Berwyn City Council Committee of the Whole Meeting November 10, 2020 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Lovero called the Committee of the Whole to Order at 7:00 p.m. The following Aldermen were in chambers and responded "Present" on the call of the roll: Lennon, Ramirez, Reardon, Fejt, Santoy, Ruiz, Avila, and Nowak. Treasurer Miranda participated remotely.

Mayor Lovero asked the council members if they had questions on agenda items for the Regular meeting. Aldermen raised questions on the following items:

- Avila: Agenda Item C Minutes at I-3 did not include his remarks that the four probationary officers were filling vacant positions. Clerk Paul acknowledged the omission. Ald. Avila will make a motion to amend Minutes.
- Reardon: Cares Act Funding Remarked on Mayor Lovero's announcement that funds earmarked for housing assistance during COVID-19. Ald. Reardon asked Mayor Lovero to clarify police department's remarks that some funds would be used purchase of body cameras. Discussion ensued. Ald. Reardon requested that plans to utilize CARES Act funds be presented to City Council.
- Reardon: Asked questions about the line of credit to be voted on during the regular meeting. Mayor Lovero recognized bond counselor Dan Denys. Mr. Denys provided explanation and information about the city's financial position and the use of the line of credit for upcoming purposes.

Mayor Lovero recognized Finance Department Director Daish. He distributed presentation materials entitled: City of Berwyn, Illinois Determination of Estimated 2020 Tax Levy, Committee of the Whole November 10, 2020. Mr. Daish led the Council in the review of the materials

Mr. Daish concluded his remarks and invited questions from the Aldermen. Ald. Reardon asked Mr. Daish to supply the council with budget and finance documents provided to the Budget and Finance Committee during their meetings. Mr. Daish agreed to supply the documents. A discussion on the Tax Levy Options Summary presented by Mr. Daish ensued. Mr. Denys was recognized and provided answers to questions raised.

Mayor Lovero polled the Aldermen to determine a consensus on a tentative tax levy amount needed to draft the Tax Levy Ordinance and publish the Public Hearing Notice and Agenda required by statute. Poll results indicated that a tentative tax levy of 2.2% would be published as the levy amount being considered.

Ald. Nowak made the motion, seconded by Ald. Avila, to adjourn. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.

Berwyn City Council Regular Meeting

November 10, 2020 at 8:00 PM

Clerk's Note: Governor Pritzker's continuing emergency Executive Orders allow the suspension of "in-person attendance" by elected officials and limit the number of people allowed to congregate in public places due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The City of Berwyn uses best efforts to comply with the Governor's Orders and the spirit of the Open Meetings Act. The City Council has taken the following measures to provide residents with the ability to observe and participate in the meeting through a live video stream:

- The City posts Meeting Notices and Agendas on its website and in City Hall with directions on how the public may view meetings, participate in public meetings, and address the City Council during Open Forum.
- The City posts directions to the public on its Face Book page on how they may participate and or view the public meeting.
- City staff live-stream the meeting on the City of Berwyn website (<u>www.berwyn-il.us</u>), Berwyn Facebook page, and YouTube during the City Council meeting. The video stream / audio is recorded and available to the public.

A. Roll Call, Pledge of Allegiance, and Moment of Silence:

Mayor Lovero, present in chambers, called the meeting to Order at 8:00 p.m. Aldermen Lennon, Ramirez, Reardon, Fejt, Santoy, Ruiz, Avila and Nowak attended in person and responded "Present" on the call of the roll. Treasurer Miranda participated remotely. The attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Lovero asked for a moment of silence recognizing our First Responders.

- B. Open Forum: Mayor Lovero opened the floor for public comment. The following people stepped forward:
 - Richard Leja spoke as a representative of the Pav YMCA board and announced the Y's 50th anniversary. He gave an overview of the Y's activities during the COVID-19 crisis. He distributed presentation materials about the Y. He informed council on ways they could assist the Y financially to help celebrate 50 years of community service.
 - Brendan O'Connor asked the Mayor to explain how recently announced CARES Act funding to aid
 residents with overdue mortgage, rent and utility payments caused by COVID-19 was being publicized.
 He asked how outreach about this program was being conducted. He asked what the city was doing for
 Berwyn businesses and their employees affected by the pandemic. He submitted a copy of his remarks
 to the Clerk for the record.
 - Nicollette Penaranda raised concern about the Mayor's decision to not enforce indoor dining restrictions and asked how the community could be of service to help.
 - Ald. Nowak announced that the City of Berwyn was conducting a COVID-19 drive-up testing event on Friday, November 13 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the North Berwyn Park District building formerly known as the Harlem VFW.
 - Clerk Paul, in her capacity as the Berwyn Public Health District President, announced a drive-up Free Flu shot event on Sunday, November 15th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. The event will also be held at the Harlem VFW site. She thanked Jewel Osco for providing the vaccine doses to help up to 200 people and the North Berwyn Park District for the use of the grounds and facility.
 - Ald. Avila announced that he would be serving service veterans at Novi's Beef on Ogden on Wednesday, November 11th in recognition of their service and of Veterans' Day.
 - Ald. Ruiz announced a 6th Ward Town Hall at Berwyn Bodega on Cermak.

The Mayor recognized Clerk Paul who read email submissions received for the Open Forum:

- Deanna Durica raised her concern over the Mayor's decision not to enforce all Tier I Mitigation measures for Berwyn as announced for Berwyn and Region 10 announced by Gov. Pritzker.
- Joe Policastro asked that email exchanges he had with City Administrator Ruth Siaba Green be read
 where he voiced his disagreement with the Mayor's directive not to enforce indoor dining and other

- Tier I Mitigation requirements. There were three email exchanges. Clerk Paul summarized the content of the emails.
- Dan Leali wrote of his disagreement with Mayor Lovero on the issue of non-enforcement of business compliance with Tier I Mitigations.
- Tabitha Haro voiced her disagreement with the Mayor's non-enforcement decision and asked him to reverse his decision.
- Clerk Paul read a joint email from Salvador Figueroa (La Lupita Restaurant), Noe Gonzalez (Las Islas Bar & Grill), Laura Guerrero (Tacos y Salsa), Martin Sarmiento (Los Corrales Restaurant), and Isidro Garcia (La Michoacana Paleteria) thanking Mayor Lovero for his decision to not enforce the Tier I Mitigation requirements.
- Rocio Hernandez wrote to disagree with the Mayor's decision regarding Tier I enforcement and the disproportionate impact COVID-19 has on the Latinx and Black community.
- Anna Wagner wrote to disagree with the Mayor's decision on Tier I enforcement.
- Jose Alfredo Arteaga (Guadalajara Grill and Bar) thanked Mayor Lovero for his decision to not enforce Tier I Mitigations.
- Elizabeth Ojeda-Jimenez wrote against the non-enforcement of Tier I Mitigation requirements. She
 quoted Gov. Pritzker's remarks about local governments not following public health department
 guidelines and the need for them to take action to keep their constituents safe.
- Will Hudson wrote in opposition to the Mayor's actions to not enforce the Tier I Mitigation requirements. He asked the Mayor to find ways to support local businesses while enforcing measures to keep residents.
- Manny Haro expressed his opposition to the Mayor's Tier I Mitigation nonenforcement in a lengthy rhyme. Clerk Paul chose to summarize Mr. Haro's remarks.
- Julia McAleer-Forte expressed her opposition to the Mayor's Tier I Mitigation nonenforcement decision. She asked him to rescind his decision.
- C. Approval of Minutes: Ald. Avila made the motion, seconded by Ald. Lennon, to amend the Minutes for the Regular City Council Meeting held on October 27, 2020 at paragraph J-3 to include that his motion included his statement that the four Probationary Police Officer positions were filling vacancies on the police force. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. Thereafter, Ald. Avila made the motion, seconded by Ald. Fejt to approve the Minutes as amended. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.
- **D. Bid Openings**: Nothing submitted for the agenda.

Ald. Avila made the motion, seconded by Ald. Nowak, to bring forward agenda items I-3, I-4, I-5 and I-6. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.

- I-3: Ald. Avila made the motion, seconded by Ald. Nowak, to concur with the recommendation of the Police and Fire Commission and appoint Zachary Erdman to the rank of Probationary Police Officer. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. Clerk Paul then administered the Oath of Office to Officer Erdman.
- I-4: Ald. Avila made the motion, seconded by Ald. Nowak, to concur with the recommendation of the Police and Fire Commission and appoint Erica Mendoza to the rank of Probationary Police Officer. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. Clerk Paul then administered the Oath of Office to Officer Mendoza.

Re: Overview of Depot District Grant Funding

Council Members:

The Depot District Streetscape Project consists of streetscape improvements along Stanley Avenue and Windsor Avenue between Harlem Avenue on the west and Ridgeland Avenue on the east. The streetscape project also includes improvements along Grove Avenue from 32nd Street south to 34th Street and along Oak Park Avenue from 31st Street south to Ogden Avenue. The overall improvement consists of the following major items; resurfacing and patching the roadways; geometric modifications such as bump-outs, redefined parking spaces and minor alignment shifts; new street lighting; streetscape amenities such as benches, trash cans, signing and bike racks. Additionally, vertical alignment adjustments are planned to provide better drainage slopes; permeable pavement, Silva cells and other green infrastructure; new sidewalk and ADA ramps; and landscaping throughout.

The City of Berwyn has sought out various grant funds to finance the construction of the streetscape project through the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), the West Central Municipal Conference (WCMC), the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA), and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD). Recently the City has been notified of an additional \$1,282,000 of Surface Transportation Program (STP) dedicated to the project.

I would like to recognize the efforts of Robert Schiller, Nicole Campbell and the Engineering Division for successfully securing these grants that are making this project possible. At the last meeting, resolutions were approved for the latest grant applied for by Nicole and Metro Strategies for an additional \$1.3 million dollars of STP funding for the Depot streetscape. We will continue to apply for additional grants that become available to minimize the city costs for this project.

Recommendation:

I recommend that council accept this communication as informational and recognize the efforts of Robert Schiller, Nicole Campbell, the Engineering Division and Metro Strategies for a successful \$1,282,000 STP grant application.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DISSOLUTION OF THE WEST SUBURBAN MASS TRANSIT DISTRICT

- Whereas, in 1972, the West Suburban Mass Transit District (the "District"), an area including the Illinois communities of Berwyn, Brookfield, Clarendon Hills, Hinsdale, LaGrange, Lisle, Naperville, Riverside, Western Springs and Westmont, was created under the provisions of 70 ILCS 3610/3; and
- Whereas, since its creation, the District has distributed funds for improvement projects along the Burlington Northern Santa Fe commuter rail line that runs from Chicago Union Station to Aurora; and
- Whereas, the West Suburban Mass Transit District Board of Trustees (the "District Board") has determined that substantially all of the District's funds have been committed to such projects, and the District has not identified any further sources of revenue to sustain continued operations of the District; and
- Whereas, in light of the foregoing, on October 21, 2020, the District Board adopted, by unanimous consent a Resolution determining that there is no longer a need for public transportation services provided by the West Suburban Mass Transit District and/or that adequate services can be made available, and that the existence of the West Suburban Mass Transit District should be terminated (the "Resolution of Dissolution"); and
- Whereas, the District Board is requesting that the City Council of the City of Berwyn grant authorization of the discontinuance of services by the District and the dissolution of the District by approving the Resolution of Dissolution; and
- Whereas, the Resolution of Dissolution provides that, in compliance with 70 ILCS 3610/9, after payment of all the District's debts and settlement of all obligations and claims have been made, any funds remaining after the sale and disposition of its property shall be disposed of by payment to the Treasurer of each of the Member Communities on a pro rata basis in accordance with their respective scheduled transportation route miles; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Berwyn that the discontinuation of services by the District is hereby authorized; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Berwyn that, if discontinuance and dissolution is approved by each of the member communities of the District, then pursuant to 70 ILCS 3610/9, after payment of all the debts of the District and settlement of all of its obligations and claims have been made, any funds remaining after the sale and disposition of its property shall be disposed of by payment to the treasurers of each of the member communities of the District on a pro rata basis in accordance with their respective scheduled transit route miles; and

WHEREAS, a request (the "Application") seeking a variation to build a second story addition to a single family home with a setback of twelve and one-half (12 ½) feet from the front façade of the building at the property commonly known as 1628 S. Cuyler Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, (the "Subject Property"), in the R-2 Bungalow Zoning District, was filed by Petitioner Patsy McEnroe (the "Applicant") with the City of Berwyn; and

WHEREAS, because the minimum second story bungalow setback required in the R-2 Bungalow Zoning District is fifteen (15) feet, the request requires a second story setback variation pursuant to Section 1246.11.B.1/Table 1246.11-A (R-2 District Requirements) of the Zoning Code of the City of Berwyn ("Zoning Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property is legally described in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Application has been referred to the Zoning, Planning and Development Commission of the City ("Commission") and has been processed in accordance with the Zoning Code, as amended; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2020, the Commission held a public hearing on the Application pursuant to notice thereof given in the manner required by law, and, after considering all of the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing, the Commission recommended denial of the requested two and one-half (2 1/2) foot second story addition setback variation by a vote of five (5) in favor and one (1) opposed, all as set forth in the Findings and Recommendation of the Commission in this matter ("Findings and Recommendation"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has duly considered the Findings and Recommendation of the Commission, and all of the materials, facts and circumstances affecting the Application, and, contrary to the Findings and Recommendation of the Commission, find that the Application satisfies the standards set forth in Section 1252.03(D)(6) of the Zoning Code relating to variations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Berwyn, Cook County and State of Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: <u>Incorporation</u>. Each whereas paragraph set forth above is incorporated by reference into this Section 1.

Section 2: Approval of Variation to Build a Second Story Addition To Single Family Home with a Twelve and One-Half (12 ½) Setback from the Façade of the Building. The City Council, acting pursuant to the authority vested in it by the laws of the State of Illinois and the Zoning Code, hereby disagrees with the findings of fact and recommendation of the Zoning, Planning and Development Commission, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B, and finds instead that the standards set forth in Section 1252.03(D)(6) of the Zoning Code relating to variations have been met in this case. The City Council further approves a two and one-half (2 1/2) foot variation from the fifteen (15) foot second story addition setback requirement of the Zoning Code in order to allow the Applicant to build a second story addition to the single family home with a twelve and one-half (12 1/2) foot setback from the front façade of the building on the Subject Property located at 1628 S. Cuyler Avenue, Berwyn, Illinois, in the R-2 Bungalow Zoning District, as legally described in Exhibit A..

<u>Section 3</u>: <u>Violation of Condition or Code</u>. Any violation of any term or condition stated in this Ordinance or of any applicable code, ordinance, or regulation of the City shall be grounds for the immediate rescission by the City Council of the approvals made in this Ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>: <u>Severability and Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances</u>. Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the unconstitutionality or invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>: <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.

- The cost sharing program will be added to the existing Flood Mitigation Shared Cost and Downspout Disconnection Program

On Tuesday, November 10, 2020, City Council approved the \$10 million extension of the Line of Credit with BMO Harris Bank. ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING ORDINANCE NUMBER 20-45 RELATED TO A REVOLVING LINE OF CREDIT LOAN FROM BMO HARRIS BANK N.A. TO THE CITY OF BERWYN, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Berwyn (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and, as such, may exercise various powers and perform numerous functions pertaining to its government and affairs in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City previously passed Ordinance Number 20-45, authorizing and providing for a \$3,850,000 revolving line of credit loan from BMO Harris Bank N.A. to the City, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary to repeal and replace Ordinance Number 20-45 in order to approve a second amendment to the Credit Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City (the "Mayor") and City Council (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") have considered the needs of the City and, in doing so, the Corporate Authorities have deemed and do now deem it advisable, necessary and for the best interest of the City in order to promote and protect the public health, welfare, safety and convenience of the residents of the City to make provision for the payment of ordinary and necessary expenditures of the City as the same are due in anticipation of receipts from taxes and other general revenues; and

WHEREAS, the City and BMO Harris Bank N.A. (the "Bank") previously entered into a certain Revolving Credit Agreement as amended from time to time (the "Credit Agreement") on or about June 1, 2017, which Credit Agreement has been subsequently amended; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Bank desire to amend the Credit Agreement as set forth in the Second Amendment to the Revolving Credit Agreement and the Amended and Restated Note (collectively, the "Second Amendment"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, to continue to have access to a revolving line of credit loan (the "Loan") from the Bank for such working capital purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to borrow money for such purpose in an amount not to exceed at any one time the sum of \$10,000,000 pursuant to a revolving line of credit arrangement which will permit, for a certain term to maturity, draws and repayments, from time to time, as funds are needed for corporate purposes or as funds are available for repayment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 6(d) and 6(k) of Article VII of the Constitution, a home rule unit may incur debt payable from ad valorem property tax receipts maturing not more than 40 years from the time it is incurred and without referendum approval thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the City to take all actions required to secure the line of credit in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000 pursuant to the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities further desire, following approval of the Second Amendment to draw upon the Loan in the amount of \$3,850,000 (the "Draw"); and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities desire to rescind Ordinance Number 20-45, and replace it with this Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Berwyn, County of Cook, State of Illinois, in the exercise of the City's home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. The statements set forth in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 2. That Ordinance Number 20-45 is hereby repealed and replaced with this Ordinance.

Section 3. That the Second Amendment to the Credit Agreement, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, is hereby approved with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the City Attorney.

Section 4. Definitions. The following words and terms are defined as set forth:

"Obligations" means all obligations to repay advances to, and all debts, liabilities, obligations, covenants and duties of, the City under the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof.

"Ordinance" means this Ordinance No. 20-____, numbered as set forth on the title

[&]quot;Applicable Law" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;Bank" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;City" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;Code" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;Corporate Authorities" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;Credit Agreement" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

[&]quot;Loan" is defined in the Preambles of this Ordinance.

Words and terms used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings given to them unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning is intended. Words and terms defined in the singular may be used in the plural and vice-versa. Reference to any gender shall be deemed to include the other and also inanimate persons such as corporations, where applicable.

Section 5. In order to provide sufficient funds for working capital purposes and such other purposes as shall be set forth herein, the Corporate Authorities approve and authorize the Loan from the Bank, which Loan shall contain such terms and conditions as set forth in the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof, including the Second Amendment, attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof, with any changes approved by the Mayor or the City Clerk.

Section 6. General Obligations. The Obligations shall be general obligations of the City, for which the full faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged, and are payable from all sources legally available to the City to make such repayment, including, in the discretion of the Corporate Authorities, from the levy of taxes on all of the taxable property in the City, without limit as to rate or amount. For the prompt payment of the Obligations, both principal and interest, at maturity, the full faith, credit and resources of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged. The City represents and warrants that the total amount due to be outstanding at any time, together with all other indebtedness of the City, is and shall be within all statutory and constitutional debt limitations. The City agrees to appropriate funds of the City annually and in a timely manner so as to provide for the making of all payments when due pursuant to the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof. If any portion of the Loan is outstanding on the 15th day of February immediately preceding the termination date of the Credit Agreement, the City will take all necessary action to adopt and put in place in a timely

manner a levy on all taxable property in the City in an amount sufficient to pay all Obligations when due. This Ordinance constitutes an ongoing appropriation from legally available funds for payment of the Obligations payable pursuant to the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof.

Section 7. Use of Loan Proceeds. The proceeds of the Loan shall be used by the City from time to time for such working capital purposes as shall hereafter be determined by the Corporate Authorities. Such working capital purposes may include, without limitation, the repayment of the City's Series 2010A bonds on December 1, 2020, the use of not more than \$10,000,000 of Loan proceeds to fund payments due on December 1, 2020 with respect to certain existing indebtedness of the City in order to accommodate the restructuring of such indebtedness, and for such other purposes as shall be determined from time to time by the Corporate Authorities prior to the termination of the Loan.

Section 8. Approval and Execution of Other Required Instruments. The Mayor and the City Clerk are each individually hereby authorized and directed to execute the Second Amendment and such other instruments, documents, certificates or agreements reasonably required by the Bank in order to effectuate the consummation of the Loan in accordance with the Credit Agreement and any amendments thereof, and such other documents required to be executed in connection with the Second Amendment and the Loan, the approval of such documents to be subject to the review and approval of counsel to the City, such approval to be evidenced by the execution of any such other instruments, certificates or agreements by the Mayor or the City Clerk.

Section 9. Provisions in a Contract. The provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the City and the Bank; and no changes, additions, or alterations

of any kind shall be made hereto, except as herein provided, so long as there is an Outstanding Principal Amount or interest due on the Loan.

Section 10. Approval of Draw on the Loan. The Corporate Authorities further approve and authorize the Draw in the amount specified herein in accordance with the terms of the Credit Agreement, and any amendment thereof.

Section 11. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 12. Repealer and Effective Date. All resolutions, ordinances, orders or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect forthwith upon its passage.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO REVOLVING CREDIT AGREEMENT

This Second Amendment to Revolving Credit Agreement (herein, the "Amendment") is entered into as of November ___, 2020, by and between City of Berwyn, Illinois, a municipality and home unit of local government duly organized and existing under the constitution and laws of the State of Illinois (the "Borrower"), and BMO Harris Bank N.A. (the "Lender").

PRELIMINARY STATEMENTS

- A. The Borrower and the Lender are parties to that certain Revolving Credit Agreement, dated as of June 1, 2017 (as amended hereby and as may be further amended from time to time, the "Credit Agreement"). All capitalized terms used herein without definition shall have the same meanings herein as such terms have in the Credit Agreement.
- B. The Borrower and the Lender wish to amend the Credit Agreement as provided herein and the Lender is willing to do so under the terms and conditions of this Amendment.

Now, Therefore, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS.

Subject to the satisfaction of the conditions precedent set forth in Section 2 below, the Credit Agreement shall be hereby amended as follows:

"Benchmark Replacement" means the sum of: (a) the alternate benchmark rate (which may include Term SOFR) that has been selected by the Lender giving due consideration to (i) any selection or recommendation of a replacement rate or the mechanism for determining such a rate by the Relevant Governmental Body or (ii) any evolving or then-prevailing market convention for determining a rate of interest as a replacement to the LIBOR Rate for U.S. dollar-denominated syndicated or bilateral credit facilities and (b) the Benchmark Replacement Adjustment; provided that, if the Benchmark Replacement as so determined would

be less than zero, the Benchmark Replacement will be deemed to be zero for the purposes of this Agreement.

"Benchmark Replacement Adjustment" means, with respect to any replacement of the LIBOR Rate with an Unadjusted Benchmark Replacement for each applicable one-month interest period, the spread adjustment, or method for calculating or determining such spread adjustment, (which may be a positive or negative value or zero) that has been selected by the Lender giving due consideration to (i) any selection or recommendation of a spread adjustment, or method for calculating or determining such spread adjustment, for the replacement of the LIBOR Rate with the applicable Unadjusted Benchmark Replacement by the Relevant Governmental Body or (ii) any evolving or then-prevailing market convention for determining a spread adjustment, or method for calculating or determining such spread adjustment, for the replacement of the LIBOR Rate with the applicable Unadjusted Benchmark Replacement for U.S. dollar-denominated syndicated or bilateral credit facilities at such time.

"Benchmark Replacement Conforming Changes" means, with respect to any Benchmark Replacement, any technical, administrative or operational changes (including changes to the definition of "Base Rate," timing and frequency of determining rates and making payments of interest and other administrative matters) that the Lender decides may be appropriate to reflect the adoption and implementation of such Benchmark Replacement and to permit the administration thereof by the Lender in a manner substantially consistent with market practice (or, if the Lender decides that adoption of any portion of such market practice is not administratively feasible or if the Lender determines that no market practice for the administration of the Benchmark Replacement exists, in such other manner of administration as the Lender decides is reasonably necessary in connection with the administration of this Agreement).

"Benchmark Replacement Date" means the earlier to occur of the following events with respect to the LIBOR Rate: (1) in the case of clause (1) or (2) of the definition of "Benchmark Transition Event," the later of (a) the date of the public statement or publication of information referenced therein and (b) the date on which the administrator of the LIBOR Rate permanently or indefinitely ceases to provide the LIBOR Rate; or (2) in the case of clause (3) of the definition of "Benchmark Transition Event," the date of the public statement or publication of information referenced therein.

"Benchmark Transition Event" means the occurrence of one or more of the following events with respect to the LIBOR Rate: (1) a public statement or publication of information by or on behalf of the administrator of the LIBOR Rate announcing that such administrator has ceased or will cease to provide the LIBOR Rate, permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of such statement or publication, there is no successor administrator that will continue to provide the LIBOR Rate; (2) a public statement or publication of information by the regulatory

supervisor for the administrator of the LIBOR Rate, the U.S. Federal Reserve System, an insolvency official with jurisdiction over the administrator for the LIBOR Rate, a resolution authority with jurisdiction over the administrator for the LIBOR Rate or a court or an entity with similar insolvency or resolution authority over the administrator for the LIBOR Rate, which states that the administrator of the LIBOR Rate has ceased or will cease to provide the LIBOR Rate permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of such statement or publication, there is no successor administrator that will continue to provide the LIBOR Rate; or (3) a public statement or publication of information by the regulatory supervisor for the administrator of the LIBOR Rate announcing that the LIBOR Rate is no longer representative.

"Benchmark Transition Start Date" means (a) in the case of a Benchmark Transition Event, the earlier of (i) the applicable Benchmark Replacement Date and (ii) if such Benchmark Transition Event is a public statement or publication of information of a prospective event, the 90th day prior to the expected date of such event as of such public statement or publication of information (or if the expected date of such prospective event is fewer than 90 days after such statement or publication, the date of such statement or publication) and (b) in the case of an Early Opt-in Election, the date specified by the Lender by notice to the Borrower.

"Benchmark Unavailability Period" means, if a Benchmark Transition Event and its related Benchmark Replacement Date have occurred with respect to the LIBOR Rate and solely to the extent that the LIBOR Rate has not been replaced with a Benchmark Replacement, the period (x) beginning at the time that such Benchmark Replacement Date has occurred if, at such time, no Benchmark Replacement has replaced the LIBOR Rate for all purposes hereunder in accordance with Section 2 and (y) ending at the time that a Benchmark Replacement has replaced the LIBOR Rate for all purposes hereunder pursuant Section 2.

"Early Opt-in Election" means the occurrence of: (1) a determination by the Lender that at least five currently outstanding U.S. dollar denominated syndicated or bilateral credit facilities at such time contain (as a result of amendment or as originally executed) as a benchmark interest rate, in lieu of the LIBOR Rate, a new benchmark interest rate to replace the LIBOR Rate, and (2) the election by the Lender to declare that an Early Opt-in Election has occurred and the provision by the Lender of written notice of such election to the Borrower.

"Relevant Governmental Body" means the Federal Reserve Board and/or the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, or a committee officially endorsed or convened by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the Federal Reserve Bank of New York or any successor thereto.

"SOFR" with respect to any day means the secured overnight financing rate published for such day by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, as the

administrator of the benchmark, (or a successor administrator) on the Federal Reserve Bank of New York's Website.

"Term SOFR" means the forward-looking term rate based on SOFR that has been selected or recommended by the Relevant Governmental Body.

"Unadjusted Benchmark Replacement" means the Benchmark Replacement excluding the Benchmark Replacement Adjustment.

1.10. The first sentence of Section 2.06 of the Credit Agreement shall be amended and restated to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.06. Interest. (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) and (e) below, each Eurodollar Rate Loan will bear interest on the outstanding principal amount thereof at a rate per annum equal to the sum of (A) the Eurodollar Rate, plus (B) the Applicable Rate; and (ii) the Term Loan will bear interest on the outstanding principal amount thereof at a rate per annum equal to the Term Loan Rate.

- 1.11. Section 2.06 shall be further amended by adding the following as clause (e) at the end thereof:
 - (e) Effect of LIBOR Transition Event.
 - (i) LIBOR Replacement. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, upon the occurrence of any of the following (each, a "LIBOR Transition Event"):
 - (A) a public statement or publication of information by or on behalf of the administrator of the LIBOR Index Rate announcing that such administrator has ceased or will cease to provide the LIBOR Index Rate, permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of such statement or publication, there is no successor administrator that will continue to provide the LIBOR Index Rate;
 - (B) a public statement or publication of information by the regulatory supervisor for the administrator of the LIBOR Index Rate, the U.S. Federal Reserve System, an insolvency official with jurisdiction over the administrator for the LIBOR Index Rate, a resolution authority with jurisdiction over the administrator for the LIBOR Index Rate or a court or an entity with similar insolvency or resolution authority over the administrator for the LIBOR Index Rate, which states that the administrator of the LIBOR Index Rate has ceased or will cease to provide the LIBOR Index Rate permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of such

statement or publication, there is no successor administrator that will continue to provide the LIBOR Index Rate;

- (C) a public statement or publication of information by the regulatory supervisor for the administrator of the LIBOR Index Rate announcing that the LIBOR Index Rate is no longer representative; or
- (D) (1) a determination by the Lender that at least ten (10) currently outstanding U.S. dollar-denominated syndicated or bilateral credit facilities at such time contain (as a result of amendment or as originally executed) as a benchmark interest rate, in lieu of the LIBOR Index Rate, a new benchmark interest rate to replace the LIBOR Index Rate, and (2) the Lender has notified the Borrower in writing that the Lender elects to amend this Agreement as provided below;

then the Lender may amend this Agreement to replace the LIBOR Index Rate and the LIBOR Quoted Rate with a Benchmark Replacement. Any such amendment will become effective at 5:00 p.m. on the fifth (5th) Business Day after the Lender has provided such proposed amendment to the Borrower without any further action or consent of the Borrower.

- (ii) Benchmark Replacement Conforming Changes. In connection with the implementation of a Benchmark Replacement, the Lender will have the right to amend this Agreement to make technical, administrative or operational changes (including changes to the definition of "Base Rate," the timing and frequency of determining rates and making payments of interest and other administrative matters) that the Lender decides may be appropriate to reflect the adoption and implementation of such Benchmark Replacement and to permit the administration thereof by the Lender in a manner substantially consistent with market practice (or, if the Lender decides that adoption of any portion of such market practice is not administratively feasible or if the Lender determines that no market practice for the administration of the Benchmark Replacement exists, in such other manner of administration as the Lender decides is reasonably necessary in connection with the administration of this Agreement).
- (iii) Base Rate Loan Until Benchmark Replacement is Selected. Commencing on the occurrence of a LIBOR Transition Event, until the Benchmark Replacement has been selected in the manner described herein, the obligations of the Lender to create, continue, or effect by conversion Loans shall be suspended (and any existing Loans shall be automatically converted to bear interest at the Base Rate, without regard to clause (iv) thereof, upon the end of the applicable interest period therefor).

- 1.12. Section 2.10 of the Credit Agreement shall be amended and restated to read in its entirety as follows:
 - Section 2.10. Payments. All payments to be made by the Borrower shall be made in Dollars and immediately available funds by 12:00 noon on the date specified by the Lender and without condition or deduction for any counterclaim, defense, recoupment or setoff. The Lender is hereby authorized to debit the account of the Borrower maintained with Byline Bank for each payment of principal, interest, fees and Obligations as it becomes due hereunder. The Borrower will not revoke such authorization.
- 1.13. The first sentence of Section 2.11 of the Credit Agreement shall be amended and restated to read in its entirety as follows:

At least one hundred and twenty (120) days and no more than one hundred and eighty (180) days prior to the Termination Date, the Borrower may make a request to the Lender, upon written notice, to extend the Termination Date.

- 1.14. Section 6.01 of the Credit Agreement shall be amended and restated to read in its entirety as follows:
 - Covenant to Levy. The Borrower agrees that in the event it (k) determines that it is unable to facilitate the payment of the principal and interest on the Loans or Term Loan and the payment of any other Obligations when due, or the Lender directs the Borrower to do so, the Borrower shall take all necessary actions to adopt and put in place a levy on all taxable Property in the City of Berwyn in an amount sufficient to pay all Obligations owing hereunder when due no later than (i) February 15, 2022, with respect to all amounts owing on the Loan or all principal payments owed on the Term Loan on the Initial Term Loan Payment Date and thereafter, and (ii) if no levy was filed pursuant to clause (i) above, by February 15, 2023, with respect to all principal payments owing on the Loan and the Term Loan that have not previously been paid and, with respect to the Term Loan, that are due on the Payment Dates commencing March 31, 2023 through and including the Term Loan Maturity Date. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the rating of the Borrower's General Obligation Debt falls below "Baa2" by Moody or "BBB" by S&P or Fitch, the Borrower shall immediately take all necessary action to adopt and put in place a levy on all taxable Property in the City of Berwyn in an amount equal to the Commitment Amount. Requests for Loans following any such downgrade will not be funded until such a levy is in place to the satisfaction of the Lender.
- 1.15. Article VI of the Credit Agreement shall be further amended by adding the following clause (o) thereof:
 - (o) Relationship. The Borrower shall, within 180 days of the date of the Second Amendment to this Agreement, and for the remaining term of this

Agreement and while any Loans or the Term Loan are outstanding, maintain treasury services with the Bank related to the Borrower's collection and/or disbursement accounts maintained with the Bank or any Bank affiliate.

- 1.16. Section 7.01(j) of the Credit Agreement shall be amended and restated to read in its entirety as follows:
 - (j) any of Fitch, Moody's or S&P downgrades its long-term unenhanced rating of any General Obligation Debt of the Borrower to below "BBB-" (or its equivalent), "Baa3" (or its equivalent), or "BBB-" (or its equivalent), respectively, or suspends or withdraws for credit related reasons its rating of the same, and such action continues for thirty (30) days after the occurrence thereof; or
- 1.17. The Note substantially in the form of Exhibit B to the Credit Agreement shall be replaced with a Note in the form of Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 1.18. All references in the Agreement to "the Bank" shall be deemed to refer to the Lender.

SECTION 2 CONDITIONS PRECEDENT.

The effectiveness of this Amendment is subject to the satisfaction of all of the following conditions precedent:

- 2.1. Delivery by the Borrower of an executed counterpart of this Amendment.
- 2.2. The following statements shall be true and correct as of the date hereof:
- (a) the representations and warranties of the Borrower contained in the Agreement and each of the Loan Documents are true and correct on and as of the date hereof as though made on and as of such date (except to the extent the same expressly relate to an earlier date); and
- (b) no Default or Event of Default has occurred and is continuing or would result from the execution of this Amendment.
- 2.3. Receipt by the Lender of a certified copy of the Ordinance and any other ordinances of the Borrower's City Council (or similar governing body) authorizing the execution, delivery and performance of this Amendment and the Ordinance and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby, together with specimen signatures of the persons authorized to execute such documents on the Borrower's behalf, all certified in each instance by the City Council.
 - 2.4. Receipt of payment of the fees and expenses of the Lender's counsel.

2.5. All other legal matters with respect to this Amendment shall be satisfactory to the Borrower and its counsel.

SECTION 3. REPRESENTATIONS.

In addition to the representations given in Article V of the Agreement, the Borrower, hereby represents and warrants as follows:

- 3.1. The execution, delivery and performance by the Borrower of this Amendment and the Agreement, as amended hereby, are within its respective powers, have been duly authorized by all necessary action and do not contravene any law, rule or regulation, any judgment, order or decree or any contractual restriction binding on or affecting the Borrower.
- 3.2. No authorization, approval or other action by, and no notice to or filing with, any governmental authority or regulatory body is required for the due execution, delivery and performance by Borrower of this Amendment or the Agreement, as amended hereby.
- 3.3. This Amendment and the Agreement, as amended hereby, constitute legal, valid and binding obligations of the Borrower and are enforceable against the Borrower in accordance with their respective terms, except that (i) the enforcement thereof may be limited by principles of sovereign immunity and by bankruptcy, reorganization, insolvency, liquidation, moratorium and other laws relating to or affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights and remedies generally, as the same may be applied in the event of the bankruptcy, reorganization, insolvency, liquidation or similar situation of the Borrower, and (ii) no representation or warranty is expressed as to the availability of equitable remedies.

SECTION 4. MISCELLANEOUS.

4.1. Except as specifically amended herein, the Credit Agreement shall continue in full force and effect in accordance with its original terms. Reference to this specific Amendment need not be made in the Credit Agreement, the Note, or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith, or in any certificate, letter or communication issued or made pursuant to or with respect to the Credit Agreement, any reference in any of such items to the Credit Agreement being sufficient to refer to the Credit Agreement as amended hereby. Except as specifically amended herein, the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect in accordance with its terms. Reference to this Amendment need not be made in any note, document, agreement, letter, certificate, the Agreement or any communication issued or made subsequent to or with respect to the Agreement, it being hereby agreed that any reference to the Agreement shall be sufficient to refer to, and shall mean and be a reference to, the Agreement, as hereby amended. In case any one or more of the provisions contained herein should be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired hereby. All capitalized terms used herein without definition shall have the same meanings herein as they have in the Agreement. THIS AMENDMENT SHALL BE GOVERNED BY, AND CONSTRUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH, THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS WITHOUT GIVING EFFECT TO CONFLICTS OF LAWS PRINCIPLES. EACH PARTY HEREBY WAIVES ANY OBJECTION THAT THE BORROWER

4.2. This Amendment may be simultaneously executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

FOR VALUE RECEIVED, the undersigned CITY OF BERWYN, ILLINOIS (the "Borrower"), hereby promises to pay to BMO HARRIS BANK N.A. or registered assigns (the "Lender"), in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement (as hereinafter defined), the principal amount of each Loan from time to time made by the Lender to the Borrower under that certain Revolving Credit Agreement, dated as of June 1, 2017 (as amended, restated, extended, supplemented or otherwise modified in writing from time to time, the "Agreement;" the terms defined therein being used herein as therein defined), between the Borrower and the Lender.

The Borrower promises to pay interest on the unpaid principal amount of each Loan from the date of such Loan until such principal amount is paid in full, at such interest rates and at such times as provided in the Agreement. Renewal of Excess Workers Compensation Insurance

The City's excess workers compensation insurance coverage is set to expire on December 31, 2020. Per protocol, staff asked our independent insurance broker Alliant Insurance to go out for bid to solicit quotes from carriers (see attached).

Although the City has been proactive with its workers' compensation claims, rates across the insurance industry have seen a slight increase. Safety National, our current carrier, has provided the most competitive bid, with a rating base of \$0.3900 per \$100 of payroll. To maintain the current SIR of \$1,000,000, the premium will be \$123,878.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that council authorize city administration to execute a contract with Safety National for excess workers' compensation insurance at – a premium of \$123,878 with an SIR of \$1,000,000.
