs

This team also secured bond insurance by Assured Guaranty that will allow the bonds to be sold at a lower interest cost based on the Triple A rating of the insurance company. Finally, municipal interest rates have declined to their lowest levels in 40 years The combination of the rating, bond insurance, and market conditions should have a favorable impact on the City.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois, in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the purpose of refunding a portion of the City's outstanding bonds and paying for the costs related thereto and to the issuance of such bonds and for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn, Cook County, Illinois (the "City"), is a home rule municipality and body politic of the State of Illinois, duly created, organized and existing under the Illinois Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code"), and having the powers, objects and purposes provided by said Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 6(d) and 6(k) of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois (the "Constitution"), a home rule unit may incur debt payable from ad valorem property tax receipts maturing not more than 40 years from the time it is incurred and without referendum approval thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City has outstanding certain bonds designated as its Convertible General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 1998 (the "Series 1998 Bonds"); General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 1999 (the "Series 1999 Bonds"); General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2001 (the "Series 2001 Bonds"); General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2002A (the "Series 2002A Bonds:); General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2002B (the "Series 2002B Bonds"); General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2004 (the "Series 2004 Bonds"); General Obligation Bonds, Series 2007A (the "Series 2007A Bonds"); and General Obligation Bonds, Series 2008 Bonds") (the "Prior Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution and Local Government Debt Reform Act 30 ILCS 3501, et seq. (the "Debt Reform Act"), the City may issue its refunding bonds to refund all

or a portion of the Prior Bonds including interest (the portion to be refunded by this issue, known as the "Refunded Bonds") consisting of the following prior bonds maturing on the dates, in the amounts as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City (the "Council") has determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the City to issue its bonds (i) to refund the Refunded Bonds (the "Refunding"), (ii) to pay the cost of issuance of the Bonds (as hereinafter defined); and

WHEREAS, there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay the estimated cost of the Refunding, including legal, financial, bond discount, printing and publication costs, and other expenses (collectively, the "Costs"); and

WHEREAS, the issuance of bonds is exempt from the requirements of the Bond Issue Notification Act; and

WHEREAS, the bonds to be issued will be payable from the unlimited ad valorem property taxes levied within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Council is now authorized to issue bonds in the aggregate issued amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 in accordance with the provisions of the Code and Debt Reform Act, and the Council hereby determines that it is necessary and desirable that there be issued at this time not to exceed \$15,000,000 in issued amount of the bonds so authorized;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 <u>Incorporation of Preambles</u>. The Council hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this ordinance are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this ordinance by this reference

Section 2. <u>Authorization</u> It is hereby found and determined that the Council has been authorized by the provisions of the Constitution and Debt Reform Act to issue bonds of the City in the aggregate issued amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the purpose of paying a portion of

the cost of the Refunding, and such borrowing of money is necessary for the welfare of the government and affairs of the City, is a proper public purpose and is in the public interest.

Section 3 <u>Bond Details</u> There shall be borrowed on the credit of and for and on behalf of the City, the sum not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the purpose aforesaid and that the City shall issue in the name of the City it's "General Obligation Bonds Series 2009" (the "Bonds") pursuant to the Debt Reform Act in the amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the purpose of the payment of the costs of the Refunding, and the payment of costs of issuance

The Bonds shall be issued in amounts of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof, shall be numbered consecutively from R-1 up and shall be dated the date, and paying interest as set forth in the Bond Order to be filed in connection with the sale of the Bonds (the "Bond Order"). The Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the principal office of the Paying Agent (as hereinafter defined). Such Bonds shall mature on and bear interest at the rates per annum not to exceed 7% (computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months) all as provided in the Bond Order.

Section 4 Registrar and Paying Agent The City Treasurer is hereby appointed to serve as Registrar and Paying Agent for the Bonds (the "Registrar" or "Paying Agent") The Registrar is hereby charged with the responsibility of authenticating the Bonds

The Bonds shall be payable at the principal office of the Paying Agent If the payment date occurs on a date when financial institutions are not open for business, the payment shall be made on the next succeeding business day The Paying Agent shall be instructed to wire transfer payments by 1:00 p m. (New York City time) so such payments are received by the registered owner by 2:30 p m (New York City time) All payments on the Bonds shall be made in any coin

or currency of the United States of America, which on the date of such payment shall be legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Each Bond shall be transferable or exchangeable only upon the books of the City kept for that purpose at the principal office of the Registrar by the registered owner in person, or by its attorney duly authorized in writing, upon surrender of such Bond together with a written instrument of transfer or exchange satisfactory to the Registrar duly executed by the registered owner, or its attorney duly authorized in writing, and thereupon a new fully registered Bond or Bonds in an authorized aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity, shall be executed and delivered in the name of the transferee or transferees or the registered owner, as the case may be, in exchange therefor The Registrar shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Bond during the fifteen (15) days prior to a principal payment date and ending on such principal payment date. The costs of such transfer or exchange shall be borne by the City except for any tax or governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer or exchange, which taxes or governmental charges are payable by the person requesting such transfer or exchange. The City, Registrar and Paying Agent for the Bonds may treat and consider the person in whose name such Bonds are registered as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes including for the purpose of receiving payment of, or on account of, the Maturity Amount

The Registrar and Paying Agent may at any time resign as Registrar and Paying Agent upon giving 30 days' notice in writing to the City and by first class mail to each registered owner of the Bonds then outstanding, and such resignation will take effect at the end of such 30 day period or upon the earlier appointment of a successor registrar and paying agent by the City. Any such notice to the City may be served personally or sent by registered mail. The Registrar and Paying Agent may be removed at any time as Registrar and Paying Agent by the City, in

which event the City may appoint a successor registrar and paying agent. The City shall notify each registered owner of the Bonds then outstanding by first class mail of the removal of the Registrar and Paying Agent. Notices to the registered owners of the Bonds shall be deemed to be given when mailed by first class mail to the addresses of such registered owners as they appear on the registration books kept by the Registrar

Upon the appointment of any successor registrar and paying agent by the City, the Mayor or the Treasurer are authorized and directed to enter into such agreements and understandings with such successor registrar and paying agent as will enable the institution to perform the services required of a registrar and paying agent for the Bonds. The Mayor and Treasurer are further authorized to pay such fees as the successor registrar and paying agent may charge for the services it provides as registrar and paying agent.

Any predecessor registrar and paying agent shall deliver all of the Bonds and any cash or investments in its possession with respect thereto, together with the registration books, to the successor registrar and paying agent

The Registrar shall cause said Bonds to be printed in blank in such number as the Registrar shall determine to be necessary or customary; provided, however, that the Registrar shall not be required to have such Bonds printed until it shall have received from the City indemnification for all costs and expenses associated with such printing

In connection with any notice or other communication to be provided to bondholders by the City or the Registrar with respect to any consent or other action to be taken by bondholders, the City or the Registrar, as the case may be, shall establish a record date for such consent or other action and give the bondholders notice of such record date not less than fifteen (15) calendar days in advance of such record date to the extent possible

The City has determined that it may be beneficial to the City to have the Bonds held by a central depository system pursuant to an agreement between the City and The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("Depository Trust Company") and have transfers of the Bonds effected by book-entry on the books of the central depository system ("Book Entry System") The Bonds may be initially issued in the form of a separate single authenticated fully registered Bond for the aggregate principal amount of each separate maturity of the Bonds In such case, upon initial issuance, the ownership of such Bonds shall be registered in the register kept by the Registrar in the name of Cede & Co, as nominee of the Depository Trust Company

With respect to the Bonds registered in the register kept by the Registrar in the name of Cede & Co, as nominee of the Depository Trust Company, the City and the Paying Agent shall have no responsibility or obligation to any other holders or owners (including any beneficial owner ("Beneficial Owner")) of the Bonds with respect to (i) the accuracy of the records of the Depository Trust Company, Cede & Co., or any Beneficial Owner with respect to ownership questions, (ii) the delivery to any bondholder (including any Beneficial Owner) or any other person, other than the Depository Trust Company, of any notice with respect to the Bonds including any notice of redemption, or (iii) the payment to any bondholder (including any Beneficial Owner) or any other person, other than the Depository Trust Company, of any amount with respect to the principal of, or premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds except as otherwise provided herein

No person other than the Depository Trust Company shall receive an authenticated Bond evidencing an obligation of the City to make payments of the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds pursuant to this ordinance The City and the Registrar and Paying Agent may treat as and deem the Depository Trust Company or Cede & Co. to be the absolute

bondholder of each of the Bonds for the purpose of (i) payment of the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on such Bonds; (ii) giving notices of redemption and other notices permitted to be given to bondholders with respect to such Bonds; (iii) registering transfers with respect to such Bonds; (iv) obtaining any consent or other action required or permitted to be taken of or by bondholders; (v) voting; and (vi) for all other purposes whatsoever The Paying Agent shall pay all principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository Trust Company, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the City's and the Paying Agent's obligations with respect to principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. Upon delivery by the Depository Trust Company to the City of written notice to the effect that the Depository Trust Company has determined to substitute a new nominee in place of Cede & Co., and subject to the provisions herein with respect to consents, the words "Cede & Co" in this ordinance shall refer to such new nominee of the Depository Trust Company. Notwithstanding any other provision hereof to the contrary, so long as any Bond is registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of the Depository Trust Company, all payments with respect to the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on such Bonds and all notices with respect to such Bonds shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository Trust Company as provided in a representation letter from the City to the Depository Trust Company

Upon receipt by the City of written notice from the Depository Trust Company to the effect that the Depository Trust Company is unable or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities and no substitute depository willing to undertake the functions of the Depository Trust Company hereunder can be found which is willing and able to undertake such functions upon reasonable and customary terms, then the Bonds shall no longer be restricted to being registered in the

register of the City kept by the Registrar in the name of Cede & Co, as nominee of the Depository Trust Company, but may be registered in whatever name or names the bondholders transferring or exchanging the Bonds shall designate, in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance

If the City determines that it is in the best interest of the bondholders that they be able to obtain Bonds for the fully registered Bonds, the City may notify the Depository Trust Company and the Registrar, whereupon the Depository Trust Company will notify the Beneficial Owners of the availability through the Depository Trust Company of Bonds for the Bonds In such event, the Registrar shall prepare, authenticate, transfer and exchange Bonds for the Bonds as requested by the Depository Trust Company and any Beneficial Owners in appropriate amounts, and whenever the Depository Trust Company requests the City and the Registrar to do so, the Registrar and the City will cooperate with the Depository Trust Company by taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (i) to make available one or more separate Bonds evidencing the fully registered Bonds of any Beneficial Owner's Depository Trust Company account or (ii) to arrange for another securities depository to maintain custody of Bonds for and evidencing the Bonds

If the Bonds shall no longer be restricted to being registered in the name of the Depository Trust Company, the Registrar shall cause said Bonds to be printed in blank in such number as the Registrar shall determine to be necessary or customary; provided, however, that the Registrar shall not be required to have such Bonds printed until it shall have received from the City indemnification for all costs and expenses associated with such printing

Section 5 Redemption Bonds maturing on or after a date specified in the Bond Order are subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City as stated in the Bond Order

Section 6. General Obligations. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment when due of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be direct and general obligations of the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property in the City for the payment of the Bonds according to their terms, without limitation as to rate or amount

Section 8 Sale of Bonds The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to have the Bonds prepared, and the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and attest the Bonds in the form and manner provided herein. The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to deliver the Bonds to George K. Baum & Company, Chicago, Illinois or such other purchaser (the "Purchaser"). The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to deliver the Bonds to the purchaser as identified in the Bond Order (the "Purchaser"). Authority is hereby delegated to the Mayor and the Treasurer to sell all, but not less than all, of the Bonds to the Purchaser at a purchase price of not less than 97% of par. The sale of the Bonds shall be evidenced by a Bond Order which shall be signed by the Mayor or Treasurer. The Mayor and the City Clerk are authorized and directed to execute a bond purchase agreement in connection with the sale of the Bonds, in the name of and on behalf of the City. The bond purchase agreement shall be substantially in the form of purchase agreements commonly used in transactions similar to that described in this Ordinance, with such changes as necessary to reflect the terms and provisions of the Bonds, this Ordinance and such other changes as the Mayor or

Treasurer shall determine are necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Bonds, including whether to purchase bond insurance and the related terms

No person holding any office of the City either by election or appointment, is in any manner interested, either directly or indirectly, in his or her own name or in the name of any other person, association, trust, company or corporation, in said purchase of the Bonds.

The Bonds when fully paid for and delivered to the Purchaser, shall be the binding general obligations of the City The proper officers of the City are hereby directed to sell the Bonds to the Purchaser and to do whatever acts and things which may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance

Distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement by the Purchaser for its bonds, as prepared by George K Baum & Company, is hereby ratified and distribution of the Purchaser's final Official Statement (the "Official Statement") containing information about the City, is hereby approved

Section 9. <u>Tax Levy</u>. In order to provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds, there be and there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property within the City, in addition to all other taxes, in the years for which any of the Bonds are outstanding, direct annual taxes as provided in the Bond Order

The City covenants and agrees with the purchasers and the holders of the Bonds that so long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding, the City will take no action or fail to take any action which in any way would adversely affect the ability of the City to levy and collect the foregoing tax levy and the City and its officers will comply with all present and future applicable laws in order to assure that the foregoing taxes will be levied, extended and collected as provided herein and deposited in the Bond Fund.

The funds derived from the tax levy be and the same are hereby appropriated and set aside for the sole and only purpose of paying the principal and interest of said Bonds when and as the same become due. The funds from the sale of said Bonds be and they are hereby appropriated and set aside for the Refunding and payment of costs of issuance

Section 10 Filing of Ordinance Forthwith upon the passage of this ordinance, the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance with the County Clerk of Cook County, Illinois. It shall be the duty of said County Clerk to annually in and for each of the levy years as provided in the Bond Order, ascertain the rate necessary to produce the tax herein levied, and to extend the same for collection on the tax books against all of the taxable property within the City in connection with other taxes levied in each of said years for general corporate purposes, in order to raise the respective amounts aforesaid and in each of said years such annual tax shall be computed, extended and collected in the same manner as now hereafter provided by law for the computation, extension and collection of taxes for general corporate purposes of the City, and when collected, the taxes hereby levied shall be placed to the credit of the Bond Fund created pursuant to Section 12 of this ordinance

Section 11. <u>Use of Bond Proceeds</u> The principal proceeds of the Bonds, including any premiums, are hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying the costs of the Refunding and are hereby ordered deposited into the Refunding Fund of the City created pursuant to Section 12 of this ordinance (the "Refunding Fund") The Refunded Bonds shall be refunded at the earliest possible date and a Certificate of Reduction of Taxes shall be filed with the County Clerk abating a portion of the tax levies on the Refunded Bonds Remaining proceeds shall be used to pay costs of issuance

Section 12. <u>Creation of Funds and Accounts</u>. (a) Bond Fund There is hereby created the "Bond and Interest Fund of 2009" (the "Bond Fund"), which shall be the fund for the payment of the Bonds Collections of taxes herein levied in Section 10 of this ordinance shall be deposited into the Bond Fund as required by such Section and shall be used solely and only for the payment the Bonds when due. All amounts on deposit in the Bond Fund are hereby irrevocably pledged to and shall be used only for the purpose of paying the Bonds.

(b) Refunding Fund There is hereby established a special fund of the City known as the "Refunding Fund" to be held by the Treasurer There shall be deposited in the Refunding Fund proceeds of the Bonds sufficient to refund the Refunded Bonds The Refunding Fund shall be maintained separate and apart from all other accounts of the City and shall be used to pay costs of issuance and pay the costs of refunding a portion of the Prior Bonds

Section 13 <u>Defeasance and Payment of Bonds</u>. (A) If the City shall pay or cause to be paid to the registered owners of the Bonds, the Bonds due or to become due thereon, at the times and in the manner stipulated therein and in this ordinance, then the pledge of taxes, securities and funds hereby pledged and the covenants, agreements and other obligations of the City to the registered owners and the beneficial owners of the Bonds shall be discharged and satisfied

(B) Any Bonds, whether at or prior to the maturity or the redemption date of such Bonds, shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning of paragraph (A) of this Section (1) in case any such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to the maturity thereof, there shall have been taken all action necessary to call such Bonds for redemption and notice of such redemption shall have been duly given or provision shall have been made for the giving of such notice, and (2) there shall have been deposited in trust with a bank, trust company or national banking association acting as fiduciary for such purpose either (i) moneys in an amount which shall be

sufficient, or (ii) "Federal Obligations" as defined in paragraph (C) of this Section, the principal of and the interest on which when due will provide moneys which, together with any moneys on deposit with such fiduciary at the same time for such purpose, shall be sufficient, to pay when due the Maturity Amount due on said Bonds on and prior to the applicable redemption date or maturity date hereof.

(C) As used in this Section, the term "Federal Obligations" means (i) non-callable, direct obligations of the United States of America, (ii) non-callable and non-prepayable, direct obligations of any agency of the United States of America, which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America as to full and timely payment of principal and interest, (iii) non-callable, non-prepayable coupons or interest installments from the securities described in clause (i) or clause (ii) of this paragraph, which are stripped pursuant to programs of the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America, or (iv) coupons or interest installments stripped from bonds of the Resolution Funding Corporation

Section 14 <u>Continuing Disclosure</u> A Continuing Disclosure Undertaking (the "Undertaking") in substantially the form presented to the meeting is hereby approved, and the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and attest the same on behalf of the City. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this ordinance, failure of the City to comply with the Undertaking shall not be considered an event of default under the Bonds or this ordinance.

Section 15. <u>Tax Covenants</u> In order to preserve the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal tax purposes under Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the date of issuance of the Bonds (the "IRS Code") and as an inducement to purchasers of the Bonds, the Council represents, covenants and agrees that:

- (a) The facilities financed with the Refunded Bonds are available for use by members of the general public. Use by a member of the general public means use by natural persons not engaged in a trade or business. No person or entity, other than the City or another state or local governmental unit, will use more than 10% of the proceeds of the Refunded Bonds or property financed by the Refunded Bond proceeds other than as a member of the general public. No person or entity other than the City or another state or local governmental unit own property financed by Refunded Bond proceeds or have actual or beneficial use of such property pursuant to a lease, a management or incentive payment contract, an arrangement such as a take-or-pay or output contract or any other type of arrangement that conveys other special legal entitlements and differentiates that person's or entity's use of such property from the use by the general public, unless such uses in the aggregate relate to no more than 10% of the proceeds of the Bonds
- (b) No more than 10% of the payment of the Bonds will be (under the terms of the Bonds, this ordinance or any underlying arrangement), directly or indirectly, (i) secured by any interest in property used or to be used for a private business use or payments in respect of such property or (ii) derived from payments (whether or not to the City) in respect of such property or borrowed money used or to be used for a private business use
- (c) None of the Bond proceeds will be loaned to any entity or person other than a state or local governmental unit. None of the Bond proceeds will be transferred, directly or indirectly, or deemed transferred to a nongovernmental person in any manner that would in substance constitute a loan of the Bond proceeds
- (d) The City reasonably expects, as of the date hereof, that it will comply with the covenants described in paragraph (a), (b) and (c) above during the entire term of the Bonds

- (e) None of the proceeds of the Bonds will be attributable to private business use as described in (a) and private security or payments described in (b) attributable to unrelated or disproportionate private business use. For this purpose, the private business use test is applied by taking into account only use that is not related to any government use of proceeds of the issue (Unrelated Use) and use that is related but disproportionate to any governmental use of those proceeds (Disproportionate Use)
- (f) The City will not take any action nor fail to take any action with respect to the Bonds that would result in the loss of the exclusion from gross income for federal tax purposes of interest on the Bonds pursuant to Section 103 of the IRS Code, nor will the City act in any other manner which would adversely affect such exclusion, and it will not make any investment or do any other act or thing during the period that the Bonds are outstanding which would cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the IRS Code
- (g) It shall be not an event of default under this ordinance if the interest on any Bonds is not excludable from gross income for federal tax purposes or otherwise pursuant to any provision of the IRS Code which is not currently in effect and in existence on the date of issuance of the Bonds
- (h) These covenants are based solely on current law in effect and in existence of the date of delivery of the Bonds. The City hereby designates the Bonds are qualified tax-exempt obligations for purposes of Section 265(b) of the IRS Code.

The City hereby authorizes the officials of the City responsible for issuing the Bonds, the same being the Mayor, the City Clerk and the Treasurer of the City, to make such further covenants and certifications as may be necessary to assure that the use thereof will not cause the Bonds to be arbitrage bonds and to assure that the interest on the Bonds will be excludable from

gross income for federal income tax purposes. In connection therewith, the City further agrees:

(a) through its officers, to make such further specific covenants, representations as shall be truthful, and assurances as may be necessary or advisable; (b) to consult with counsel approving the Bonds and to comply with such advice as may be given; (c) to pay to the United States, as necessary, such sums of money representing required rebates of excess arbitrage profits relating to the Bonds as required pursuant to Section 148 of the IRS Code and the regulations promulgated thereunder; (d) to file such forms, statements, and supporting documents as may be required and in a timely manner; and (e) if deemed necessary or advisable by their officers, to employ and pay fiscal agents, financial advisors, attorneys, and other persons to assist the City in such compliance

Section 16. Registered Form The City recognizes that Section 149(a) of the IRS Code requires the Bonds to be issued and to remain in fully registered form in order that interest thereon is exempt from federal income taxation under laws in force at the time the Bonds are delivered. In this connection, the City agrees that it will not take any action to permit the Bonds to be issued in, or converted into, bearer or coupon form.

Section 17 <u>List of Bondholders</u>. The Bond Registrar shall maintain a list of the names and addresses of the holders of all Bonds and upon any transfer shall add the name and address of the new Bondholder and eliminate the name and address of the transferor Bondholder.

Section 18 <u>Duties of Bond Registrar</u> If requested by the Bond Registrar, the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to execute the Bond Registrar's standard form of agreement between the City and the Bond Registrar with respect to the obligations and duties of the Bond Registrar hereunder which may include the following:

- (a) to act as bond registrar, authenticating agent, paying agent and transfer agent as provided herein;
- (b) to maintain a list of Bondholders as set forth herein and to furnish such list to the City upon request, but otherwise to keep such list confidential;
- (c) to give notice of redemption of any Bonds;
- (d) to cancel and/or destroy Bonds which have been paid at maturity or upon redemption or submitted for exchange or transfer;
- (e) to furnish the City at least annually a certificate with respect to Bonds canceled and/or destroyed; and
- (f) to furnish the City at least annually an audit confirmation of bonds paid, Bonds outstanding and payments made with respect to interest on the Bonds

Section 19 Severability If any section, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance

Section 20 Ordinance to Constitute a Contract. The provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a contract between the City and the registered owners of the Bonds. Any pledge made in this ordinance, and the provisions, covenants and agreements herein set forth to be performed by or on behalf of the City, shall be for the equal benefit, protection and security of the registered owners of any and all of the Bonds.

Section 21 <u>Repeal</u>. All ordinances, resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed and this ordinance shall be in foil force and effect forthwith upon its adoption

Rationale

Standard & Poor's Ratings Services assigned its 'A-' long-term rating to the city of Berwyn, Ill.'s general obligation bonds. The negative outlook reflects the city's significantly reduced liquidity since 2007 and budgetary conditions that currently suggest another deficit for 2009. The rating reflects our view of the city's:

- · Participation in the deep and diverse Chicago-area economy;
- · Good income and adequate wealth levels;
- · A diverse, primarily residential tax base; and
- · Limited future capital needs

In addition to budgetary pressures, these strengths are further offset by a moderately high debt burden.

Berwyn is located eight miles southwest of Chicago's Loop and within 12 miles of the city's two major airports. It is a mature suburb with a population of roughly 54,000. Although primarily residential, the nearly four-square-mile city also has a retail and service presence. With the city essentially built out, emphasis is on redevelopment, particularly along its major commercial corridors. Notable within the city is the presence of MacNeal Hospital, a teaching hospital that employs 2,200 people, and the associated medical offices located nearby

Residents have easy access to jobs in the Chicago metropolitan area due to the proximity of two major interstate highways, I-55 and I-290, and the Metra commuter rail

The city's tax base is mature as reflected in its equalized assessed valuation (AV), which has remained relatively flat between triennial reassessment years. On average, equalized AV increased at an annual rate of 7.7% from 2004 to 2007, to \$836.5 million. The fair market value of the city's tax base is \$2.5 billion, or an adequate \$50,279 per capita. The tax base is very diverse and primarily residential. The leading 10 taxpayers account for 8% of total AV, and there is no significant concentration among the group. The median household effective buying income for Berwyn residents is good at 90% of the state and 96% of the national levels. The city's 12.9% June 2009 unemployment rate was above the state and national averages of 10.5% and 9.7%, respectively.

Berwyn continues to focus on improving its financial position. Management tells us their current initiatives include reorganizing departments for cost savings, creating a committee to explore revenue enhancements, and seeking union cooperation regarding salary levels consistent with the economy. Although the city passed a balanced 2008 budget, the weakened revenue climate led to a general fund deficit. For fiscal year ended Dec. 31, 2008, the city reported a \$563,429 general fund deficit (net of transfers), resulting in a negative unreserved fund balance of

\$434,196, or a negative 1% of expenditures. The city reported \$564,000 of cash assets in the general fund and relies on liquidity in other funds as well as lines of credit with local banks to meet its cash flow needs. The city passed a balanced 2009 budget, but revenues are running about \$1.3 million below budget mainly the real estate transfer taxes and sales tax revenues. We are told the city is instituting a hiring freeze, cutting departmental spending, reducing overtime, and withdrawing its participation in the local housing authority to partially offset the revenue shortfall. At this time, management tells us they may report another general fund deficit in 2009, but they expect it to be less than \$1 million.

Berwyn's financial management practices are considered "standard" under Standard & Poor's Financial Management Assessment (FMA) An FMA of standard indicates that the finance department maintains adequate policies in some, but not all, key areas. The city is developing a capital improvement plan and recently adopted a fund balance policy calling for general fund reserves equivalent to 16% of expenditures

The overall debt burden is moderate at \$3,365 per capita but moderately high at 7.2% of market value. Historically, the city has amortized its debt very rapidly to the extent that it pressured financial operations. In fiscal 2008, debt service carrying charges were an elevated 18% of total governmental funds expenditures. The city is again using bond proceeds to restructure its outstanding debt, stretching the maturities out to 20 years. Debt amortization is somewhat slower than average, with 43% of debt retired within 10 years. Not only should future carrying charges decline, but the restructuring will lower the debt levy, allowing the city to adjust its operating rate without changing the overall tax rate. The city currently has no plans for further debt issuance although it will take advantage of opportunities to restructure its debt.

Outlook

The negative outlook reflects the city's deteriorated financial position as of fiscal 2007, a deficit in 2008, and the expectation of another deficit for 2009. We may consider lowering the rating if the city's finances further deteriorate or if it fails to balance its 2010 budget. However, there could be positive rating implications if the city reports favorable financial results and replenishes its reserves and liquidity.

A meeting was held today between the abovementioned communities and the engineer consulting firm Christopher Burke The purpose of this meeting was to update the communities in regards to the design and implementation progress of the quiet zone

Constant warning time signals have been installed by CN and are operational at Hainesworth and DesPlaines. All ADT counts have been preformed and processed by IDOT. The counts submitted meet the quiet zone requirements. Plans for the crossing improvements have been submitted and approved by IDOT. IDOT has issued all necessary permits and bond forms. The crossing improvements consist of concrete barrier median improvements at the crossings. These improvements are the responsibility of the local agencies, as part of the quiet zone agreement.

The consultant also provided a cost estimate of the improvements. The total project cost was estimated on the high side at \$182,916.00, which will be divided evenly amongst the three communities. The contract will be a completion date contract for January 22, 2010, allowing approximately 25 calendar days once bids are awarded and paperwork is completed

The time schedule of events presented is as follows:

Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) is pleased to submit this addendum to the April 27, 2009 Professional Services Agreement. The Addendum will provide additional engineering services to perform construction engineering for the barrier median along Cermak Road/22nnd Street and Harlem Avenue.

#### **UNDERSTANDING OF THE ASSIGNMENT**

The project will consist of additional construction engineering necessary for construction associated with replacement of the existing medians east and west on Cermak Road/22nd Street and north and south on Harlem Avenue, each of which are along the Chicago Central and Pacific railroad tracks. The medians will be an integral part of establishing a Quiet Zone along the Chicago Central and Pacific tracks through North Riverside, Riverside and Berwyn

#### SECTION I - SCOPE OF BASIC SERVICES

The Scope of Services has been broken down into the following task

<u>Task 9: Construction Engineering:</u> CBBEL proposes to furnish the services described below:

#### Task 9.1 – Pre-Construction Services

Attend all pre-construction meetings.

- Attend all public meetings with concerned residents
- Review all submittals from the Contractor for compliance with the contract
- Review Contractor's construction schedule for compliance with contract documents.

#### Task 9.2 - Construction Observation Services

CBBEL will provide a Resident Engineer who will perform the following duties:

- Observe the progress and quality of the executed work and to determine if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. The Engineer will keep the Village informed of the progress of the work, guard the Village against defects and deficiencies in the work, advise the Village of all observed deficiencies of the work, and will disapprove or reject all work failing to conform to the Contract Documents. This is not intended to be full time Construction Observation but part time observation at critical points during construction.
- Assist all construction conferences. Arrange a schedule of progress meetings and other job conferences as required. Maintain and circulate copies of records of the meetings.
- Review the Contractor's schedule on a weekly basis. Compare actual
  progress to Contractor's approved schedule. If the Project falls
  behind schedule, work with the Contractor to determine the
  appropriate course of action to get back on schedule.
- Coordinate all on-site and plant inspection of materials with CBBEL's testing consultant, Testing Service Corporation.
- Maintain orderly files for correspondence, reports of job conferences, shop drawings and other submissions, reproductions or original contract documents including all addenda, change order and additional drawings issued subsequent to the award of the contract.
- Record the names, addresses and phone numbers of all contractors, subcontractors and major material suppliers in the diary
- Keep an inspectors daily report book as outlined in the IDOT Project Procedures Guide, which shall contain a daily report and quantity of hours on the job site, weather conditions, list of visiting officials, daily activities, job decisions and observations as well as general and specific observations and job progress.
- Prior to final inspections, submit to the Contractor a list of observed items requiring correction and verify that each correction has been made.
- Coordinate and conduct the final inspection with the Village, prepare a final punchlist
- Verify that all the items on the final punchlist have been corrected and make recommendations to the Village concerning acceptance.

- Except upon written instructions of the Village, the Resident Engineer or Inspector shall not authorize any deviation from the Contract Documents
- Determine if the project has been completed in accordance with the Contract Documents and that the Contractor has fulfilled all of his obligations.
- Maintain a set of Record Drawings on which all changes are noted and deliver a reproducible set to the Village at the completion of the Project.

#### Task 9.3 - Shop Drawing Review

For the project CBBEL will:

- Record data received, maintain a file of drawings and submissions, and check construction for compliance with them.
- Review Contractor's submittals for compliance with contract documents. Notify the Village of any deviations or substitutions. With the notification, provide the Village with a recommendation for acceptance or denial, and request direction from the Village regarding the deviation or substitution.
- Alert the Contractor's field superintendent when materials or equipment are being installed before approval of shop drawings or samples, where such are required, and advise the Village when it is necessary to disapprove work as failing to conform to the Contract Documents.

#### Task 9.4 - Contract Documentation

The Resident Engineer/Inspector will also document all quantities and material inspections following the guidelines in the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) Construction Manual. This process will facilitate payment applications and the closeout of the contract. CBBEL will maintain and transmit to the Village a set of record drawings in any format desired at the completion of the project.

#### Task 9.5 - Materials Testing

CBBEL to provide verification testing of the Contractor's work, if necessary

For Tasks 9.1 through 9.5 it is understood that CBBEL will not be responsible for job and site safety on this project; job and site safety shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor(s). CBBEL does not have the right to stop work and will not advise/schedule/coordinate/supervise the Contractor(s) nor the Contractor(s) means and methods of their work

Normal and customary engineering services do not include service in respect to the following categories of work which are usually referred to as Supplemental Services. If Client shall so advise CBBEL and we shall perform or obtain from others such services, CBBEL will be paid on an hourly basis or based on subsequent proposal/contract agreements, at the option of Client. Additional Supplemental Services for the project includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Services due to major changes in the general scope of the project.
- Applying to the FRA for approval of Alternative Safety Measures (ASMs) including their engineering design.
- Revising studies, reports, and design documents which the Client, the municipality, and/or other governmental agencies have previously approved.
- Providing Engineering Design and Construction Services for:
  - Unusual or unanticipated improvements.
  - Additional off-site improvements requested by the Client or governmental agencies
  - Improvements necessary to the project development beyond those being included under Basic Services herein.
  - Lift stations.
  - Structural Engineering.
  - Retaining walls.
  - Site lighting.
  - Landscaping, berms or tree replacement.
  - Wetland permitting.
  - NPDES/Erosion Control Report.
  - Detention and hydraulic channel analysis
  - Determining the 100-year Base Flood Elevation (BFE) and developing the required documentation in support of the floodplain fill activities.
  - Preparing wetland assessments, mitigation, permit applications and documents.
  - Bidding documents and bid assistance.
- Meetings with the Client, Contractor(s), the municipal staff, or others during the course of design or construction not included under Basic Services.
- Giving testimony as an expert witness for the Client in litigation or other court proceedings involving this project.
- Environmental assessments, geotechnical investigations.
- Providing work zone traffic control When our work requires suspension of the normal function of a roadway, traffic control procedures must be implemented to provide for the safety of our crews, road users, and pedestrians. When our work duration, location, or roadway type requires it, we will provide the necessary traffic control devices, high visibility clothing and qualified flaggers for our personnel and for the duration of our work only
- Preparation of any plats (ALTA Surveys, etc.) or documents not explicitly identified under Basic Services.
